## CALIFORNIA ANNUAL DISTRICT CONFERENCE

## In Memoriam

### L. O. STANTON

Rev. L. O. Stanton passed on to his reward on March 24, 1960. He had a wonderful missionary field through the medium of used stamp correspondence. Many folks in different countries, especially Malaya and Indonesia, have accepted Jesus as their Savior. To these he sent tracts and helpful literature.

He died at 82 years of age and left a widow, eight sons and five daughters. Two, Mrs. Eva Twyman and Mrs. Olive R. Nowland, are missionaries in the Highlands of Papua.

### CHARLES CONNELLEY

Rev. Charles Connelley was born on March 15, 1885. He was converted in his early twenties and attended Bible School to prepare for the Lord's work. He went to India as a missionary and while there met another missionary who later became his wife. They came to the states on furlough with the intention of returning to the mission field, but unrest in that country and his wife's health would not permit it. They remained in the states and pastored several churches in Illinois and Missouri. They came to California in 1927, and he worked with several missions in the area. During this time, he was an ordained minister of the California District and was a member of the East Los Angeles Pilgrim Holiness Church. His health was poor during the last few years of his life and he passed away on July 5, 1959. May God bless his memory.

### JAMES LEASURE

Rev. James F. Leasure was born March 31, 1882, in the state of Ohio. He was married in September, 1907. During the years he spent in Colorado, he was active in Christian work by helping in the missions. The Leasures moved to California in 1929. They became members of the Rees Memorial Pilgrim Church.

In 1941 they took a pastorate in Kennewick, Wash. It was a small church but a great challenge. In 1945, the people felt the need of a new church, and together, with the help of Rev. Leasure, they began construction. The church was completed enough for services on Easter Sunday in 1947. Mrs. Leasure had been very ill and was bed-ridden from December, 1946, until April 10, 1947, when she passed away. Rev. Leasure continued on at the church for a few more months, and then he returned to California to live.

In 1949, he was united in marriage to Mrs. Ella Koelle who has also been a member of the Rees Memorial Pilgrim Church for many years. In 1952, they moved to Temecula, California, where they helped in the Sunday School. Several years later they moved back to Pasadena, where they lived until his passing on August 24, 1959.

He was a man that lived by his motto: God first, family second, material things third.

### MYRTLE HAINES

Myrtle J. Haines was born June 30, 1891, at West Newton, Pa., and departed this life March 10, 1960, at Los Angeles, Calif.

Mrs. Haines was converted at an early age and joined the United Brethren Church. Later, she united with the Pilgrim Holiness Church and became an ordained Deaconess. She was a member of the Rees Memorial Church in Pasadena at the time of her death.

In 1916 she had entered God's Bible School. There she met Rev. Paul Haines who was to become her husband. They were married on June 25, 1918.

Shortly after their marriage, they left for their first term of Missionary service in Korea. They spent their third term in Korea just prior to World War II. Following the war they spent some time in Canton, China. For the last ten years of her life, the deceased worked in the home office of the Oriental Missionary Society, alongside her husband, who is treasurer of the Society.

Mrs. Haines is survived by her husband, a son, Paul W., and four grandchildren of Seoul, Korea. Also a son, Meredith C., professor at Taylor University, and the following brothers and sisters: Charles J. Neff, Mattie E. Curry, Rev. Lawrence R. Neff, and Dr. William H. Neff, a General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

## DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To our General Superintendent and to the thirty-eighth annual conference of the California District of the Pilgrim Pilgrim Holiness Church, greetings.

It is no small thing for the Christian to be able to feel the warm glow of the Holy Spirit in this day of lukewarmness, to sense the abiding hope that anchors the soul to things eternal in an ever-changing world, to build holy character firmly on the Rock of Ages, while others around are sinking beneath the waves of worldly pleasures and moral decay. It is a great joy to abide in the center of God's will, rest in the assurance that we are not our own but His, and that He shall order the steps of His dear children. It is with a deep sense of gratitude for God's grace and help that I give this report.

### I. District Activities:

A. Western Pilgrim College has merged with Central Pilgrim College. The closing year at Western Pilgrim College was a good year in many respects. Credit should be given to the president and his co-workers for this good year. I trust that each of us will fall in line with this merger and give our cooperation and support to Central Pilgrim until there is a school opened again on the West Coast.

