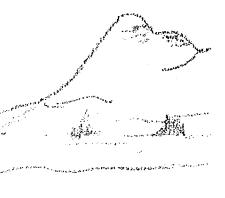

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

First Sitting

The Eleventh annual conference of the Arizona-New Mexico District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church was convened at the call of Superintendent, John Dunn.

The host pastor, Rev. Lockard, gave words of welcome to the assembly, followed by the greetings of the District Superintendent to the pastors and delegates.

Rev. Wilbur Smith led in the singing of "I Am Thine O Lord" and "Wonderful, Wonderful, Jesus is to Me".

Rev. Dunn led the congregation in a responsive reading on the theme of "God's Grace".

Prayer was offered by Charles Long and G. L. Keene.

Dr. William H. Neff, General Superintendent, was introduced to the conference and brought greetings from the General Church and reminded us of his early association with the great Southwest.

His message centered around a scripture lesson in II Corinthians chapter four beginning at verse one, with verse seven as a text. Three words were emphasized in the development of the text, as follows:

TREASURE

This treasure is Jesus Christ dwelling in our hearts. It is a living treasure.

TRIAL

The trial comes because of the vessel the treasure is indwelling. There is a cross to be borne.

TRIUMPH

Triumph comes through the indwelling Christ, manifest in us. There is a crown to be won.

The devotional period of the opening session closed with the sing-ing of, "In The Sweet By and By^{tt} .

Dr. Neff gave a brief but careful resume of the events surrounding the resignation of R. C. Hawkins.

The roll of ministers and delegates was called. A motion carried to establish the center section and the platform as the conference bar.

Ushers were appointed as follows: Edwin Diggs, Neil Bailey, Paul Barefoot and Wilbur Smith.

A motion carried to accept the transfers of the following: Arville Parker from another denomination, G. L. Keene from the Texas District, Larry Williams from another denomination, Charles Gordon from another denomination, Lois Barefoot from the California District, Laura Steinberger from the East Michigan District and Wilbur Smith from the Forthern Indiana District.

By motion, the schedule of sessions was set as follows: 9:00-11:30 A.H., 1:30-3:30 P.M., Ordination service at 4:00 P.K. and any further business until completed.

District Superintendent Dunn gave his report to the conference. It was received graciously.

The Auditor's Report was read and approved.

The District Treasurer's Report was read, including a financial statement of the corporation and the annual report of finances. The financial statement and annual reports were received by separate motions.

The Statisticians Report was presented with only the totals read to the conference. A motion to receive the report was adopted.

The pastor's reports were heard by the conference. These were interesting and challenging.

The time of the first sitting was extended to hear two remaining reports. These were from the Education and Examining Board and the Memoirs Committee.

The report of the Education and Examining Board was read by G. L. Kaene. It was accepted and adopted.

The report of the Memoirs Committee was read by Mellie Linder. The congregation stood in silent memorial to those who have departed from our midst.

Announcements were made by the District Superintendent. The session was dismissed with prayer by Paul Barefoot.

Second Sitting

Rev. Wilbur Smith led in singing of "Where He Leads, I'll Follow" after which prayer was offered by Elwood Hunter. Mrs. Barefoot made an announcement concerning the teacher training classes and the certificates were awarded.

Denzel Clouse presented the forms dealing with travel expense to the conference.

The minutes of the First Session were read and approved.

The Conference Action Committee report was read and discussed point by point. Each numbered resolution was adopted by motion including the adoption of 13A as the plan of operation for the District Budget for the coming year.

The election of officers followed. For Superintendent, two names were nominated by the General Board: John A. Dunn and Melvin D. Lock-ard. John A. Dunn was elected for two years on the first ballot.

For Assistant Superintendent, Melvin D. Lockard was elected on the first ballots

District Secretary, M. E. Turner was re-elected on the first ballot.

District Treasurer, Denzel Clouse was re-elected on the first ballot.

An advisory member for the District Council was elected. Neil Bailey was elected on the third ballot.

Kenneth Artz was elected to the Board of Trustees for a three year term.

