CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The thirtieth annual conference of the Idaho-Washington District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Clarkston, Wash., July 31, 1944, at 9:00 a.m.

The Conference joined in singing, "I Know I Love Thee Better, Lord," led by C. R. Bennett. Bro. Pratt led the congregation in prayer.

Rev. E. R. Himmelright, district Superintendent, expressed our appreciation to Rev. R. G. Flexon, first Assistant General Superintendent, for his ministry in the Camp, and introduced him to the conference.

Bro. Flexon read a scripture lesson from John 1:37 and spoke of the necessity of personal work and the training of our young people, and the importance of advertising our church.

The meeting was called to order and the roll was called with 27 ministers and delegates responding.

The Conference bar was set to include the first four rows of seats on both sides of the room.

The Garfield and Wenatchee churches were presented to the Conference and were accepted.

The following ministers were presented to the Conference and were received: R. V. Steelhead, Rex Witt, G. M. Pratt, Stanley Weber and Mrs. R. V. Steelhead.

A motion prevailed that the district superintendent appoint the Reception Committee. Mrs. John Grauberger and Miss Kenney were appointed.

The chair suggested that the Conference set the time for sittings. It was voted to have the same time as last year, namely, 9:00 to 11:30 a.m., 2:00 to 5:00 p.m., and 7:00 to 9:30 p.m.

The following ministerial reports were read and accepted: J. W. Partridge, L. J. Laubaugh, John Grauberger, C. R. Bennett, Harper Cole, C. E. Dietz, J. F. Leasure, Mrs. Ida Garner, Hazel Goss, L. W. Goss, E. E. Storm, W. J. Webster, Orbie Wells, Paul Idler, Florence Kenney, H. D. Nettleton, Mrs. H. D. Nettleton, C. E. Young, R. V. Steelhead, Stanley Weber, Rex Witt and D. R. Martin. The Deaconess reports of Mrs. Laura Himmelright and Mrs. Opal Webster were read and accepted.

The following churches reported: Benton City, Clarkston, Coeur d'Alene, Daisy, Grandview, Granite and Hermiston.

The Conference adjourned by expiration of time.

Second Sitting

The second sitting opened with singing hymns, "Where He Leads I'll Follow" and "Guide Me O Thou Great Jehovah." We were led in prayer by Bro. Partridge, who also read the scripture lesson from the second chapter of Philipians.

The secretary read the minutes of the previous sitting and they were approved.

The Resolution Committee presented a resolution to dispense with the reading of the reports. This resolution was not seconded.

The Reception Committee presented Rev. Nolt of the Church of the Nazarene. It was voted to give Rev. Nolt the courtesy of the floor.

Reports of the following churches were accepted: Kamiah, Kennewick, McGuires, Spirit Lake, Spokane, Weippe, Wenatchee, Garfield and Boise.

Rev. Himmelright, District Superintendent, gave his report which was accepted.

The Resolution Committee presented an amendment to Resolution No. 7 omitting the words, "the Advisory." This resolution was lost.

Resolution No. 24 was presented by the committee amended to read "all ministers and workers are urged to be present." This was adopted.

Resolution No. 1 was presented and adopted.

A motion was made that Resolution No. 8 be changed to read "District Council" instead of "District Superintendent." This motion was lost.

The Ways and Means Committee presented Resolution No. 1. This was amended and the chair was asked to give his opinion on the question. The resolution was lost.

A motion prevailed to adjourn so as to give the committees an opportunity to work.

Third Sitting

The third sitting opened with the congregation singing, "Still Sweeter Every Day." The chair asked for several scripture quotations and we were led in prayer by Bro. Himmelright.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

The Resolution Committee presented Resolution No. 5 which was amended and passed.

A resolution was presented changing the time for the Camp Meeting and Conference to the middle of June. This resolution was lost.

Resolution No. 26 was presented and carried.

A resolution was presented which provided for a Young People's Convention. It was voted to refer this to the committee for redrafting.

Resolution No. 27 was presented and carried.

The Resolution Committee recommended that No. 9 of the previous year be rescinded. This was carried.

Resolution No. 7 was presented and carried.

A motion prevailed to recess until 8:30, then meet for the election of officers and extend the time if necessary.

Reconvened at the specified time.

It was voted to postpone the order of the day until the Council reports to the Conference.

The District Council reported as follows:

We recommend that H. D. Nettleton and C. E. Young be ordained in this Conference; that Mrs. Harper Cole be retained in the third year of the licensed ministers' course of study; that Miss Florence Kenney be retained in the second year of the licensed ministers' course of study; that Rev. Paul Idler be retained in the first year licensed ministers' course of study; that Rev. Rex Witt be promoted to the second year of the licensed ministers' course of study; and that W. H. Harman and Donald Goss be granted a first year's license in the course of study.

