JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Thirty-fourth annual conference of the Idaho-Washington District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in the camp meeting tabernacle at Clarkston, Washington, July 9, 1948 at 8:00 a.m.

Rev. L. J. Laubaugh conducted the song service. The song "Speak to my Soul" was sung by the conference.

We were then led in prayer by Rev. J. W. Partridge. "Draw Me Nearer" was sung before arising from prayer.

Rev. E. E. Storm, District Superintendent, introduced Rev. Wm. Neff, First Assistant General Superintendent, who addressed the conference and brought greetings from the General Church.

In addressing the conference, Romans 12 was read and commented on briefly.

The District Secretary gave the roll call.

The conference bar was formed. It was moved and seconded that the first five rows of seats and platform constitute the conference bar.

Moved to accept Rev. Ralph Armstrong, Paul Idler, and E. O. Rathbun into the conference bar. Carried.

Committees were appointed by the District Superintendent as follows: Reception, Sr. Webster and Sr. Himmelright; Memoirs, Sr. Nettleton and Sr. Weber.

Motion was made that the time of the conference settings be as follows: 8:00 - 12:00 a.m.; 1:30 - 5:00 p.m.; 6:00 - 9:30 p.m.

The District Superintendent presented his report, which was accepted.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The Educational Board reported. The recommendations as presented were ratified by the conference.

Ways and Means committee reported.

Moved to accept Resolution No. 2 as amended, thus reading: "District Home Missions."

Moved to adopt Resolution No. 1 as amended, "the amount to be \$9.00 instead of \$9.75."

Moved to adopt substitute motion to Resolution No. 4.

Resolution No. 5 read and adopted as amended.

Resolution No. 6 presented as amended. It was lost.

Resolution No. 8 accepted as to word change.

Resolution No. 11 was accepted as amended.

Resolution No. 12 read and accepted.

Resolution No. 13 (word change) adopted as changed.

Moved to carry the other yearly resolutions.

The Resolution committee reported.

Moved that Resolution No. 10 be amended to read that only 200 copies of the District minutes be printed. Supported.

Moved and seconded that Resolution No. 13 be amended as follows: "That the District Superintendent be the Home Missionary worker and that he select his helpers." It was lost.

The chair suggested a 10 minute recess which was accepted.

Business resumed after the recess.

Resolutions committee continued their report.

It was recommended to drop Resolution No. 25 and that No. 9 take its place. This was lost (Resolution No. 25 stands as is).

Resolution No. 26 was presented. Moved to delete from minutes. Carried.

Committee presented Resolution No. 29, which was discussed, but no change made.

The District Statistician read his report. Moved and seconded to accept the report as read.

Moved and seconded that the first order of business immediately after the noon hour be the election of officers.

Moved and seconded to change the time of the meeting from 1:30 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. Carried.

It was moved and seconded to recess.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting opened at 1:00 p.m. by singing "Sweeter Than All," led by Rev. D. L. Goss.

We all knelt in silent prayer after which Rev. Wm. Neff prayed for God's blessings upon us.

He then spoke for a few minutes on "Defining Our Objectives."

1. Genuine Goal for increase in membership.
2. Increase in finances in Church.
3. Spiritual objectives.

The election of officers was the order of the day.

Tellers appointed by District Superintendent were as follows: Rev. L. J. Laubaugh, Harold Penny, Stanley Weber and Fred Shoemaker.

Proceeded with the voting. Officers elected as follows:

District Superintendent, Rev. E. E. Storm.

Assistant Superintendent, Rev. G. M. Pratt.

Secretary, Rev. C. R. Bennett.

Treasurer, Rev. William P. Moore.

Additional Councilmen: Rev. D. L. Goss, Rev. O. A. Wells and Rev. Ralph Armstrong. One member of the Examining and Educational Board, Rev. G. M. Pratt.

Votes were cast for the Home Missionary Committee. Rev. G. M. Pratt and Rev. Wm. P. Moore were elected.

The Resolutions committee reported. Resolution No. 16 was presented for deletion.

The question was called for, vote was attained by rising vote. The motion was deleted.

Resolution No. 30 as amended, adding the words, "the pastor's telephone number." Carried.

Resolution No. 33 was presented by the committee. Moved and seconded to combine Resolution No. 33 and 19. Carried.

