PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING—Thursday A. M., July 20, 1944

The Eighth Annual Conference of the Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9 o'clock, Thursday, July 20, 1944, at 2117 Market Street, Hannibal, Missouri. The Conference joined in singing songs, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms" and "Glory to His Name." Prayer was made by Rev. H. T. Mills, president of the Bible Holiness Seminary, of Owosso, Michigan.

Rev. W. L. Surbrook, D.D., General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, was introduced by Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, District Superintendent. Brother Surbrook spoke to the Conference, using as his subject, "Pungent Points for Preachers."

The presiding officer, Rev. W. L. Surbrook, asked the secretary to call the roll of the Ministerial and Lay Delegates. This having been completed, the Conference Bar was fixed to include the first five rows of seats and the platform. Hours for Conference sittings were fixed as follows: 9 a. m. to 12:15 noon; 2 p. m. to 5 p. m.

The District Superintendent then appointed Rev. W. T. Johnson and Rev. B. Ivan Williams to serve as Reception Committee.

The District Superintendent gave an excellent report, which was duly accepted.

The new church at Hot Springs, Arkansas, was presented to the Conference at this time, and by due action of the Conference was received into the District. Rev. Mrs. Mary Wall, one of the pastors and Earnest Dickson were introduced to the Conference.

Rev. Leon L. Adams, District Statistician, gave the statistical report. Motion with its second that this report be received. Carried.

The Report of the Ways and Means Committee was then read and adopted. (See Report of Ways and Means Committee.)

The Resolution Committee gave a partial report which was adopted. (See Report of the Resolution Committee.)

Motion with its second that we have the election of District Officers at this time. Carried.

Tellers were appointed by the District Superintendent.

Reception Committee presented Rev. L. L. Miller, returned missionary from Barbados, British West Indies, and Rev. Orval C. Keller, Representative for General Home Missions; after words of greeting these brethren were seated on the platform.

Being now ready for the election of officers the conference knelt in silent prayer, after which Rev. W. L. Surbrook led in public prayer.

The election resulted as follows: Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, District Superintendent; Rev. Edward Boone, Assistant District Superintendent; Rev. W. Lloyd Smith, District Secretary; Rev. M. L. Peterson, District Treasurer. Additional Council Members as follows: Rev. Leon L. Adams, Rev. A. C. Wieand, Rev. I. E. Fields.

The Conference voted by acclamation that Rev. Edward Boone be elected to the Examining Board for the three year period.

Moved and seconded to adjourn until 2 p. m. Carried.

SECOND SITTING—Thursday P. M., July 20, 1944

The second sitting of the Eighth Annual Conference opened at 2:30 p. m. by singing songs: "Tell it to Jesus" and "No Not One." Prayer was made by the District Secretary, Rev. W. Lloyd Smith.

Brother Surbrook read from Colossians fourth chapter and continued his message on the subject, "Pungent Points for Preachers."

Motion made and seconded that, whereas the Conference Roll was completed by the Secretary, the calling of the Roll be dispensed with for the remainder of the Conference. Carried.

Secretary read the Minutes, of the First Sitting, which were approved.

Brother Surbrook spoke regarding to the closing of the Beulah Redemption Home at Springfield, Illinois, and about the General Church with its committee working on the plan for Old Age Assistance.

Report of the Auditing Committee was heard and accepted.

Treasurer's report was given by Rev. M. L. Peterson and on motion was accepted.

Examining Board gave their report and was duly accepted. (See Report of the Examining Board.)

Resolution Committee gave another partial report, which was accepted by motion.

The District Sunday School Board gave their report, which was encouraging and motion was made and seconded to accept the same.

The District Superintendent appointed the various committees.

Motion made and seconded to advise the Resolution Committee

to prepare a resolution regarding addresses and telephone numbers of ministers to be placed in the Conference Minutes. Carried.

Motion made and seconded to read the final resolutions of the Resolution Committee in the night service. Carried.

Motion made and seconded that any unfinished business be taken care of by the District Council. Carried.

The business of the Conference having been finished, it was moved and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried. Brother Surbrook dismissed the Conference with prayer.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE

1—Be it resolved that each of our resolutions remain in effect from year to year except when revoked by the District Conference.

2—Be it resolved that each pastor consult the District Superintendent before calling an evangelist.

3—Be it resolved that each church pay its offerings to deputational workers of the Bible School, Foreign Missions and Home Missions through the District Treasurer, so that the District will receive credit for the same.

4—Be it resolved that each pastor be permitted to conduct two revival meetings away from his own charge during each conference year, if it can be planned so as not to conflict with the local church work.

5—Since our Camp meeting is growing from year to year, and many items are needed such as bedding and cooking utensils, we recommend that each church furnish as many of these items as possible before next Camp. The District Council shall make a list of things needed and the pastors shall present this list to the churches.

