CONFERENCE JOURNAL

The thirty-seventh annual Conference of the Idaho-Washington District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in the camp-meeting tabernacle, at Clarkston, Washington, July 23, 1951, at 8:00 A.M.

Rev. Paul Idler led the congregation in singing "I Need Thee Every Hour". Prayer was offered by Bro. G. M. Pratt.

Rev. M. C. Kittle read a letter of greeting from our General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, authorizing Rev. P. F. Elliott, Secretary of Sunday-schools and Youth Work, to preside over the Conference. He then introduced Bro. Elliott to the Conference.

Bro. Elliott addressed the Conference stressing our objective, that of winning souls for the Master. He read the 13th chapter of 1st Corinthians as the Scripture lesson.

The roll was called with twenty-four ministers and delegates responding.

The names of D. L. Goss, W. F. Coy, and Lyle Tullis were presented and they were received into the Conference. Each gave testimony of victory. Rev. and Mrs. Dale Swinney and Mrs. Lyle Tullis also testified.

The report of the Educational Board was presented as follows: We recommend that W. F. Coy be accepted as an ordained minister; Paul Idler be granted 4th year license; R. H. Buery be granted 3rd year license; Alton Finney, W. H. Harman and Lyle Tullis be granted 2nd year licenses; Ralph Coy, Allen Harman, Virgil Hogarth, Iona Kittle and Dale Swinney be granted 1st year licenses. The report was accepted and approved.

It was voted that the first five rows of seats across the tabernacle and the platform constitute the conference bar.

A motion prevailed that the time of conference sittings be the same as last year, namely, 8:00-12:00 A.M.; 1:30-5:00 P.M.; 6:00-9:30 P.M.

The District Superintendent, Rev. M. C. Kittle, gave his annual report which was accepted with appreciation. The congregation expressed their confidence in their leader by singing a stanza of "Blest Be the Tie That Binds".

The Assistant Superintendent, Rev. G. M. Pratt, gave a verbal report which was accepted with thanksgiving.

The District Treasurer's report was read. The Superintendent appointed Sr. Swinney as auditor in place of Sr. Pratt who was absent.

The Ways and Means committee presented a report. Resolution No. 1 to be changed to read: "Resolved that 14% of all local church receipts except building funds be applied on the District budget as follows: $90\frac{1}{2}\%$ for District Expense, 3% for General Conference Delegate Expense, 3% for District Home Missions, 3% for District Church Extension loan fund, $\frac{1}{2}\%$ for Pilgrim Evangelistic Institute".

After much discussion a motion was made to refer it to the committee. There was no second.

An amendment was offered as follows: "That each church raise the equivalent of 14% of the receipts except building and improvement funds".

An amendment was offered to insert the word "major" before improvements. This was lost.

Another amendment was offered to exempt evangelists' offerings but this was lost.

The first amendment carried and the resolution as amended carried.

Resolution No. 11 was amended providing the Camp Association fee be \$1.00 instead of \$1.50.

Resolution No. 12 was amended by inserting the words "and district superintendent".

Resolution No. 13 was presented as follows: "Resolved that the District Treasurer pay the equivalent of 4% of the District Superintendent's salary into the Pension fund of the General Church."

The resolution was carried.

Resolution No. 14 was presented as follows: "Resolved that the District Treasurer deposit the General Conference Delegate fund in a savings account until needed."

The resolution was carried.

Resolution No. 15 was presented as follows: "Resolved that the District Treasurer and family receive free registration and meals during the camp meeting".

An amendment was offered to replace the words "District Treasurer and family" with the words "all pastors and families".

Another amendment was offered to include the District Superintendent and family. The resolution as amended was carried.

The Resolutions Committee presented a report.

Resolution No. 3 was changed to read: "Resolved that each church be urged to erect a cabin on the camp-ground for their pastor. Laymon may also build cabins. All building plans to be under the direction of the District Council."

Resolution No. 5 was changed to read: "Resolved that the Council appoint an editor and arrange a means of finance for a district publication."

Resolution No. 10 was deleted from the Minutes.

It was recommended by the committee that the following words from Resolution No. 14 be deleted: "and in case of failure to do so the pastor explain to the conference". This was adopted.

Resolution No. 16 was changed to read: "Resolved that the District Superintendent upon his first quarterly visit to the churches instruct the local church board as to their duties".

Resolution No. 25 was changed to read: "Resolved that we express our deep appreciation to our camp and conference workers, namely: Rev. and Mrs. Wm. S. Deal; Rev. and Mrs. Paul Trissel; Rev. P. F. Elliott; and Rev. and Mrs. G. C. Avery.

The Committee recommended the deletion of resolution No. 6 and the insertion of the following: "Resolved that we pay our Superintendent for nine months of the year and permit him to do evangelistic work during the months of January, February and March".

