## CONFERENCE JOURNAL

The thirty-ninth annual conference of the Idaho-Washington District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in the camp-meeting tabernacle, at Clarkston, Wash., July 20, 1953, at 8:00 A. M.

Rev. David Bailey led the congregation in singing the song, "The Unsearchable Riches of Christ". Prayer was offered by Bro. G. M. Pratt.

The district superintendent, Rev. Finney, introduced the General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk, who addressed the Conference. He spoke briefly that the greatest need of the conference is the unction of the Holy Ghost.

The roll was called with twenty-seven ministers and delegates responding.

The conference bar was set to include the first six rows of seats and the platform of the tabernacle.

The Reception Committee presented the following guests: Rev. Stone, from Kentucky; Rev. Vaughn, from N. Carolina; Rev. Moore, from Portland; Rev. Hoover, from Colorado; Rev. Ewers, from Michigan and Rev. Bailey, from Spokane. Each of these brethren gave words of testimony and were given honorary seats within the conference bar.

The time for sittings was voted to be 8:00-12:00 A.M.; 1:30-5:00 P.M.; 6:00-9:00 P.M.

A report of Rev. E. E. Leadingham of his labors as superintendent was read by the secretary. Rev. Alton Finney, district superintendent, read his report. Both of these reports were received.

The auditing committee reported and its report was received.

The district treasurer presented his report and it was received.

The district statistician's report was given and received. The Promotional S. S. secretary gave his report which was received.

The Educational and Examining Board reported and their recommendations were accepted.

The Resolutions Committee recommended the deletion of resolutions No. 13 and 17. It was voted to delete.

The following resolution was presented to the conference by the committee: Resolved that we favor the merging of the two Northwest districts and the secretary convey this action to the Pacific Northwest District and to the Executive Council. Be it further resolved that we leave the office of the superintendent vacant, and if this action is not approved by the Executive Council that the General Board send us a superintendent.

Considerable discussion followed during which the conference recessed because of the expiration of time.

It was voted to change the time of the next sitting to 1:00 P. M.

### Second Sitting

The afternoon session convened with prayer by Bro. Ewers.

The discussion of the resolution continued and the vote was taken resulting in seven in favor and twenty-two opposed. The resolution was lost.

A motion from the floor was made and seconded that we have a full-time superintendent. It was carried.

The committee presented the following: Resolved that we elect a district missionary president to oversee the work of the local missionary societies, and be it further resolved that each missionary society send a quarterly report to the district missionary president, and an annual report to the conference and that said report be entered in the conference minutes. This resolution was carried.

The Ways and Means Committee presented a report. It recommended that in Resolution No. 1,  $\frac{1}{2}\%$  for Pilgrim Evangelistic Institute be changed to the purpose of building our own school. This proposed change was lost.

The secretary was asked to make a correction of a typographical error in Resolution No. 7.

It was recommended that in Resolution No. 11, the word "minimum" be inserted and the clause, "get as many members as possible" be deleted. This was carried.

The committee offered the following: Resolved that the district superintendent on his visits to the churches take offerings to aid in the General Conference Delegate Fund. A substitute was offered from the floor to transfer \$700

from the district expense fund to General Conference Delegate Expense fund. The substitute motion was carried.

A resolution was offered providing for donations to be given the district superintendent on his visits to the churches. A substitute motion from the floor was presented providing a salary for the superintendent of \$200 per month plus his utilities and five cents per mile traveling expense. The substitute motion was carried.

The following resolution was presented: Resolved that free entertainment be given the pastors and their families who work on the camp ground, preparing for and cleaning up after the camp and conference. An amendment was added as follows: For those who work on the designated work days. The resolution as amended was carried.

The committee presented the following resolution: Be it resolved that we improve our camp ground by adding some new cabins and a dormitory using some of the money from the sale of the Caldwell property. There was no second to the resolution.

