## JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

1965 District Conference — July 27, 1965

The Third Annual Conference of the Central District of The Pilgrim Holiness Church convened July 27, 1965 at 10:00 a.m. at the Sheltering Heights Camp Ground, Springfield Missouri. Due to a conflict of dates, our General Superintendent, Dr. William H. Neff, could not be with us, thus Rev. C. B. Colaw, District Superintendent, presided in the chair. Conference was opened by singing, "I Am Thine O Lord," led by Rev. Calvin Jantz, evangelist for the camp current in progress.

Prayer was led by Mr. Merlin Budy, S. S. Superintendent of the Pleasant View, Oklahoma, Church and Mr. Herbert Buell, S. S. Superintendent of the Des Moines, Iowa, Church.

Rev. Colaw asked the District Secretary, Harold Monroe, to read a letter of greeting from our General Superintendent in which he expressed regret that he could not be present because of a conflict of Conferences. He further asked Rev. Colaw to chair the Conference and expressed his confidence in him as a leader and asked the cooperation of the conference.

The Conference bar was established to include the first six rows of pews on both sides of the aisle and also the front table.



Sessions were established as follows: present session will conclude at 12:00 noon, reconvene at 1:30 and continue until 5:00 p.m.; to reconvene at 7:00 p.m., if necessary.

The District Superintendent gave his report in mimeographed form and the report was accepted by the Conference without him reading it.

The Assistant District Superintendent's report was heard and accepted.

The Auditor was not present for his report.

The Treasurer gave his report and distributed copies to the delegation. A motion approving the report of the treasurer carried.

Rev. Colaw gave recognition to the churches who have their budgets paid in full. The pastors and delegates of these churches were asked to stand as their churches names were called. The Churches were: Alva, Bartlesville First, Council Bluffs, Des Moines, Eddyville, Glenwood, Hannibal, Hopeton, Jonesboro, Kansas City, Pleasant View, St. Louis, Springfield, Stanley, Warrenton, and Webster Groves. A motion of appreciation to the churches which have paid their budgets in full was passed by the Conference.

Upon recommendation of the Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. John Wilson, a motion was made to rescind the former action to omit the public reading of the District Superintendent's report. The action was rescinded and Rev. Colaw read his report.

A formal motion was made commending Rev. Colaw for his fine work, Christian Spirit and energetic manner of his leadership during the past year.

The Educational and Examining Board gave a partial report in which they recommended District License be granted to Max Colaw. Recommendation was approved by the Conference, thus accepting Rev. Colaw into the Conference.

The Statistical report was called for. A motion that only the totals of the Statistical reports be read was moved and carried. Statistician, Rev. J. H. Fortner, gave his report, and it was accepted by the Conference.

The District Superintendent gave exhortation to the Conference regarding the keeping of accurate records and giving prompt reports as they are required, emphasizing that this is a matter that all can do if we care. He emphasized the efforts of the Statistician are "meaningless" because the reports from some churches are inaccurate and incomplete.

A motion was made and carried that the District Superintendent report in the "Central District Pastor" the names of the churches and pastors who have failed to send in their monthly and quarterly reports.

The report of Sunday School Promotional Secretary, Rev. Ben Bebermeyer, was called for, was read to, and received by the Conference.

Attention was then called by the Promotional Secretary to the fact that church membership in the District was growing faster than the Sunday School gains. Honor was given to the growing Sunday Schools by asking that the Sunday School Superintendent or the Pastor to wear the ribbons of honor that were presented them at this time. A hand was given to all who shared gains.

The District Missionary President, Mrs. P. E. Brown gave her report indicating that this has been a good year on the Central District. This report was received with a hearty "Amen".

A motion was made and carried that the afternoon session of the Conference should meet in the open air tabernacle.

Following announcements, the Conference recessed by expiration of time for the setting.

## Setting No. 2

The afternoon session was opened by the chair, Rev. C. B. Colaw, and Eldon Russell led in singing "Every Day With Jesus". Special prayer was requested for Sister Puffer, wife of the pastor of the Council Bluffs, Iowa, Church. Prayer was led by William Schloeman.

The Conference Bar was set on the first six pews in the two north rows of the open air auditorium.

The Ways and Means Committee was asked to report. Rev. J. F. Wilson read the report. Resolutions No. 1 and No. 2 were recommended as printed in the 1964 minutes. Resolution No. 3, dealing with the Superintendent's salary was amended to read, "The District Superintendent shall receive a salary of \$4800.00 per year, and 6 cents per mile for traveling expenses. After some discussion, said resolution was tabled until the Treasurer could be present.

Action on Resolution No. 1 was tabled until we considered Resolution No. 3. Resolution No. 2 carried. Resolution No. 4, 5, 6, 7 & 8 carried as printed in the 1964 Conference Journal. Resolution No. 9 adopted with the understanding that it be edited to make clear that both lay and ministerial delegates be included.

