JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING

The thirty-second annual conference of the Idaho-Washington District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in the Camp Meeting tabernacle at Clarkston, Wash., July 22, 1946.

The Conference opened with singing "How Firm a Foundation," led by Brother Moore, after which Rev. H. J. Olsen led the congregation in prayer.

Rev. E. R. Himmelright introduced Rev. P. F. Elliott, the General Sunday School Secretary, who brought greetings from the General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk.

Rev. P. F. Elliott addressed the conference from the subject, "Youth on the March." He emphasized the need in the Church of a vital program to reach the youth for Christ. Three things especially needed in this program: Leadership, Vision, and Organization.

Brother Elliott then took the chair and the conference proceeded with business.

The roll was called with 38 ministers and delegates responding.

The Boise Church was presented. The pastor, Bro. Nettleton, gave a report of the Church.

It was voted that the Conference bar include the first six rows of seats and the platform of the tabernacle.

Moved and carried that the time of sittings be from 9:00 to 11:30 a.m., 2:00 to 5:00 p.m., 7:30 to 9:30 p.m.

It was moved that the Superintendent appoint a reception committee. Brothers Stuart and Weber were appointed.

The District Superintendent read his report which was accepted.

Brother Elliott explained the action of the General Conference relative to Sunday School work.

The reception committee presented H. J. Olsen, who was invited to sit on the platform with the privilege of the floor.

The Resolution Committee read its report.

Motion to recess until certain Council business is taken care of, and until the call of the chair.

Brother Olsen dismissed with prayer.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting opened with singing of, "I Know I Love Thee Better, Lord," led by Brother Weber. The Chair called for Brother Leasure to lead in prayer.

A motion made changing the time of the evening sitting to be 7:00 to 9:30 carried.

The recommendations of the District Council and Examining Board were presented.

Recommended that D. L. Goss be advanced to second year. W. H. Harmon be retained in the second year. Rex Witt be retained in the third year. Brother Horning be given first year license. N. K. Lorensen be received as an Ordained Minister subject to receipt of his letter. Allen Harmon be retained in first year. Paul Idler be retained in second year. Recommended that he transfer to the Rocky Mountain District. Recommended

that Florence Kenney be dropped from the roll. Recommended that John Grauberger be transferred to the Rocky Mountain District. Recommended that Mrs. Gladys Davidson be granted first year license. That Mrs. O. C. Keller be retained in second year. That Brother Moore, Brother Ingersoll and Brother Davidson be received as Ordained Ministers. Recommended that J. W. Murphy be referred to the local Church of which he is a member. Recommendation of Council and Examining Board received.

The District Treasurer read his report.

The auditing committee reported. Accepted.

It was moved that the Treasurer's report go into the minutes not showing deficit. Carried.

Treasurer's report accepted.

Resolution Committee report itemized.

No. 15—Referred.

No. 16—Carried.

No. 22—Amended. Purchasing agent receive his own car expense above \$10.00. Carried.

No. 1—Lost.

No. 2—Referred for redrafting for finances.

No. 3—Amendment motion to adopt last clause and balance of resolution be referred to Council. Carried

No. 4—Carried.

No. 5—Carried.

Motion that No. 28 be deleted. Carried

The Reception Committee presented Brothers Moore and Ingersoll and Brother and Sister Davidson.

The Ways and Means Committee read their report.

No. 3—Referred to Committee until budget is presented.

No. 4—Amended by the 10th instead of the 1st. Carried.

No. 5—Amendment. The monthly budget be posted in the Church.

No. 9—Amendment. Traveling in interest of district. Carried.

No. 15—Moved to table. Lost. Motion to refer. Carried.

No. 3—Charges for Camp. Not recommended. Moved to refer to committee.

No. 2—Envelopes for Camp. Amended to read and also to bring food-stuffs. Carried. Entire motion carried.

Reception Committee presented Brother Wheeler of Colorado. He was asked to give his testimony.

It was moved that the Superintendent appoint a Committee to draft a Memorial to the deceased members of our District. Sister Steelhead and Sister Nettleton were appointed.

It was voted to proceed with election of officers. The following were elected: District Superintendent E. R. Himmelright; Assistant Superintendent, J. W. Stuart; Secretary, C. R. Bennett.

THIRD SITTING

Brother Leasure in singing "Joy Unspeakable," followed with prayer by Brother Himmelright. Special song by Sister Weber.

Election of officers resumed. Treasurer, G. M. Pratt. Additional Councilmen, D. L. Goss, E. E. Storm, O. A. Wells, were elected.

Examining and Educational Board. Brother Steelhead re-elected. Motion made that Council serve as Home Missionary Committee. Carried.

Resolution Committee continued their report.