6—Be it resolved that the Conference year close June 30th. All church and ministers' reports shall be sent immediately to the District Committee so that they may be compiled before the Conference. The District Treasurer shall close his books on July 10th, therefore money must be mailed to the District Treasurer by July 1st to be included in the annual report. By action of the District Conference all churches who pay their District and General Budgets in full will be counted star churches.

7—Be it resolved that the District Superintendent appoint all committees. All the above appointments shall be announced at this conference and their names printed in the Minutes.

8—Be it resolved that the District Council select the location and date for a Christian Workers Convention after receiving invitations from the churches and that we urge all ministers, Sunday School Superintendents and Young People's Workers to attend.

9—Be it resolved that the District Council select a location and date for our Conference and Camp and call the evangelist and workers.

10—Be it resolved, we have a Sunday School rally as was provided in the previous General Conference and two sacred pictures be provided by the District and given, one for gain in attendance above the previous quarter, and the other given on largest percentage of gain over the previous quarter.

11—Resolved that we request our District Superintendent to read the report of churches and their pastors for the coming year.

12—Resolved that we instruct our District Secretary to write a letter of appreciation to the Ft. Wayne Interdenominational Church and its pastor, Rev. W. P. Staupher, for their gifts to us as a District and Church.

13—Be it resolved that all pastors or delegates bring a picture of their church and parsonage by the next Conference time. That the pictures of the District Council be included in the District Minutes.

14—Be it resolved that all the ministers' telephone numbers be added to the Conference Roll of our minutes.

15—Be it resolved, that the District Council elect a District Sunday School Board of four including the District Superintendent. The duties of the District Sunday School Board, in harmony with the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, shall be as follows:

1—The District Sunday School Board shall arrange for an annual Sunday School Convention to be held at the time of the Christian Workers' Convention.

2—To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the District.

3—To present an annual report to the District Conference which shall include the following.

(a) A Statement of the work accomplished during the year.

(b) A Statement of the general condition of the Sunday School work on the District.

(c) To recommend to the District Conference through the Ways and Means Committee the amount considered necessary to finance the District Sunday School work.

4—The District Sunday School Board shall be amenable to the District Council.

5—The District Council shall have the right to remove, or cause

to be removed, any member of the District Sunday School Board who, in the judgment of such Council, is not in harmony with the teaching of the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

6—If for any reason there is a vacancy on the District Sunday School Board, the District Council, by a majority vote, may fill the vacancy.

7—The District Sunday School Board shall work in conjunction with the General Sunday School Committee in promoting the Annual Rally Day, etc.

8—To have published each month a District Sunday School sheet showing the attendance of each Sunday School on the District for the month, the preceding month, and the attendance for the same month a year ago, as well as the average attendance for the year, this sheet to be sent to each pastor and he make it his duty to see it reaches the reporter.

16—Inasmuch as we see the need of increasing the attendance in our Sunday School, be it resolved that we ask our churches to sponsor and conduct Daily Vacation Bible Schools. Be it further resolved that we ask our District Sunday School Board to give all the assistance possible in giving information and securing supplies.

17—Be it resolved that we express our appreciation to the following for their labors in the Conference by a rising vote of thanks and a hearty "God Bless You."

To Rev. W. O. Bottenberg, our District Superintendent, for his splendid spiritual work and untiring efforts this past year over the District.

To Rev. and Mrs. W. L. Smith, pastors of the Hannibal Church and their good people for their hospitality and their liberality in entertaining this Conference and beautifying the church by placing before us these beautiful flowers.

To the St. John's Lutheran Church of this city and their pastor, Rev. Schwehn, for the use of their fine dining room and kitchen.

To Rev. W. L. Smith, our secretary; Rev. M. L. Peterson, our treasurer; and Rev. L. L. Adams, our statistician, for their efficient and accurate work.

To Rev. H. T. Mills, our evangelist, who gave out the Word of God, proving a blessing and help to all.

To Rev. L. L. Miller, our foreign missionary representative, for the convincing and inspiration services given, showing God's hand upon our work and workers in these perilous times.

To Sister W. O. Bottenberg, for her sweet and efficient leadership of our Young People's Services.

To Miss Ethel Watkins and her mother, Mrs. Della Watkins, our cooks, for their splendid food prepared and served during this Camp and Conference.

REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

We recommend the adoption of the following as the combined district and general budget.

"It is very essential that the total budget for each church be met and if not the District Council shall enforce Section 87, Paragraph 3 of the Manual, which reads as follows:

"Any church or pastor failing to raise their budget and having no good reason therefor shall be denied a voice in the District Conference."

1. All licensed and ordained ministers and evangelists of this Conference shall pay their tithe from income from ministerial labors into the District Treasury for the support of the District Superintendent and the District work.

2. Each licensed and ordained minister of this Conference shall pay a Conference Claim of one dollar a month or twelve dollars a year to the District Treasury. No credentials will be renewed unless the conference claim is paid, unless a special exemption is granted by a vote of the District Council.

3. The churches shall be apportioned the following monthly amounts for the District Budget: (District Budget includes moneys used for the support and expense of the District officers, District Home Missions. and Miscellaneous District Expense.)

