## JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

First Sitting, July 10, 1950

The Twenty-eighth Annual Conference of the California-Arizona District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at El Monte, California, at 9:00 a.m., Monday, July 10, 1950.

The motion carried that we omit the further reading of the Conference roll.

The first recommendation of the Ways and Means Committee was reopened for discussion. The recommendation as presented originally was voted upon and lost.

A motion carried to extend the time of the sitting to 5:00 p. m.

## RESOLUTIONS OF THE 1950 CONFERENCE

No. 1 Be it resolved that resolution number 3 page 17 of the 1949 conference minutes be amended to read as follows:

"Be it resolved that the Conference grant the Pilgrim Evangelistic Institute a deed to the property within the bounds herein described. That parcel of land bounded on the north by Schmidt road, on the west by Hoyt Avenue, on the south by Klingerman Street, and on the east by a line fifty feet west of the center of Adams drive. That in the event said property should cease to be used as a Pilgrim Holiness School, it shall revert to the California-Arizona District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church."

(This is recommended by the District Council)

No. 2 Whereas, the people gathering around the lunch stand to eat and make merry during the altar service has a tendency to stifle conviction, and also to lessen the interest in the altar service; therefore, be it resolved that the lunch stand shall be closed during the altar call and for at least 30 minutes thereafter.

No. 3 Lost.

No. 4 Whereas, the General Conference has set as a goal for church extension, 200 new churches within the next quadrennium, be it resolved that the California-Arizona Conference set as a goal the establishing of at least three new churches per year for the following four year period.

No. 5 Be it resolved that the District Youth Committee and the District Council be authorized to negotiate the handling of the Mile High Pines Youth Camp with power to act.

No. 6 Be it resolved that the Conference give its presiding officer, Rev. L. W. Sturk, a rising vote of thanks for his labor of love among us.

No. 7 Be it resolved that the Conference give our District Superintendent, Rev. C. L. Morgan, a rising vote of appreciation for his untiring work for the district.

No. 8 Be it resolved that the Conference give a rising vote of thanks and appreciation to Fred K. Wells, the custodians and to the kitchen and dining room help for the gracious way they have served in helping to make this a successful Conference.

## RESOLUTIONS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE 1950 Conference

No. 1 Lost.

No. 2 We recommend that each church adopt the following plan for a (district) school budget. The school shall provide each church with a mite box for each member, into which shall be deposited as their offering to the school the amount of at least a penny a day. Churches should raise a total of at least a penny a day for every member per year.

No. 3 Be it resolved that the District Superintendent's salary for the ensuing year be continued at \$3400.00 per year, in addition to his residence, utilities and traveling expenses.

No. 4 Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be given an annual vacation with pay, not to exceed two weeks.

No. 5 We recommend that the District Secretary and the District Treasurer be allotted the sum of \$25.00 per quarter for their services, and the District Treasurer be allowed \$20.00 per month for secretarial assistance.

No. 6 We recommend to the Conference that they instruct the District Treasurer to send monthly to all Pastors a report of monthly remittances from local churches to the District Treasurer. This report to be posted in a conspicuous place in the church.

No. 7 We recommend that the 10% of the Sunday School offerings be divided as follows:

50% General Sunday School and Young Peoples Assessments.  
50% District Sunday School Committee.

No. 8 We recommend that the District Assessment remain at \$2.00 per member per year, to be divided as follows:

\$0.15 General Conference Expense.  
.85 Camp Ground Maintenance.  
1.00 General Administration.

No. 9 We recommend that the 10% of the regular church tithes and offerings be raised to 12% and that this amount be distributed as follows:

30% to District Conference Expense.  
60% to District Superintendent Fund.  
10% to District Home Missions.

No. 10 We recommend that we take offerings for the Departments as follows:

Foreign Missions in August.  
General Church Extension in September.  
District Home Missions in October.  
and every third month thereafter in sequence.

No. 11 We move the deletion of the following:

No. 2, 4, & 6 on page 27.  
On page 28, No. 2 to concur with Ways and Means No. 9;  
No. 4 to concur with Ways & Means No. 8;  
No. 6 to concur with Ways & Means No. 10;  
and No. 8 to be deleted.  
On page 29, No. 2 of Standing Resolutions to be deleted.  
On page 30, No. 8 & 9 Standing Resolutions to be deleted.  
On page 31, No. 16 of Standing Resolutions to be deleted.

No. 12 Whereas, it has become necessary to sell a portion of our vacant property for the promotion of the work of the District, and whereas, we have an opportunity to dispose of certain lots for this purpose; therefore, we recommend that the following described property be sold:

The west 137.15 feet of the South 192.00 feet of the North 392.00 feet of Lot 9, Tract No. 565, as per map recorded in Book 15, Page 97 of Maps, Records of Los Angeles County.

