## CONFERENCE JOURNAL

The fortieth annual conference of the Idaho-Washington district of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in the camp meeting tabernacle, at Clarkston, Wash., July 19, 1954, at 8:00 A. M.

The Conference was led in singing the song, Amazing Grace by Rev. David Bailey. Prayer was offered by Rev. G. M. Pratt

Rev. Finney, Dist. Supt. read a letter of greeting from the Gen. Supt. delegating Rev. Wm. S. Deal, Supt. of Pacific Northwest District and member of the General Board, as conference chairman. He then introduced Rev. Deal who addressed the conference on Traits of True Leadership, reading from 2Cor. chapter 6.

The roll was called with twenty-seven ministers and delegates responding.

The conference bar was set to include the first six rows of seats and the platform of the tabernacle.

The reception Committee presented the following visitors: Rev. Otho Jennings, Camp evangelist and dean of theology at Owasso Bible College; Rev. Harley Briggs, pastor at Clarkston; Rev. and Mrs. Willingham, pastors at McGuires; Mrs. Wm. S. Deal of Pacific Northwest district; Rev. and Mrs. C. W. Thomas of Pilgrim Bible Institute, El Monte, Calif.; Rev. Ivan Canary, Pastor at Portland, Ore.; Rev. and Mrs. Acheson, pastors at McCall, Idaho; Mrs. Dan Corbett, lay member from McCall and Ronald Benjamin of Clarkston.

Rev. Briggs, Rev. Willingham, Rev. Acheson and Ronald Benjamin were received as ministers into the conference, the church at McCall with Mrs. Dan Corbett as delegate was also received into the conference. The other visitors were given honorary seats within the bar.

The time for sittings was voted to be 8:00-12:00 A.M. 1:30-5:00 P.M.; 6:00-9:00 P.M.

The report of the Auditing Committee was given and was accepted.

The district treasurer's report was given and it was received.

Rev. Alton Finney, Dist. Supt. read his report. It was

received with much appreciation but sadness as he told us he would be leaving us to labor in other fields.

The statistician's report was given and accepted.

The assistant Supt. gave a verbal report which was accepted.

The S.S. Promotional Secretary gave a verbal report which was received.

The Dist. Supt. read a report of the Missionary Society president and this report was received. It was voted to send a letter of appreciation to the Southwick society for their interest in our missionary work.

Letters of greetings were read by the secretary from Rev. and Mrs. Webster and Mrs. Garner and it was voted to send them greetings from the conference.

The educational and Examining Board presented the following recommendations which were accepted: Alan Harman be dropped from ministerial roll at his own request; Ronald Benjamin be granted 1st year license; David Bailey and W. H. Harman be granted 2nd year license; Ralph Coy and Paul Idler be granted 4th year license; Virgil and Ruth Hogarth be ordained by the conference and Ida Goss be ordained as deaconess by the conference.

The executive Secretary of Youth, Rev. Tullis, gave an oral report which was accepted.

The resolution Committee presented the following without recommendation: Resolved that we elect a part-time supt. After much discussion it was moved to refer the matter to a joint meeting of the Resolutions and Ways and Means Committee. The motion was lost. A vote for the previous question was called and the resolution was lost.

The conference recessed with prayer by Rev. Washburn

### Second Sitting

The session opened with the singing of Joy Unspeakable led by Rev. Willingham.

Prayer was offered by Sr. Acheson.

The chairman, Rev. Deal, read the Scripture lesson from Matt. 26:36, commenting briefly.

Ralph, Miller, an insurance agent, presented a group plan of insurance. A motion prevailed that this matter be postponed until later in the conference.

The minutes of the first sitting were read and approved.

The Resolution Committee presented the following: Resolved that we include a directory of the pastoral appointments in the conference minutes also a directory of the major church offices. This resolution was passed.

The committee presented without recommendation: Resolved that the district superintendent be a member of the educational and examining board by virtue of his office. There was no motion to adopt.

The committee recommended that No. 16 be changed to read that all committees except the Reception Committee be appointed by the district council. This was passed.

A resolution calling for the district council to appoint a camp meeting advertising committee was adopted.

The Ways and Means Committee presented the district and general budgets which after amended to include the youth work was adopted.

A change was called for by the Committee in Resolution No. 4 which was adopted.

The resolution providing for an annual remuneration of \$15 for the statistician was adopted.

An amendment was adopted in Resolution No. 6 which increased from 5% to 7% which the Sunday-schools are to send to the district treasurer.

Resolution No. 8 was amended to provide three cents per mile travel expense.

Resolution No. 9 was adopted to provide the supt's salary of \$200 per month and travel expense at three cents per mile.

Resolution No. 12 was amended as a request.

A resolution was adopted providing for camp meeting charges.

A resolution providing for a quarterly offering from each church for our zone school, Pilgrim Bible Institute, was adopted.

The Educational Board completed its recommendations that Mrs. Willingham be ordained and Bro. Pratt be recognized



as an evangelist in our Conference. These Recommendations were accepted.

A motion prevailed that the insurance plan also others be investigated by the council and the supt. report the results to the pastors on his first visit.