B. General Superintendents' Visits. During this past conference year we were privileged to have our three general superintendents in a series of meetings which included our annual ministerial meeting. The program of personal evangelism was presented by our leaders in these great spiritual rallies. Most of our pastors feel that this is a timely program. In the churches where this program is being practiced, definite results are being realized. The district has recently had the privilege of having our presiding general with us for three zone rallies which proved to be times of real blessing. The impact of the stirring messages given at these rallies indeed encouraged all of our church to participate in the program of personal evangelism.

C. Sunday Schools. In the **Pilgrim News** you have seen the monthly reports from our churches. Some Sunday Schools have shown steady gains, others have lost. The percentage gain is perhaps not so great as it might have been. District-wise the record shows a 5% increase.

D. Youth. The youth department was again successful in promoting camps for all ages. These camps were indeed helpful, wholesome and spiritual. At this time our own camp is closed. To be able to open, several thousand dollars is needed to meet the ever-increasing demands of the State Health Department, Welfare Department, Building Department and the government rangers. A committee is working hard to arrange for camps this summer. The youth department in cooperation with the district council is doing its utmost to continue our camp program without too many changes. We must continue to strengthen our program to reach the youth of our day.

E. Missionary Department. This is the youngest department of the district; however, a very aggressive program has been set up to unite our various missionary societies in promoting missions at home and on foreign soil.

F. District Home Missions. The Glendora Church has been completed. Services have been held since January 10. This church will be organized and dedi-

cated in the near future. The Glendora Church is a valuable addition to our district. It is already self supporting and meeting the monthly payments on the parsonage. The pastor and people are working hard to beautify the grounds. The plant has room for nine Sunday School classes, a chapel that will seat nearly 200, a pastor's study, three bedroom parsonage, off-street parking, and sufficient area to build a larger auditorium that will seat nearly four hundred when needed. Many of our pastors worked several weeks on this project, for which we are sincerely grateful. David and Elaine Eaton are pastoring the Glendora work.

Our newest work on the district is Sacramento. Some progress has been made here. A Sunday School bus was purchased by the local group. The district has purchased enough lumber to build a chapel with Sunday School rooms, but a definite site has not as yet been located. The group is still worshipping in the Shady Nook Camp tabernacle. Clayton Schletewitz and wife are pastoring this work. I trust that we can secure the money to purchase property in Sacramento soon.

The Yucaipa work has been closed this year. This work has required district support from the beginning. A loan was placed on the property by the district prior to the closing and the money was used to aid in purchasing the Solana Beach property.

The work at Solana Beach is self-supporting. The Johnsons have worked hard to make this possible.

#### G. Church improvements.

1. The Ojai Pilgrims are now using their beautiful new fellowship and youth building. This much needed and appreciated unit will be dedicated in the near future.

2. The Oak View Pilgrims have been building a very lovely fellowship and youth hall. Much of the material has been donated and the men of the Sunday School and church are doing the work.

3. After several years of talk and meeting together, the East Los Angeles and Adams Memorial churches voted to merge. The East Los Angeles Church was sold and additional property has been purchased adjacent to Adams Memorial. The merged church will be known as Adams Memorial. Plans have been drawn for a new compact church to be erected in the future.

4. Pomona has finished a new Sunday School wing and made other major improvements.

5. Rees Memorial has made major changes in the church sanctuary and redecored the entire plant.

6. Riverside has added a nursery to their church auditorium.

7. San Dimas has plans for a complete new church and Sunday School rooms in a new part of the city. This has been a large undertaking, but the folk feel confident that God will see them through.

8. Other churches have been faithfully keeping at the job of improving their properties.

9. I am sure that we all do appreciate the hard work the pastors and friends have done on the camp ground to get things ready for this conference and camp. There is much more that we plan to do that must be done before the rainy season comes.

**II. Personal Report.** Sermons preached, 88; church board meetings, 35; annual meetings, 27; district council meetings, 12; college board meetings, 4; district youth and other committee meetings, 23; General Board meetings, 2; one weekend meeting held in another district; zone meetings with the General Superintendents, 8; youth conference, camp and rallies, 4; dedication of church and parsonage, 1; funerals, 2; miles traveled in district work, 24,374, and for general church work, 17,600 miles. In addition, I have worked 81 days on the Glendora project, several days on the district grounds, and have kept up with the district correspondence.

**III. Concluding word.** To the district council I extend my gratitude for their considerate and understanding attitude, as well as to all our faithful pastors and laity. The assistant superintendent, Rev. Thomas Lee, has been cooperative and helpful. May the great grace of God be upon all is my prayer.

