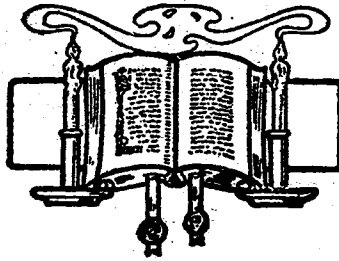

## PROCEEDINGS

### FIRST SITTING — Monday A. M., — July 19, 1948

The twelfth annual conference of Central District convened at 10:00 A. M., at the Holiness Camp Grounds at Troy, Mo. The conference was opened by singing, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." Rev. Fields of Jonesboro, Ark., conducting the singing. Rev. J. Orvan Keller, presiding at the piano. Prayer was offered by Rev. L. A. Braden of Paragould, Ark. After prayer the conference joined in singing another hymn entitled, "Glory to His Name." Rev. Catey introduced, Dr. L. W. Sturk, to the conference. After remarks by Rev. Sturk, our presiding officer, Rev. A. L. Wilson was introduced. Rev. Wilson gave greetings, afterward reading to the conference from Phil. 2.

Rev. Sturk again took the chair and called for the reading of the conference roll by secretary.

After reading the roll the conference bar was set to include first ten seats of the middle section of tabernacle. By due action, Rev. Charles Riggs, was voted a seat in the conference bar, in as much as he is taking a pastorate at the St. Louis First Church. At this time vacancy on committee were completed. Mrs. Frank Salvador and Mrs. Ben Bebermeyer were appointed as reception committee.

The report of the District Superintendent was called for but was not ready. The auditing committee report was called for and given which was duly accepted.

Rev. Ellis G. Maness, District Treasurer, was called upon to give his report which was excellently prepared. This report received by due action. Reception committee presented to the conference the following.

Rev. P. E. Brown, promotional Secretary of District Sunday School, was called upon for his report which was verbally given. This report was received by due action.

Mrs. Myrtle Rogers, chairman of the resolution committee, came forward and gave the report of the said committee which was approved.

### SECOND SITTING

The Second Sitting of the district conference convened at 2:00 P. M. Rev. Fields led the conference in singing. Rev. Keller at the piano. Rev. Boone, pastor at Des oMines, Iowa, led the conference in prayer, praying for Rev. H. D. Dieter, who is desperately ill at this time.

Rev. and Mrs. J. Orvan Keller sang at this time to the delight and blessing of us all. A song entitled, "I'm Not Disappointed in Jesus."

By common consent the reading of the roll was omitted.

Minutes of the morning sitting was read through. Rev. Smith, pastor of the Fire Baptized Church of Troy, Mo., and Rev. Ray Deason, introduced to the conference. Rev. Smith was granted an honorary seat within the conference bar.

Mrs. Myrtle Rogers continued the report of the resolution committee. Motion was at second to table the resolution in regards to the dividing of the Central District until the Ways and Means Committee was given. Carried.

The Ways and Means Committee report was read by Rev. P. E. Brown. This report accepted by due action. Motion was second to extend the time for the District Superintendent to give his report.

District Superintendent came forward and gave his report which was accepted.

Motion made and second to extend the time 30 minutes. Carried.

The report of the examining board was given by Rev. W. L. Smith, which report was accepted.

Moved and accepted to send telegram to California conference advising of the eligibility of V. Ivan Williams for ordination and urging their conference to confer these orders. Carried.

Motion was second to instruct the secretary to send out all report blanks. Carried.

### THIRD SITTING

The Third Sitting of the district conference convened at 7:00 P. M. Rev. Fields led the conference in singing. "Our Lord's Return to Earth" and "He Brought me Out." Rev. Smith presiding at the piano. Bro. Lulf led the conference in prayer.

Bro. Sturk spoke to the conference to the edification of all present.

Rev. Ben Bebermeyer gave a report of the District Young People's Work. This report accepted by the conference.

