# PREFACE

# MINUTES

# ADJOURNED SESSION

# of the

# **1960 DISTRICT CONFERENCE**

The adjourned session of the 1960 District Conference convened at El Monte, California, at 1:40 P.M., March 10, 1961.

Lyle Tullis led in prayer.

Congregational singing was conducted by L. B. Smalley, after which Max Greene led in prayer.

A special number in song was brought by David and Elaine Eaton.

Dr. R. G. Flexon, General Superintendent, brought a short devotional from Luke 9.

Rev. A. G. Parmenter, minister transferring from the Nazarene Church, was presented, and accepted by the Conference.

Presiding officer, General Superintendent Flexon, requested the District Secretary to read the two specific propositions for which the session was called.

Forty-eight ministerial and twenty-five lay delegates responded to the roll call. The following alternates were seated: El Monte, C. F. Knudsen; North Redondo Beach, Marilyn Palmer; Rees Memorial, Eldon Stohr, Ruth Hocking; Rosemead, Alma Poe; Solana Beach, David Holmquist; Ventura, Mrs. Paul Wallace.

Conference bar was established as the first six rows across the tabernacle. The presiding officer instructed the District Secretary to read the first proposition brought by the District Council. This was a request from the District Council for authorization to sell certain properties formerly occupied by Western Pilgrim College. Moved and seconded that the council's recommendation be adopted.

Motion to take a standing vote was lost.

Motion carried to vote by secret ballot.

The District Superintendent appointed the following tellers: Joseph Fillmore, Gordon Parmenter, Russell Johnson, Robert Rogers.

Tally declared the measure passed by a vote of 50-23.

Motion carried to recess for ten minutes.

Motion carried that the conference go on record as approving the action of the District Council in the sale of the "east property."

Presiding chairman, Dr. Flexon, instructed the District Secretary to read the second proposition to the conference. This was a request from the District Council for authorization to petition the Executive Council of the General Board to consider division of the California District. It was moved and seconded that the recommendation of the council be accepted.

Motion carried to accept.

Division of the house moved and seconded. A 38-22 vote opened debate again.

Amendment carried that the negotiations of the District Council with the General Church Executive Council be consumated at the May meeting of said council.

Vote on second proposition carried by rising vote.

Expression of thanks and esteem was given by the conference for our General Superintendent, Dr. R. G. Flexon.

The District Superintendent expressed thanks for the delegates present.

Appreciation was expressed by rising vote of thanks to the District Council and the brethren who cleaned the tabernacle for the conference.

Motion carried to include the minutes of the conference as a preface in the 1961 conference minutes.

Motion carried to adjourn at 5:45 P.M.

# June 1, 1960, to May 31, 1961

# To the Annual District Conference, Greetings:

This will constitute the third annual report for our district organization, and we thank God for the help He has afforded us throughout the year. This has been a busy year, but God's grace has been sufficient.

In October we served two meals for the District Workers Meeting at Rees Memorial Church.

In January of this year, we were privileged to arrange and conduct a Missionary Convention at East Pasadena Church, during which Rev. and Mrs. C. G. Keith, from Africa, and Miss Naomi Greer, from Peru, were the special speakers.

At the request of the District Superintendent, the committee arranged lunch for the C.P.C. Choir, during the Easter vacation. A number of the churches assisted by bringing in food.

Other projects sponsored by the committee this year include:

Furnishing and hanging drapes in the District Cafeteria.

Providing a venetian blind for the District Office (from the balance of the drape fund). The churches cooperated in these two undertakings.

The committee purchased and placed the American flag and Christian flag in the District Tabernacle.

Cleaned and replaced the overhead curtain on the Tabernacle platform, provided a couch covering for the District Office, and paid the balance on the venetian blind mentioned above.

A number of the ladies worked in preparing the cafeteria and cottages for Camp Meeting, on the scheduled work days.

We have prospects presently of sending a quantity of used books to the Philippines, to help satisfy the spiritual hunger of the people of the islands. Our latest project is the Missionary Room, which includes a display of the work done by the various churches. All are invited to visit the missionary room and inspect the work that has been done over the district.