On the positive side of the ledger my predecessor and I have visited 27 youth societies; I have assisted in organizing two youth societies; had one district rally; served as secretary of the Mile High Pines Board; attended many Youth Committee meetings and Board Meetings.

Though it is to be regretted that more progress was not made this year, there is a spirit of optimism among many of our youth leaders that indicates next year will mark an important milestone in spiritual accomplishment for California Pilgrim Youth.

## REPORT OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF MILE HIGH PINES CAMP

Since being elected Chairman of the Board of Directors of Mile High Pines Camp we have visited 19 churches, some of them twice in the interest of the camp. I have attended 5 board meetings, 9 committee meetings, met the government ranger twice, worked with a number of individuals, and driven over 5,000 miles trying to promote the program of Mile High Pines Camp. With all this motion we have come to this Conference farther behind than when we started.

In our summer camps last year we had 461 Pilgrim Campers with 150 seekers at the altar. Many of the workers felt it was the best camp season we had had to date.

Due to lack of finances to do the work that needed to be done the Health Department and Forest Ranger have closed Mile High Pines. We must have about \$5,000 to do the repair that has to be done before we open again plus another \$5,000 within 2 or 3 years to bring the camp up to requirements. To try to meet this need we have sent out 500 letters on two different occasions. This has not accomplished the job. The last 500 letters sent out didn't bring in enough returns to pay the postage.

We are planning on having our summer camps this year by renting from other groups. The rental program is much less work but will cost about double what we have charged our own campers in the past. We urge you to pray much about this program.

To the 38th annual conference of the California District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at El Monte, June 30, 1960 — Greetings!

We wish to express our appreciation to God for His Divine help and guidance this past year, to the Sunday School Committee for their splendid cooperation in every way, and to each pastor or Sunday School Superintendent who faithfully mailed in his report each month.

One year ago, we were embarrassed to report a district numerical loss of 40. At that time, we reported concerning the leakage from the District Sunday

Schools as follows — "The committee has attacked this problem at its very roots—in giving the District more qualified teachers . . ." A Teachers' Training Course was launched last year with Professor Paul D. Beck instructing. Many of our Sunday Schools were greatly benefited according to District Pastors and Sunday School Superintendents as well. The statistical report will perhaps convey a small degree of its value. Professor Beck instructed an advanced course this year, with a total enrollment of Forty-one. Sixteen successfully completed the course.

The Sunday School Committee sponsored a cost-free Sunday School Superintendents' Banquet this past year, with 50% of our Superintendents in attendance. Dr. Cornelius Haggard, President of Azusa College, challenged our hearts as to the importance of the Sunday School, and then gave us materials and strategic information with which to do the job.

## WESTERN PILGRIM COLLEGE PRESIDENT'S REPORT TO CONFERENCE

To the Annual Conference.

It is with pleasure that I report to you at this conference something of what the Lord has helped us to do spiritually and financially this year. We are grateful for a wonderful year in every way.

### Progress of the Work in General

This has been a wonderful year spiritually. We have had many times of gracious refreshings from the presence of the Lord. Our Spiritual Emphasis Week, fall revival, and Holiness Emphasis Week, were spiritual highlights long to be remembered. Prayer meetings in the early mornings, at noonday, in the classes, and in the evenings, have been great assets to keeping up the spiritual tide. Most of our students in the upper division of high school and in the college seem to have had definite victory, and most of them plan to give their lives to some form of full-time Christian service.

Our Gospel team workers in the churches, missions, and elsewhere have been blessed of the Lord. Various types of services have been rendered by a number of our students in several of the nearby churches.

### Statistical Report

We enrolled for the entire year 46 in college, 50 in high school, and 25 in the seventh and eighth grades. We made about 21 per cent gain in college enrollment this year over last, but we lost some in the high school, due to late re-opening.

We graduated 21 young people from high school and college this spring and 13 from junior high school, making a total of 34 graduates from all departments. Several of the college and high school young people are definitely going into full time Christian service.

The following persons have served very capably in their respective offices and positions this year: Mr. Tullis as Dean of the College, Mr. Rogers as Registrar, Mrs. June Hill as High School Principal, and Mr. Elkinton and Miss Coy as Social Deans. Mr. Henschen has done fine with the Music Department.

### Financial Report

The financial picture has also been most encouraging this year. Miss Coy has proved to be an excellent Business Office Manager and has very capably filled the place which Mrs. Pitzer served so long and faithfully.