The election of officers being the order of the conference. Rev. Catey appointed tellers. Viz.-Rev. Adams, Rev. Maness, Rev. Bittick, Rev. Bebermeyer. The conference knelt and Rev. Sturk offering prayer. Ballot was cast for the election of District Superintendent. Rev. Catey being elected.

Ballot for Assistant District Superintendent was cast. Rev. Brown being elected.

Ballot for secretary was cast being Rev. Smith. District Treasurer was nominated for District Council. Ellis Maness, the nominee elected by unanimous acclamation. The following advisory members of the District Council were elected. Rev. Boone from Iowa, Rev. Braden, and Rev. Johnson from Arkansas.

Rev. Bottenberg was elected as member of the examining board. Moved and second to have three ministerial conventions of short duration. These conventions to be held at Des Moines, Iowa, Springfield, Mo., Jonesboro, Ark.

The Resolution committee gave their final report which was accepted. By due action the conference was adjourned and dismissed.

#### REPORT OF THE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE

1. Be it resolved that each of our resolutions remain in effect from year to year except when revoked by the District Conference.

2. Be it resolved that each church pay its offerings to deputational workers of the Bible Holiness Seminary, Foreign Missions and Home Missions through the District Treasurer, so that the District will receive credit for the same.

3. Be it resolved that each pastor be permitted to conduct two revival meetings away from his own charge during each conference year, if it can be planned so as not to conflict with the local church work.

4. Be it resolved that the Conference year close June 30th. All church and Ministers' reports shall be sent immediately to the District Statistician so that they may be compiled before the Conference. The District Treasurer shall close his books on July 5th; therefore, money must be mailed to the District Treasurer by July 1st to be included in the annual report. By action of the District Conference, all churches who pay their District and General Budgets in full will be counted star churches. The treasurer will post a chart during each Conference, showing monies received from each church.

5. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent appoint all committees. All the above appointments shall be announced at this Conference and their names be printed in the Minutes.

6. Be it resolved that the District Council select the location and date for a Christian Workers Convention after receiving invitations from the churches and that we urge all ministers, Sunday School superintendents, and young people's workers to attend.

7. Be it resolved that the District Council select a location and date for our Conference and Camp and call the evangelist and workers.

8. Be it resolved, we have a Sunday School rally as was provided in the previous General Conference and two sacred pictures or banners



be provided by the District and given, one for gain in attendance above the previous quarter, and the other given on the largest percentage of gain over the previous quarter. That only schools who report regularly shall be eligible. The eligibility of such schools shall be left to the discretion of the Sunday School Secretary and Sunday School Board Chairman.

9. Be it resolved that the pictures of the District Council be included in the District Minutes.

10. Be it resolved that the telephone numbers of all ministers be added to the Conference Roll in our Minutes.

11. Be it resolved that the District Council elect a District Sunday School Board of four, including the District Superintendent. The duties of the District Sunday School Board, in harmony with the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, shall be as follows:

1. The District Sunday School Board shall arrange for an annual Sunday School Convention to be held at the time of the Christian Workers Convention and that the morning services of one day be devoted for that purpose.
2. To promote and encourage the Sunday School work throughout the District.
3. To present an annual report to the District Conference which shall include the following:
  - (a) A statement of the work accomplished during the year.
  - (b) A statement of the general condition of the Sunday School work, on the District.
  - (c) To recommend to the District Conference through the Ways and Means Committee the amount considered necessary to finance the District Sunday School Work.
4. The District Sunday School Board shall be amenable to the District Council.
5. The District Council shall have the right to remove, or cause to be removed, any member of the District Sunday School Board who, in the judgment of such Council is not in harmony with the teaching of the Manual of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.
6. If for any reason there is a vacancy on the District Sunday School Board, the District Council, by a majority vote, may fill the vacancy.
7. The District Sunday School Board shall work in conjunction with General Sunday School Committee in promoting the Annual Rally Day, etc.
8. To have published each month a District Sunday School sheet showing the attendance of each Sunday School on the District for the month, the preceding month, and the attendance for the same month a year ago, as well as the average attendance for the year. This sheet to be sent to each pastor and he make it his duty to see it reach the reporter.
12. Resolved that inasmuch as we see the need of increasing the attendance in our Sunday School, be it resolved that we ask our churches to sponsor and conduct Daily Vacation Bible Schools, and send a report of same to the annual Conference. Be it further resolved that we ask our District Sunday School Board to give all the assistance possible in giving information and securing supplies.
13. To acquaint, encourage and promote the spiritual interest of our District be it resolved that each of our pastors hold week end revivals, conventions or rallies and use the pastors and evangelists of our District.
14. Be it resolved that no church or evangelist arrange his revival