The deletion was carried by action of the Conference.

The resolution to be inserted was tabled.

Rev. and Mrs. Paul Trissel were presented to the Conference and gave words of testimony.

The conference recessed with a prayer of benediction.

Second Sitting

The Conference reconvened with the singing of the song, "All the Way My Savior Leads Me".

Prayer was offered by Bro. Rathbun.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

Bros. Ralph Coy and Dale Swinney were presented and received into the Conference.

Rev. M. N. Swinney reported as Conference Secretary of Sunday-schools and this report was received.

Rev. Swinney presented a certificate of award to Ralph Coy and the Spirit Lake Sunday-school.

The Auditing Committee reported and the report was accepted.

The Treasurer's report was received.

The District Statistician presented a report and it was received.

The Conference proceeded with the election of officers. The Superintendent appointed Bros. Buery and Coy as tellers.

Rev. M. C. Kittle was re-elected Superintendent on the lst ballot.

Rev. G. M. Pratt was re-elected Assistant Superintendent on the 4th ballot.

Rev. L. J. Laubaugh was elected Secretary on the 1st ballot.

Rev. Wm. P. Moore was re-elected Treasurer on the 4th ballot.

Rev. Alton Finney, Rev. M. N. Swinney and Rev. Lyle Tullis were elected as Advisory Council Members.

Rev. Lyle Tullis was elected as member of the Educational Board to fill the unexpired term of Bro. Sherman Moore.

Rev. D. L. Goss was elected on the Educational Board.

The District Superintendent appointed the Resolutions, Ways and Means and the Auditing Committees and the Statistician.

The Committee on Memoirs reported on the death of one of the district ministers, Rev. Wm. J. Horning.

A motion was presented to the Conference to rescind the action in the morning sitting on Resolution No. 6 thus leaving it in the minutes.

This motion was seconded and carried.

A motion prevailed to leave all unfinished business of the Conference to the Council.

Adjourned with prayer.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the 37th Annual Conference of the Idaho-Washington District:-

Greetings in the name of our Lord:-

In the providence of God we gather to give an account of our stewardship for another year's labors.

I. SPIRITUALLY

We have had some remarkable answers to prayer, resulting in definite conversions.

We have been blessed in youth conventions, Ministerial Meetings and Camp Meeting.

Some fruitful revivals have been held on the district.

A good spirit prevails in our midst.

II. MATERIALLY

We have had many splendid material gains in the churches.

- 1. Clarkston has completed a beautiful parsonage, which constitutes a real triumph for this group.
- 2. Weippe has made many improvements in parsonage and church.
- 3. Coeur d'Alene has installed a new furnace, added Sunday School rooms in the basement and other improvements.
- 4. Spokane --redecorating, hot water heater, etc.
- 5. McGuires --extensive redecorating and alteration in both church and parsonage.

6. Spirit Lake -- redecorating.

- 7. Grandview --painted Church and Parsonage.
- 8. Kennewick --extensive improvements in church and parsonage --really a transformation.
- 9. Hermiston --Paid indebtedness --Raised money for new seats, redecoration -- we are praying and believing that Hermiston will be able to complete their building this year.
- 10. All the other churches have made some improvements.
- 11. We have spent approximately \$250.00 in Camp Ground improvement.
- 12. A church building has been bought and paid for in Yakima, Wash. with approximately \$1000.00 in cash on hand to launch this work.
- 13. Brother and Sr. Buery have purchased lots in Newport and are believing God for a work there.

III. NUMERICALLY

We have suffered a loss of 11.2% in membership.

I do not wish in any way to minimize the tragedy of this loss but a careful examination will reveal that the transient condition of the country is largely responsible for this. 30 members lost by transfer.

We made a normal gain but suffered an abnormal loss.

In spite of this loss in membership every other department shows a healthy gain.

Sunday School gain - - - - 9%

Young People's Society - - 4.3% gain in membership

Young People's Society - - 6% plus gain in attendance

IV. FINANCIALLY

We have made splendid gains, namely:-

18.8% gain in Total Church Receipts

20.2% gain in Sunday School Receipts

28.8% gain in Pastoral Support

RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that the district council serve as the district trustees.

2. Resolved that all recall meetings be held sixty days prior to the district conference. The district superintendent to be notified of the results of said meetings within ten days.

3. Resolved that each church be urged to erect a cabin on the camp-ground for their pastor. Laymen may also build cabins. All building plans to be under the direction of the district council.

4. Resolved that the district conference follow the annual camp-meeting. Be it further recommended that the pastors and all members of the conference be in attendance throughout the camp-meeting.

5. Resolved that the council appoint an editor and arrange a means of finance for a district publication.

6. Resolved that the district superintendent have the privilege of holding four meetings during the year off the district and to keep all money.

