JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The sixth annual Conference of the Capital District convened at McLean, Va., 9:45 a.m. on May 28, 1958.

Rev. T. M. Weir, District Superintendent, led the Conference in singing, "Wonderful Words of Life". Rev. Alton Davis led the Conference in prayer. Rev. C. W. Beach read Proverbs 3:3-10 as a Scripture lesson.

A motion prevailed that the center section of the church constitute the Conference bar.

Rev. T. M. Weir greeted the new ministers and their wives with words of commendation and instruction.

The Conference was temporarily recessed.

Rev. T. M. Weir introduced the President of the Conference, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, Secretary of Church Extension.

The motion prevailed that the time of the sittings of the Conference should be as follows: Recess for lunch- 1:00 p.m. ; Reconvene at 2:00 p.m.; Recess for dinner 6:30 p.m.; Reconvene at 8:00 p.m. until business is complete.

Rev. T. M. Weir, District Superintendent, read his splendid report which is recorded on page #8. This report was received with a hearty amen of appreciation.

The District Superintendent introduced the newly organized McLean Church to the Conference. Rev. M. V. Goodrich represented the church in its presentation. Brother Weir gave a graphic description of the origin and work of the McLean Pilgrim Church. The McLean Church was received by the Conference with enthusiasm.

Discussion ensued over the proposal of the Secretary of Church Extension regarding the future development of the Capital District.

Recess for lunch. The Conference was led in prayer by M. V. Goodrich.

SECOND SITTING

The Conference reconvened at 2:00 p.m. E. L. Howard led in prayer.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Given to the District Conference of the Capital District
of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, McLean, Va. May 28, 1958

To the General Secretary of Church Extension and brethren of the Capital District.

I know no more fitting way to greet you than in the Name of our Lord! It, especially, seems fitting to greet you in His Name because of the multiplication of providences which permit our gathering together under such favorable circumstances. In the midst of our searching to know the mind of God, it is a habit with us to reach for a promise from the Holy Word. In connection with the history of the Capital District and the plans for its future, I would like to call your attention to these words found in I Kings 6:14 - "So Solomon built the house and finished it". There are two emphasis outstanding in this portion of history: First, the work of building the Kingdom is always started by the hand of God. Second, His work will be finished by this same Hand. I am sure that each and everyone of us sense a solid assurance that God, who has blessed and prospered the development of the Capital District, will never fail us, but will in every case, see us through each problem and undertaking.

RETROSPECT:

As I reviewed the past year, I experienced both joy and disappointment. The advancements have been gratifying. Time will not permit me the pleasure of dealing with each church individually as to its gains, both spiritually and temporally, but it is sufficient to say that we have realized, again, this year, gains in all departments. Then, too, there has been the development of new churches, the acquiring of a splendid spiritually aggressive ministerial body. The emergence of the Capital District into a leading position in the Church Extension Department of our Church. Yet, we cannot help but be saddened by the fact that so many glorious opportunities have been missed. In so many ways, we have failed to accomplish that that would have caused rejoicing in Heaven.

Gospel work has never progressed without first having had someone, or some group, with courage to step ahead of the crowd, to lead the way to a new day of victory and progress. Only in this fashion can the enemy territory be invaded and held for God. The easiest way out is to see difficulties, shirk responsibility and maintain the status quo. We, as men of Church Extension, will never be satisfied with this weak, sickly attitude, spawned by lazy minds and nurtured by satan.

We delight in doing the difficult as God enables us. We rejoice in the reaping-hard though the work may be. We want no pity, but the prayers of all. We know we are called to this task and glory in its hardships. Our reward is the blessing of building on no man's foundation and in seeing the desperately lost truly saved. We echo the words of Martin Luther, "The God of battles lives today - The Lord Sabbath is His Name".

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT CONT.

SUBJECTIVELY:

Speaking subjectively, it might be well to point out that this Conference should prayerfully consider the advances that have been made (as will be revealed in the reports to follow) and feel perfectly free to discuss fully and carefully the program laid down by the General Secretary, Brother Hawkins. We should, also, know that whatever is decided here concerning our future program, promotionally, financially and otherwise, will be definitely required of us.