We have been able to pay teachers' salaries in full as well as all of our current bills. Besides, we have reduced teachers' back salaries from \$8,700 last year at this time to just over \$1,500. We have also paid over \$3,000 on other bills. For example, we have paid back taxes, reduced the Warner Press bill to \$300, reduced the Pilgrim Publishing House bill by about \$200, \$200 has been paid on the sewer bill, the fire alarm system has been installed and paid for, costing about \$1,300, and \$1,300 was paid on the local church debt of \$5,000.

We have met our obligations consistently, and have finished the year in the black. As of June 15, current bills were paid and there was a balance of about \$2,700 in the bank. This is the first year I can recall of late when we have been so prosperous.

This condition is attributable to the fact that we cut out extra discounts and scholarships, raised tuition in junior high, high school and college, and that we operated a more successful collection program for student funds. The Zone giving was actually below last year's income. A few items of saving also may be noted, such as Miss Coy's new dish-washing method whereby students did their own dishes to the saving of about \$1,000 during the year. Mr. Tullis took over management of the grounds with student aid, saving a considerable amount of money also. Careful management by others also was helpful. It has been done largely by the blessing of God and the assistance of a fine Staff and Faculty who aided the President whole-heartedly.

### My Personal Report

During the year I have attended to all duties incident to the office of President and have also held a number of revival meetings. Offerings from three of these have been turned back to the school, amounting to over \$300.

We have covered most of the churches in the California District twice in deputational work. The response has been most gracious. Last summer we covered the Northwestern districts with good results. A good number of fine students came to W.P.C. from this area.

I have preached 109 times, prayed with 88 seekers. Have conducted during the year 55 school services and have traveled for the school 11,350 miles. I have attended two General Board meetings.

The school group has always been graciously received everywhere we have gone. May I thank each pastor and layman for every kindness shown us in this work. We sincerely appreciate all you have done and will yet do for W.P.C. Our last year here on this campus has been a most fruitful and happy one in the Lord.

Permit me to say in closing that the College Board of Directors has certainly stood by the Administration and Faculty of the school in every way during the years we have served here. It has been a pleasure to work with them in carrying out the policies adopted and endeavoring to do an effective work in training Christian youth.

In closing, I would like to call attention to our missionary booth, and the display of some of the work done by the various societies. These are but samples of some of the materials sent to the various fields throughout the year, and of which we have no accurate record.

We trust you will take time to visit the booth and see for yourself the type of work that is being done for our missionaries.

## RESOLUTIONS OF THE 1960 CONFERENCE

### Ways and Means Committee

**No. 1**—We recommend that the following system of finance, which shall cover the total district and general budget obligations of the local church, be adopted:

Each and every local church in the district shall send to the district treasurer at least once each month a budget assessment in the amount of ten per cent (10%) of all offerings received by the church, Sunday School, Youth Society and Missionary Society; **except** all funds received for General Church interests and sent through the district treasurer to the General Church treasurer, and **except** funds received for the support of evangelists or special speakers conducting services in the local church, and **except** funds received for the zone college, and **except** all specified funds raised for the construction or acquisition of church buildings or property, Sunday school units, and parsonages, and **except** specified funds raised for the retirement of indebtedness on same.

This system of finance shall be designated as the District Unified Stewardship Fund and each and every church in the district shall remit each month a tithe of its income to the district treasurer for the account of said Unified Stewardship Fund.

The district treasurer shall distribute within thirty days after receipt the funds received in the Unified Stewardship Fund as follows:

(1) 62% to District Budget, said 62% to be distributed as follows:

Superintendent's Account .....	51%
Operational Expense .....	20%
Home Missions .....	15%
General Conference Reserve .....	4%
Sunday School Promotional Committee .....	4%
Young People's Executive Committee .....	4%
Missionary Society Committee .....	2%

(2) 38% to General Budget; and if the said 38% shall exceed the annual general budget responsibility of this district, then the amount received over and above our annual General Budget responsibility shall be used for District Home Missionary work.

**No. 2**—Whereas Western Pilgrim College has now been officially merged with Central Pilgrim College, and whereas the complete boards of directors of both institutions are working as one board to administer the affairs of Central Pilgrim College until February, 1961, and whereas the combined board has requested that each conference in the combined zone shall accept and adopt a goal of five dollars (\$5.00) per member per year in support of Central Pilgrim College,

Therefore, be it resolved that this conference accept and adopt said goal. The basis for determining membership responsibility for the above-mentioned goal is to deduct ten per cent (10%) from the total voting membership of the church."

