Following the reading of the minutes of the preceding session, additional reports were read and acted upon.

Moved and supported that this Assembly recommend to the Kentucky Assembly, O. A. Morgan for ordination.

Moved and supported that General Superintendent appoint Committee to examine Ralph Garrison for license to preach.

Appointment was made as follows: L. D. Sharp, J. C. Edwards, and Herbert Haines.

Moved and supported that this committee be retained as a standing committee with power of remaining two to appoint a successor

should some one of them leave the District.

Moved and supported that this Assembly decide to raise money for Home Missions for this District at the rate of \$2.00 per member.

Moved and supported that the preachers of this district pay 50 per cent of their tithe to the Home Mission fund.

Moved and carried that this Assembly strongly urge that each member of this District tithe their income into the local church treasury.

Resolved that an equivalent of \$1.00 per member be raised by our District for the support of the General work of the Church. Adopted.

Moved and carried that election of officers for ensuing year be held to-morrow at 10:00 A. M.

Moved and carried that Brother and Sister Haines and Brother Floyd Morgan be the committee on minutes.

Moved and carried to adjourn until 10:00 A. M. to-morrow.

Moved and carried that Hartman be the place for the third annual District Assembly of Colorado.

Moved and supported that the District Council decide the date of the next District Assembly.

Adjourned to meet at 2:30 to-day.

The fourth session of the Assembly was called to order at 2:30 P. M. July 12, 1923.

The early part of the session was taken up with various reports, and action upon same.

Moved and carried that we have the minutes of our Assembly printed.

The following resolutions were brought before the Assembly, and were adopted:

(1) Resolved, That no church of our district shall call an evangelist or missionary representative without consultation with our District Superintendent.

(2) Resolved, That the pastor with advisory board of our churches shall decide the amount that shall be paid to a called evangelist.

(3) Resolved, That the District Council shall decide with reference to appropriation of all Camp and Assembly offerings.

(4) Resolved, That this the Second Annual Assembly of the District of Colorado express our appreciation by rising vote of thanks for the hearty interest shown by our General Superintendent to the work in the District in its early stages.

(5) Resolved, That a cash and pledge offering be taken up for Home Missions at our conventions, Camps, and Assembly.

(6) Resolved, That the District Superintendent make his visits, if convenient, to the local churches each quarter, and conduct communion services on these visits.

(7) Resolved, That our District Superintendent be our Home Missionary for the State.

(8) Resolved, That we submit a word of appreciation and fellowship, and send to the People's Mission Church.