G. L. Keene was elected to the Education and Examining Board for a three year term.

The District Council appointments were read by the District Superintendent. (see officers and committees)

The coming events for Pilgrims were reviewed, including: Ministers meetings, General Conference, and Family and Youth Camps.

The Conference Action Committee presented a final resolution: BE IT RESOLVED by a rising vote we express our appreciation to our host pastor and the members of Tucson First Church for their gracious hospitality. We also express to our District Superintendent, John A. Dunn, our thanks for his wise and capable leadership in assuming this responstibility so unexpectedly. To our General Superintendent, Dr. William H. Neff, who in a trying time for the General Board and the Church Extension Department, ably championed the cause of Christ in his devotional messages and chairmened the conference in his own commendable way, we express our gratitude. Carried by a rising vote.

The conference adjourned with a unanimous feeling of confidence and courage for the future.

CONFERENCE REPORTS

ADDRESS OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT TO THE DISTRICT CONFERENCE SESSION--Nay 17. 1966

To the eleventh annual conference of the Arizona-New Mexico District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, to our General Superintendent, Dr. William H. Neff, ministers, delegates and friends, Greetings in Christ's name!

It is a joy to bring you an interim Superintendent's report. Since my responsibilities have been for three months, my report will be brief.

We would not be fair if we did not pause a moment and thank God for the good leadership that was given to us under District Superintendent T. M. Weir. He was certainly a great asset to our District.

We also want to record the fact that every major decision by the members of the District Council has been unanimous. We thank the conference for placing men on the district council who, I believe, are full of faith, wisdom and the Holy Ghost. They have not turned down one request to help the district.

One significant matter that has plagued us for years has been resolved; The Camp Ground indebtedness is cared for. Possibly, we can recover from this loss and in future years have our own District Center again.

Two areas need our attention as we face the new year. We show losses in both Sunday School and Membership. We need to be on the alert for new members as a result of conversion and transfer. Our Sunday Schools can do better in each Church. While losses were sustained in these areas, district income shows a good increase. With a combined effort to increase our Sunday Schools and membership across the district we should continue to show an increase in income.

The records show that there was over a 10% increase in Foreign Missionary giving this year. Let us continue to believe the promise of God - "give and it shall be given unto you."

We are called upon to face our district operational structure. The Conference Action Committee is giving a choice in this area. As we choose together, may God grant us wisdom to do better than we know to do. We are gathered to hear the reports of the churches. We must be conscious that this is the work of God and our work for Him cannot be treated lightly. I believe firmly the law of God that teaches, if we honor God, God will honor us. Let us Honor Him and seek His best as we deliberate today.

SUPERINTENDEHT'S PERSONAL REPORT

To the best of my ability, I have cared for the responsibilities of the office of District Superintendent. I represented the district at the Leaders Conference in Indianapolis and attended the C.P.C. board meeting. Annual meetings and other matters of church business were cared for with the aid of members of the Council.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS OF PREVIOUS CONFERENCES

LOCAL CHURCH

- 1. The local churches shall provide modern cooling, cooking and heating facilities for the parsonage, the type of facilities to be suitable to the locality where the parsonage is situated, and all churcher in the conference shall pay the utilities for the parsonages.
- 2. Each local church is urged to raise a subscription list to the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate equal to its total family membership. (Revised 1965)
- 3. BE IT RESOLVED that all local indebtedness involving an expenditure of more than \$500, where financing is involved, be approved by the District Council. (1960)
- 4. BE IT RESOLVED that all non-Pilgrim Evangelists must first have the approval of the District Superintendent or the District Council before being called for evangelistic activity in our churches. (1960)
- 5. BE IT RESOLVED that no church may borrow from its paster, nor may any paster underwrite loans for a church so as to make himself legally responsible as an individual, without the prior consent of the District Council. (1961)
- 6. BE IT RESOLVED that a call pastor meeting be conducted between the first two Sundays of March. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in the absence of the District Superintendent, the Church Secretary conduct said meeting. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the pastor present a letter of answer to the District Superintendent within 15 days of acceptance or rejection of call. It is understood that each pastor enters into a moral contract when accepting a call to a church and should do everything possible to honor the term of his call. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that retiring pastors terminate their services on the 2nd Sunday in June. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Church Secretary count the ballots and notify the pastor and District Superintendent at the close of the election. (1965)
- 7. In the interest of good business practice BE IT RESOLVED that the offerings received in the local churches be counted cooperatively by both the Secretary and the Treasurer of the Congregation or designated parties appointed by the local church board and that the paster consistently be informed of offering receipts each Sunday. (1965)
- 8. BE IT RESOLVED that budget monies be forward to the District Treasurer by the local church treasurers no later than the 10th of each month. (1965)