The Resolutions Committee was asked to report, and Rev. E. Maness gave the report.

No. 1. The Committee recommended that we delete the last sentence. Motion carried.

No. 2. Regarding the Camp, Conference, and Youth Camp. This matter was discussed at length and then referred to the committee for redrafting.

No. 3. It was moved to amend this resolution by dropping the first two sentences. The amendment carried. A substitute motion was supported that a committee appointed by the council be empowered to select a site for next year's camp. The motion to substitute carried. The Substitute motion carried.

No. 4. Regarding a proposed Kansas City site for the District Headquarters. The Superintendent recommended that this Conference ask the Council to appoint a committee to study this matter for a year, and come back next year with a report and a recommendation to the Conference. A motion was supported to refer this to the District Council and that they meet and come back with some plan for preliminary effort at Kansas City. The District Superintendent is to give extra attention to this area. Amendment carried.

Realizing that the conference could not conclude business by 5:00 p.m., a motion was made to: Set the time to reconvene at 9:00 a.m. Tuesday morning. This motion was amended that we reconvene at 5:30 p.m. this evening. A motion to table this motion until we see how far we get with the business of the Conference in this session. Motion carried.

No. 5. Resolution carried.

No. 6. Resolution granting the District Superintendent a two week vacation with pay. Resolution carried.

The Conference was recessed for ten minutes. Upon reconvening, the Conference united in a few minutes of silent prayer.

The Resolutions Committee was asked to continue their report.

The Resolutions Committee presented the redrafted Resolution No. 2 to the Conference. It read as follows: Be it resolved that the District Conference, District Camp, and the District Youth Camp be held at the time and place designated by the District Council and The District Youth President. Resolution carried.

No. 7 through 16. These resolutions carried as recorded in the 1964 Journal.

No. 17. Regarding sending flowers and notices in the event of illness of a Minister or a Minister's spouse was substituted by a motion to send flowers and notices only upon the death of a Minister or a Minister's spouse. The substitute motion carried.

No. 18. This resolution was amended to read: Any resolution to be considered by the Conference must be in the hands of the proper committee at least 60 days before the Conference or they will not be considered by the committee. The amendment carried.

A report from the Ways and Means Committee was called for.

Resolution No. 3 was amended to read that the District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$4500.00 per year and 8 cents per mile for traveling expenses. Motion carried.

Resolution No. 1 of the Ways and Means Committee was presented to the Conference again and was adopted.

It was moved that the District Council present to the 1966 Conference a proposal for an annual salary increment to be paid to the District Superintendent, beginning with the next church year and be in effect each year, and that a maximum salary be set. Motion carried.

The Missionary Society Treasurer's Report was called for and was read by Mrs. P. E. Brown, District President. The report was received upon motion. It was moved that we encourage the Missionary Society to make arrangements for the President's expense to the Conference. Motion carried.

The following motion was made from the floor: I make the motion that the Conference authorize the District Superintendent to effectively take care of the Kansas City Seminary Student situation this coming year, and furthermore that a study group be appointed by the District Council to analyze the situation in Kansas City and present a report and recommend it to the District Conference in 1966, Motion Carried. (It is understood that this motion takes place of all previous discussion and action of this Conference regarding the possible re-location of the District Headquarters in Kansas City).

The Chairman of the Conference, Rev. C. B. Colaw called for the election of the officers of the District. The elections were as follows:  
Assistant District Superintendent — Harold Monroe.

A motion was made by the chairman of the Educational and Examining Board that Floyd Smith be received as a District Licentiate. This motion carried and he was seated in the Conference.

The election of officers continued.

District Secretary — Eldon R. Kirks.

District Treasurer — G. H. Jenewein.

Because of expiration of time, it was agreed to recess and to reconvene at 6:15 p.m. The Conference reconvened at 6:15 p.m. The election of officers continued.

Advisory members of the District Council — William Schloeman, William Haltom, and John Wilson.

Educational and Examining Board — Harold Bland.

Trustees — The Executive members of the District Council were elected by acclamation.

Missionary Society President — Mrs. C. B. Colaw.

Ministerial Delegates to the International Conference in 1966 — Rev. Harold Monroe, Rev. Bruce Chamberlain, Rev. C. H. Jenewein.

Alternate Ministerial delegates in order of vote — Rev. John Wilson, Rev. H. R. Gunsalus, Rev. Wayne Lyon.

Motion was made that the Conference recess for the Evening service, and to reconvene immediately following the close of the service and Altar service. Motion carried.

The Conference reconvened at 9:30 p.m.

The Chairman of the Conference called for the report of the Committee of Memoirs. This was given by Rev. Mrs. Lois Williams.