**No. 3**—Whereas there is a substantial Western Pilgrim College operational indebtedness which must be liquidated, and whereas this operational indebtedness is the responsibility of the entire Western Zone, and whereas the combined board of directors of Central Pilgrim College has recommended that two-thirds (2/3) of all funds raised in regular college offerings in the Western Zone be applied on the operational indebtedness of Western Pilgrim College until its liquidation,

Therefore, be it resolved that this conference approve this plan of Western Pilgrim College operational debt retirement, and each and every church in the conference give whole-hearted support by taking an offering once each month in a major Sunday service for the Zone College.

**No. 4**—Be it resolved that the following sums be allowed to the District Secretary and the District Treasurer for their services.

District Secretary—\$25.00 per quarter.  
District Treasurer—\$100.00 per quarter.

**No. 5**—Whereas many of our ministers and their wives who are eligible for membership in the Ministerial Benefit Association are not members, and whereas the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has made the following recommendation relative to this matter, therefore:

Be it resolved that each church pay the assessment fees of the pastor and wife if they are members of the Association, it being fully understood that this will apply only to those pastors and their wives who are eligible for membership in the Association.

**No. 6**—Be it resolved that the District Superintendent's salary be \$4,500.00 per year in addition to his residence, utilities, traveling expenses, and automobile mileage at seven (7) cents per mile.

### **Resolutions Committee**

**No. 1**—Be it resolved that resolution No. 2, page 32 of the 1959 Minutes be deleted.

**No. 2**—Be it resolved that the words **Western Pilgrim College Stewardship responsibility** be deleted from resolution No. 5, page 32.

**No. 3**—Be it resolved that resolution No. 18, page 33 be deleted.

**No. 4**—Be it resolved that resolution No. 21, page 34 be deleted.

**No. 5**—Be it resolved that resolution No. 33, page 35 be deleted.

**No. 6**—Be it resolved that resolution No. 51, page 38 be deleted.

**No. 7**—Inasmuch as our school seems to have successfully operated in the black this year, and since it now seems to many people to have been unwise to vote to merge this school with Central Pilgrim College,

Therefore, be it resolved that this conference petition the executive committee of the Board of Directors to meet again and reconsider this whole matter, and to take whatever steps they can which are necessary to bring about the reopening of Western Pilgrim College this fall.

**No. 8**—Be it resolved, that we change resolution 36, page 35—that we change the wording of minister or minister's wife to pastor or pastor's wife.

**No. 9**—Be it resolved, that resolution 47, page 37 be changed to read as follows: Be it resolved, that licensed ministers and deaconesses be notified in advance of conference to meet with the Educational and Examining Boards on the Saturday previous to Conference and in event it is impossible to do so, they shall notify these boards in writing. If there is no response it will indicate to the Educational and Examining Boards that the licentiate is not interested in his, or her, credentials.

**No. 10**—Lost.

**No. 11**—Whereas our District Superintendent has untiringly given himself to the work of building the District, therefore be it resolved that we give Rev. Lundy Hill a rising vote of appreciation for his labors of love during the past eight years.

**No. 12**—Be it resolved, that we pledge to our newly elected District Superintendent, Rev. Thomas C. Hamon, our cooperation and prayerful support.

**No. 13**—Be it resolved that the Conference give its presiding officer, Dr. R. G. Flexon, a rising vote of thanks for his labor of love among us.

**No. 14**—Be it resolved that this conference give a rising vote of thanks to Rev. Wells, Rev. Park and to the kitchen and dining-room crews for the magnificent manner in which they have entertained this conference.

**No. 15**—Be it resolved that greetings be sent to all the Missionaries now serving under appointment abroad, who hold membership in this District.

### **STANDING RESOLUTIONS FROM PREVIOUS CONFERENCES**

(1)

Be it resolved that the District Council shall be informed of all **matters of major legislative change** prior to presentation to the conference.

(2)

We recommend that Section 92, paragraph 4, and Section 149, paragraph 8, of the 1958 Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, which reads as follows, be enforced:

"Any church or pastor failing to raise the United Stewardship Fund without good reason shall be **denied a voice** in the annual conference."

(3)

Be it resolved that the local churches pay the **traveling expenses and entertainment** of their **delegates** for the Conference business sessions. This does not include camp meeting.