CONFERENCE

- 1. The district council and the following committees and boards shall meet at least 30 days prior to the Annual Conference to take care of such work as they have at hand: Conference Action Committee and the Educational and Examining Board.
- 2. In order that the relatives and friends may know the set time for the ordaining of ministers, BE IT RESOLVED that the Ordination Service take place at 4:00 p.m. the first day of Conference. (1957)
- 3. The Education and Examining Boards shall be combined and this Board shall consist of three members, one being elected for a period of three years, one for two years and one for one year.

- 4. There shall be a Memoirs committee which shall annually list departed members by name, date of decease, and church, for inclusion in the Conference Journal. In case of ministers, there shall be a picture and a brief resume of ministerial labors.
- 5. BE IT RESOLVED that the district furnish credential forms to each local church conference delegate and alternate to be filled out and signed by the pastor and the church secretary, and sent to the district secretary at least 30 days prior to Conference. (1959)
- 6. BE IT RESOLVED that the District Trustees and the Statistician be made permanent members of the District Conference. (1959)
- 7. INASMUCH AS there is such close correlation between the work of the Resolutions Committee and the Ways and Means Committee: THEREFORE BE it RESOLVED that there be an appointment of a Conference Action Committee of 5 members, which would combine the functions and capacities of the Resolutions and Ways and Means Committees. (1960)
- 8. BE IT RESOLVED that there be an appointment of a Building Appraisal Committee: (competent in the field of Appraisal) the function of which shall be to set the value of all church property. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the appointment of this committee be made bi-annually. AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all properties acquired between these appraisals shall be carried as tentatively appraised by the District Council, until the next general appraisal. (Revised 1961)
- 9. WHEREAS the District Council has recommended the moving of the Arizona-New Mexico District into the "ADVANCED LEVEL," THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this conference approve the promotion of the Arizona-New Mexico District into the "A DVANCED LEVEL STATUS." (1962)
- 10. BE IT RESOLVED that the conference year of the Arizona-New Mexico District shall begin April 1 and end March 31 the following year, and that all reports be sent to the District Superintendent and District Statistician by April 15. (Revised 1965)

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

1. BE IT RESOLVED that the District pay \$85.00 per month on salary of the District Superintendent. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the District Superintendent be remunerated for meals and lodging incidental to travel. (Rovised 1963)

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MINISTERIAL

1. BE IT RESOLVED that we accept the Blue Cross, Blue Shield group hospitalization, surgical and medical plan. And BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the churches pay \$5.00 per month to be applied to the pastor's premium, and the district pay \$5.00 per month to be applied to the District Superintendent's premium. (1959 - Revised 1962 & 1966)

2. Each pastor is to be granted a two weeks vacation with full salary.

3. BE IT RESOLVED that when ministers come to this district from other denominations, that the Executive Officer of the transferring minister be contacted by the District Superintendent asking for a recommendation, to be in the hands of the District Council at least 30 days prior to

The truth of the statement "the hand is quicker than the eyo" was demonstrated by the magic of Andre Kole, and the testimony of his life was a stirring inspiration to all. Later in the evening Central Pilgrim College was represented and the New Year was welcomed with a Midnight Communion Service.

Even the desert has its times of cold--and we demonstrated that by spending a day on Tucson's Mt. Lemon. The snow coupled with the ico-cold stream proved to be almost too much for some--but by now I'm sure all have recovered.

Looking back on the year it has been one of spiritual refreshment combined with good fun and followship. It has renewed my conviction that Pilgrim Youth are "the cream of the crop." But as we look ahead, the challenge of winning others to Christ remains, and as we allow God to lead us, we shall meet that challenge.

May God's richest blessing rest upon each one of you is my prayer.