Eighteen individuals have finished the required number of books in the 1960 Reading Course, and have qualified to receive their certificates.

I wish to express my appreciation for the other members of the committee who have worked so faithfully. Sister Mildred Wengert, who is generally distinguished for her cooking, has been incapacitated for some time because of an auto accident. How thankful we are that the Lord spared her, and we are asking the Lord to fully restore her to health. Sister Ruby Tschinkel has been a good secretary, mimeographing and sending out letters, and otherwise making herself useful. Her ingenuity may also be discovered in the arrangement of the missionary room.

I am likewise grateful for the assistance of Sister Hamon, in the purchase and hanging of the cafeteria drapes.

# **RESOLUTIONS OF THE 1961 CONFERENCE**

# **Resolutions Committee**

No. 1—BE IT RESOLVED THAT: This Conference elect a committee of three to investigate the advantages of renting or selling the District Conference grounds. This committee shall report their initial findings to the District Council not later than the regular council meeting of October, 1961. The District Council shall present a specific recommendation to the District Conference of 1962, regarding the renting or selling of the District Conference grounds. This committee shall be made up of the assistant district superintendent and two additional members of the conference not serving on the District Council.

No. 2—BE IT RESOLVED THAT: This conference authorize the District Council to appoint a District Scholarship Committee, for the purpose of raising finances for a District Scholarship Fund. This committee will also serve in the examination and recommendation of worthy students to receive help from such funds. This committee is to be amenable to the District Council, and all final appointments are to be subject to Council approval.

No. 3 — BE IT RESOLVED THAT: Standing resolution number 35, page 34, of the District Minutes be changed to read "the District Superintendent call a meeting of all District leaders and pastors for the purpose of introducing the programs of the various departments for the coming year, this meeting to be held during the month of September. The time and schedule of such meeting is to be worked out by the District Superintendent."

No. 4 — Whereas in the past there have been program conflicts between District, Zone and Local activities, therefore, be it resolved that a new district office be created. Said office to be known as the District Program Coordinating Secretary, appointed by the District Council. The duty of said secretary shall be to assist all departments in arranging program dates, thus avoiding conflicts where possible.

It shall be the duty of said officer to arrange calendars for each department of the District and Zone leaders. Said officer shall notify the District officers of scheduled activities affecting each department, keep zone leaders and pastors posted as to activities affecting each.

No. 5 — BE IT RESOLVED THAT: Standing resolutions numbers 22 and 38 be deleted and the following resolution be substituted in the place of these two: Be it resolved that there be a Camp Meeting Grounds Committee appointed by the Council. Responsibilities: 1. The responsibility for the preparation of the district camp grounds for annual conference and camp meeting be delegated to this committee; 2. The secretary of this committee shall be responsible for notifying all pastors and all other ministers of the District as to the dates for any work days set for the preparation of the grounds; 3. The camp meeting committee be empowered to hire such help as is necessary to have the delegates' accommodations properly arranged and cleaned.

No. 6 — Be it resolved THAT: The second paragraph of standing resolution number 39 be changed to read: "Any church providing the labor or funds set forth above, the active members of that church sall be entitled to meals at one-half price."

No. 7— Be it resolved that standing resolution number 28 be changed to read as follows: "Be it resolved that the ordination service be conducted at the evening service on the first day of conference. This to be effective for the 1962 conference." (This resolution makes obsolete a previous resolution passed by this conference.)

No. 8 — Whereas our District Superintendent has untiringly given himself to the work of building the District, therefore be it resolved that we give Rev. Thomas Hamon a rising vote of appreciation for his labors of love during the past year.

No. 9 — BE IT RESOLVED THAT: The Conference give its presiding officer, Dr. R. G. Flexon, a rising vote of thanks for his labor of love among us.

No. 10 - BE IT RESOLVED THAT: This conference give a rising vote of thanks to Rev. Park, Rev. Wells and to the kitchen and dining room crews for the maginificent manner in which they have entertained this conference.

