JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Fifth Annual Conference of the Capital District convened at Alexandria, Va., 9:45 a.m. on May 28, 1957.

The Conference convened by singing "Faith of Our Fathers" which was led by Rev. M. V. Goodrich. Brother E. L. Howard led the Conference in prayer.

A motion carried that Rev. & Mrs. Mulholland be granted an honorary seat within the Conference bar.

Rev. R. W. Hawkins, Secretary of Church Extension, was introduced by Rev. T. M. Weir, District Superintendent. Rev. Hawkins read Psalms 121 as a Scripture lesson and addressed the Conference with a brief, but encouraging message.

A motion carried that the first five seats on the right of the church comprise the Conference bar.

A motion carried that the Conference recess from 1:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m.

The District Superintendent gave his very fine report which is recorded on page #7.. This report was received with a rising vote of gratitude.

The Woodlawn Church was presented to the Conference and heartily received. (Rev. Robert Evans was denied the privilege of being present because of extenuating circumstances.) The Woodlawn delegation comprised of Rev. & Mrs. Foot and Mrs. Ruth Evans were received by Rev. R. C. Hawkins and Rev. T. M. Weir.

Mr. E. L. Howard, District Treasurer, read his well prepared report which is recorded on page #9. A motion carried to receive the Treasurer's report with gratitude to God for providing our needs.

The District Statistician's report was given showing gains in every department for which we are very grateful to God.

Rev. J. W. Kraus, Executive Secretary of District Sunday Schools, gave his report. A motion prevailed that this report be received.

Rev. J. D. Pence, Executive Secretary of District Youth, gave his report. A motion prevailed that this report be received.

Rev. T. M. Weir read reports from Rev. Parks and Rev. Davis. A motion prevailed that these reports be received.

A motion prevailed that the order of the day be the presentation of resolutions.

RESOLUTION COMMITTEE'S REPORT

Resolution I - To amend general resolution #I page 29 relative to the time of District Youth Rallies. Carried.

Resolution II - Carried. See Standing Rule #4 relative to Youth Camp Work Program.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE'S REPORT

Resolution I - Carried. Amends Ways and Means Resolution #I to delete the words for 1955-56.

Resolution II - Amends Ways and Means Resolution #4 last paragraph to read, "Be it resolved that Ways and Means Resolution #4 of the Conference Rules be amended to exclude the words "who are not stationed or whose church is not subject to the District Budget". This resolution was referred back to the Committee. (The Chairman granted free discussion on the Ways and Means Committee resolution).

A motion carried to recess. The Conference sitting was adjourned by prayer led by Rev. J. D. Pence.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting of the Conference convened at 2:00 p.m. with the singing of "All Hail The Power Of Jesus' Name" led by Rev. M. V. Goodrich. The Conference was led in prayer by Rev. J. D. Pence.

Ways and Means Committee's report was continued, with proposals to amend Resolution #4, with alternate A, B, C. The motion carried that Resolution #2 alternate B amend Ways and Means Resolution #4 page # 28.

Resolution III - Carried as amended. See Ways and Means #5 page 28

Rev. T. M. Weir commented "We are building toward the day when this District will be on its own".

Resolution IV - Tabled.

Motion prevailed that the election of officers be the order of the day.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins, Secretary of Church Extension, made the following appointments for the fiscal year 1957-58.

Rev. T. M. Weir, District Superintendent, appointed committees for the 1957-58 fiscal year.

A motion prevailed that the Council or Treasurer prepare forms itemizing the various items of the budget and that the local church treasurers be supplied with same.

Rev. E. L. Foot addressed the Conference concerning the Pilgrim Book Room.

PERSONAL REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT
CAPITAL DISTRICT - May 29, 1957

General Secretary, R. C. Hawkins, the clergymen, delegates and friends of the fifth annual conference of the Pilgrim Churches of the Capital District.

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, it is with grateful hearts that we come to the close of another fiscal year enjoying victory all along the line. Because of the goodness and the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, we are able to report gains in all departments again this year. These gains, year by year, are not by accident, but represent the combined efforts of men and women, clergy and laity, dedicated to the task of building the kingdom of God. We are happy, too, that these gains do not represent numbered proselytes, but rather solid spiritual growth, characteristic of the spirit of our district from its inception.

It would be impossible to enumerate all the gains, sacrifices, accomplishments and victories experienced over the district through the past year. However, there are several outstanding factors that are especially worthy of note. Practically all churches have shown gains numerically and spiritually.

The present parsonage-church combination is entirely inadequate.

Edgewood has secured an additional lot and is looking forward to building.

We are happy to welcome into our midst the Woodlawn Pilgrim Church. God has richly blessed this new group of Pilgrims under the capable leadership of the pastor, Brother Evans. In two weeks time, the first section of a beautiful new sanctuary will be dedicated to all that we hold sacred. This building, so ideally located and speedily erected, is a tribute to the careful planning and ability to follow through on the part of the pastor, church officers and entire congregation. As a result of this progress, this church is already growing in every department.

Yorkshire Pilgrim Church has been renovated and is looking forward to greater things this coming year.

Franconia, Temple and Cameron Valley all have encouraging reports.

We are trusting that God will meet the needs of Ellicott City and supply them with a permanent pastor. We are grateful to Brother Young for his untiring efforts in behalf of this work and know that the Lord will give him souls for his hire.

Woodridge Pilgrim Church is in the processing of relocating. We are sure that the Lord, who has led them thus far, will continue to give pastor and people the wisdom that is needed in securing the proper location and building which is of such vital importance in re-establishing a work.