No. 15—Amended that all delegates attend Camp Meeting. Amended that it be recommended instead of required. Carried. Entire motion carried.

No. 2—Caretaker. Motion to refer to Ways and Means Committee.

No. 6—District Council—Trustees. Carried.

No. 7—Wedding and Class rings carried.

Ways and Means Committee report.

No. 1—Appeal to Executive Council. Amendment to use word recommend. Entire resolution carried.

No. 1—Carried.

Motion that the Superintendent be allowed to hold two or more revivals withdrawn.

Resolutions Committee report.

No. 29—Amended to read four meetings instead of two and keep the money. Carried.

No. 10—Substitute. Carried.

No. 2—Carried.

Committee on Memorials.

Report accepted.

The District Superintendent appoint the standing committees.

Motion made to accept partial Statistical report. Motion made to call roll and each Pastor state number of subscriptions to the Advocate he will attempt to secure. Brother Ingersoll—18, Bro. Bennett—15, Bro. Steelhead—10, Bro. Pratt—10, Bro. Harmon—10, Bro. Goss—5, Bro. Leasure—15, Bro. Moore—10, Bro. Witt—10, Bro. Stuart—15, Bro. Wells—10, Wenatchee—5, Bro. Weber—15, Bro. Nettleton—10.

Statistical report accepted. Adjournment with the singing of the Doxology.

RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that the District Council serve as the District Trustees.
2. Resolved that our District go on record as being opposed to our members wearing wedding and class rings.
3. Be it resolved that each church be granted the privilege of erecting a cabin for their pastor, the plans to be under the supervision of the District Council.
4. Resolved that the Conference request the District to provide a lunch stand on our camp grounds, the same to be governed by the District Council.
5. Resolved that the District Conference follow the annual camp meeting. Be it further recommended that the pastors and all members of the Conference be in attendance throughout the camp meeting.
6. Resolved, that we have a monthly publication to be called "The Idaho-Washington Bulletin." The District Council shall arrange a means of finance and also approve the appointment of an editor, selected by the District Superintendent. Be it further resolved that all pastors cooperate by sending church items to the District Editor.
7. Resolved that the Camp Registrar and Food Purchaser receive \$10.00 each for their services during camp and conference, this amount to be paid from camp meeting expense, and that food purchaser receive operating expenses above his \$10.00.
8. Resolved that the District Superintendent have the privilege of holding four meetings during the year off the district and to keep all money

9. Resolved, that we have one prayer convention and one three-day Christian Workers' Institute during the year, and that one or more services be devoted to the young people, the time and place shall be arranged by the Superintendent and his Assistant.

10. Resolved, that three hundred copies of the District minutes be printed.

11. Resolved, that the District Superintendent appoint the Statistical Committee at least two weeks prior to the Conference.

12. Resolved, that no worker be allowed on our platform whose practice, that is, their lives and dress, does not come up to our church standards.

13. Resolved, that the Conference elect a committee of two to work with the District Superintendent in district home missionary work, said committee to be nominated by the District Council and governed by rules drawn by the the Council.

14. Resolved, that our District Council serve as the Camp Meeting Committee or elect a committee if necessary.

15. Resolved that we recommend active ministers be elected as members of the District Council.

16. Resolved, that all parent members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church refrain from cutting their girls' hair and to dress them as becometh holiness.

17. Resolved that each church have a uniform Treasurer's book to keep accurate account.

18. Resolved that our conference year close May 31 and that each pastor sees that a correct report from his church be sent in not later than June 10 and in case of failure to do this the pastor explain same to the conference.

19. Resolved that our churches give our District Superintendent a cash offering besides the regular offering for his travel expense when he comes for the quarterly meeting.

20. Resolved that the District Superintendent instruct the local church board as to their duties when he makes his quarterly calls.

21. Resolved that each church have a financial budget, setting an allowance for all expenditures, including the pastor's salary.

22. Resolved, that all committees except the Reception Committee, be appointed by the District Superintendent at the close of each conference and hold office through the next yearly conference.

23. Resolved that each pastor and the District Superintendent be given a two weeks' vacation each year with pay.

24. Resolved that each church pay their pastor his salary during Camp Meeting and conference.

25. Resolved that we have a District Young People's Convention during the year and that it be held at a convenient time for those young people who are in school.

26. Resolved that all members voting in the annual church meeting, must be present.

27. Resolved that we have a meeting for ministers and workers at least three times during the Camp Meeting. The District Superintendent shall be in charge and all ministers and workers are urged to be present.

28. Resolved that we have a District Sunday School Committee to promote Sunday School interest in the district and to cooperate with the General Committee and that said committee be appointed by the District Council and the District Superintendent be a member of the committee. (Recommended by the General Sunday School Committee.)

