FIRST MEETING, TUESDAY, JUNE 5, 1928, A. M.

The Sixth Annual Assembly of the California District was called to order by General Superintendent Seth C. Rees at 10 A. M. Tuesday, June 5, 1928. Scripture quotations were given by members of the Assembly. Prayer and singing and praise followed spontaneously and the presence of God was manifestly felt by all present.

A few remarks were made by the Chairman, Rev. S. C. Rees, in regard to the conduct of business after which the roll of the Assembly was made up.

The Bar of the Assembly was designated as the first six rows of chairs.

The Secretary was permitted to select his own assistant. Rev. Emmett Van Note was selected.

Rev. and Mrs. E. R. Stewart from Texas were introduced to the Assembly and given seats within the Bar. Brother and Sister Curtis of San Diego were granted seats within the Bar.

It was moved and seconded that the afternoon session be at 2 P. M. Carried. It was moved and seconded that we meet at 9:30 A. M. and adjourn at 11:45. Carried.

It was moved and seconded to reconsider the time of the afternoon session. Carried. Moved and carried to meet at 1:30 P. M. and close at 4 P. M.

Moved and seconded to have the Chair appoint a Committee on Nominations to nominate all Assembly Committees and Boards. Carried. Brothers Coleman, Tyrell and Blake were appointed. It was moved and carried to excuse this Committee to make its nominations and report later to the Assembly. Carried.

The District Officers' reports were next called for. The District Treasurer's report was read and adopted. (See Reports). The Report of the Treasurer of the Recue Board was read and adopted. (See Reports).

Church Reports were next taken up. The San Diego Pastor's, Statistical and Sunday School reports were read and adopted. The Phoenix Pastor's statistical, Financial, and Sunday School reports were read and adopted. The Pasadena Pastor gave a verbal report which was dopted.

It was moved and seconded to extend the time five minutes in order to hear the report of the Nominating Committee. The Committee made its report which was adopted as a whole. (The report was later revised so will appear later).

It was moved and carried to adjourn.

SECOND MEETING, TUESDAY, JUNE 5, 1:30 P. M.

The devotions were conducted by Rev. S. E. Van Note.

The Committee on Nominations asked permission to revise the list of nominations. Granted.

Mrs. Bailey was substituted for Mrs. Bud Robinson as delegate from the Pasadena Church.

Miss Sanholz and Miss Bradshaw, ministers of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Ohio, were introduced and given seats within the Bar.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as corrected.

District Superintendent O. R. Sickler gave his report. Adopted. (See Reports.)

It was moved and seconded that the Assembly express by a rising vote its thanks to the District Superintendent for his faithfulness during his term of office. Carried unanimously.

The Olinda statistical, financial and Sunday School reports were read and adopted. The East Pasadena Pastor's statistical, and financial reports were read and adopted.

The revised report of the Nominating Committee was read and adopted. The report follows:

Miss Daisy Buby was granted a seat within the Bar. She gave a sincere testimony expressing her call to Mexico to engage in clinical work among the Mexicans. The Assembly's prayers go with her.

The new work at Sierra Madre was reported by Mrs. Stewart, the one who began it. The Pastor's Sunday School, statistical and financial reports were made and adopted.

A. Welch, W. R. Miner, Rhoda B. Ducey, L. L. Bucey, Herbert Trafton, Walter Carrithers, C. L. Hutchings, Mrs. Freda Rees.

It was moved and carried to take a five minute recess.

After the recess the following reports were given and adopted: J. P. Coleman, D. T. Grout, S. E. Van Note, Jean Pound, H. L. Blake, Mrs. Nellie M. Foss, and W. L. Troyer.

At this time Rev. and Mrs. Carl Dauel entered the Assembly and were welcomed by the Assembly.

It was moved and carried that the Assembly proceed to the election of District Trustees. The Chair nominated the following who were ratified by the Assembly: Geo. Wise, W. L. Troyer, Jens Jensen.