No. 11 — BE IT RESOLVED THAT: Greetings be sent to all the Missionaries now serving under appointment abroad, who hold membership in this District.

# Ways and Means Committee

No. 1 — Be it resolved that Resolution No. 2, page 29, be replaced with the following:

Whereas the Board of Directors of Central Pilgrim College has requested that each conference in the zone shall accept and adopt a goal of five dollars (\$5.00) per member per year in support of Central Pilgrim College.

Therefore, be it resolved that this conference accept and adopt said goal. The basis for determining membership responsibility for the above-mentioned goal is to deduct ten per cent (10%) from the total voting membership of the church.

No. 3 - Be it resolved that Resolution No. 3, page 29, be deleted.

No. 3 — Be it resolved that paragraph 2 of Resolution No. 1, page 29, be replaced with the following:

Each and every local church in the district shall send to the district treasurer once each month a budget assessment in the amount of ten per cent (10%) of all offerings received by the church, Sunday School, Youth Society and Missionary Society; except all specified funds raised for the construction or acquisition of church buildings or property, Sunday school units, and parsonages, and except specified funds raised for the retirement of indebtedness on same. (This resolution makes obsolete Committee Resolution No. 1 passed by this conference.)

# STANDING RESOLUTIONS FROM PREVIOUS CONFERENCES

(1)

Be is resolved that the District Council shall be informed of all matters of major legislative change prior to presentation to the conference.

(2)

We recommend that Section 92, paragraph 4, and Section 149, paragraph 8. of the 1958 Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, which reads as follows, be enforced:

"Any church or pastor failing to raise the United Stewardship Fund without good reason shall be **denied** a **voice** in the annual **conference.**"

(3)

Be it resolved that the local churches pay the **traveling expenses and enter**tainment of their delegates for the Conference business sessions. This does not include camp meeting.

(4)

Whereas, the General Conference has made provision that newly organized churches in districts assume one-fourth of their United Stewardship Fund the first year after being organized; one-half of their budget the second year; threefourths the third year, and beginning with fourth year pay in full:

Therefore, be it resolved that on this district we apply the same percentages in regard to our **district budget**.

(5)

Be it resolved that the following items be paid out of the **District Expense** Fund:

1. Utilities for the home of the District Superintendent.

2. Publication of the Pilgrim News.

3. District office expense.

# (6)

Be it resolved that the cafeteria and lunch stand be considered part of the camp meeting operations and all monies pertaining thereto be held in the Camp Meeting fund.

### (7)

Be it resolved that **ministers** coming to this district **from other denominations** be interviewed by the District Council before their **credentials** are presented to the Conference.

# (8)

Whereas in the past important papers have been lost and a considerable loss of time and finance was necessary to secure new papers, therefore be it resolved that all local churches of the district forward to the District Council for filing, all **legal papers** pertaining to the ownership of the local church property.

(9)

Whereas, the District owns shares in the Lexington Blvd. Mutual Water Co., therefore be it resolved that the following five district officers, by virtue of their office, be appointed to represent our shares in the Water Co.; District Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Treasurer and Secretary and the President of the Board of Trustees. And be it further resolved that the representatives vote the shares as a block as instructed by the District Council on matters of policy.

(10)

Be it resolved that the **District Council** and following **committees and** boards, meet one day prior to the annual Conference to take care of such work as they have on hand. The Resolutions and Ways and Means Committees, and the Educational and Examining Boards.

# (11)

Be it resolved that all plans for the construction or remodeling of church buildings be presented to a District Building Committee on which there shall be an architect, a builder, and a financier for their suggestions.

# (12)

Resolved that before licensed or ordained **ministers** coming **from** other **churches** shall be received into the local churches, the pastor shall consult with the District Superintendent and Council regarding said minister.

# (13)

Be it resolved that our district **Educational and Examining Boards** be instructed to secure a set of questions covering the course of study prescribed by the manual and make the same available to those desiring to take the Study Course.

(14)

Be it resolved, that each **pastor** be granted the privilege of holding at least one **revival** each conference year.