No. 13 Because some of the funds of the District Treasurer create a surplus, we recommend that all such surplus funds be placed to the credit of the District Expense Account.

### Notice To All Churches

Inasmuch as some of the churches have inquired about the various assessments, percentages and offerings which they are to send in each month and how they are to figure them. Therefore, for the benefit of all, the Ways and Means Committee lists below all items of importance which are to be standard procedure in each church:

- (1) With each remittance from your church, please include a remittance sheet so that each amount can be credited to the proper account.
- (2) 12% of regular offerings and tithes after deducting building funds and rentals, same to be distributed according to "Ways and Means resolution No. 9."
- (3) 10% of regular Sunday School offerings to be used for district Sunday School work.
- (4) District assessments \$2.00 to be distributed according to Ways and Means resolution No. 8.

NOTE: Assessments are to be pro-rated to a monthly basis and remitted each month. Assessments are based on total membership, with exemptions provided for those regularly engaged in Christian work such as active missionaries and evangelists and all non-voting members.



## (5) Ministers Retirement Plan:

If your pastor is participating in the Retirement Plan, you will deduct 2% of his salary and send in each month. Along with this your church will contribute the equivalent of 4% on his salary (or twice the amount he paid) and send along with the 2%, keeping each percentage separate in your remittance sheet. If you send in a remittance to the Minister's Retirement Fund, please include two copies (original and duplicate) of the Pension Plan Remittance sheets and keep one copy for your own files. Be sure the form is clearly and correctly filled out.

(6) Monthly Missionary offerings to be taken according to Ways and Means Resolution No. 10.

(7) All Sunday School birthday and thank offerings go to District Home Missions.

(8) All District and General Funds should be paid through the local church Treasurer to the District Treasurer.

(9) All churches should use the budget system. Obligations should be met weekly and sent monthly to the District Treasurer. All offerings should be mailed so they will reach the District Treasurer by the 10th of the month. This will make for easy and prompt handling of all accounts.

## Standing Resolutions from Previous Conferences

## (1)

Because of the increase in the expense of printing, be it resolved that the price of the District Minutes be 25c per copy, the same to be paid out of the local church funds not later than thirty days after received.

## (2)

Whereas the stress and strain of the times in which we live are such as to tax the strength of the busy pastors of our district, be it resolved that each church of the district give their pastor a two weeks' vacation with pay.

## (3)

Resolved that love offerings be taken monthly for pastors of each church and that the delegate sees that this is done.

## (4)

Be it resolved that the local churches pay the traveling expenses and entertainment of their delegates for the Conference business sessions. This does not include camp meeting.

## (5)

Whereas, the General Conference has made provision that newly organized churches in established districts assume  $\frac{1}{4}$  of their General Budget obligations the first year after being organized;  $\frac{1}{2}$  of their budget the second year;  $\frac{3}{4}$  the third year, and beginning with the fourth year pay in full;

Therefore be it resolved that on this district we apply the same percentages in regard to our district budget.

## (6)

Be it resolved that the following items be paid out of the District Expense Fund.

1. Utilities for the home of the District Superintendent.
2. District Superintendent's traveling expense.
3. Publication of the Pilgrim News.
4. District office expense.

(7)

Be it resolved that the cafeteria and lunch stand be considered part of the camp meeting operations and all monies pertaining thereto be held in the Camp Meeting fund.

(8)

Be it resolved that no person shall be granted license as a deaconess by the district until she has served two years as a local deaconess, with the District Secretary providing the proper credential.

(9)

Be it resolved that upon the completion by the candidate of the two years required as a local preacher or deaconess, he shall be interviewed by the District Council as well as the Educational and Examining Boards, before being issued his first district license.

(10)

Be it resolved that all candidates recommended for ordination shall meet with the District Council prior to their ordination.

(11)

Be it resolved that ministers coming to this district from other denominations be interviewed by the District Council before their credentials are presented to the Conference.

(12)

Whereas in the past important papers have been lost and a considerable loss of time and finance were necessary to secure new papers, therefore be it resolved that all local churches of the district forward to the District Council, for filing, all legal papers pertaining to the ownership of the local church property.

(13)

Whereas the District owns shares in the Lexington Blvd. Mutual Water Co., therefore be it resolved that the following five district officers, by virtue of their office, be appointed to represent our shares in the Water Co.: The District Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, Treasurer and Secretary, and the President of the Board of Trustees. And be it further resolved that the representatives vote the shares as a block as instructed by the District Council on matters of policy.