The Committee on Memorials to the General Conference offered the following resolutions: Resolved that the General Church publish an annual combined minutes of our districts consisting of a complete ministerial directory, and major items in the local church statistical and financial reports. Resolved that the General Board make some provision in the financial program of the Church Extension Department to establish churches within organized districts. Resolved that our publishing house publish graded Sunday School material. These resolutions were passed.

A letter from the Websters was read by the superintendent. It was voted to send greetings to them.

The superintendent read the report of Sr. Swimney, The Missionary Society president. This report was accepted.

The election of officers was the next item of business with the results as follows: District Superintendent, Rev. Alton Finney; Ass't Supt., Rev. Paul Washburn; Dist. Sec'y, Rev. Lloyd Laubaugh; Dist. Treas., Rev. M. N. Swimney; Advisory Council Members, Rev. E. O. Rathbun, Rev. D. L. Goss, Rev. Lyle Tullis; Educ. & Exam. Board, Rev. G. M. Pratt; Ministerial Delegates to General Conference,

Rev. D. L. Goss, Rev. Lyle Tullis and Rev. G. M. Pratt as alternate. Elbert Bailey was elected as lay delegate to the General Conference with Sister Himmelright as first alternate and Bertha Bacon as second alternate.

A dedication service was held for the baby daughter of Rev. and Mrs. R. E. Buery.

The sitting was dismissed with prayer by Br. Pratt.

### Third Sitting

The Conference reconvened with an ordination service for Mr. and Mrs. Paul Washburn, Lyle Tullis and Alton Finney.

The superintendent appointed the following committees: Resolutions, L. J. Laubaugh, L. V. Tullis, Wm. P. Moore, D. L. Goss, A. G. Wheeler; Ways and Means, M. N. Swinney, O. A. Wells, G. M. Pratt, E. O. Rathbun, Paul Washburn; Auditing, Hazel Goss, Mrs. Rathbun; Statistician, Mrs. Paul Washburn.

A motion prevailed that the Council appoint a District Missionary president.

The conference adjourned with prayer by Bro. Sturk.

We have completed another year in the great work of the kingdom, and thus are one year nearer eternity. We are met here to give account of our activities during the past year and to make plans for another year. Jesus may come before another conference, but we must work until he comes. We can't afford to rest on the oars, but must keep rowing with all our might until "Old Ship Zion" is safely anchored in the harbor.

This has been a great year in the Lord; even though we haven't made the numerical gain we would have liked to have seen, we feel we have made great spiritual strides. God has given some glorious revivals in some of our churches. We are indeed grateful to God for the wonderful camp meeting which has just closed. Most of our churches have made material gains. Kennewick has added a rear entrance and restrooms, also redecorated the parsonage. Coeur d'Alene has rewired the church, added new classrooms in the basement, insulated the parsonage and the Young People's Society has purchased new light fixtures. McGuire has redecorated the church and are adding two bedrooms and bath to the parsonage. Benton City has added a twelve foot addition to the church, redecorated the church and parsonage and landscaped the lawn. Hermiston has completed the work on the church restrooms which were begun last year. They have also refinished the floor in the church and have put in sidewalks for the church and parsonage. Outstanding among the labors of the Hermiston Pilgrims is the beautiful new parsonage, which was built and paid for this year. Weippe has nearly completed a basement under their church. They will be adding classrooms and a furnace soon. Grandview has redecorated the interior of the church. Spirit Lake has installed a bath in the parsonage. Yakima has completed the front entrance of the church which was begun last year. Spokane has redecorated the church and is in the process of painting the exterior. They have also refinished the floor and installed a beautiful new sign in front of the church. Clarkston has replaced the old benches with pews. They have also installed and paid for a new furnace in the church this year.

Outstanding improvements have also been made at our district camp ground. We have installed a large gas range and a water heater in the kitchen. We have also put toilets and showers in the washrooms. We have purchased several more bunkbeds for the camp. Let us pray that God will help us in the near future to make more much needed improvement.

Personally I wish to say that I am very grateful for the kindness shown me and the wonderful cooperation of every pastor and Pilgrim on the district. Also for the splendid cooperation given me in carrying on the duties of the camp.