These recommendations were passed by the Conference.

The Council further recommended that the Examining and Educational Boards be combined and have four members. At the advice of the chair this was amended to have five members. This was carried.

The District Superintendent appointed the tellers and the Conference proceeded with the election of officers.

The Conference stood adjourned by expiration of time.

Fourth Sitting

The fourth sitting opened with congregational singing led by Bro. Pratt. There followed a season of prayer led by Sr. Himmelright.

Bro. Flexon read the first chapter of second Peter, giving us some practical thoughts. He said, "The world is not fighting holiness, it is fighting the lack of it."

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

A telegram from Rev. and Mrs. Harper Cole was read to the Conference and it was voted to send them greetings.

The Council presented the nominees for the Home Missionary Committee, and these being elected completed the election of the district officers.

The Resolution Committee presented Resolution No. 28 and it was carried.

Resolution No. 21 was presented and carried.

The committee presented Resolution No. 29 and it passed.

The Auditors' report was presented and it was voted to accept it.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

A motion prevailed to have each pastor pledge some new subscriptions to the Advocate. This was done by a call of the roll.

Resolution No. 2 was amended to read "three hundred" instead of "two hundred."

The Conference recessed until the call of the chair.

Reconvened with congregational singing and the report of the Resolution Committee was called for.

The committee presented a resolution asking the Conference to provide a ministers' library. This resolution was lost.

An amendment was presented to be added to Resolution No. 12 and this was carried.

The Ways and Means Committee reported and presented Resolution No. 1. This was amended and carried, the amendment automatically rescinding Resolution No. 5.

The committee recommended that Resolution No. 7 be rescinded as this was thought to be taken care of by the Home Missionary pledges already made. This recommendation was lost. A motion prevailed that it be amended to read "District Superintendent" instead of "each pastor."

The District Council presented the following report: That as Bro. Idler had expressed dissatisfaction as to his standing in the Conference and expressed a desire for reconsideration, the majority report of the Council was that he be reconsidered. Two council members, L. J. Laubaugh and J. W. Partridge expressed dissent from this action and presented a minority report that we do not reconsider Bro. Idler's standing. The majority report was accepted and it was voted to reconsider. Bro. Idler was advanced to the second year license.

The Resolution Committee presented Resolution No. 30 which was passed.

A motion prevailed that the Council approve the minutes of the last sitting.

The Conference adjourned with thankfulness to God for His guidance.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Annual District Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Idaho-Washington District:

Greetings in the precious name of Jesus.

Another Conference year is now history, a year that has had many problems for each of us, but the Lord has been very gracious and brought us through with victory.

We have no great gains to report for the District, but we have not lost ground. Through the efforts of Bro. Storm, we have a new church at Wenatchee, Wash. Bro. Nettleton reports that they are making gains at Boise, Idaho, with a very good prospect for a church in that city. We have a new church at Garfield, Wash., with a fine group of spiritual folk.

Also at this time of scarcity of ministers the Lord has sent several our way to fill in the gaps, for which we praise Him.

We have received our salary of \$840.00; work on the camp grounds, \$100.00; special offering, \$48.00; revival meeting, \$36.34 food donations, \$57.57; total \$1,061.91. Travel expense, \$314.85.

I have held one revival, had 22 seekers, preached 74 times, traveled on the district 10,927 miles, visited each church at least three times and made a trip to the Superintendents' meeting at Indianapolis.

We appreciate the encouragement received from the saints and feel like pressing on. Let us keep the spiritual trend high, with our eyes on Jesus.

RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved, that we have one prayer convention and one three-day Christian Workers' Institute during the year, and that one or more services be devoted to the young people; the time and place shall be arranged for by the Superintendent and his Assistant.

2. Resolved, that three hundred copies of the District Minutes be printed.

3. Resolved, that the District Superintendent appoint the Statistical Committee at least two weeks prior to the Conference.

4. Resolved, that no worker be allowed on our platform whose practice, that is, their lives and dress, does not come up to our church standards.

5. Resolved, that the Conference elect a committee of two to work with the District Superintendent in district home missionary work, said committee to be nominated by the District Council and governed by rules drawn up by the Council.

6. Resolved, that our District Council serve as the Camp Meeting Committee, or elect a committee if necessary.

7. Resolved, that we recommend active ministers be elected as members of the District Council.

8. Resolved, that no pastor or church shall can an evangelist without the consent of the District Superintendent.

9. Resolved, that a'l parent members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church refrain from cutting their girls' hair, and to dress them as becometh holiness.