The election of officers continued as follows:

Lay delegates to the International Conference in 1966: William Schloeman, William Haltom, and Herbert Buell.

Alternate delegates in order of vote: Duane Mueller, Dr. Glen Springer, and Ray Snook.

The Committee on Memorials to the International Conference was asked to report. Harold Monroe, District Secretary, read the report.

No. 1-4 carried.

No. 5 lost.

No. 6 not moved for adoption.

No. 7 carried.

A motion to adjourn was passed by all standing and joining in singing the Doxology.

#### **REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE**

##### **No. 1**

Be it resolved that our Conference year close June 30th. Be it further resolved that all reports be completed and sent to the proper District Committees, and all District Monies be sent to the District Treasurer by July 5.

##### **No. 2**

Be it resolved that the District Camp and Conference, and the District Youth Camp be held at the time and place designated by the District Council and the District Youth President.

##### **No. 3**

Be it resolved that the conference authorize the District Superintendent to effectively take care of the Kansas City Seminary Student situation this coming year, and furthermore a study group be appointed by the District Council to analyze the situation in Kansas City and present a report and recommend it to the District Conference in 1966.

##### **No. 4**

We recommend that each Pastor be permitted to conduct at least one two-Sunday revival each conference year away from his church. We further recommend that the pastor be given a two weeks vacation. The church will pay the expenses of the supply speaker and the pastor's salary in both cases.

##### **No. 5**

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be granted a two weeks vacation with pay during the conference year.

##### **No. 6**

Be it resolved that the District Council appoint all District Conference and District Camp meeting committees for the ensuing year immediately after the current District Conference, and further, that the District Secretary shall immediately notify all committee appointees by letter, and that their names be printed in the District Minutes.

##### **No. 7**

The District Secretary shall issue credentials to those entitled to them during the Conference.



**No. 8**

We recommend that the Sunday School and Youth Zones now represented in the District be retained.

**No. 9**

Be it resolved that there be a District Wide Ministerial Fellowship, and that the District Council arrange for the program and set the date.

**No. 10**

Be it resolved that the full membership of the District shall covenant to daily hold up the hands of the District Leaders and Officers with prayer and supplication.

**No. 11**

In accordance with the Manual, Section 54, Paragraph 1, item 5, which reads as follows: "To report monthly to the local church board his (the pastor's) activities related to the local church; his calls to members and non-members, at hospitals, sermons preached, etc." Be it resolved that the District Council prepare a form to be used for this monthly report to the local church board, and that the pastor be asked to send a copy to the District Superintendent each month.

**No. 12**

Be it resolved that each church set a goal of 10% increase in net Church Membership this Conference year.

**No. 13**

Be it resolved that each Sunday School strive for a 10% increase in net Sunday School attendance this Conference year.

**No. 14**

Be it resolved that the District Council appoint a District CYC Director, and a District PELT Director, as required by the General Board of our church.

**No. 15**

In order to guard against any oversight in compiling the Annual Memorials of the deceased members; be it resolved that each pastor or church send the names of deceased members to the Chairman of the Committee on Memoirs immediately following the close of each Conference Year.

**No. 16**

Be it resolved that in the event of the death of any of our active or retired Ministers or their spouse that the District Superintendent be notified immediately, and he, in turn, will instruct the District Treasurer to send a Floral Memorial to the family of the deceased.

**No. 17**

Whereas the resolutions that are presented to the delegates assembled for the Annual District Conference by the District Resolutions Committee and the District Ways and Means Committee have far reaching ramifications, and the time does not always permit the delegates to think them through sufficiently, therefore creating unnecessary unintelligent voting many times, therefore, be it resolved that the Ways and Means and Resolutions Committees shall prepare prior to the Conference and mimeograph copies, listing all resolutions with committee recommendations, and shall place said copies in the hands of all delegates no later than ten days before said District Conference. Further, be it resolved that any resolution to be considered by this Conference must be in the hands of the proper committee at least 60 days before Conference or they will not be considered by the committee.

**No. 18**

Be it resolved that we give our District Superintendent, Brother Colaw and his wife, a rising vote of thanks for their untiring efforts this past year.

**No. 19**

Be it resolved that we give Brother and Sister Jantz a rising vote of thanks for their excellent ministry of the Word of God, and in Song. Also to their daughter, Carolyn, and Don Hamlett for their splendid contribution to the Camp.

**No. 20**

## WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

### As adopted by the Conference

#### No. 1

Be it resolved that each church pay \$2.00 for each assessable member per month. This \$2.00 will be pro-rated as follows:

United Stewardship fund	34%
Central Pilgrim College	20%
International Conference Expense	1%
District Operational Fund	45%
	<hr/> 100%

The \$2.00 per member is to be sent by the Church Treasurer to the District Treasurer the first of each month.