(14)

Be it resolved that the School Board for the Grade and High School shall be comprised of five members. One elected for 4 years, one for 3 years, one for 2 years, and two for 1 year. And be it further resolved that all subsequent elections be for a full three years.

(15)

Whereas the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the West Coast is in need of a more adequate Bible School, where our young men and women will receive recognized Bible training within our church, thereby retaining them for our denomination, be it resolved that the District Council and the School Board make plans to expand our present Bible School facilities, either by a building program on our own beautiful campus, or by investigating some worthy project elsewhere in the immediate future.

(16)

Be it resolved that the District Council and following committees and boards meet one day prior to the annual Conference to take care of such work as they have on hand: The Resolutions and Ways and Means Committees, and the Educational and Examining Boards.

(17)

Be it resolved that each church on the district be responsible to furnish at least two man days labor in preparation of the grounds for camp meeting, subject to the call of the District Council.

(18)

Be it resolved that the emphasis being placed on the work among the children of the Sunday Schools shall not be lessened, but that a greater stress shall be placed on the work among our young married folk and adults, thus building into our Sunday School program a definite place for the family as a complete unit.

(19)

We recommend that each self-supporting church put forth a home missionary campaign and try to establish at least one new church.

(20)

Be it resolved that all plans for the construction or remodeling of church buildings be presented to a committee on which there shall be an architect, a builder, and a financier for their suggestions.

(21)

Resolved that no pastor employ an evangelist without the endorsement of the District Superintendent.

(22)

Resolved that before licensed or ordained ministers coming from other churches shall be received into the local churches, the pastor shall consult with the District Superintendent and Council regarding said minister.

(23)

Be it resolved that each pastor be granted the privilege of holding at least one revival each conference year.

(24)

Be it resolved that the district limit the use of our district camp grounds to one camp each summer other than our own.

(25)

Be it resolved that our district Educational Board be instructed to secure a set of questions covering the course of study prescribed by the manual and make the same available to those desiring to take the Study Course.

(26)

Be it resolved that the reports of the Examining and Educational Boards be included in the body of the minutes.

(27)

We recommend that our District Superintendent or his Assistant shall, when possible, conduct quarterly meetings at each church, at which time he shall preach a gospel sermon and administer the sacraments.

(28)

We recommend that, whereas we now have a standing Statistical Committee to function during the conference year, be it resolved that all reports be made in full and sent to the Statistical Committee not later than one week before the conference date.

(29)

It is recommended that the district create the office of District Sunday School Secretary, which person is to be nominated by the District Sunday School Committee, the nomination to be ratified by the District Council, and said secretary shall be an ex-officio member and responsible to the Sunday School Committee.

(30)

Resolved that when recommendation for credentials is presented to the Conference the candidate be present, or send a written testimony to accompany the recommendation.

(31)

Whereas the devastating influence of the liquor traffic in America is gaining such momentum, be it resolved our church and ministry take a more militant stand against the sale of the same.

(32)

Be it resolved that our District Superintendent appoint an editing committee comprised of the District Secretary and one or two other members to expedite the editing and publishing of our District Minutes.

(33)

Inasmuch as the ministerial directory in the district minutes does not differentiate between missionaries in foreign lands and ministers in the homeland, therefore, be it resolved that in the future these be shown in two separate lists.

(34)

Be it resolved that the necessary data for the General Statistician be placed in our District Minutes.

(35)

Be it resolved that the part of the District Superintendent's and other district officer's expense, relating to the propagation of the district home missions, be so designated, and paid for out of district home mission funds.

(36)

Be it resolved that the District Young Peoples' and the Sunday School Committee's financial reports be submitted as a yearly report to the District Conference.

(37)

Whereas the local churches have been paying for the pastor's traveling and housing expenses during camp meeting and conference, and whereas some of the pastors have to leave full time or part time secular work to attend such camp and conference, thereby cutting off part of their source of income and creating a financial problem; therefore be it resolved that each church assume the responsibility of seeing that the local pastor's temporal needs are adequately supplied during this time.

(38)

Whereas the school has operational control of the Conference grounds the greater part of the year; therefore we recommend that the matter of a maintenance man for said grounds be left to the consideration of the District Council and the school board.

(39)

Be it resolved that the number of the District Board of Trustees be reduced from seven to three, one to be elected for three years, one for two years, and one for one year, same to be put into operation as the terms of the present trustees expire.

(40)

Be it resolved that the Conference form a committee of three which shall have charge of the Old Folks Home buildings and grounds, said committee to be comprised of the District Superintendent, the pastor of the El Monte Pilgrim Holiness Church and the President of the Board of Trustees.