Another step forward is the fact that the Capital District now has a "Pilgrim Book Room". This undertaking which God has placed upon the heart of Brother Foot is bound to be a blessing to the entire district. This is a non profit organization and is dedicated to the establishing of new Pilgrim Churches built for the glory of God. I am sure Brother Foot will have a great deal more to say concerning this enterprise.

We are grateful for the continual growth and interest in both our District and Youth camps. We have been able to purchase another two acres of land, thus rounding out nicely our camp site. We are trusting that this spiritual center shall continue to be a great blessing in this part of God's vineyard.

In closing, I would like to say that we are saddened because of the illness of Brother Schaffner. We feel that we have suffered a loss because of his having to leave the pastoral field. However, we are encouraged to see that he is continuing to be active in week-end meetings and revival services. We are praying for his speedy and complete recovery.

My personal report is as follows: I have served as District Superintendent of the Capital District for the last twelve months. In connection with this work I have organized one new church and started two others. I have supervised the construction of one new church building and purchasing of a pastor and camp ground land. I have visited our churches and held five annual meetings. At the request of the General Secretary of Church Extension, I have covered parts of California, Virginia and Michigan in deputational work. I have represented our District on the Eastern College Board and have attended regular meetings at Allentown, Pa. I have served the College as Public Relations Man.

I have served as pastor of the Edgewood Pilgrim Church. I have made 327 calls. I have officiated at five weddings and six funerals. I have travelled over 48,000 miles in the performance of my duties. I have received \$1,985.00 support. My auto expense has been provided. The District has paid all parsonage expense. I am grateful for the privilege of serving and respectfully submit this report.

C O N F E R E N C E R U L E S

Ways and Means Resolutions

I

Be it resolved that the District Budget for 1956-57 be raised as follows:

1. Each church in the District shall pay to the District Treasurer 7% of all offerings received by the church except those offerings designated for a specific purpose or activity (other than local church) such as: missions, Church Extension, Sunday School Extension (Rally Day), colleges, and District projects.
2. All regular offerings of the church such as: tithes, building fund, Sunday School and Young People's offerings shall be subject to this assessment.
3. Two per cent (2%) or $\frac{2}{5}$ of this budget shall be credited by the District Treasurer to the District Revolving Fund.
4. The remainder of the budget shall be credited to the District General Fund for use as required for District Administration.
5. All offerings received at District rallies, conferences and other meetings shall be credited to the District General Fund unless otherwise specifically designated or directed by the District Council.
6. The District budget shall be paid to the District Treasurer by the 10th day of the following month.

II

Be it resolved that all loans made to individual churches from the District Revolving Fund shall be repaid with interest at the rate of 6% per annum. The interest shall be due and payable annually on the anniversary date of the loan.

III

Whereas the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church provides for bi-annual visits by the District Superintendent to each church, be it resolved that at these visits to the churches, a plate offering shall be taken and given to the District Superintendent as a love offering. (Carried as amended).

(Continued)

IV

Be it resolved that 25% of the tithe of all pastors of congregations in the Capital District shall be sent by each church treasurer, or by the pastor, to the District Treasurer each month for application to the District Administration expenses.

V

Whereas the current District Budget requirements are not being fully met by District income, and

Whereas organized districts pay General Budget, which Capital District does not pay, on the basis of a fixed assessment per member, and

Whereas the Capital District will be required to pay General Budget in this manner when it becomes an organized district,

Therefore, be it resolved that five dollars (\$5.00) per member per year be assessed each member of the Capital District.

Be it further resolved that this offering be forwarded by each church treasurer to the District Treasurer within 90 days after District Conference for use, first, in meeting District Budget requirements, and second, in furthering Home Mission projects in the Capital District.

S T A N D I N G R U L E S

1. TIME OF DISTRICT CAMP

Be it resolved that the annual District Camp Meeting be held over a ten day period including the third and fourth Sundays of July.

2. PASTOR'S VACATION

Each church is encouraged to give their pastor a two weeks' vacation.

3. WORK PROGRAM FOR DISTRICT CAMP GROUNDS

The District Council shall determine the number of man hours required to prepare the grounds for camp meeting and that each year the Council request each church to supply an equal share of man hours to complete the work.

4. DISTRICT YOUTH PROGRAM

Whereas the Youth Program of the Capital District is rapidly growing in size and importance, be it therefore resolved that upon the call of the Superintendent, each pastor will make himself available for service during Youth Camp and that every pastor arrange his schedule so as to be available during the week of Pilgrim Youth Camp. The date of the Youth Camp is to be set one year in advance.

G E N E R A L R E S O L U T I O N S

1. TIME OF DISTRICT YOUTH MEETINGS

Whereas the local church program many times conflicts with the District program and whereas each pastor is urged to support and promote every District function: Be it therefore resolved that the third Friday of every other month, starting in September, be reserved for District Youth Rallies and functions. This is subject to change if conflict should arise.

2. DISTRICT MINUTES

Be it resolved that the Editing Committee meet and have its work completed by June 30th of each year.

3. EDUCATIONAL & EXAMINING BOARD

Be it resolved that the third year appointee of said Board be and hereby is appointed Chairman of said Board.

4. PILGRIM PENSION PLAN, INC.

Whereas the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has authorized the Pilgrim Pension Plan, Inc. to make loans of pension funds to local P. H. Churches under such conditions as require active participation on the part of P. H. Districts, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Annual Conference of this District that the District Council, District Trustees and all District officials be, and they are hereby, authorized to do and perform any and all acts required of them in the consumation of authorized loans to local P. H. Churches of this District, subject, however, to the limitations and conditions set out in said Resolution of the General Board of the P. H. Church authorizing said loans. (Adopted).