(4)

Whereas, the General Conference has made provision that newly organized churches in districts assume one-fourth of their United Stewardship Fund the first year after being organized; one-half of their budget the second year; three-fourths the third year, and beginning with fourth year pay in full:

Therefore, be it resolved that on this district we apply the same percentages in regard to our **district budget**.

(5)

Be it resolved that the following items be paid out of the **District Expense Fund**:

1. Utilities for the home of the District Superintendent.
2. Publication of the Pilgrim News.
3. District office expense.

(6)

Be it resolved that the **cafeteria and lunch stand** be considered part of the camp meeting operations and all monies pertaining thereto be held in the Camp Meeting Fund.

(7)

Be it resolved that **ministers** coming to this district from other **denominations** be interviewed by the District Council before their **credentials** are presented to the Conference.

(8)

Whereas in the past important papers have been lost and a considerable loss of time and finance was necessary to secure new papers, therefore be it resolved that all local churches of the district forward to the District Council for filing, all **legal papers** pertaining to the ownership of the local church property.

(9)

Whereas, the District owns shares in the **Lexington Blvd. Mutual Water Co.**, therefore be it resolved that the following five district **officers**, by virtue of their office, be appointed to represent our shares in the Water Co.: The District Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Treasurer and Secretary and the President of the Board of Trustees. And be it further resolved that the representatives vote the shares as a block as instructed by the District Council on matters of policy.

(10)

Be it resolved that the **District Council** and following **committees** and boards, meet one day prior to the annual Conference to take care of such work as they have on hand. The Resolutions and Ways and Means Committees, and the Educational and Examining Boards.

(11)

Be it resolved that all plans for the **construction or remodeling of church buildings** be presented to a District Building Committee on which there shall be an architect, a builder, and a financier for their suggestions.

(12)

Resolved that before licensed or ordained **ministers** coming from other **churches** shall be received into the local churches, the pastor shall consult with

the District Superintendent and Council regarding said minister.

(13)

Be it resolved that our district **Educational and Examining Boards** be instructed to secure a set of questions covering the course of study prescribed by the manual and make the same available to those desiring to take the Study Course.

(14)

Be it resolved, that each **pastor** be granted the privilege of holding at least one **revival** each conference year.

(15)

We recommend that, whereas we now have a standing Statistical Committee to function during the conference year, be it resolved that all **reports** be made in full and sent to the **Statistical Committee** not later than one week before the conference date.

(16)

Resolved that when recommendation for **credentials** is presented to the Conference the candidate be present, or send a written testimony to accompany the recommendation.

(17)

Be it resolved that the part of the **District Superintendent's** and other district officers' **expense**, relating to the propagation of district home missions, be so designated and paid for out of district home mission funds.

(18)

Be it resolved that the Conference form a **committee** of four which shall have charge of the Old Folks' Home buildings and **grounds**, said committee to be comprised of the District Superintendent, the pastor of the El Monte Pilgrim Holiness Church, the President of the Board of Trustees, and one member to be appointed by the District Council.

(19)

Be it resolved that the **District Superintendent** be given an annual **vacation** with pay, not to exceed two weeks.

(20)

Be it resolved that each local church be urged to raise a **subscription** list to the **Pilgrim Holiness Advocate** equal to its total membership.

(21)

Be it resolved, that the **Conference Minutes** be sold at 75¢ per copy. Be it further resolved, that each church remit from local funds for the minutes ordered, and then sell them to the members for the stipulated price.

(22)

Be it resolved, that there be a **Camp Meeting Grounds Committee** appointed by the Council to improve and prepare the Camp Ground for Camp services.

(23)

Be it resolved, that in lieu of the Annual District Home Missions offering received the last Sunday of Camp, we adopt a system known as the **District Home Missions Reserve Call System** to operate as follows. The District Superintendent be privileged to ask for a special offering toward the needs of any mission project, not to exceed the equivalent of three \$5.00 calls to each voluntary member per year.

(24)

Be it resolved that our pastors be urged to secure Pilgrim Holiness **Evangelists** as much as possible. And be it further resolved that evangelists from other denominations be secured under the District Superintendent's approval.

(25)

Be it resolved that the **financial records of all departments** of the District be submitted to the District Auditing Committee at least **THREE** days prior

to the District Conference. This includes District Treasurer, District Youth, Sunday School Committee.

