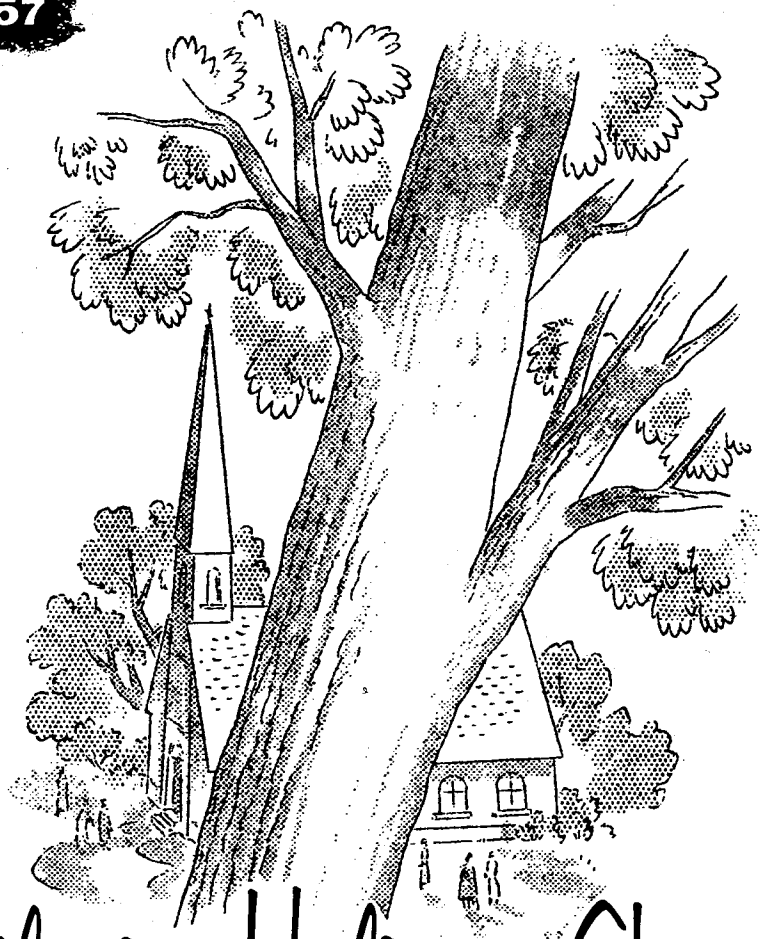

JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The forty-third annual conference of the Idaho-Washington District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in the district tabernacle, Clarkston, Washington, July 15, 1957 at 8 A. M.

The conference opened with the singing of "Higher Ground" and "All Hail the Power of Jesus Name" led by Miss Anna Hooker.

Prayer by Rev. O. A. Wells.

Rev. I. G. Canary, District Superintendent, introduced Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary-Treasurer of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, as chairman of the conference. Rev. Beltz spoke words of appreciation and greetings. He spoke on Titus 1:4-9 and commented on making the best of a bad situation. He used "set in order the things that are wanting."

The conference was called to order and the roll was called with thirty-three ministers and delegates present. Miss Pearl Bennett was voted in as delegate from Kennewick.

The conference bar was set to be the same as last year which included the first four rows of seats and the platform of the tabernacle. The conference bar was cleared by the chairman.

The time of conference sessions was set to be the same as last year, and deleting the last part for evening service.

Revs. H. G. Briggs and Lester Boone were appointed as the reception committee.

The District Superintendent read his report which was accepted by the conference.

The Superintendent introduced the new church, pastor, and delegate from Weiser, also Mrs. Eslinger from the Pilgrim Fellowship at Wenatchee. They were accepted into the conference.

The motion was made and passed that Mrs. Eslinger be accepted into the Conference with the privilege to vote.

The report of the Examining and Educational Board was read and accepted.

The District Council recommended Rev. Charles Stewart and Rev. and Mrs. C. E. Dietz for transfer to the conference. Accepted.

The Statistician's report was given and accepted.

The reception committee reported and presented

Rev. and Mrs. Dietz from Post Falls, Rev. and Mrs. Cyrus Lynch from Spirit Lake, Rev. and Mrs. R. S. Miller from Benton City, and they were accepted into the conference.

The Assistant Superintendent, Rev. D. L. Goss, presented his report. Accepted.

The Young People's Executive Secretary, Rev. Betty L. Miller, read her report and it was accepted.

The District Missionary President, Mrs. Canary, presented her report. Accepted.

The report of Dr. C. W. Thomas, president of Western Pilgrim College, was read by the District Secretary. Accepted.

The Resolutions Committee presented a partial report.

The conference was adjourned for lunch. Dismissed with prayer by Bro. Coy.

Second Sitting

The conference reconvened by singing "Where He Leads I'll Follow" led by Miss Miller. Prayer by Bro. DeField.

The minutes of the first sitting were read and approved.

The District Council recommended to the conference for acceptance Rev. and Mrs. H. Nettleton as ordained ministers pending their transfer from the Pacific Northwest District. Accepted.

The Chairman spoke a few words in regard to the budgets.

The Resolutions Committee again presented Resolution #10. It was moved and seconded that this resolution be referred back to a combined meeting of the Ways and Means Committee and the District Council.