OBJECTIVELY:

Objective planning will bring into focus some definite steps that should be considered. These steps are the natural outgrowth of all that has been accomplished up to this moment. Expansion produces growing pains.

What we have been able to do only reveals what can be done. When a hobo is given a clean shirt and tie, he feels he must wash his face, get new shoes and comb his hair. One advance points up the need everywhere. The same is true of our District. We plan, pray and progress only to realize that we have but scratched the surface. In order to reach our objective, we will have to take a real long look at our District, correct mistakes, strengthen weak points, gird ourselves anew and launch out, clothed in the full armour of God.

PROPER ATTITUDE:

What is the proper attitude of a Capital District Pilgrim? First of all, and above all, he must always think District-wise. What is best for the District is what is best in promoting evangelism. The District Organization is the strong arm that promotes new missionary enterprises. When we honor our budget obligations, we are sending our offerings of love into the battle to continue the Forward Movement of evangelism. Every church in this Capital District is the result of sacrifice. Bro. & Sis. Clark Floor gave their all in order to establish Floor Memorial. Bro. & Sis. Foster stepped out on faith and a willingness to sacrifice. Pastors are gladly supporting themselves and preaching full time. Laymen are giving and going until they can do no more. And, back of all this, is the sacrificial giving of thousands of Pilgrims throughout the Church. Only as we encourage continual sacrificial living and giving, can we expect to be blessed and see God's Kingdom grow.

PERFECT ORGANIZATION:

Each church, in order to fill its place in the Capital District, must be thoroughly organized. Each member must find his place. The pastor must provide the leadership and reveal that leadership in his organization. To the extent that the pastor succeeds in organizing his people, to that extent can he be considered successful as a leader. A place for every person and every person in his place should be our goal.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT CON'T.

PERPETUAL PROMOTION:

Every leader is responsible for his plan or program. To be without a program is to start on a journey without a map. We may make the trip, but we will not make it directly or on time. Planning should include training of the laity in personal evangelism, in Sunday School work, in encouraging special talents and developing young lay ministers. It, also, should include promotional advertising, best suited to the location and circumstances of the church. Financial planning, also, is important so as to meet all obligations, local and district.

PURPOSEFUL FOLLOW-UP:

To consolidate the work wrought by the Spirit is the duty of every true shepherd. To follow up an advantage gained is the part of wisdom. To continually check, encourage, and follow-up a financial plan, at least once a quarter, is absolutely necessary. When it comes to follow-up, our work is never done. Nothing happens in this field unless we make it happen. Let us be sure that our follow-up is purposeful.

This four point plan, briefly presented in skeleton form, if worked, will bring definite results. If we are to realize the goal set before us this next year, we will have to have an aggressive attitude, a well oiled organization and God's plan.

All that I have recommended up to this point is based on the assumption that we are all faithful to the doctrines of our church and presently, are enjoying the blessings of full salvation and the cleansing of the Spirit.

As District Superintendent, I confess, I eagerly accept the challenge laid down by the enormity of the task set before us. May God grant us to work well and to do exploits for His Glory alone.

Finally, I refer you to that promise pregnant with challenge and assurance - I Cor.16:13 - "Watch, ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong".

My personal report is as follows:

Served as pastor, Edgewood from May to July 1957. Served as pastor, Yorkshire from September 1957 to April 1958. Held two revivals. Held three funerals. Held two weddings. Made 720 calls. Covered part of New York District in Deputational work. Covered part of Pennsylvania & New Jersey District in Deputational work. Organized and operated two Youth Camps. Held three S. S. Institutes. Attended Zone Ministerial, E.P.C. Attended two Board of Directors meetings, E.P.C. Served as Public Relations Man, E.P.C. District-wise: I have organized one church, 16 members and started one church, 8 members available. I have held six annual meetings and visited several churches on occasion. Travelled 46,000 miles in the performance of my duties. I have received \$1,920 for my services.

May God richly bless us as we take His business in hand and may He overshadow our deliberations.

Report of Ways & Means Committee.

Correction of Conference Rules in the 1957 Minutes: Carried.