(26)

Whereas in order that the pastor may be at his best and the church may be served better by the **pastor** receiving an **annual vacation**, therefore, be it resolved that each church of the District give its pastor a two weeks' vacation with pay.

(27)

Be it resolved that the **time of sittings of future Conferences** be set as follows: 9:00 a.m.-12:00 noon; 2:00 p.m.-4:30 p.m.; and 7:00 p.m.-10:00 p.m., respectively.

(28)

Be it resolved that the first order of business of the afternoon sitting of the second day of District Conference be that of ordination service.

(29)

Be it resolved that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary, or his representative, shall have the privilege of holding two **services** annually in each of the churches of the District **in the interests of** the work of the **District Sunday School Committee** and that an offering shall be taken in said service and forwarded immediately to the District Treasurer being specified as an offering for the District Sunday School Committee.

(30)

Whereas, the **funds** received by the District from pledges for construction of a **camp dormitory** are not sufficient to cover the costs of construction, and whereas, these funds could be of a great help in developing churches in our district, now therefore be it resolved that the District Council shall continue to promote the raising of funds for a campgrounds dormitory, and be it further resolved that until such time as sufficient funds are received to cover the costs of construction of a campgrounds dormitory that the District Council be authorized and is hereby authorized to use said funds for short term loans on properties for the development of our district.

(31)

Be it resolved that the District Secretary be informed immediately upon the **death of a pastor or pastor's wife** of the District, and that he notify by telephone all pastors in the District and that proper notification be given to the editor of the District publication.

(32)

Be it resolved that the Conference adopt the following **method of pastoral recall**:

- 1—That each church shall vote during the last full week of March on the recall of its pastor.
- 2—That each local church secretary shall forward to the District Superintendent the results of such vote within five days following the time of voting.
- 3—That each pastor shall forward to the District Superintendent his reply relative to his recall, within 15 days of the time of voting. (See 1958 Manual, Section 53, Paragraph 3).
- 4—That each pastor who does not plan to be a candidate for recall shall notify the District Superintendent on or before the 15th day of March.

(33)

Be it resolved that the District Conference follow the method prescribed in the Manual, Section 45, which reads as follows: "Each **delegate** shall be provided with a **certificate of his appointment**, signed by the pastor and secretary."

Be it further resolved that a **Conference registrar** be appointed by the District Council, the registrar to assume his duties at the entrance to the district tabernacle one hour prior to the opening of each session of the Conference, and further that the duties of the registrar shall be to register all members of the conference and all duly certified lay delegates, presenting each member or delegate with a badge admitting him within the Conference Bar.

That the Conference registrar shall receive and record the certificates from the lay delegates, and shall present the list of registered delegates to the conference secretary prior to the opening of each session of the conference.

(34)

Whereas there seems to be considerable misunderstanding relative to the **listing of inactive ministers,**

Therefore, be it resolved that the Conference adopt the interpretation of the General Board with reference to Section 178 of the Manual.

"We understand by the term 'active and regularly engaged in the work of the ministry,' to mean pastors with a regular appointment and full time evangelists and to ministers who are under special appointment. With reference to the aged ministers we suggest that only those above 65 years may be so classified."

(35)

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent call a **meeting of all District leaders and pastors** for the purpose of introducing the programs of the various departments for the coming year, this meeting to be held during the month of October.

(36)

Whereas it seems necessary to have a uniform method of **computing Sunday School attendance** in the District so as to make the comparison of statistics on an equal basis between each and every Sunday School, thus permitting the enjoyment of equal opportunity in said comparisons,

Therefore, be it resolved that only those attending Sunday School who arrive for at least 15 minutes of class participation be counted in reports to the District Conference or to any of its committees or officials.

(39)

Whereas the projects and information in regard to the Foreign Missionary Department could be better co-ordinated and better results could be achieved within our individual churches and within our District as a whole through the help of a **District Missionary Society Committee,**

Therefore be it resolved that the District Council shall nominate and the District Conference shall elect from the nominations of the District Council a Missionary Society Committee of not less than three members whose number and terms shall be for such periods as the District Council shall provide.

Be it further resolved that from among those elected the District Council shall appoint one to serve as District Missionary Society President. It is intended that this Missionary Society Committee shall operate under the same rules and organization as the District Sunday School Committee.

