We want to express our gratitude to God for His presence with us the past year on the District, We have won some victories through prayer, Faith and labor. In solving our problems we have had council form our beloved General Supt, bro kees and full cooperation of the Council, changes have been made at six of our churches, we believe we are blessed with preachers that are clean progressive and sacrificing.

MEMORIALS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

-1- WHEREAS, some of the Districts are not making the progress that they should, and WHEREAS- our General Church is proposing to adapt atationing committee for our Districts to regulate the locating of the Pastors.

THEREFORE, be it resolved that we the California District
Assembly recommend that the General Assembly Constitute the
Executive Council as a Stationing Committee to effect any changes
in our District Superintendents that they may deem necessary.

-2- WHEREAS, it is evident that the supervision of our entire work at Home and Abroad is too heavy for one man, because of the territory that it covers and the time it takes for visitation, also in anticipation of future growth, necessarily entailing a greater amount of supervision.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: that the General Assembly elect three General Superintendents, Two for the home work and one for the Foreign Fields.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: - That one Assistant Genl Supt be elected for the Home work, and che Assistant Gen Missionary Supt be elected for the Foreign Fields.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That those five men along with the Editor of our Church paper and the General Secretary Treasurer constitute the Executive Committee of the General Board.

constitute the Executive Committee of the General Board.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: - That these men be remunerated from the General Budget according to the amount of service rendered and the time expended, plus expenses entailed. Said sums to be determined by the General Assembly, and that each Officer be privileged to devote any portion of his time not required by the General Church to special Evangelistic meetings and retain as his own any remuneration received therefrom.

-3- WHEREAS: - Whe work of the General Board has been so evidently successful in a time of unusual stees:

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that this same form of Government be continued through another quadrentum.

REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE AS ADAPTED BY DISTRICT ASSEMBLY

1- BE IT RESOLVED, That all Ministers coming to us from other denominations be required to bring a recommendation of good standing from the Church they leave. Moved that this resolution be sent as a Memorial to General Assembly.

REPORT OF RESOLUTION COMMITTEE AS ADAPTED BY THE ASSEMBLY Continued.

2- WHEREAS: We have of our own Denomination, capable and Spiritual Evangelists and WHEREAS, It is necessary to the best interest of our Church that we use our own men, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That our Pastors use Filgrim Evangelists where possible.

3-WHEREAS We feel that a Ministerial Convention affords an opportunity to our Ministers to discuss matters of mutual interest bE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that under the direction of the Dist Supt a Ministerial Convention be held at the end of each Quarter, the first to be held at Ventura, the exact time and program to be assigned to Dist Superintendent.

4- WHEREAS: There are inactive licensed and Ordained kinisters on our District Directory: WHEREAS, We feel that each should preach some each ; year,; THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED; That each Minister preach at least twelve times a year or give reason in view of the inactivity, why he should retain his Credentials.

5---WHEREAS: During these days of financial strain many of the Pastors on the District are receiving compare tively small remuneration, be IT RESOLVED, That each month a love offering of provision be taken for the Fastor, same to be instituted by the delegate upon returning to their Church, that each Ch set aside a night for the said offering.

6-- WHEREAS: In years past there has been no adequate financial measure to care for the District work or the General Budget, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVEDM That 10% of gross offerings of both Church and Sunday School, with exception of rent, Foreign Missionary and building funds, And shall be sent to the District Treasurer, One third shall be divided into Geleral Budget, The other two thirds shall be divided by the District Council between District Superintendent support and the District Eudget AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED; That the Foreign Missionary budget be raised by special offering.

7-- BE IT RESOLVED; That The California District favor the reorganizization of Filgrim Bible College so as to place the institution under the control of the Filgrim Holiness Church as outlined in the Folicy of the General board of said Church with reference to educational institutions, and, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED. That this Assembly pledge itself to the Spiritual and financial support of the Filgrim bible College.

8---BE IT RESOLVED; The District Council arrange for our next Dist Assembly to be held in connection with An Annual Camp meeting

9--- WHEREAS, In the good providence of God we are favered with the presence of our General Superintendent Surbrook whose untiring, and intellegent administration during the business sessions, and whose Spirit filled messages during the Evangelistic services have been an inspiration to all

REPORT OF HOME AND FOREIGN MISSIONARY COMMITTEE

The Royal marching orders of The Church are these-"Go ye therefore and teach all nations, and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem and in all Judea and unto Samaria and unto the uttermost parts of the Earth.

Christs method for carrying out His Commission was to constantly press on with His Disciples to the next town or village

to preach the Gospel.