so as to conflict with the District Camp and Conference.

15. Be it resolved that the Council adopt measures whereby the local pastor may have sufficient help for making needy preparations and restoring in order the same before and after camp.

16. We recommend that each pastor during the Conference give to the Secretary the number of copies of District Minutes needed to supply their church.

17. Whereas Young People of Central District have a paper "Abintra" published each month which has been a blessing to young and old. Be it resolved that a four page paper under the name "Abintra" be published, the editor appointed by the District Council. Be it further resolved that the front page be for our Young People—one page for the District Superintendent and news from churches—one page for Sunday School Reports which is now published each month, and one page for financial reports from the District Treasurer. The space allotment for each department is to be flexible.

18. Resolved that the Secretary shall issue credentials to those entitled to them while they are at this Conference if present; and if not present they shall be mailed within a week.

19. Resolved that those having reports for the Minutes have them completed and turned over to the editing committee within two weeks from date of Conference. The editing Committee shall be given three weeks to complete them within one month. These minutes shall be mailed to the churches by October 10th and if not, suitable excuse will be requested at the next Conference.

20. Be it resolved that due to the geographical size of this District, we discuss before this Conference the dividing of Central District, to determine the sentiment of the same, and that this Conference send a recommendation to the General Board for action.

21. Be it resolved that we express our appreciation to the following for their labors in the Conference, by a rising vote of thanks and a hearty "God bless you."

To Rev. L. W. Sturk, our General Superintendent and A. H. Wilson, second assistant General Superintendent for their efficient work as chairmen of this Conference.

To the Fire Baptised pastors and their churches, namely: Troy, Elsberry, Bowling Green, Bellflower and Whiteside, Missouri, appreciation for their hospitality and liberality to this Camp and Conference and we further recommend that the District Secretary send letters to each pastor of these churches expressing our thanks.

Rev. D. E. Wilson and H. B. Jackson, our evangelists, who gave out the Word of God; proving a great spiritual blessing to all.

To Rev. and Mrs. A. M. Doll, our Foreign Missionary representatives, for the convincing and inspiring services given, showing God's hand upon our work and workers.

To Rev. R. A. Beltz, our Secretary of Home Missions, for his inspiring services given, showing the improvements in our home land.

To Ben Bebermeyer, our District Young People's Secretary, for his work done with our young people.

To Rev. W. L. Smith, our secretary, Rev. Ellis Maness, our treasurer, and Rev. Leon L. Adams, our statistician, for their efficient and accurate work.

To Rev. F. Paul Bittick and Elmer Briggs, for their fine work in auditing the District Treasurer's books.

To Rev. W. L. Surbrook, President of our Bible School in Owosso, Michigan, for his interest shown and messages given in behalf of our young people, while representing our school.

We wish to thank Mrs. Cleo Turner, our cook, and Sister Catey and Sister Adams and all others who assisted in preparing and serving the splendid food during this Camp and Conference.

## REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

We the ways and means committee, present the following recommendations for your consideration.

1. That all departments of the church pay through the local treasurer to the District Treasurer, ten percent of their gross income, with the exception of money raised for evangelistic purposes, and building fund. The building fund is to consist of specified amounts for new buildings or additions, and not to include improvements, remodeling, redecorating, or debts on property. We also recommend that each assessable member pay four dollars per year into the local church for the General Budget. We further recommend that all ordained and licensed ministers pay their tithe into the local church treasury of which they are members. The responsibility of remitting this amount shall rest with the local church treasurer and pastor. We also recommend that this money be paid weekly.