It was voted to proceed with the election of officers.

The Supt. appointed Bros. David Bailey, Elbert Bailey, Acheson and Willingham as tellers.

Prayer was offered by the chairman for God's guidance in the selection of officers for the coming year.

Ballots were cast which resulted in the election of I. G. Canary as Dist. Supt., D. L. Goss as Ass't Supt., L. J. Laubaugh as Sec'y and M. N. Swinney as Treas.

It was voted to have the ordination service at the beginning of the next sitting.

A motion prevailed to challenge the Pacific-Northwest district as to percentage gain in Sunday-school Attendance and church membership.

The sitting was dismissed with prayer by Bro. Tullis.

### Third Sitting

An ordination service was held with Virgil and Ruth Hogarth and Erma Willingham being ordained to the ministry and Ida Goss as deaconess. Rev. Deal gave the address and the ordination charge in a very impressive service.

It was voted to give Bro. and Sr. Finney and family a rising vote of appreciation for their labors of love among us. A love offering was given for them.

The election was completed with Bros. Tullis, Washburn and Briggs as Advisory members, Bro. Willingham as school board representative and Bro. Rathbun as Educational Board member.

It was voted to express our appreciation to our Camp meeting workers and Bro. Deal for their splendid ministry in our midst.

A motion prevailed that we go on record as having as our objective in four years, 18 churches and preaching points.

It was voted that the council appoint the missionary president, also to take care of all unfinished business.

The Conference adjourned with prayer by Bro. Deal.

## REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the fortieth annual conference of the Idaho-Washington district of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Greetings:

Another year has become history and God has permitted us to gather again for another annual conference. We are indeed grateful to God for the many blessings of the past year. We thank him for his abiding presence and for health and strength to carry on.

We are met here to give account of our labors during the past year and to make plans for the coming year. We believe that God has raised up the Pilgrim Holiness church for "times like these". Let us not forget that the fields are white, ready to harvest, and let us sharpen the sickle and prepare for a greater harvest than we have ever known. The time is short and what we do must be done quickly.

Although we haven't accomplished what we would have liked to, we thank God for what he has done for our district. Several of our churches have had good revival meetings in which many souls sought the Lord, several for the first time. We were very happy to receive into our fellowship a fine group of Christian people formerly known as The Hi-Way Chapel of McCall, Idaho. They have decided to cast their lot with us. We sincerely hope that we will be a blessing to them and are sure that they will be to us.

Most of our churches have made material gains. Weippe has installed a new furnace in the basement of the church and refinished the auditorium. They have also made considerable improvement in the parsonage. Spokane has completely redecorated the parsonage and rewired the basement of the church. Spirit Lake has built an entrance to the church basement. Coeur d'Alene has painted the outside of the church and parsonage and are beginning to build new rest rooms and pastor's study on to the church. Benton City has installed a gas heating plant in the church and a gas stove in the parsonage. They have also refinished the floor and redecorated the church. Clarkston has redecorated the church auditorium, finished a classroom and the restroom in the basement, and purchased new chairs for the primary class.

Grandview has installed a fifty gallon electric water heater in the parsonage. Hermiston has improved the restrooms and the water system. Kennewick has refinished the floor in the church and finished the young people's room in the basement. They have also finished two bedrooms in the parsonage. McGuires has finished the addition to the parsonage which consist of two beautiful bedrooms and bath. They have redecorated the parsonage and added several pieces of furniture.

Two new cabins have been added to the district camp ground. Beds for these cabins were furnished by Pilgrims throughout the district. We have purchased a new electric range for the district parsonage, also redecorated the first two floors.

We are glad to report gains in many departments of our work. The number of seekers after regeneration and sanctification shows a substantial increase, which we believe to be of great importance. Other departments showing an increase are: souls delt with personally, prayed with for healing, baptized, communion services, children dedicated, marriages, cash support from churches for pastor, gifts, average Sunday school attendance, cradle roll and total Sunday school receipts.

## RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that the district council serve as the district trustees.
2. Resolved that all recall meetings be held sixty days prior to the district conference. The district Superintendent to be notified of the results of said meetings within ten days.
3. Resolved that each church be urged to erect a cabin on the camp ground for their pastor. Laymen may also build cabins. All building plans to be under the direction of the district council.
4. Resolved that the district conference follow the annual camp meeting. Be it further recommended that the pastors and all members of the conference be in attendance throughout the camp meeting.
5. Resolved that the district council appoint an editor and arrange a means of finance for a district publication.
6. Resolved that we have one three-day ministerial meeting to be held in early spring. The time and place to be arranged by the superintendent and his assistant.
7. Resolved that two hundred copies of the district minutes be printed.
8. Resolved that the superintendent appoint the statistician at least two weeks prior to the conference.
9. Resolved that the council be authorized to appoint a committee of two to work with superintendent in home missionary work.
10. Resolved that the district council serve as the camp-meeting committee or elect a committee if necessary.
11. Resolved that we recommend active ministers be elected as members of the district council.
12. Resolved that our conference year close June 30 and that each pastor see that a correct report from his church be sent in not later than July 10.
13. Resolved that in the quarterly meetings each church take an offering for the superintendent's travel expense to be sent to the district treasurer.
14. Resolved that the district superintendent upon his first quarterly visit to the churches instruct the local church board as to its duties.