Resolution No. 34 presented as follows: Resolved that we extend our appreciation to all our camp meeting workers, viz: Rev. E. E. Leadingham, and all those who brought messages in song. Also to Brother Kuhl for food donations given for the camp, and to our beloved First Assistant General Superintendent Rev. Wm. H. Neff, and our District Superintendent Rev. E. E. Storm.

Committees for the coming year were read by the District Superintendent.

Resolutions: Rev. J. W. Partridge, Rev. Stanley Weber and Rev. E. O. Rathbun.

Ways and Means: Rev. D. L. Goss, Rev. A. G. Wheeler and Rev. G. M. Pratt.

Editing Committee: Rev. C. R. Bennett and Rev. J. W. Partridge
District Bulletin: Rev. Fred L. Shoemaker.

Auditing Committee: Mrs. G. M. Pratt and Mrs. Fred L. Shoemaker.

It was moved and seconded to ratify the recommendation of the District Council in the appointment of Rev. Shoemaker as Editor for the District Bulletin. Carried.

Moved and seconded that the District Council approve the conference minutes. Carried.

The District Young People's worker gave a report which was accepted.

The Memoir committee give their report which was accepted.

Moved and seconded to adjourn. Conference closed by singing "We're Marching To Zion." After remarks by the chairman to take steps to go forward in the work of the District the conference closed by the benedictory prayer by Brother Neff.

RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that the District Council serve as the District Trustees.

2. Resolved that our District go on record as being opposed to our members wearing wedding rings.

3. Be it resolved that each church be granted the privilege of erecting a cabin for their pastor, the plans to be under the supervision of the District Council.

4. Resolved that the conference request the District to provide a lunch stand on our camp grounds, the same to be governed by the District Council.

5. Resolved that the District Conference follow the annual camp meeting. Be it further recommended that the pastors and all members of the conference be in attendance throughout the camp meeting.

6. Resolved that we have a monthly publication to be called the "Idaho-Washington Bulletin." The District Council shall arrange a means of finance and also approve the appointment of an editor, selected by the District Superintendent. Be it further resolved that all pastors cooperate by sending church items to the District editor.

7. Resolved that the Camp Registrar and Food Purchaser receive \$10.00 each for their services during camp and conference. This amount to be paid from the camp meeting expense, and the food purchaser receive operating expenses above his \$10.00.

8. Resolved that the District Superintendent have the privilege of holding four meetings during the year off the District and to keep all money.

9. Resolved that we have one prayer convention and one three day Christian Workers Institute during the year, and that one or more services be devoted to the young people, the time and place shall be arranged by the Superintendent and his assistant.

10. Resolved that two-hundred copies of the District minutes be printed.

11. Resolved that the District Superintendent appoint the Statistical committee at least two weeks prior to the conference.

12. Resolved that no worker be allowed on our platform whose practice, that is, their lives and dress, does not come up to our church standard.

13. Resolved that the conference elect a committee of two to work with the District Superintendent in District home missionary work. Said committee to be nominated by the District Council.

14. Resolved that our District Council serve as our Camp Meeting committee or elect a committee if necessary.

15. Resolved that we recommend active ministers be elected as members of the District Council.

16. Resolved that each church treasurer have a uniform treasurer's book to keep accurate accounts.

17. Resolved that our conference year close June 30 and that each pastor see that a correct report from his church be sent in not later than July 10 and in case of failure to do so the pastor explain to the conference.

18. Resolved that our churches give our District Superintendent a cash offering for his travel expense when he comes for the quarterly meetings. This offering to be sent to the District Treasurer.

19. Resolved that the District Superintendent instruct the local church board as to their duties when he comes for his quarterly calls.

20. Resolved that each church have a financial budget, setting an allowance for all expenditures, including the pastor's salary.

21. Resolved that all committees except the Reception committee be appointed by the District Superintendent at the close of each conference and hold office through the next yearly conference.

22. Resolved that each pastor and Superintendent be given a two weeks vacation with pay.

23. Resolved that each church pay their pastor his salary during the camp and conference.

24. Resolved that we have District Young People's Convention during the year and that it be held at a convenient time for the young people who are in school.

25. Resolved that we have a meeting for ministers and workers at least three times during the camp meeting. The District Super-

intendent shall be in charge and all ministers and workers are urged to be present.