2. The District Treasurer shall pay \$250.00 to the Bible Holiness Seminary, at Owosso, Michigan.

3. The District Superintendent shall devote six months of the year to district work. We recommend that he visit each church twice during the year. We further recommend that he serve three months in developing at least one home-missionary project.

4. The District Superintendent is to be paid a salary of \$1200.00 per year. The District shall pay all train and bus fare, postage, and telephone expenses, and if automobile is used, he shall be allowed four cents per mile.

5. At each visit of the District Superintendent the church shall take a free-will offering for him. The church shall receive credit from the District Treasurer for this offering.

6. There shall be a Camp and Conference charge of \$1.00 per day for persons above twelve years of age, for registration and meals. Those under twelve years of age fifty cents per day. Children under twelve years of age of ministers in active district service will be registered without charge. We further recommend that registration without charge be given to those needed to operate the dining-room in exchange for their services. We further recommend that each church pay the Camp and Conference fee for its pastor and his wife and delegate, and that the

Conference assume this fee for active district evangelists.

7. The District Treasurer shall set aside twenty dollars a month for a special Camp and Conference Fund towards the expenses of the annual Camp and Conference.

8. The District Treasurer shall be paid ten dollars per month for his services during the year, and the District Secretary \$30.00 for his services and the Statistician \$30.00.

9. The District Treasurer shall set aside \$150.00 this year for General Conference expenses.

10. In as much as the Pension plan for preachers has been passed by the General Conference, therefore, be it resolved that we encourage all of our pastors and evangelists to co-operate with this plan.

### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT REPORT

To the Twelfth Annual Conference of the Central District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, now in session at Troy, Missouri. Greetings in the name of Him who bought us with his own blood.

As we come to the end of the conference year we pause to give thanks unto God who giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. While it has been a very busy year and not without its problems we can say, truly, it has been a year of sweetest fellowship and richest blessing on our own soul.

As we entered into this new field of labour we were keenly conscious of our weakness and our utter dependence upon God but remembered He had said, "go and I will go with you," and "Lo I am with you even unto the end," and tho' we have not seen accomplished all that we desired, we do feel that he has verified that promise. Nearly every church has had an increase in Sunday School and many have reported good revivals. Organization has been delayed at Prairie Grove, Ark., and Malvern, Iowa, because it was impossible to obtain a building in which to worship. A home missionary tent meeting at Runnels, Iowa, reached a few souls but did not result in an organization. A preaching point and Sunday School has been established at Grand River, Iowa, in a school house and also near Prairie Grove, Ark. Bro. Brantley has started a mission in the city of Hot Springs, Ark., and is looking forward to organizing a church there soon.

Plans are going forward for remodeling the church at Springfield, Mo., and money is coming in for the new church building to be erected soon at Webster Groves, Mo. Bro. Bitticks has completed a splendid basement under the church at Poplar Bluff, with Sunday School rooms, rest rooms, drinking fountains, etc. The Council Bluff Church has re-decorated the interior and built new steps outside. With the exception of Garrison, Mo., and McFadden, Ark., I have visited all the churches at least twice and most of them three times and some of them many times. I held an eight-day revival at Kansas City and a two week's meeting at Webster Groves with a number of souls seeking justification or sanctification. There has been several seekers and happy finders in some of the regular visits.

My work on the district has called for over 17,500 miles of travel; I have preached 210 times and conducted a number of funerals, presided over 15 annual meetings and have been present in a number of board meetings. The pastors and their people have been very kind to me, and their fellowship has been sweet. For my labors I have received on salary, \$2150.00, on my traveling expenses from the Treasurer, \$128.29

and direct from churches \$111.31; on rent \$400.00 a total of \$2789.50.

May God grant to us all His gracious and needed guidance for the coming year, and if Jesus should come before another annual conference shall convene, may we all be found in Him, in Peace, without spot and blameless.