The Ways & Means Committee notes the following items to be corrected in the Conference Rules set forth in the 1957 Minutes of the Capital District Conference under Ways & Means Resolution #1:

- a. In the preamble delete "For 1956-57".
- b. In paragraph 3 change "2/5" to "2/7".
- c. In paragraphs 4 & 5 "District General Fund" to read "District Administration Fund".

The Ways & Means presents the following Resolutions and recommends their adoption:
Resolution #1:

Whereas, the Treasurer's report previously given has shown that the estimated income of the Capital District will satisfy the requirements of the budget without requiring the use of funds under Ways & Means Resolution #5 of the Conference Rules, and
Whereas, the General Secretary of Church Extension has told this Conference of plans to establish eight(8) new churches in the Capital District in the next quadrennium,
Be it resolved that the following be substituted for Ways & Means Resolution #5 of the Conference Rules: "Whereas, it is desirable that new churches be established in the Capital District and that young churches be strengthened and
Whereas, preparation for assuming the responsibility of an organized district is desirable and would be gained in this manner.

Therefore, be it resolved that five dollars(\$5.00)per member per year be assessed each church of the Capital District.

Be it resolved, further, that this offering be forwarded by each church treasurer to the District Treasurer by 1 December of each year for use in furthering Home Missions Projects in the Capital District.

Resolution #2.

Whereas, Christian Education, with the facilities therefor, is one of the most important foundation stones of a free and democratic nation, exemplified by our United States of America, and

Whereas, the Capital District is part of the Eastern School Zone(of the Pilgrim Church)which is charged with the responsibility of supporting and promoting the

interest and well being of Eastern Pilgrim College in return for the privilege of having our children and Pilgrim young people given a guarded christian education there, and

Whereas, Eastern Pilgrim College merits the whole-hearted support and prayers of every christian in the Eastern School Zone in consideration of (a) the self-sacrificing devotion to God's work and to the Pilgrim Church by the College President and his Administrative and Teaching Staffs, (b) the high educational and christian standards of the College, (c) the great building program, presently under way at the College to enable it to meet the demands of additional students in the next few years, and (d) the efforts of E. P. C. Administration to continue to give the best education at the least possible cost to the student, and

Whereas, other districts of the Eastern School Zone, under Resolutions adopted by the individual districts, now support E. P. C. by means of a small levy of 25¢ per member per month.

Therefore, be it resolved that each church of the Capital District, subject to the approval of its Official Board or other local governing body, pay an amount equal to 25¢ per member each month for E. P. C. These funds shall be sent to the District Treasurer along with the District Budget each month for forwarded to E. P. C.

Further, be it resolved, that each delegate to this Conference be instructed to bring this Resolution to the attention of the Board or Officials of his church for consideration and action within sixty days following this Conference.

Further, be it resolved, that this Conference recommends and strongly urges the approval of this payment by each church of the Capital District.

CONFERENCE RULES

Ways and Means Resolutions

I

Be it resolved that the District Budget be raised as follows:

1. Each church in the District shall pay to the District Treasurer 7% of all offerings received by the church except those offerings designated for a specific purpose or activity (other than local church) such as: Missions, Church Extension, S. S. Extension (Rally Day), Colleges, and District projects.
2. All regular offerings of the church such as: tithes, building fund, S. S. and young people's offerings shall be subject to this assesement.
3. Two sevenths(2/7) of this budget shall be credited by the District Treasurer to the District Revolving Fund.
4. The remainder of the budget shall be credited to the District Administration Fund for use as required for District Administration.
5. All offerings received at District Rallies, Conferences and other meetings shall be credited to the District Administration Fund unless otherwise specifically designated or directed by the District Council.
6. The District Budget shall be paid to the District Treasurer by the 10th day of the following month.

II

Be it resolved that all loans made to individual churches from the District Revolving Fund shall be repaid with interest at the rate of 6% per annum. The interest shall be due and payable annually on the anniversary date of the loan.

III

Whereas, the Mannual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church provides for bi-annual visits by the District Superintendent to each church, Be it resolved that at these visits to the churches a plate offering shall be taken and given to the District Superintendent as a love offering.

IV

Be it resolved that 25% of the tithe of all pastors of congregations in the Capital District shall be sent by each church treasurer, or by the pastor, to the District Treasurer each month for application to the District Administration expenses.