We the Committee believe that this is still the most efficient and Scriptural mathod that can be employed to Evangelize THEREFORE. WHEREAS, The California District has in time past had some difficulty in enlarging its borders, we recommend that each Pastor and Church wherever possible, cooperate with the Dist Supt in opening up new works by branching out into other towns, cities or a . villages near their Church, said work to be financed when necessary from the District Ludget.

We further recommend that four months be given by Superintendent to pioneer work, on the District, approximately four months to the Churches and four months to Evangelistic work wherever

he may choose.

WHEREAS; A district Home Missionary board and a Foreign Missionary board are similar, we recommend that their duties be delegated to the District Supt and District Council. We also recommend that all Churches of the District shall yearly welcome a Foreign Missionary representative from the General Headquarters, at which time offerings shall be taken for these interests.

And be IT FURTHER RESOLVED. that all our Churches and Pastorsbe urged to recognize the Missionary program of the General Church by supporting its Missionaries and interests through the General Board.

MEMOTR OF GENERAL SUPERINTENDENT, REV SETH C. REES

It becomes our sorrowful duty to record the passing from our midst of our beloved General superintendent Rev Seth C.Rees. who spipped away into the unseen Holies, round three oclock Monday morning, May 22nd 1933.

He came home in September of last year, after an arduous tour among the Islands and South America visiting our Missions. but

failing heal th compelled him to return home.

Word came to us after he landed at Headquarters in Indianapolis that he was a sick man, after a brief visit he came on home, at first he was able to preform a little work, speak in the interest of our bible School and supplying the pulpit at the Tabernacle.

Those who heard him will not forget his last effort in preaching, attempting to stand erect in speaking he would have to turn to the pulpit to cling for support. his last attempt was a brief address on the financial conditions of the School.

It was evident to close observers that his usual strength and forcefulness was gene, to those of us who had heard him in the days of his great pulpit power, when people trembled like aspen leaves under his mighty preaching, there came over us a deep feeling of sorrow and commisseration.

Bro Rees was highly favored, having been raised by a Godly family, who were members of the Frends Church, their home was in Indiana where he was born and raised to young manhood, converted at the age of nine teen years, he immediately began preaching the Gospel, his ministry spread out over the State of Indiana and Ohio, where he preached in School houses and Churches and wherever opportunities afforded.

After ten years of faithful ministry he received the baptism with the Holy Ghost, which came in consuming fire, burning out all carnality and anointing him with unctious power. his ministry from this on whrough his eventful career was attended with unusual results, in Camp meetings and Revivals from one State to another in fact all over the Country, from East to West and North to South hundreds of people were converted and Sanctified.

I presume we are safe in saying that no Minister of this generation has reached more people than he has.

bro Rees was twice married, in each instance blessed with Godla women who themselves were able and efficient ministers of the Word, each being great helpers to him in his work, two sons were born to him in the first marriage, both having passed away several years ago, in the second marriage there were four children born. Paul.s, Russel, Evangeline and Seth Jr. the latter having been called to his heavenly home about seven years ago, in addition to be his extraordinary labors he was the author of several books on Gospel themes the last of which was an account of their journey around the World, he also founded rescue homes for the unforturate in different parts of the Country, all of which have become havens for the weary and destitute, many of whom have yielded their lives to One who heals the broken hearted. but we have not space to mention all the benevolent works of his willing hands and warm heart.

In the year nineteen hundred and eight he removed to Southern California, locating in Pasadena, he eventually united with the Church of The Nazarine in Los Angeles, he was finally called to the Pastorate of University Church where his preaching attracted unusual attention.

resulting in the attendance of large congregations, under his ministry a great revival broke out among the students and the Church and swept on for meny days, a large number were saved and many Sanctified.

By a peculiarly strange providence bro Rees and congregation were deprived membership where they had worshiped, following this he was led to organize an independent Church taking the name of Pentecost Pilgrim Church, the word Pentecost was subsequently dropped, by invitation we became united with the International Holiness Church, adapting the name of Pilgrim Holiness Church, after five years of faithful service he resigned the Fastorate in favor of Rev G. Arnold Hodgin, in order to improve a long cherished desire to take a trip around the World.

We are all familiar with his long accomplished desire and how God so wonderfully preserved he and his family and blessed his π ministry returning them safely home.

In 1926 he was elected General Superinterdent of the Hilgrim Holiness Church a position involving increasing and heavy responsibilities, all of which he bore with remarkable strength and versatility, as a General officer of the Church he continued in unabated activities, presiding at the Assemblies, visiting among the Churches until called to the General Assembly in Heaven.