The following ministers reported: Luther Estes, Mrs. Norris, Gene Gandier, Mrs. Scogin, Mrs. Yorba, A. C. Augsburg. Gene Gandier reported the starting of a Sunday School among the Japanese in Phoenix. Brother and Sister J. P. Bowen, Nazarene preachers of Los Angeles, were introduced and given seats within the Bar.

Brother Grout asked to be excused from the Committee on statistics. Granted. The Committee on Nominations was authorized to make a new nomination.

Brother E. G. Hollowel, a Friends Minister, was introduced and given a seat within the Bar.

The time for adjourning having arrived, the Assembly stood adjourned to 9:30 Wednesday Morning.

THIRD MEETING, WEDNESDAY, JUNE 6, 9:30 A. M.

The devotions were led by Rev. Seth C. Rees

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as corrected.

The Assembly meeting in the main auditorium required the fixing of the Bar. It was moved and carried to fix the four rows of seats as the assembly Bar. It was moved and seconded to add Brother Hodgins' name to the Rescue Board. Carried.

Brother Arthur Lewis, a minister of the Nazarene Church, and his wife were introduced to the Assembly and given seats within the Bar.

Brother J. F. Silver, a minister of the Free Methodist Church was introduced and given a seat within the Bar.

Sister Rees asked to be excused from the Rescue Board. Granted. Nettie Crutchfield was added to the Rescue Board.

The East Pasadena Sunday School report was given and adopted. The Rialto Pastor's, statistical, financial, and Sunday reports were read and adopted.

Miss Maude Brillhart, a minister of the Nazarene Church was introduced to the Assembly and given a seat within the Bar.

The Belvedere Gardens Pastor's, Statistical, financial and Sunday School reports were read and adopted. The Alta Loma Pastor's, Statistical and Sunday School reports were read and adopted.

The District Foreign Missionary Treasurer's report was read and adopted. (See Reports).

It was moved and carried that all money for Foreign Missions go thru the hands of the Foreign Missionary Treasurer.

It was moved and seconded that Brother Arthur Lewis and Sister Holloway sing a song. Carried unanimously. They responded with a delightful message in song.

The following reports were read and adopted: Mrs. Mary Burtand Mrs. Flora Evans.

The election of officers for the District was made the order of the day for Thursday at 10:30.

On a carried motion the meeting stood adjourned to Thursday at 9:30

FOURTH MEETING, WEDNESDAY, JUNE 6, 1:30 P. M.

The devotions of the fourth meeting were conducted by Brother Stewart. The minutes of the preceding meeting were read and approved as read.

A motion was made and seconded that the Secretary be excused at his own request on account of school matters. Carried. The Assistant Secretary took his place

The matter of the deficit in the amount pledged on the Editor of the Advocates salary was presented to the Assembly. Pledges were taken to the amount of thirty dollars which covered the deficit.

Subscriptions to the Advocate were taken to the number of Seventy-five. The following pledged themselves to be responsible for a certain number of subscriptions: Mrs. Dickinson, 5; Brother Nering, 10; Brother Curtis, 5; Brother Dixon, 5; Brother Sickler, 8; Carl Dael, 10; Brother Steelhead, 2; Brother Edwards, 5; Sister Beard, 5; Sister Rees, 20.

A motion was made and carried to add Brother Rees to the Rescue Board.

Armour Peisker, Business Manager of the Puritan, was given a few minutes to present the school annual to the Assembly. One Subscription was obtained.

Invitations for the holding of the next Annual Assembly were given by Pasadena, and Belvedere Gardens. It was moved and seconded to accept the invitation of Belvedere Gardens. Tie vote. A call for a rising vote resulted in the motion being carried.

Moved and carried that the \$25.00 interest on the Rescue fund be given to Sister Scogin for her work in the Jail the same as it was last year.

It was moved and seconded that Sister Scogin or some member of the Rescue Board be permitted to hold a meeting in each church during the year in the interests of Rescue work. Carried. The District Superintendent took the Chair while Rev. S. C. Rees gave a talk in the interest of the establishment of a Rescue home on the coast.

It was moved and carried that this Assembly shall encourage the District Rescue Board to proceed to the establishment of a home on this coast for unfortunate girls and women with the understanding that the Board is not to obligate the District financially.