7. Resolved that we have one three-day ministerial meeting to be held in early spring. The time and place to be arranged by the district superintendent and his assistant.

8. Resolved that two-hundred copies of the district minutes be printed.

9. Resolved that the district superintendent appoint the statistical committee at least two weeks prior to the conference.

10. Resolved that the council be authorized to appoint a committee of two to work with the superintendent in home missionary work.

11. Resolved that our district council serve as our camp-meeting committee or elect a committee if necessary.

12. Resolved that we recommend active ministers be elected as members of the district council.

13. Resolved that each church treasurer have a uniform treasurer's book to keep accurate accounts.

14. Resolved that our conference year close June 30th and that each pastor see that a correct report from his church be sent in not later than July 10th. 15. Resolved that in the quarterly meetings each church take an offering for the superintendent's travel expense to be sent to the district treasurer.

16. Resolved that the district superintendent upon his first quarterly visit to the churches instruct the local church board as to its duties.

17. Resolved that each church have a financial budget, setting an allowance for all expenditures, including the pastor's salary.

18. Resolved that all committees be appointed by the district superintendent at the close of each conference and hold office through the year, except the reception committee, which he shall appoint at the beginning of each conference.

19. Resolved that each pastor and superintendent be given a two-weeks vacation with pay.

20. Resolved that each church pay their pastor his salary during the camp and conference.

21. Resolved that we have a district young people's convention during the year and that it be held a convenient time for the young people who are in school.

22. Resolved that we have a meeting for ministers and workers at least three times during the camp-meeting, the district superintendent shall be in charge and all ministers and workers are urged to be present.

23. Resolved that we have a district sunday-school committee to promote sunday-school interest in the district and to cooperate with the general committee and that said committee be appointed by the district council and the district superintendent be a member of the committee. (Recommended by the General Sunday-school Committee).

24. Resolved that we express our appreciation to our district superintendent, secretary, and treasurer for their services during the year. Be it further resolved, that we express our appreciation to our cook, Sr. Hueth, and her helpers in the kitchen, also to the Clarkston church and friends for the splendid entertainment and food donations.

25. Resolved that we express our deep appreciation to our camp and conference workers, namely: Rev. and ars. Wm. S. Deal; Rev. and Mrs. Paul Trissel; Rev. P. F. Elliott; and Rev. and Mrs. G. C. Avery.

WAYS AND MEANS

1. Resolved that each church raise the equivalent of 14% of the receipts except building and improvement funds to be applied on the district budget as follows: $90\frac{1}{2}\%$ for Tistrict Expense, 5% for General Conference Delegate Expense, 3% for Tistrict Home Missions, 3% for District Church Extension loan fund, $\frac{1}{2}\%$ for Pilgrim Evangelistic Institute.

2. Resolved that each church take a missionary offering each month during the year, alternating equally between district home missions and foreign missions, offerings to apply on local budget.

3. Resolved that all treasurers send local money for the district and general purposes to the district treasurer by the tenth of each month.

4. Resolved that each local treasurer give the pastor a monthly statement of the church's district obligation and that when in arrears the pastor shall attempt to raise the same.

5. Resolved that we have a home missionary fund to be raised by special offerings during the camp-meeting and by use of pledge cards, the same to be presented by the presiding officer in cooperation with the pastors to the amount of \$1000 or more.

6. Resolved that each Sunday-school apply 3% of their regular offering and send to the district treasurer to be applied on district home missionary fund.

7. Resolved that the annual remuneration of the district secretary and treasurer be \$15.00 and \$30.00 respectively.

8. Resolved that the expenses of travel and entertainment for all called sessions of the council except those meetings held during camp-meetings and district conventions be assumed by the district.

9. Resolved that the district superintendent receive \$125.00 per month salary, five cents per mile for his travel expense when he uses his car and actual train or bus fare when traveling in the interest of the district.

10. Resolved that the district treasurer be bonded, such amount to be set by the council, and the cost to be paid out of the district expense fund.

11. Resolved that we have a camp-meeting association with a membership fee of \$1.00 per year, to be equally divided between camp expense and camp-ground improvement. Be it further resolved that the district superintendent

present this association on his visits to the churches and get as many members as possible.

12. Resolved that all pastors and unstationed ministers and the district superintendent pay their tithe from ministerial remuneration to the local treasurer to be directed into the district expense fund.

13. Resolved that the district treasurer pay the equivalent of 4% of the district superintendent's salary into the pension fund of the General Church.

14. Resolved that the district treasurer deposit the General Conference Delegate fund in a savings account until needed.

15. Resolved that all pastors and families including the district superintendent and his family receive free registration and meals during the camp-meeting.