15. Resolved that all committees be appointed by the district council at the close of each conference and hold office through the year, except the reception committee, which the supt. shall appoint at the beginning of each conference.

16. Resolved that each pastor and the superintendent be given a two-week vacation with pay.

17. Resolved that each church pay their pastor his salary during the camp and conference.

18. Resolved that we have a district young people's convention during the year and that it be held at a convenient time for the young people who are in school.

19. Resolved that we have a meeting for ministers and workers at least three times during the camp meeting, the district superintendent shall be in charge and all ministers and workers are urged to be present.

20. Resolved that we have a district Sunday school committee to promote Sunday school interest in the district and to cooperate with the general committee and that said committee be appointed by the district council and the district superintendent be a member of the committee.

21. Resolved that the people who attend camp meeting be counted in attendance at their local Sunday school.

22. Resolved that we elect a district missionary president to oversee the work of the local missionary societies, and be it further resolved that each missionary society send a quarterly report to the district missionary president, and an annual report to the conference and that said report be entered in the conference minutes.

23. Resolved that we express our appreciation to our district superintendent, secretary and treasurer for their services during the year. Be it further resolved that we express our appreciation to our cooks, Srs. Bacon and Powell and their helpers in the kitchen, also to the Clarkston church and friends for the splendid entertainment and food donations.

24. Resolved that the district council appoint an advertising committee for the annual camp meeting.

25. Resolved that we include a directory of pastoral appointments and local major church officers in our minutes.

26. Resolved that we express our deep appreciation to our camp meeting workers, namely: Rev. and Mrs. Otho Jennings and Mr. Tromble; also our conference chairman, Rev. Wm. Deal.

#### WAYS AND MEANS

1. Resolved that each church raise the equivalent of 12% of the receipts except building and improvement funds and evangelists' offerings to be applied on the district budget as follows: 90 $\frac{1}{2}$ % for District Expense, 3% for district Youth Work, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ % for District Home Missions, 3% for District Church Extension Loan Fund. Be it further resolved that each church shall raise an amount equal to \$6.00 for the General budget as follows: General Administration, \$1.50; Foreign Missions, \$2.10; Church Extension, \$1.20; Sunday School and Youth Work, 24¢; Church Extension Loan Fund, 36¢; Senior College Fund, 60¢.

2. Resolved that each church take a missionary offering each month during the year, alternating between district home missions and foreign missions, offerings to apply on local budget.

3. Resolved that all treasurers send local money for the district and general purposes to the district treasurer by the tenth of each month.

4. Resolved that each local treasurer give the pastor a monthly statement of the church's district obligation and that when in arrears the pastor and treasurer shall attempt to raise the same.

5. Resolved that we have a home missionary fund to be raised by special offerings during the camp meeting and by use of pledge cards, the same to be presented by the presiding officer in cooperation with the pastors to the amount of \$1,000 or more.

6. Resolved that each Sunday School send 7% of their regular offering to the district treasurer, 2% for S. S. promotional work and 5% for district home missionary fund.

7. Resolved that the annual remuneration of the secretary and statistician be \$15 and the treasurer, \$30.

8. Resolved that the travel expense of 3¢ per mile and entertainment for all sessions of the council except those

meetings held during the camp meetings and conventions be assumed by the district.

9. Resolved that we have a full time supt. and his salary be \$200 per month and that he be permitted to hold four meetings each year off the district, also that he receive three cents per mile when he uses his car and actual train or bus fare when traveling in the interest of the district.

10. Resolved that the district treasurer be bonded, such amount to be set by the council, and the cost to be paid out of the district expense fund.

11. Resolved that we have a camp meeting association with a minimum membership fee of \$1.00 per year, to be equally divided between camp expense and camp-ground improvement. Be it further resolved that the dist. supt. present this association on his visits to the churches.

12. Resolved that all pastors and unstationed ministers be requested to pay their tithe from ministerial remuneration to the local treasurer to be directed into the district expense fund.

13. Resolved that the district treasurer pay the equivalent of 4% of the superintendent's salary into the pension fund of the General Church.

14. Resolved that the treasurer deposit the General Conference Delegate Fund in a savings account until needed.

15. Resolved that in our Camp free entertainment except registration fees be given the ministers and families who work on the ground on the designated work days, preparing for and cleaning up after the camp and conference.

16. Resolved that the camp registration fees be as follows: Regular Camp, \$2.00 for those 12 years of age and over; Youth Camp, \$1.00 for those 12 years of age and over unless he or she plans to stay for the regular camp or a part thereof, then the regular fee shall be paid. Be it further resolved that the regular cost of meals shall be \$1.00 per day or 50¢ per meal except for those working their way through camp, and all children under age of 12.

17. Resolved that each church be requested to take an offering quarterly for the support of our zone school, Pilgrim Bible Institute.