29. Resolved that we have young people's study class during our Camp Meeting and that the District Council appoint a leader to take charge of this work.

30. Resolved, that the full addresses of all ministers be printed after their names in the Conference Minutes and that the words "Pastor or un-stationed by" dropped.

31. Resolved, that we express our appreciation to our District Superintendent, Secretary and Treasurer for their services during the year. Be it further resolved, that we express our appreciation to our cook, Sister Hueth, and her helpers in the kitchen; also to the Clarkston church and friends for the splendid entertainment furnished.

32. Resolved that we extend our appreciation to our Camp workers, Rev. S. I. Emery, Rev. P. F. Elliott, Rev. H. J. Olson and Rev. Roy Morgan. Their splendid messages and helpful advice are highly appreciated.

WAYS AND MEANS

1. Resolved that each local church of the district be apportioned the minimum of \$7.25 per voting member to finance our General church and district obligations. Said amount to be distributed as follows: Foreign Missions, \$1.90; District Expense, \$4.25; General Administration, 50 cents; General Home Missions, 60 cents. Be it further resolved that all active and inactive licensed and ordained ministers and Deaconesses pay the tithe of their remuneration received from their ministry into the local church treasury for the support of the District Superintendent, whose support shall not be less than \$100.00 per month. Be it further resolved that the tithe of the District Superintendent be paid into the Home Missions fund of the district.

2. Resolved that each church take a missionary offering each month during the year, alternating equally between Home and Foreign Missions.

3. Resolved, that local treasurer send all money for the district and general purposes to the District Treasurer by the 10th of each month.

4. Resolved, that our District Treasurer send our pastor a monthly statement of their church's district obligations the same to be posted in the church and that the pastors attempt to raise said amount when in arrears.

5. Resolved that we have a Home Missionary budget, that we use the Home Missionary pledge card recommended by the General Church, and that the District Superintendent present same to each church.

6. Resolved, that each Sunday School take 5 per cent of their regular offerings and send to the District Treasurer monthly to be applied on the District Home Mission Fund.

7. Resolved that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary, and District Treasurer be \$15.00 and \$30.00 respectively.

8. Resolved that the District pay traveling expenses for all Councilmen and entertainment of same for all sessions except Conference and Camp; also District Conventions.

9. Resolved that the District Superintendent receive three cents per mile traveling expense, when he uses his car and actual train or bus fare when traveling in the interest of the District.

10. Resolved that the District Treasurer be bonded, the amount to be set by the Council and the cost to be paid out of the District Fund.

11. Be it resolved that we use envelopes for the purpose of creating Camp Meeting funds from year to year. Same to be passed out at Camp Meeting time and all urged to give at least \$1.00 during the year for this fund. Also urge those who can to give foodstuffs.

12. Be it resolved that a registration fee be charged for all those eating at the dining hall or staying on the Camp Grounds as follows: (1) all over 14 years of age be charged the sum of \$2.00. (2) Furthermore there shall be a charge for meals in the dining room as follows. All 14 years and over shall pay for breakfast 15 cents; dinner and supper, 20 cents each. The above charges to aid in defraying the Camp Meeting expenses. Anyone willing to work for their meals and entertainment may do so by applying to the registrar.

13. Be it resolved that all ministers give two days' work before the Camp and Conference and as much time at the close of same as to take care of all necessary details; furthermore be it resolved that all ministers meet the above requirements shall be provided with their families free

entertainment during the Camp and Conference. Ministers not giving the proper amount and time during Camp and Conference shall pay the regular Camp Meeting charges for meals and entertainment.

14. Be it resolved that a request be sent to the General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, and to the members of the Executive Council, asking that the Idaho-Washington District be granted help from the General Home Missionary fund to the amount of \$300.00 during the Conference year of 1946-47.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Idaho-Washington Conference:

Greetings in the name of our Saviour and King.

We come to the close of another Conference year, thankful for God's mercy and the privilege of working in His vineyard, and wish to report that the Blood covers all sin just now.

The District has not made the progress that we would have liked to see the past year, but there has been some victories and advancements made, some good revivals have been reported with souls seeking the Lord.

Brother and Sister Nettleton have been laboring in Boise for some time and making some good gains. Brother Storm held a revival there this year and was able to organize a church with eleven members.

Clarkston and Hermiston have each built new churches and the Kennewick Church has started a church building, the basement having been dug, getting ready for the building.

There are some good prospects for Home Missionary work but workers are needed.

My personal report is as follows. I have visited each church at least three times and some four or five times. I have traveled on the District 12,989 miles, preached 119 times, held three revivals with a number of souls seeking to either be saved or sanctified. Preached two funerals, held several communion services in various churches. Salary received, \$1,200. Special offering, \$210.00. Revivals, \$201.72. Donations, \$16.65.