The following reports were heard and adopted: Ralph V. Steelhead, Miss Beard, Miss Gross.

It was moved and carried to publish the Minutes of the Assembly. It was moved and carried to publish the same number as last year. A motion was made and seconded that each church be assessed by the District Treasurer sufficient to cover the printing bill. Carried. It was moved and seconded to publish 100 copies of the Minutes. Carried. The motion to publish the same number as last year was rescinded.

It was moved and carried to authorize the one engaging the printer to investigate prices and secure the cheapest price.

Brother Lewis and Sister Hollowell favored the Assembly with a song.

The financial report of the San Diego church was read and adopted.

Brother John Edwards reported verbally. Report adopted.

Moved and carried to adjourn.

FIFTH MEETING, THURSDAY, JUNE 7, 9:30 A. M.

The devotions were led by Brother Curtis of San Diego.

The Minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved as corrected.

The Roll was then called.

It was moved and seconded that E. M. Smith take the place of Brother Mat-tal, lay delegate from Pasadena. Carried.

The financial report of the Alta Loma Church was given and adopted.

Qualified for first year Deaconess license: Mrs. Mary Burt, Rhoda Bucey.

Qualified for second year Deaconess license: Mrs. Flora Evans.

It was moved and carried that these names be referred to the Examining Board for action by them.

The report of the Committee on Resolutions was read and adopted. (See Reports.)

It was moved and carried to give a rising vote of thanks to the District Treasurer for his good work for the year.

It was moved and carried to give a rising vote of thanks to the District Missionary Treasurer for the excellent service given during the past year.

By the action of the Assembly, Brother and Sister E. R. Stewart were added to the Rescue Board. Mrs. G. Tyrrell was also added.

The Order of the Day was called for and the election of officers begun. Brother Carl Dael was nominated for District Superintendent. No other nominations were made and the Secretary was authorized to cast the ballot for Brother Dael. A brief speech by the new Superintendent was made.

It was moved and carried that Sister Eva Dael be made the Assistant District Superintendent. A few words of appreciation were spoken by Mrs Dael.

It was moved and seconded that Walter Adams be made District Secretary. Mr. Adams asked permission to withdraw his name inasmuch as he would be gone most of the year. Granted. George Tyrrell was then nominated and elected.

George Wise was nominated as District Treasurer and elected.

The three following men were elected as additional members of the District Council: J. P. Coleman, S. C. Rees, H. L. Blake.

Alexander Krag was elected District Missionary Treasurer.

It was moved and carried unananimously to give the retiring Secretary a rising vote of thanks for his faithfulness for the past several years.

A partial report was given by the Committee on Memoirs. It was moved and carried to spread this report on the Minutes. Brother Coleman was also instructed to send an abridged copy of the same to the Advocate. Along with this report he was intructed to send a report of the Assembly.

The following resolution was presented by Brother Grout and adopted:

Whereas the sacrifices of the Distict are many and the remuneration small, therefore be it Resolved:

That we request our pastors to arrange for a Quarterly Meeting with the District Superintendent at which time a generous offering for his support be taken.

It was moved and seconded that an offering be taken quarterly for our Distrist Superintendent whether he be able to attend the Quarterly Meeting or not. Carried.

It was moved and carried that each church be requested to conduct a Revival at least once a year.

It was moved and carried that if licensed ministers do not report at the next District Assembly this shall be deemed sufficient cause for refusing to renew their licenses.

It was moved and seconded to suspend the rules and to change the time of meeting so that when we adjourn we adjourn to meet at 9:30 Friday morning. Carried.

It was moved and seconded that this Assembly make the Sunday afternoon meeting of this local church the Educational meeting of the Assembly. Carried. It was further ordered that Rev. J. R. Gardner, President of the Pilgrim Bible College, be permitted to address the Assembly for at least forty minutes at the Friday morning session in the interest of Pilgrim Bible College.