(15)

We recommend that, whereas we now have a standing Statistical Committee to function during the conference year, be it resolved that all **reports** be made in full and sent to **the Statistical Committee** not later than one week before the conference date.

# (16)

Resolved that when recommendation for **credentials** is presented to the Conference the candidate be present, or send a written testimony to accompany the recommendation.

(17)

Be it resolved that the part of the **District Superintendent's** and other district officers' **expense**, relating to the propagation of district home missions, be so designated and paid for out of district home mission funds.

(18)

Be it resolved that the Conference form a committee of four which shall have charge of the Old Folks' Home buildings and grounds, said committee to be comprised of the District Superintendent, the pastor of the El Monte Pilgrim Holiness Church, the President of the Board of Trustees, and one member to be appointed by the District Council.

## (19)

Be it resolved that the **District Superintendent** be given an annual **vacation** with pay, not to exceed two weeks.

(20)

Be it resolved that each local church be urged to raise a **subscription** list to the **Pilgrim Holiness Advocate** equal to its total membership.

(21)

Be it resolved, that the **Conference Minutes** be sold at 75t per copy. Be it further resolved, that each church remit from local funds for the minutes ordered, and then sell them to the members for the stipulated price.

# (22)

Be it resolved, that in lieu of the Annual District Home Missions offering received the last Sunday of Camp, we adopt a system known as the **District Home Missions Reserve Call System** to operate as follows. The District Superintendent be privileged to ask for a special offering toward the needs of any mission project, not to exceed the equivalent of three \$5.00 calls to each voluntary member per year.

# (23)

Be it resolved that our pastors be urged to secure Pilgrim Holiness **Evan**gelists as much as possible. And be it further resolved that evangelists from other denominations be secured under the District Superintendent's approval.

(24)

Be it resolved that the **financial records of all departments** of the District be submitted to the District Auditing Committee at least THREE days prior to the District Conference. This includes District Treasurer, District Youth, Sunday School Committee.

(25)

Whereas in order that the pastor may be at his best and the church may be served better by the **pastor** receiving an **annual vacation**, therefore, be it resolved that each church of the District give its pastor a two weeks' vacation with pay.

(26)

Be it resolved that the **time of sittings of future Conferences** be set as follows: 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon; 2:00 p.m. - 4:30 p.m.; and 7:00 p.m. - 10:00 p.m., respectively.

(27)

Be it resolved that the ordination service be conducted at the evening service on the first day of conference. This to be effective for the 1962 conference.

# (28)

Be it resolved that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary, or his representative, shall have the privilege of holding two services annually in each of the churches of the District in the interests of the work of the **District Sunday School** Committee and that an offering shall be taken in said service and forwarded immediately to the District Treasurer being specified as an offering for the District Sunday School Committee.

# (29)

Whereas, the **funds** received by the District from pledges for construction of a **camp dormitory** are not sufficient to cover the costs of construction, and whereas, these funds could be of a great help in developing churches in our district, now therefore be it resolved that the District Council shall continue to promote the raising of funds for a campgrounds dormitory, and be it further resolved that until such time as sufficient funds are received to cover the costs of construction of a campgrounds dormitory that the District Council be authorized and is hereby authorized to use said funds for short term loans on properties for the development of our district.

#### (30)

Be it resolved that the District Secretary be informed immediately upon the **death of a pastor or pastor's wife** of the District, and that he notify by telephone all pastors in the District and that proper notification be given to the editor of the District publication.

#### (31)

Be it resolved that the Conference adopt the following method of pastoral recall:

- 1—That each church shall vote during the last full week of March on the recall of its pastor.
- 2—That each local church secretary shall forward to the District Superintendent the results of such vote within five days following the time of voting.
- 3—That each pastor shall forward to the District Superintendent his reply relative to his recall, within 15 days of the time of voting. (See 1958 Manual, Section 53, Paragraph 3).
- 4—That each pastor who does not plan to be a candidate for recall shall notify the District Superintendent on or before the 15th day of March. (32)

Be it resolved that the District Conference follow the method prescribed in the Manual, Section 45, which reads as follows: "Each **delegate** shall be provided with a certificate of his appointment, signed by the pastor and secretary."