C O N F E R E N C E R U L E S

V

Whereas, it is desirable that new churches be established in the Capital District and that young churches be strengthened and
Whereas, preparation for assuming the responsibilities of an organized district is desirable and would be gained in this manner.

Therefore, be it resolved that five dollars(\$5.00) per member per year be assessed each church of the Capital District.

Be it resolved further that this offering be forwarded by each church treasurer to the District Treasurer by 1 December of each year for use in furthering Home Missions projects in the Capital District. Also, that the District Council be directed to give a plan of operation to be presented by the District Superintendent to the churches, either generally or individually.

VI

Whereas christian education, with the facilities therefor, is one of the most important foundation stones of a free and democratic nation, exemplified by our United States of America, and

Whereas, the Capital District is part of the Eastern School Zone(of the Pilgrim Church)which is charged with the responsibility for supporting and promoting the interests and well-being of E.P.C. in return for the privilege of having our children and Pilgrim young people given a guarded christian education there, and

Whereas, E.P.C. merits the wholehearted support and prayers of every christian in the Eastern School Zone in consideration of (a) the self-sacrificing devotion to God's work and to the Pilgrim work of the College President and his administrative and teaching staffs, (b) the high educational and christian standards of the college (c) the great building program presently underway at the College to enable it to meet the demands of additional students in the next few years, and (d) the efforts of the E.P.C. Administration to continue to give the best education at the least possible cost to the student and

Whereas, other districts of the Eastern School Zone under Resolutions adopted by the individual districts now support E.P.C. by means of a small levy of 25¢ per member per month.

Therefore, be it resolved that each church of the Capital District, subject to the approval of its official board or other local governing body, pay an amount equal to 25¢ per member each month for E.P.C. These funds shall be sent to the District Treasurer along with the district budget each month for forwarding to E.P.C.

Further, be it resolved that each delegate to this Conference be instructed to bring this Resolution to the attention of the Board or officials of his church for consideration and action within sixty days following this Conference.

Further be it resolved that this Conference recommends and strongly urges the approval of this payment by each church of the Capital District.

STANDING RULES

1. TIME OF DISTRICT CAMP

Be it resolved that the annual District Camp Meeting be held over a ten day period including the second and third Sundays of July.

2. PASTOR'S VACATION

Each church is encouraged to give their pastor a two weeks vacation.

3. WORK PROGRAM FOR DISTRICT CAMP GROUNDS

The District Council shall determine the number of man hours required to prepare the grounds for campmeeting and that each year the Council requests each church to supply an equal share of man hours to complete the work.

4. DISTRICT YOUTH PROGRAM

Whereas the Youth Program of the Capital District is rapidly growing in size and importance, be it therefore resolved that upon the calling of the Superintendent, each pastor will make himself available for service during Youth Camp and that every pastor arrange his schedule so as to be available during the week of Pilgrim Youth Camp. The date of the Youth Camp is to be set one year in advance.

GENERAL RESOLUTIONS

1. TIME OF DISTRICT YOUTH MEETINGS

Whereas the local church program many times conflicts with the District Program and whereas each pastor is urged to support and promote every District function: Be it therefore, resolved that the third Friday of every other month, starting in September, be reserved for District Youth Rallies and functions. This is subject to change if conflicts should arise.

2. DISTRICT MINUTES

Be it resolved that the Editing Committee meet and have its work completed by June 30th of each year.

3. EDUCATIONAL AND EXAMINING BOARD

Be it resolved that the third year appointee of said Board be and hereby is appointed Chairman of said Board.

4. PILGRIM PENSION PLAN, INC.

Whereas the General Board of the Pilgrim Holiness Church has authorized the Pilgrim Pension Plan, Inc. to make loans of Pension Funds to local P. H. Churches under such conditions as require active participation on the part of P. H. Districts, therefore, Be it resolved by the annual Conference of this District that the District Council, District Trustees and all District officials be, and they are hereby, authorized to do and perform any and all acts required of them in the consumation of authorized loans to local P. H. Churches of this District, subject, however, to the limitation and conditions set out in said Resolution of the General Board of the P. H. Church authorizing said loans. (Adopted).
