

The first session of the fifth annual District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Chuch of Colorado was opened Monday, June 28th, 1926 at 9:00 A. M. The Assembly was called to order by Dist. Supt. L. D. Sharp after reading the 1st Psalm and a good season of prayer he made a few remarks and asked our Gen. Supt. Cox to take the Chair.

Moved and carried that Brother Harold Ripper be granted seat in conference bar.

Moved and carried that seat in conference bar be granted to Brother and Sister C. A. Ingersoll.

Moved and carried that Brother Harry L. Covert be granted a seat in the conference bar.

Moved and carried that a seat in the conference bar be granted to Brother Ira N. Diggs.

Moved and carried that we grant an honorary seat in conference bar to Rev. Tinsley of the Church of the Nazarene.

Moved and carried that we grant an honorary seat in the conference bar to Brother E. G. Marsh of the Ohio District.

Moved and carried that we grant to Brother and Sister J. J. Cork of the Western Kansas District honorary seat in the conference bar.

Moved and carried that the sessions of this assembly run as follows:

Morning opening 9:00 o'clock. Morning closing 12:00 o'clock. Afternoon opening 2:00 o'clock. Afternoon closing 4:30 o'clock. Evening opening 6:30 o'clock. Evening closing 8:30 o'clock.

Moved and carried that we adopt the rules laid down in our manual to govern the proceedings of this assembly.

tors read their reports, and that the Sunday School reports be read, but that the statistical and financial reports be turned in unread.

Moved and carried that the election of the District Council be held at 3:30 this afternoon.

The remaining part of this session was taken up in the reading or reports.

Adjourned at 12:00 Noon.

The second session of this assembly opened Monday afternoon at 2:00 o'clock. Opening address by Gen. Supt. W. R. Cox.

Moved and carried that we grant an honorary seat in the conference bar to Brother Harry Close of the Western Kansas District.

Moved and carried that we accept the recommendations of the Examining Board in reference to credentials for Harold Ripper, C. A. Ingersoll, Mrs. Maude Ingersoll, A. F. Duncan, Mrs. A. F. Duncan, Charles B. Young, and Harry L. Covert.

Moved and carried that we grant an honorary seat in the conference bar to Rev. Ruppert of the Friends Church. Brother Ruppert spoke in acceptance, and was enjoyed by all present.

The District Council election then followed, resulting as follows:

Adjourned to meet at 6:30 P. M.

The Third session of this assembly was called to order Monday at 6:30 P. M. Opened with devotional service led

by Brother J. J. Cork, Superintendent of the Western Kansas District.

Some time was taken in hearing reports of various ministers and deaconesses.

Moved and carried that this district be incorporated.

Moved and carried that we set apart a portion of tomorrow morning for incorporation and election of trustees.

Moved and carried that the Chair appoint a committee to draw up articles of incorporation. Result of appointment as follows: L. D. Sharp, P. W. Thomas, Herbert Haines.

Moved and carried to adopt Resolutions Nos. 1 to 13 inclusive of the 1925 District Assembly, this being done in accordance with a resolution submitted by committee appointed, as follows:

WHEREAS many of the resolutions and motions accepted by the District Assembly are found to be of lasting value in our state organization:

BE IT RESOLVED that the following resolutions appearing in the minutes of the Fourth District Assembly remain in force until rescinded or amended by action of this assembly:

1. That no Church of our district shall call an evangelist or missionary representative without consulting our District Superintendent.

2. That each pastor, with the advisory board of his church, shall decide the amount that shall be paid to a called evangelist.

3. That all district moneys, except money raised for Foreign Missions, be sent direct to the District Treasurer, and a proper receipt obtained for same.

4. That an offering for Home Missions be taken once each month in each church of the district.

5. That a cash and pledge offering be taken for Home Missions and for the support of our Bible School at our conventions, camps and assemblies.

6. That as there is a tendency in many religious circles

to lower their standards in reference to immodest dress, and all other forms of worldliness, we the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the District of Colorado insist upon a strict observance of the rules of our Manual in regard to these matters.

7. That each pastor insist that his members pay their tithe into the treasury of the local church in conformity with the rules of our Manual.

8. That each minister of this district tithe his support as a minister to the District Superintendent.

9. That the minutes of this assembly be printed.

10. That our District Superintendent tithe his income to the support of our General Superintendent.

11. That this District provide house, traveling expenses and \$1000.00 for the coming year for the support of our District Superintendent, to be raised as follows: 1st. by ministerial tithe of the district; 2nd, by the ministerial offering he receives for his services and which he turns over to the District Treasurer; 3rd, by the offerings he receives on his visits to the churches of the District.