Be it further resolved that a Conference registrar be appointed by the District Council, the registrar to assume his duties at the entrance to the

district tabernacle one hour prior to the opening of each session of the Conference, and further that the duties of the registrar shall be to register all members of the conference and all duly certified lay delegates, presenting each member or delegate with a badge admitting him within the Conference Bar.

That the Conference registrar shall receive and record the certificates from the lay delegates, and shall present the list of registered delegates to the conference secretary prior to the opening of each session of the conference.

# (33)

Whereas there seems to be considerable misunderstanding relative to the listing of inactive ministers,

Therefore, be it resolved that the Conference adopt the interpretation of the General Board with reference to Section 178 of the Manual.

"We understand by the term 'active and regularly engaged in the work of the ministry,' to mean pastors with a regular appointment and full time evangelists and to ministers who are under special appointment. With reference to the aged ministers we suggest that only those above 65 years may be so classified."

# (34)

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent call a meeting of all District leaders and pastors for the purpose of introducing the programs of the various departments for the coming year, this meeting to be held during the month of September. The time and schedule of such meeting is to be worked out by the District Superintendent. (35) Whereas it seems necessary to have a uniform method of **computing Sunday School attendance** in the District so as to make the comparison of statistics on an equal basis between each and every Sunday School, thus permitting the enjoyment of equal opportunity in said comparisons,

Therefore, be it resolved that only those attending Sunday School who arrive for at least 15 minutes of class participation be counted in reports to the District Conference or to any of its committees or officials.

(36)

Whereas there seems to be considerable misunderstanding relative to the Department could be better co-ordinated and better results could be achieved within our individual churches and within our District as a whole through the help of a **District Missionary Society Committee**, Therefore be it resolved that the District Council shall nominate and the

Therefore be it resolved that the District Council shall nominate and the District Conference shall elect from the nominations of the District Council a Missionary Society Committee of not less than three members whose number and terms shall be for such periods as the District Council shall provide.

Be it further resolved that from among those elected the District Council shall appoint one to serve as District Missionary Society President. It is intended that this Missionary Society Committee shall operate under the same rules and organization as the District Sunday School Committee.

(37)

Be it resolved that each church be responsible to furnish two man days labor or \$25.00 for preparation of the Camp Meeting buildings and grounds at least three days prior to Camp Meeting upon the call of the District Superintendent.

Any church providing the labor or funds set forth above, the active ministers of that church shall be entitled to meals at one-half price.

Each individual who at the call of the District Superintendent works three man-days or more preparing the grounds and buildings for Camp Meeting shall be entitled to free board during Camp Meeting.

# (38)

Be it resolved that **members of all standing committees** shall be members of the annual district conference with voice and vote.

(39)

Be it resolved, that licensed ministers and deaconesses be notified in advance of conference to meet with the Educational and Examining Boards on the Saturday previous to Conference and in event it is impossible to do so, they shall notify these boards in writing. If there is no response it will indicate to the Educational and Examining Boards that the licentiate is not interested in his, or her, credentials.

## (40)

Be it resolved that an honor system for recognition of churches who pay their budget be established and that a chart shall be compiled by the District Treasurer and displayed at the District Camp and Conference.

# (41)

Be it resolved that an annual **Pastors' Retreat** be established and that the District Superintendent arrange for such meetings.

(42)

Whereas some resolutions have far reaching ramifications and thus demand the careful attention of the delegates, therefore

Be it resolved that the Ways and Means and Resolutions Committee meet 30 days prior to Conference, and

Be it further resolved that **mimeographed copies listing all resolutions** with committee recommendations be placed in the hands of all delegates no later than 10 days prior to said District Conference.

And be it further resolved that **each local church** be limited to **two resolutions** each to be sent to the chairmen of the respective committees no later than the 15th of May.