My personal labors for the district aside from my pastorate are as follows:

As district Missionary president, I submit the following report for the year 1952 and '53.

We have active missionary societies in nearly every church with 93 active members and 55 associate members, making a total of 148 members. Two societies are taking the Mission study course put out at headquarters, and three societies are participating in the reading course. We are subscribing to 80 missionary bulletins on the district. (With a society membership of 148 that is not as many as we should be taking.) We have 39 Junior Missionary subscriptions. Clarkston and Hermiston are supporting native workers. Clarkston gave \$180.00 this year for Native Worker support and Hermiston, \$135.00. Our societies were all very active in sending boxes of used clothing to headquarters for distribution, and also sending direct to the field. I would like to report the total number of pounds of used clothing, bandages and literature sent, but some of the societies kept record only of the number of boxes sent and not the pounds. So all I can do is to report 1097 pounds plus 16 boxes that we do not know the weight of. This does not include the Christmas packages. \$102.86 postage was paid out on these packages. Most of the societies sent some missionary a fine Christmas box.

The following are a few extras reported:

Hermiston sent \$25.00 to headquarters to be used for duty on boxes sent to missionaries. They also made 13

skirts and blouses for Native Bible women. Clarkston participated four months in the projects listed in the News Sheet for those months and also sent  $11\frac{1}{2}$  pounds of baby clothing. Spirit Lake included new things such as dish towels, pillow cases, dresser scarfs and rolled bandages, in with their boxes of used clothing. A number report helping refinish their local parsonage. Post Falls and Grandview each made two quilts and sent to missionaries. Weippe and Spirit Lake made quilts for our own camp. Grandview gave \$25.00 on the new range for the camp kitchen. Coeur d'Alene sent 16 boxes of used clothing and two quilts to missionaries, one ladies' dress and four baby dresses and two slips for the Berg family making a total of \$86.05 raised for Foreign Missions. The societies have been very good about bringing in food supplies for this year's camp.

The Lord has truly blessed us as we have worked for Him and others. I am pleased with the reports the societies have sent in to me. With God's help I am sure we can do even more next year.

## RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that the district council serve as the district trustees.
2. Resolved that all recall meetings be held sixty days to the district conference. The district superintendent to be notified of the results of said meetings within ten days.
3. Resolved that each church be urged to erect a cabin on the camp ground for their pastor. Laymen may also build cabins. All building plans to be under the direction of the district council.
4. Resolved that the district conference follow the annual camp meeting. Be it further recommended that the pastors and all members of the conference be in attendance throughout the camp meeting.
5. Resolved that the council appoint an editor and arrange a means of finance for a district publication.
6. Resolved that the district superintendent have the privilege of holding four meetings during the year off the district and to keep all money.
7. Resolved that we have one three-day ministerial meeting to be held in early spring. The time and place to be arranged by the superintendent and his assistant.
8. Resolved that two-hundred copies of the district minutes be printed.
9. Resolved that the superintendent appoint the statistician at least two weeks prior to the conference.
10. Resolved that the council be authorized to appoint a committee of two to work with the superintendent in home missionary work.
11. Resolved that the district council serve as the camp-meeting committee or elect a committee if necessary.
12. Resolved that we recommend active ministers be elected as members of the district council.
13. Resolved that our conference year close June 30 and that each pastor see that a correct report from his church be sent in not later than July 10.
14. Resolved that in the quarterly meetings each church take an offering for the superintendent's travel expense to be sent to the district treasurer.
15. Resolved that the district superintendent upon his first quarterly visit to the churches instruct the local

church board as to its duties.

16. Resolved that all committees be appointed by the superintendent at the close of each conference and hold office through the year, except the reception committee, which he shall appoint at the beginning of each conference.

17. Resolved that each pastor and superintendent be given a two-week vacation with pay.

18. Resolved that each church pay their pastor his salary during the camp and conference.

19. Resolved that we have a district young people's convention during the year and that it be held at a convenient time for the young people who are in school.