12. That an advertisement of one page be given to the Colorado Springs Bible Training School in our minutes.

13. That our District Superintendent be in charge of our Home Missionary work.

Moved and carried to amend resolution No. 11 to read \$1200.00 instead of \$1000.00.

The Fourth session of the Fifth Annual District Assembly was called to order at 9:00 A. M. Tuesday, June 29th, 1926. Opened by devotional service led by Brother R. H. Mc-Cart.

Some time was then taken up in hearing various reports of ministers and officers of the district.

Auditing Committee report was then given and accepted. The proposed Articles of Incorporation were then read. It was then moved and carried that the Articles of Incorporation submitted be accepted.

Moved and carried that Colorado Springs, Colorado, be the headquarters of this Incorporate Church.

Moved and carried that Board of Foreign Missions be elected, and that the Board organize itself, resulting.

Mrs. Lizzie Norris P. W. Thomas Dist. Supt. L. D. Sharp.

Herbert Haines was then elected a member of the Examining Board for the period of three years.

Moved and carried that the Assembly leave the matter of delegates to the General Assembly to the decision of the District Council.

Moved and carried that the District Council decide on the matter of ways and means of delegates to the General Assembly.

The following Debt Fund resolution was submitted:

INASMUCH: As there are, along with the assets, certain financial obligations of the former People's Mission Church, and which, by virture of the merger of said organization with the Pilgrim Holiness Church, particularly the Colorado District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, become the obligations of said District, liabilities amounting to \$2,753.00, and

WHEREAS: These matters must be attended to at the earliest date,

BE IS RESOLVED: That the District appoint a special treasurer, who shall report to the regular district treasurer, to handle the matter; and that a Debt Fund shall be created to supplement the pledges made to cover this indebtedness and now outstanding; said Debt Fund to receive at least 3% of the income of each church, payable quarterly, and of the general income of the District, except the foreign missionary money; which provision, in as far as the local churches are concerned, shall not be in force if a majority of any local church board shall deem it inadvisable.

Moved and carried that the Debt Fund resolution be accepted.

Moved and supported that we elect a special treasurer to handle this debt fund, resulting in the election of P. W. Thomas.

The following resolutions were then submitted and accepted by the assembly:

(a) RESOLVED: That the District Council be permitted to engage evangelists and missionaries for periods of time extending into the Assembly Year following date of call.

(b) BE IT RESOLVED: That by a rising vote of thanks we express our gratitude to Brother Cox for his unselffish services in our behalf.

(c) BE IT RESOLVED: That we express our appreciation of Brother Sharps' unselfish services in the interests of the Church work and Camp Meeting by a rising vote of thanks.

(d) BE IT RESOLVED: That by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation of Brother Haines, Sister Custer, and the others that have labored in the kitchen and dining room for our benefit; and to Brother Henschen, Sister Sharpless and those who have provided lodging for us.

Moved and carried to refer memorials for General Assembly to the District Council for decision.

Moved and carried that the Committee on Minutes get out extra copies of the Memorials for the General Assembly.

Moved and carried to adjourn until 3:30 P. M.

The Fifth session of this assembly was called to order at 3:30 P. M. Tuesday, June 29th, 1926.

Moved and carried that the time and place of next Camp and Assembly be referred to the District Council.

The District Council elected as delegates to the General Assembly the following:

Assembly adjourned.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the Fifth Annual Assembly of The Pilgrim Holiness Church of Colorado— Greetings:—

The two Churches coming together at our last District Assembly has made this a very busy year for your District Superintendent. This past year can truly be called "The year of adjustment." However, I am glad to report that the Churches are pulling together smoothly, and God has helped us thus far.

I have traveled about 9,000 miles, have preached 201 times. God has blessed me with 123 souls at the altar to get saved or sanctified; have taken 48 into the Church; held seven revivals; have visited all the churches, and some of them several times on business.

We have done some good work in getting into new fields of labor, and were successful in organizing two new churches, and we have a greater opportunity to do more of that kind of work this coming year.

Pueblo Church has bought them a nice little tabernacle; also Rocky Ford has purchased them a fine little mission hall located right on Main Street. We trust our Churches will continue to buy halls and Church buildings and quit paying rent.

I read twenty books which had 4602 pages, and called and prayed in many homes. We have made a good gain on every line.

Received \$1000.00 in salary, \$240.00 for house rent.

Gave General Superintendent \$100.00, and gave offerings elsewhere amounting to \$75.00.

With a deep sense of my limitations and a consciousness of my inability. I have done my best for God and for the Church.