It was moved and seconded to adjourn.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

Another assembly year has drawn to a close. History is written and sealed. God's blessings have been many, for which we are very thankful. There have been many burdens, trials and battles, but God's grace has been so much more than sufficient that we feel like saying, "His Yoke is easy, and His burden is light." Our Christian experience is the best it has ever been in the nineteen years of our walk with the Lord without a break.

There have been a few changes over the District during the year. Four pastors have been changed and new work has been started in two fields. At Sierra Madre, if the work continues to grow, they will soon be ready to organize. In Arcadia we are in hopes of getting a permanent work started. At Phoenix, a lot has been purchased and a beautiful Church has been built. At San Diego, a parsonage has been built and is free from debt.

We have held quarterly meetings, preached in all the churches and most of them several times. We have traveled over 6000 miles in the interest of district work. We held three revivals. About the first of February we took the pastorate at Belvedere Gardens.

We have preached 103 times, had 130 seekers, and received \$73.00 from the district, \$281.25 from revivals, \$440.00 from Belvedere Gardens, a total of \$794.25.

I have accepted the call to the pastorate at Belvedere Gardens for the coming year. I have now been District Superintendent for three and a half years and have enjoyed laboring with you very much. However we feel led to the pastoral work and will not be a candidate for District Superintendent the coming year. Our prayer is that God's richest blessings may be upon the District and that it may grow and prosper more than it has in the past.

COMMITTEE ON MEMOIRS

Laura E. Lane

Laura E. Wallace was born near Allentown, Iowa, of Presbyterian parentage. Home teaching produced in her an unusually strong character. During her high school years through the lectures she heard by some of our noted men an ambition was stirred within her to attend college.

Being brought under the teaching of entire sanctification, she immediately sought and obtained the blessing.

In 1909 she was graduated from the University of Nebraska. A year was given as instructor in English at the School in Oskaloosa, Iowa. Two years were devoted to the English department in the Nazarene University at Pasadena, Calif.

January 25, 1915 she was united in marriage to J. Preston Lane. Two children were born to them. She was greatly devoted to her family.

In 1924 Mrs. Lane was instrumental in organizing East Pasadena Pilgrim Holiness Church and continued as pastor until her death.

With failing health she was a constant sufferer. As she grew weaker she longed to be taken to the mountains. It was a great relief to be among the big trees. As she neared the end she gave a clear, ringing testimony, then bidding good-by to her husband and children, she was gone.

Nella J. True

Nella J. True was born December 8, 1882 and passed away March 19, 1928 at the age of 46 years. She was converted in early childhood and became a subject of earnest prayer by her parents that she would be called of God to the mission field.

Having yielded her heart fully to the Saviour, she became greatly concerned for the salvation of the Mexican people in California. She gave herself heart and soul to the work of evangelizing these and as fruit of her labor among them, native pastors and evangelists are doing effective work among their people.

In August 1921 she was called to Mexico where her labors were uncommonly successful. She was greatly beloved by all the Mexican people but especially by the Indians who had been greatly blessed by her work among them. Through political troubles, depriving foreigners from laboring among them, she was called home to do deputation work in the interest of Mexican needs.

While busily engaged in this new field of labor, she was stricken with a very malignant disease and finally returned to California where she lingered for many months in great bodily pain. But through it all she was enabled to rejoice in the Lord.

Her last words were, "In my Father's house—In my Father's house."

Perry O. Wilson

Perry Ozias Wilson was born at Pleasantville, Indiana, July 7, 1872 and was suddenly called to his heavenly home, April 8, 1928 at Pasadena, California aged 55 years and nine months.

In 1904 he was united in marriage to Bessie Lora McIndoo. To this union were born three children.

He was converted February 12, 1900 and soon after wonderfully healed of stomach trouble. November 12, 1902 he received the blessing of entire sanctification.

Soon after he was saved he received a definite call to preach the gospel. He was greatly burdened for people in the mountainous districts and just as it seemed his desire was about to be consummated to labor among these people, God called him home.

On Easter Sunday he attended the services throughout the day, giving his last testimony at the street meeting in the evening. He evidently was not conscious that his home-going was so near. Shortly after ten o'clock he dropped into quiet slumber and within an hour was not, for God took him.