20. Resolved that we have a meeting for ministers and workers at least three times during the camp meeting, the district superintendent shall be in charge and all ministers and workers are urged to be present.

21. Resolved that we have a district Sunday school committee to promote Sunday school interest in the district and to cooperate with the general committee and that said committee be appointed by the district council and the district superintendent be a member of the committee.  
(Recommended by the General Sunday School Committee)

22. Resolved that the people who attend camp meeting be counted in attendance at their local Sunday school.

23. Resolved that we elect a district missionary president to oversee the work of the local missionary societies, and be it further resolved that each missionary society send a quarterly report to the district missionary president, and an annual report to the conference and that said report be entered in the conference minutes.

24. Resolved that we express our appreciation to our district superintendent, secretary and treasurer for their services during the year. Be it further resolved that we express our appreciation to our cook, Sr. Wheeler, and her helpers in the kitchen, also to the Clarkston church and friends for the splendid entertainment and food donations.

25. Resolved that we express our deep appreciation to our camp and conference workers, namely: Rev. T.C. Vaughn, Rev. and Mrs. W. T. Stone and our beloved General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk.

### WAYS AND MEANS

1. Resolved that each church raise the equivalent of 12% of the receipts except building and improvement funds and evangelists' offerings to be applied on the district budget as follows: 90 $\frac{1}{2}$ % for District Expense, 3% for General Conference Delegate Expense, 3% for District Home Missions, 3% for District Church Extension Loan Fund,  $\frac{1}{2}$ % for Pilgrim Evangelistic Institute. Be it further resolved that each church shall raise an amount equal to \$5.50 for the General budget as follows: General Administration, \$1; Foreign Missions, \$2; Church Extension, \$1; Sunday School and Youth Work, 25¢; Church Extension Loan Fund, 50¢; Senior College Fund, 75¢.

2. Resolved that each church take a missionary offering each month during the year, alternating between district home missions and foreign missions, offerings to apply on local budget.

3. Resolved that all treasurers send local money for the district and general purposes to the district treasurer by the tenth of each month.

4. Resolved that each local treasurer give the pastor a monthly statement of the church's district obligation and that when in arrears the pastor shall attempt to raise the same.

5. Resolved that we have a home missionary fund to be raised by special offerings during the camp meeting and by use of pledge cards, the same to be presented by the presiding officer in cooperation with the pastors to the amount of \$1,000 or more.

6. Resolved that each Sunday school apply 5% of their regular offering and send to the district treasurer to be applied on district home missionary fund.

7. Resolved that the annual remuneration of the district secretary and treasurer be \$15 and \$30 respectively.

8. Resolved that the expenses of travel and entertainment for all sessions of the council except those meetings held during the camp meetings and district conventions be assumed by the district.

9. Resolved that we have a full-time superintendent and his salary be \$200 per month, and that he receive five cents per mile for his travel expense when he uses his

car and actual train or bus fare when traveling in the interest of the district.

10. Resolved that the district treasurer be bonded, such amount to be set by the council, and the cost to be paid out of the district expense fund.

11. Resolved that we have a camp-meeting association with a minimum membership fee of \$1.00 per year, to be equally divided between camp expense and camp-ground improvement. Be it further resolved that the district superintendent present this association on his visits to the churches.

12. Resolved that all pastors and unstationed ministers pay their tithe from ministerial remuneration to the local treasurer to be directed into the district expense fund.

13. Resolved that the district treasurer pay the equivalent of 4% of the district superintendent's salary into the pension fund of the General Church.

14. Resolved that the district treasurer deposit the General Conference Delegate fund in a savings account until needed.

15. Resolved that free entertainment be given the pastors and their families who work on the camp ground on the designated work days, preparing for and cleaning up after the camp and conference.

1. Resolved that the General Church publish an annual combined minutes of our districts consisting of a complete ministerial directory, and major items in the local church statistical and financial reports.

2. Resolved that the General Board make some provision in the financial program of the Church Extension Department to establish churches within organized districts.
