## JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

God in His wise providence allowed Pilgrim delegates from Arkansas, Iowa, Missouri and Oklahoma to assemble at Springfield, Missouri, for the First Annual Conference of the Central District.

The Conference was called to order by District Superintendent Rev. C. B. Colaw.

Rev. W. O. Bottenberg led the Conference in singing, "We're Marching to Zion."

Rev. J. F. Wilson led the Conference in prayer.

Rev. C. B. Colaw introduced Rev. Dale Emery, General Secretary of Sunday School and Youth, to the Conference.

Rev. Melvin Snyder, General Superintendent, was introduced to the Conference.

Rev. Snyder read the Scripture lesson from Revelation 3, then proceeded to give us some thoughts on the lesson.

1. Spiritual Perceptibility—"Let Him Hear." This implies the truth that "the Spirit does have something to say to the Churches." He continued by saying, "He has something to say to us." Then we were admonished to, "Hear the Spirit of God—Give Him Audience."

2. Spiritual Conflict—Him that Overcometh." Rev. Snyder encouraged us to "Arm Ourselves with great determination and anticipation."

3. Infallible Appraisal—"I Know Thy Works," "God knows us." He knows "Our weakness and strength." He knows, "the motive behind your works."

4. Spiritual Responsibility—"Unto the Messenger of the Church." The

laymen were urged to take into serious consideration the responsibility of the Minister — Be in prayer. The Ministers were urged to a 'Holy Courage,' and to dispense their responsibility in Faithfulness to God and the people. Rev. Snyder said, "This will result in the Honor of God upon the people individually and collectively as a church and a Conference."

## REPORTS TO CONFERENCE

### REPORT OF W. O. BOTTENBERG, Superintendent of North Central District

To our esteemed General Superintendent, Dr. Melvin H. Snyder, our fine District Superintendent, Rev. Charles Colaw, fellow ministers and delegates to the first Conference of the Central District — Greetings! May God's blessings continue in our midst. It is indeed a pleasure and privilege to meet here in Springfield for our first annual conference of our merged districts, now known as Central District.

The past year of 1962-63 has indeed been a very busy one. Mrs. Bottenberg and I moved to Mexico, Missouri, in March, 1959, after pastoring the first church in St. Louis for a very enjoyable ten years, while also superintending the district.

At the time of our move to Mexico, we were not acquainted with anyone there, but in our many times of visiting the North Central District and driving through this attractive little city, we felt that God would someday give us a church there. Thus feeling the leadings of the Lord, we made this move, leaving St. Louis. Soon God had awarded our obedience by allowing us to organize a fine group of Pilgrims in Mexico. A building site was purchased and after quite a lengthy delay of receiving the abstract, the building of a new Pilgrim Holiness Church began. A great part of the labor of building the church was donated by pastor, members and friends. Much of my time was spent during the months of August, September, and October of this conference year, working on this new church building.

The price of material for the building of the church amounted to \$9,067.98. The church site was purchased at a cost of \$2,750.00, making a total of \$11,817.98. The Mexico Pilgrims have paid into the building fund the sum of \$817.98, leaving a total balance of \$11,000.00, \$6,500 to the North Central District, and \$4,500 to the Mexico Savings Bank. Since January 1, the church has paid \$50.00 per month on the Mexico Savings Bank Loan.

The Rev. and Mrs. William H. Neff were with us for the dedication service of the new church on October 28, this conference year. A wonderful spirit

prevailed, and a very full house of fellow Pilgrims and friends, helped to make it a wonderful day.

This year I have visited each church of the district twice. I have attended the church leaders' conference in Indianapolis, the three district merger meetings and the annual board meeting of Central Pilgrim College at Bartlesville, one District Youth—Sunday School—Missionary Convention in Kansas City. One Zone Youth and Sunday School Rally was held in our church in Mexico, under the direction of our Youth and Sunday School leaders, Rev. Robert Keith and Dr. Glen Springer. I have traveled 7,838 miles in the interest of the North Central District, have pastored the church in Mexico, preached 96 times, conducted many of the prayer services, have carried on a very fine Home Department with an enrollment of 20, have made 440 calls, and have dealt with many in personal work.

We have a very fine group of young people in our Mexico church, who faithfully attend all the services and are a real blessing to the church. Our night services are well attended and are evangelistic. It has been my privilege to help the man we purchased the building site from to find God. After kneeling at our altar and praying through for the first time in his life, he arose to testify, saying he thanked God for saving him, and that He had sent the Pilgrims to build their church on this ground adjoining his, and that which he and his father had sold. A few nights later he became a member of the church and was elected to the church board.

God has been giving us some very fine altar services for which we praise Him. Another man living just a few doors from the church has prayed through. God has delivered him from the use of tobacco, and he gives a glowing testimony. We believe he, too, will soon be a Pilgrim.

I have served the North Central District for 22 years as superintendent and have this year accepted the pastorate of the Pilgrim Holiness Church in Enid, Oklahoma. If I live and Jesus tarries, I am sure God can make this the best year of my life, as I continue in His service, working as hard as I can work for the upbuilding of His Kingdom in Enid, Oklahoma.

While I address my greetings to the Conference of the newly formed Central District, the report of my activities of the past year will reflect largely the labors performed on the Oklahoma District. That part of this report which looks forward will be relevant to the entire new District.

**SUPPLEMENT**

Due to the merger of the North Central, Oklahoma, and South Central Districts, the expense has been far above normal. The Oklahoma District Council agreed to assume all of the expenses incurred by Rev.