(38)

Be it resolved that 1. the responsibility for the **preparation of the district camp grounds** for annual conference and camp meeting be delegated to the district Camp Meeting Board; 2. the secretary of the Camp Meeting Board shall be responsible for notifying all pastors and all other ministers of the District as to the dates for any work days set for the preparation of the grounds; 3. the camp meeting board be empowered to hire such help as is necessary to have the delegates' accommodations properly arranged and cleaned.

(39)

Be it resolved that each church be responsible to furnish two man days labor or \$25.00 for **preparation of the Camp Meeting buildings and grounds** at least three days prior to Camp Meeting upon the call of the District Superintendent.

Any church that fails to provide the labor or funds set forth above, the active ministers of that church shall be denied their usual camp discount privileges.

Each individual who at the call of the District Superintendent works three man-days or more preparing the grounds and buildings for Camp Meeting shall be entitled to free board during Camp Meeting.

(40)

Be it resolved that **members of all standing committees** shall be members of the annual district conference with voice and vote.

(41)

Be it resolved, that **licensed ministers and deaconesses be notified in advance of conference** to meet with the Educational and Examining Boards on the Saturday previous to Conference and in event it is impossible to do so, they shall notify these boards in writing. If there is no response it will indicate to the Educational and Examining Boards that the licentiate is not interested in his, or her, credentials.

(42)

Be it resolved that an **honor system** for recognition of churches who pay **their budget** be established and that a chart shall be compiled by the District Treasurer and displayed at the District Camp and Conference.

(43)

Be it resolved that an annual Pastors' Retreat be established and that the District Superintendent arrange for such meetings.

(44)

Whereas some resolutions have far reaching ramifications and thus demand the careful attention of the delegates, therefore

Be it resolved that the **Ways and Means and Resolutions Committee** meet 30 days prior to Conference, and

Be it further resolved that **mimeographed copies listing all resolutions** with committee recommendations be placed in the hands of all delegates no later than 10 days prior to said District Conference.

And be it further resolved that **each local church** be limited to **two resolutions** each to be sent to the chairmen of the respective committees no later than the 15th of May.

(45)

Whereas the manual states—"any church or pastor failing to raise the budget without good reason shall be denied a voice in annual conference," and whereas a number of our churches have failed to raise their budgets for the past year, now therefore be it resolved that this Conference authorize the District Council to appoint a **committee** from its membership to visit these churches early in the fiscal year for the **purpose of counseling and assisting** them in working out their **budget problems**.

(46)

Be it resolved that **local and district youth finances** or monies given for youth activities be listed separately in district and local reports.

(47)

Be it resolved that the **District Young People's Executive Secretary**, or his representative, shall have the privilege of holding **two services annually** in each of the **churches** of the district in the interest of the work of the District Young People's Committee and that an offering shall be taken in said service and forwarded immediately to the District Treasurer, being specified as an offering for the District Young People's Committee.

(48)

Whereas there is an urgent need for further education on the subject of **tithing** and whereas many of our people are contributing all or part of their tithe to other areas of Gospel work, within and without the church, and whereas Section 69 of the Manual specifically stipulates that the tithe should be paid into the treasury of the local church, therefore be it resolved that the District Superintendent, the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary, the District Young People's Executive Secretary, and the President of the District Missionary Society be appointed, by virtue of their office, a **permanent committee** to investigate and provide material for the education of our people in this area of tithing and that they make a report of their activities to the Annual Conference.

(49)

Be it resolved that the District Secretary give written notification to all appointees to standing District Committees within thirty days after District Conference.

Be it further resolved that the chairman of each standing committee be notified by the district secretary sixty days prior to District Conference to activate his committee.

(50)

Whereas the report of the Statistical Committee consumes much time, and gives more detail than can be readily understood or appreciated, therefore be it resolved that the chairman of the Statistical Committee present orally only the following highlights from the report: total number of seekers; membership; Sunday School attendance; and the financial summary of totals by departments.

Be it further resolved that the entire report be posted before the fourth sitting of the conference.

(51)

Be it resolved that the names and addresses of the following officers of each local church be submitted to the Editor of California **Pilgrim News** for publication with or in the August issue of each year: Sunday School superintendent; Youth Society president; Missionary Society president.

(52)

Whereas we have an obligation as Christian citizens and members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church to oppose legislation detrimental to evangelical Christianity and whereas lobbying is a most effective method of influencing legislation, be it therefore resolved that the governmental committee of the Sacramento Holiness Association be authorized to speak for the California District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church on all legislative matters that are of vital interest to Christian citizens.