4. Since this is now the fourth year following the organization of our district into a fully organized district, and in accordance with Section 109, Paragraph 2 of the Church Manual, each church shall pay to the General Budget an annual amount equal to \$3.00 for each member of voting age. We recommend that this be paid in monthly payments to the district treasurer.

5. The Churches shall be apportioned the following annual amounts for the Bible Holiness Seminary, Owosso, Michigan:

6. The District Superintendent shall visit each Church and preaching point at least two times during the year. He shall be allowed the privilege of holding two revival meetings off the District. The remainder of his time shall be devoted to District evangelism and home missionary work.

7. The District Superintendent shall be paid a salary of \$135.00 a month plus rent not to exceed \$40.00 a month, and three cents a mile for traveling on the District in visiting churches and Home Missionary work. He shall be allowed expense for postage, telephone and telegrams. He shall be permitted to keep his offerings for evangelistic meetings over and above his salary but shall pay his own traveling expenses to and from same.

8. The Kansas City church shall pay to the District the sum of \$260.00 for the year as salary for the services of the District Superintendent who is serving as pastor.

9. At each visit of the District Superintendent the churches shall take an offering for him, the same to be applied on his traveling expenses and the church shall be credited for this amount on the District Budget. The District Superintendent shall send all such offerings to the District Treasurer, who shall receipt the churches for the same.

10. There shall be a Camp and Conference registration fee of \$1.00 per person for those above 12 years of age and 50c for those between the ages of 5 and 12 years.

11. The District Treasurer shall set aside \$20.00 a month from the District Budget fund for a special Camp and Conference fund toward the expenses of the Annual Conference.

12. The District Treasurer shall be paid \$60.00 for his services during the year, the District Secretary \$30.00 for his services, and the Statistician \$20.00.

13. The District Treasurer shall set aside \$75.00 each year for General Conference expense. This money shall be taken from the District Budget fund.

14. Inasmuch as there is such a great need for money in our District for Home Missions and Church Extension work, we recommend that each church be asked to raise during the year an amount equivalent to \$1.00 per member for the District Home Missions fund.

We further recommend that the fund be raised through the Sunday Schools and Young People's Societies.

TO THE EIGHTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE CENTRAL DISTRICT OF THE PILGRIM HOLINESS CHURCH.

Greetings:

We give praise to Almighty God for the privilege of meeting again in an annual Conference. Truly the Blessings of the Lord have been upon Central District, and while the past year has been one of many problems, yet we have felt the presence of God at all times, and we are thankful for each victory. As a District we are enjoying a sweet spirit of cooperation, and we have advanced along all lines.

God has given us a 5.5% gain in membership, and an increase in our Sunday School attendance, and a good financial year with a gain of 39.8%. One new church has been organized near Hot Springs, Arkansas, a beautiful Stucco Church valued at least at \$2000.00 has been dedicated free of debt. Rev. and Mrs. C. A. Wall are the pastors. A beautiful history is connected with this new church. A Sunday School was first organized in the School House, and the use of this building being denied these good people, they continued on with their Sunday School using the shade of the friendly trees in the summer, and an old shed in the winter. They missed only two sessions in the two years; then God gave them faith and vision for a new building. They immediately started to work, and God supplied the need in answer to their prayers, and we predict a great future for this new church.

Our Des Moines Church has greatly reduced their indebtedness and no doubt will be completely out of debt in just a few months. They have purchased two very beautiful electric signs at the cost of several hundred dollars, and I am sure that this added attraction is appreciated by the entire City of Des Moines. The greatest attraction in this church is the spiritual fervor, and the presence of God in each of the services. God has greatly blessed the church and the Boone family despite the fact that Brother Boone has been ill a great deal of the time and able to preach but very few times. Will we not as a district remember him daily in our prayers.

The Council Bluffs church has re-decorated the interior, the Pacific Junction church has remodeled, the Omaha church has added Sunday School rooms in their basement. Garden Grove has paid off the indebtedness on their parsonage. Eddyville has made advancement in their new building. The new pews in the Hannibal church are a great improvement. The Jonesboro Pilgrims have remodeled and have a beautiful auditorium. Kansas City Pilgrims are making plans for a building program in October.

God has helped us in Kansas City, and we are gaining each month in getting the church established. With the exception of visiting the churches of the District, we have used all of our time in Kansas City. We have covered the District twice, and visited some of the churches more than twice. We attended a School Board meeting in Owosso, and the Superintendents' Conference in Indianapolis, Indiana, in May, and in all traveled about 25,000 miles.

We are thankful for the \$756.59 in the Home Mission Evangelistic Fund. Let us all pray for \$2000.00 in this fund, that we may be able to launch a Missionary program in another of our fine cities.

We wish to take this opportunity to thank the District for the beautiful flowers sent at the time of our Mother's death, July 11.

Without a doubt, each victory and accomplishment of the past year has been brought about because of the cooperation of all.