# (43)

Whereas the manual states—"any church or pastor failing to raise the budget without good reason shall be denied a voice in annual conference," and whereas a number of our churches have failed to raise their budgets for the past year, now therefore be it resolved that this Conference authorize the District Council to appoint a committee from its membership to visit these churches early in the fiscal year for the **purpose of counseling and assisting** them in working out their **budget problems**.

(44)

Be it resolved that local and district youth finances or monies given for youth activities be listed separately in district and local reports.

(45)

Be it resolved that the **District Young People's Executive Secretary**, or his representative, shall have the privilege of holding **two services annually in each of the churches** of the district in the interest of the work of the District Young People's Committee and that an offering shall be taken in said service and forwarded immediately to the District Treasurer, being specified as an offering for the District Young People's Committee.

(46)

Whereas there is an urgent need for further education on the subject of tithing and whereas many of our people are contributing all or part of their tithe to other areas of Gospel work, within and without the church, and whereas Section 69 of the Manual specifically sitpulates that the tithe should be paid into the treasury of the local church, therefore be it resolved that the District Superintendent, the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary, the District Young People's Executive Secretary, and the President of the District Missionary Society be appointed, by virtue of their office, a permanent committee to investigate and provide material for the education of our people in this area of

tithing and that they make a report of their activities to the Annual Conference. (47)

Be it resolved that the District Secretary give written **notification** to all **appointees** to standing District **Committees** within thirty days after District Conference.

Be it further resolved that the chairman of each standing committee be notified by the district secretary sixty days prior to District Conference to activate his committee.

(48)

Whereas the **report of the Statistical Committee** consumes much time, and gives more detail than can be readily understood or appreciated, therefore be it resolved that the chairman of the Statistical Committee present orally only the following highlights from the report: total number of seekers; membership; Sunday School attendance; and the financial summary of totals by departments.

Be it further resolved that the entire report be posted before the fourth sitting of the conference.

(49)

# Be it resolved that the names and addresses of the following officers

of each local church be submitted to the Editor of the California **Pilgrim** for publication with or in the August issue of each year: Sunday School superintendent; Youth Society president; Missionary Society president.

(50)

Whereas we have an obligation as Christian citizens and members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church to oppose legislation detrimental to evangelical Christianity and whereas lobbying is a most effective method of influencing legislation, be it therefore resolved that the governmental committee of the Sacramento Holiness Association be authorized to speak for the California District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church on all legislative matters that are of vital interest to Christian citizens.

(51)

We recommend that the following system of finance, which shall cover the total district and general budget obligations of the local church, be adopted:

Each and every local church in the district shall send to the district treasurer once each month a budget assessment in the amount of ten per cent (10%) of all offerings received by the church, Sunday School, Youth Society and Missionary Society; except all specified funds raised for the construction or acquisition of church buildings or property, Sunday School units, and parsonages, and except specified funds raised for the retirement of indebtedness on same.

This system of finance shall be designated as the District Unified Stewardship Fund and each and every church in the district shall remit each month a tithe of its income to the district treasurer for the account of said Unified Stewardship Fund.

The district treasurer shall distribute within thirty days after receipt the funds received in the Unified Stewardship Fund as follows: (1) 62% 1 s:

(2) 38% to General Budget; and if the said 38% shall exceed the annual general budget responsibility of this district, then the amount received over and above our annual General Budget responsibility shall be used for District Home Missionary work.

Be it resolved that the following sums be allowed to the District Secretary and the District Treasurer for their services.

District Secretary—\$25.00 per quarter. District Treasurer—\$100.00 per quarter.

(53)

Whereas many of our ministers and their wives who are eligible for membership in the Ministerial Benefit Association are not members, and whereas the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has made the following recommendation relative to this matter, therefore:

Be it resolved that each church pay the assessment fees of the pastor and wife if they are members of the Association, it being fully understood that this will apply only to those pastors and their wives who are eligible for membership in the Association.

(54)

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent's salary be \$4,500.00 per year in addition to his residence, utilities, traveling expenses, and automobile mileage at seven (7) cents per mile.