#### No. 2

Be it further resolved that each pastor of the Conference pay tithe of their ministerial salary to the local Church Treasurer, who in turn will forward it to the District Treasurer the first of each month, and that the District Treasurer shall place this in the District Operational Fund.

#### No. 3

Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$4500.00 per year. He shall be allowed mileage for District work at the rate of 8 cents per mile for his car, and other actual travel expenses, and other expenses relative to his office shall be paid.

#### No. 4

Be it further resolved that the District Statistician shall receive \$50.00 per year, the District Secretary shall receive \$100.00 per year, and the District Treasurer shall be paid \$20.00 per month.

#### No. 5

Be it resolved that the matter of printing the District Conference Minutes be referred to the District Council.

#### No. 6

We recommend that from the funds budgeted for Central Pilgrim College, an amount equal to \$.25 per year assessable member be allocated for Board Trustees travel expense, and that an amount equal to \$.75 per year per assessable member allocated for a District Scholarship Fund.

Be it further resolved that the Scholarship Fund shall be held by The Central Pilgrim College to the account of the Central District until such time as the District Council shall grant such Scholarship.

#### No. 7

We recommend that each church pay the assessment fees of their pastor and his wife, if they are members of the Ministerial Benefit Association.

#### No. 8

We recommend that the District pay the assessment fees of the District Superintendent and his wife, if they are members of the Ministerial Benefit Association.

#### No. 9

Whereas the delegates elected to the Annual District Conference represent the entire local church where they are members, and thereby duly serve in the best interests of their local churches, therefore:

Be it resolved that each local church pay the traveling expense, lodging and meals of the lay delegates and the pastor while they are traveling to and from and in attending the Annual District Conference.

#### No. 10

The Missionary Society made the following recommendation: We recommend that each Missionary Society in the Central District contribute .50 cents per month for the expense of the Central District Missionary Society.

## MEMORIALS FOR GENERAL CONFERENCE

Number 1: Whereas church extension is a church wide interest, and

Whereas the Department of Church Extension is a part of the General Budget to which all districts contribute, and

Whereas the Department of Church Extension is limited by only working within church extension districts,

Therefore, be it resolved that the Department of Church Extension involve itself in the whole church program by working through organized districts and combining existing church extension districts with organized districts wherever possible, and to the best interest of the total church program.

RECOMMENDED.

Number 2: Inasmuch as children and young people under sixteen years of age cannot fully understand the issues of the church, and are often influenced in voting, etc., by their friends or parents, rather than by their own initiative,

Be it resolved that no member of the Pilgrim Holiness Church be privileged to vote under sixteen years of age, and,

Inasmuch as children and young people under sixteen years of age seldom have significant income,

Be it resolved that members under sixteen years of age be non-assessable.

RECOMMENDED.

Number 3: Inasmuch as members are often dropped too soon from our rolls, and our present per-capita budget systems often encourages this;

Be it resolved that an inactive list be established of all members who have not attended or supported the church for a period of six months, but are still, in the opinion of the pastor and board, prospective active members. These shall be continued on the roll only as long as they are being consistently contacted at least twice annually, and are felt to be prospective.

Be it further resolved that said inactive membership list shall be non assessable.

RECOMMENDED.

Number 4: Be it resolved that Section 61, Paragraph 3 of the Manual which reads as follows: The board shall not permit fairs, festivals, dramatic exercises, so called sociables or anything of like nature to be held in connection with the church or any department of its work, be rewritten to read — "the board shall not permit fairs or festivals to be held in connection with any department of the church nor permit any dramatic exercises or suppers to be conducted for the purpose of raising funds for the Lord's work."

RECOMMENDED.

Number 5: Since association with Christians of other denominations has many wholesome benefits and since a broad social program often draws outsiders into the spiritual atmosphere of the church, therefore, be it resolved that Section 63 of the Manual which prohibits inter-church sponsored athletics be deleted.

RECOMMENDED.

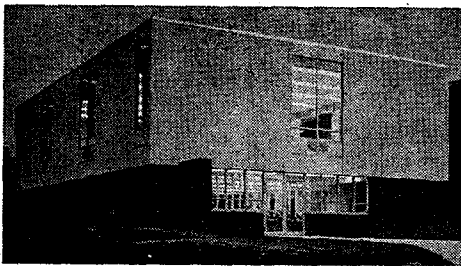

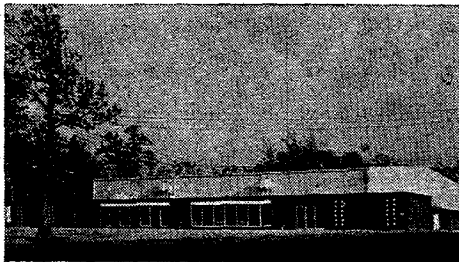