26. Resolved that we have a District Sunday School Committee to promote Sunday School interest in the District and to cooperate with the General Committee and that said appointment by the District Council and the District Superintendent be a member of the committee. (Recommended by the General Sunday School Committee.)

27. Resolved that we have our young people's study class during the camp meeting and that the District Council appoint a leader to take charge of the work.

28. Resolved that the full addresses of the ministers with their telephone numbers be printed after their names in the Conference Minutes and that the words: "Pastor or unstationed" be dropped.

29. Resolved that we express our appreciation to our District Superintendent, Secretary and Treasurer for their services during the year. Be it further resolved, that we express our appreciation to our cook Sr. Hueth, and her helpers in the kitchen, also to the Clarkston church and friends for the splendid entertainment furnished.

30. Resolved that the District Treasurer prepare some form that may be sent to the local treasurer upon which may be indicated the amount of the budget, both District and General. The same to be used by the local treasurer for sending the remittances to the District Treasurer, so that he may know what portions of the said remittance is for the various divisions of the budget.

30. Resolved that we extend our appreciation to all our camp meeting workers, namely: Rev. E. E. Leadingham and all those who brought messages in song. Also Brother Kuel for food donations given for the camp, and to our beloved First Assistant General Superintendent. Rev. Wm. H. Neff, and our District Superintendent Rev. E. E. Storm.

WAYS AND MEANS

1. Be it resolved that each local church of the District be apportioned the minimum of \$9.00 per voting member, plus the pastor's tithe for District administration expense, plus \$2.00 for General Foreign, \$1.00 for General Home Missions and \$1.00 for General administration expense.

2. Resolved that each church take a missionary offering each month during the year, alternating equally between District Home Missions and Foreign Missions.

3. Resolved that all treasurers send local money for the District and General purposes to the District Treasurer by the tenth of each month.

4. Resolved that each local treasurer give the pastor a monthly statement of the church's District obligation and that when in arrears the pastor shall attempt to raise the same.

5. Resolved that we have a Home Missionary fund to be raised by special offerings during the camp meetings and by use of pledge cards, the same to be presented by the District Superintendent in cooperation with the pastors to the amount of \$1,000 or more.

6. Resolved that each sunday school take 5% of their regular offerings and send to the District Treasurer to be applied on District Home Missionary Fund.

7. Resolved that the annual remuneration of the District Secretary and Treasurer be \$15.00 and \$30.00 respectively.

8. Resolved that the expenses of travel and entertainment for all called sessions of the Council except those meetings held during camp meetings and District conventions be assumed by the District.

9. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent receive .05 cents per mile for his travel expense when he uses his car and actual train or bus fare when traveling in interest of the District.

10. Resolved that the District Treasurer be bonded, the amount to be set by the Council, and the cost to be paid out of the District fund.

11. Be it resolved that each church take an offering at least once a quarter for camp expense.

12. Be it resolved that a registration fee be charged for those eating in the dining hall or staying on the grounds as follows: (1) Over 12 years of age shall pay \$2.00; (2) Furthermore the minimum charge for breakfast shall be 25c, dinner 30c each. The above charges to aid in defraying camp meeting expenses. Provision will be made for those willing to work for their meals.

13. Be it resolved that all ministers give two days work before the camp and conference and as much time at close to take care of the details; furthermore be it resolved, that free entertainment be provided, ministers unable to comply with the above requirements shall be expected to meet the conditions as referred to in Resolution No. 12.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the District Conference of the Idaho-Washington District.

Greetings in the Name of Our Lord and Coming King:

Another year has passed into history. There has been many problems, but God has been very gracious to us.

I feel that the District has made progress spiritually. Some of the churches have good gains, while others have had a loss in membership. Caldwell Church has purchased a lot and is planning a building program, which we hope to see started at once. Boise Church has completed their parsonage, which at present is used for a place of worship. They hope to be able to start a church building program. Coeur d'Alene Church has been doing some work on their church and parsonage.

While it is true that there has been both losses and gains in the church, I feel that the ministry and laity are striving for a greater spiritual awakening on the district, that God's Kingdom may go forward.

I have visited all the churches at least twice, some of them more. Total visits to churches 43, conducted 35 business meetings, preached 187 times, conducted 6 revivals on the District with 91 individual seekers.

I have traveled in the interest of the District 18,741 miles.

Total support received \$1288.40.