10. Resolved, that each church have a uniform Treasurer's book to keep accurate account.

11. Resolved, that we express our appreciation to our District Superintendent, Secretary and Treasurer for their services during the year. Be it further resolved, that we express our appreciation to our cook, Sister Hueth, and her helpers in the kitchen, also to the Clarkston church and friends for the splendid entertainment furnished.

12. Resolved, that each pastor be responsible to see the annual reports from his church be sent in not later than July 10 and in case of failure to do this the pastor explain same to the Conference.

13. Resolved, that our churches give our District Superintendent an offering of provisions when he comes for the quarterly meetings.

14. Resolved, that the District Superintendent instruct the local church board as to their duties when he makes his quarterly calls.

15. Resolved, that the District Conference follow the Annual Camp Meeting.

16. Resolved, that we have a monthly publication to be called "The Idaho-Washington Bulletin." The District Council shall arrange a means of finance and also approve the appointment of an editor, selected by the District Superintendent.

17. Resolved, that each church have a financial budget, setting an allowance for all expenditures, including the pastor's salary.

18. Resolved, that all committees, except the Reception Committee, be appointed by the District Superintendent at the close of each Conference and hold office through the next yearly Conference.

19. Resolved, that each pastor and the District Superintendent be given a two weeks' vacation each year with pay.

20. Resolved, that each church pay their pastor his salary during Camp Meeting and Conference.

21. Resolved, that we have a District Young People's Convention during the year, and that it be held at a convenient time for those young people who are in school.

22. Resolved, that each pastor read our District Conference resolutions to his church as soon as the minutes are available.

23. Resolved, that all members voting in the annual church meeting must be present.

24. Resolved, that we have a meeting for ministers and workers at least three times during the Camp Meeting. The District Superintendent shall be in charge, and all ministers and workers are urged to be present.

25. Resolved, that we have a District Sunday School Committee to promote Sunday School interests in the district and to cooperate with the General Committee, and that said Committee be appointed by the District Council and the District Superintendent be a member of the committee. (Recommended by the Gen. S. S. Com.)

26. Resolved, that we have a Young People's Study Class during our Camp Meeting, and that the District Council appoint a leader to take charge of this work.

27. Resolved, that we omit the reading of church and pastor reports in the Conference, and that they be posted by the Statistical Committee.

28. Resolved, that the full addresses of all ministers be printed after their names in the Conference Minutes, and that the words, "pastor or unstationed" be dropped.

29. Resolved, that the District Superintendent have the privilege of holding two meetings during the year off the Idaho-Washington District.

30. Resolved, that we express our appreciation to Rev. R. G. Flexon for coming this great distance to be with us, also for his splendid messages and helpful advice.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. Resolved, that each local church of the district be apportioned the minimum of \$6.00 per voting member to finance our general church and district obligation. Said amount to be distributed as follows: Foreign Missions, \$1.90; District Expense, \$3.00; General Administration, 50 cents; General Home Missions, 60 cents. Be it further resolved, that all active and inactive licensed and ordained ministers and deaconesses pay the title of their remuneration received from their ministry into the local church treasury for the support of the District Superintendent, which support shall not be less than one hundred dollars per month.

2. Resolved, that each church take a foreign missionary offering each month.

3. Resolved, that there be an assessment of 25 cents per member annually for General Conference expense.

4. Resolved, that each local treasurer send all money for the district and general purposes to the District Treasurer the first of each month, or more often if necessary.

5. Resolved, that our District Treasurer send our pastors a monthly statement of their church's district obligation, and that the pastors attempt to raise said amount when in arrears.

6. Resolved, that we have a Home Missionary budget, that we use the Home Missionary pledge card recommended by the General Church, and that the District Superintendent present same to each church.

7. Resolved, that each Sunday School take 5 per cent of their regular offerings and send to the District Treasurer monthly to be applied on the District Home Mission Fund.

8. Resolved, that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary, and District Treasurer be \$10.00 and \$20.00 respectively.

9. Resolved, that the district pay traveling expenses for all Councilmen and entertainment of same for special called sessions.

10. Resolved, that ministers and their families be provided free entertainment at the Camp Meeting and Conference.

11. Resolved, that the District Superintendent receive three cents per mile traveling expense, when he uses his car, and actual train or bus fare.

12. Resolved, that the District Treasurer be bonded, the amount to be set by the Council and the cost to be paid out of District Funds.