It was moved and seconded that Resolution #3 be deleted.

The Sunday School Promotional Secretary, Rev. Frank Evans, gave his report and it was accepted.

The Ways and Means Committee reported.

The Memorials to the General Conference were read.

The Chairman gave a few words on our own district obligations.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted. Thanks were extended to this Committee.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

Mrs. Bessie Crowson, Twin Falls, was invited into the conference bar and gave her testimony.

The conference was adjourned until Tuesday morning.

The Superintendent appointed Mrs. Ida Goss and Mrs. Rachel Bailey to a Memorial Committee.

Dismissed with prayer by Bro. Canary.

Third Sitting

The conference reconvened July 16, 1957 at 8:00 am with Bro. DeField leading in the singing of "When We All Get to Heaven".

Prayer by Rev. E. E. Meeks.

Bro. Beltz spoke for a few minutes on the qualification of the ministry.

The Secretary read the roll call and the minutes of the second sitting. These were corrected and approved.

The Secretary read the resolution in regard to the Home Missionary program: "Be it resolved that the District Council formulate and present to the churches an aggressive Home Missionary program."

It was moved and seconded that we go back to the original resolution. Lost.

The substitute motion by the Council was passed.

Motion made and seconded that #4 of the Ways and Means be changed. Resolved that #4 be changed to read "Resolved that a special offering be taken some time during camp for camp improvement."

Amended to read "Home Missions and/or camp improvement". Passed.

The Resolutions Committee again reported.

A motion was made and passed that a pamphlet be printed advertising the camp meeting and including funds, services, fees, etc., 30 days before camp and sent to each church.

The District Superintendent appointed tellers as follows: L. Boon, R. S. Miller, E. E. Meeks, and D. L. Goss.

Bro. Canary was re-elected as District Superintendent. Bro. Goss was re-elected as Assistant Superintendent. Bro. Hogarth was re-elected as District Secretary. Bro. Swinney was elected as District

Treasurer. Bros. Meeks, Mansfield, and Wells were elected as Advisory Council Members. Bro. Wells was elected for a 5 year term to the Examining and Educational Board. Miss Miller, Bros. Mansfield and Wells were elected as delegates to the General Conference.

Motion made to vote for the four highest; the two highest be delegates and the next two be alternate. Passed.

Moved and seconded that all unfinished business be left to the District Council to complete.

Moved and seconded that after election by majority vote the next highest be alternate.

Bro. Harold Wise elected as lay delegate. Bro. Paul Acheson elected as alternate lay delegate.

Moved and seconded to extend time until the balloting is completed.

Moved and seconded to send greetings to Bro. Bailey.

Representative to Western Pilgrim College was voted on. It was moved and seconded to vote on the two highest names. Bro. Bailey was elected.

It was moved and seconded that the congregation stand and sing the Doxology.

Moved and seconded that we give thanks to Bro. Beltz for serving as chairman of conference by a hearty Amen.

Dismissed with prayer.

Personal Report: Sermons Preached 168; week-end meetings -two; revivals conducted -four; held fifteen annual business meetings; conducted nine council meetings; attended church leaders' conference; youth convention and ministerial convention. We worked several days on the camp grounds. We have

To the Forty-Third Conference of the Idaho-Washington District, Pilgrim Holiness Church, Greetings:

The ideal missionary organization is seldom attained. I am glad to report, however, a continued and growing interest throughout the district toward the great missionary program of our denomination. Annual reports proved this fact, although some were incomplete and two churches did not report.

Increased interest is developing in the Study Course, in a planned program, in the monthly Wednesday night missionary prayer meeting, and in a closer acquaintance with our missionaries.

The total district membership reported is 144. At least 126 boxes have been packed and shipped, some of which weighed almost one hundred pounds. At least \$2200 has been received through local societies. That amount does not include the missionary offerings received through other channels of the church.

District interests have not been forgotten. The hot water tank installed last year has been cleared of debt, and funds are on hand for the installation of laundry tubs - subject to Council approval. Utensils, glasses, and many other items have been added to the Dining Hall Equipment.

The Southwick Community church deserves honorable mention, for they reported not only the highest financial receipts, but also the largest number of boxes packed and shipped.

The reports of 4 Junior Missionary Societies show 60 members and offerings totaling \$260.59. Here again the Southwick Juniors report the highest offering of \$96.74.

I have personally conducted 14 missionary services, and have assisted the missionary presidents in every way possible. I have provided awards for the Juniors, and some study course materials. I have worked with Miss Eubanks, distributing materials and maintaining accurate mailing lists and records.

I pray that our vision of sending the Gospel to the "ends of the earth" may never grow dim.

REPORT OF DISTRICT S.S. PROMOTION SECRETARY

It has been a pleasure to serve the Idaho-Washington District in the capacity of Sunday School Promotion Secretary. The pastors and Sunday Schools were new to me, but it didn't take long to become acquainted with them. The members of the District Sunday School Committee have endeavored to work together, but distance and circumstances have made it quite difficult to get together since there is no district fund that provides for travel expense.

Each month we have received from and sent out reports to the pastors and Sunday School superintendents, and along with this we have edited a booster page to inform the churches of what was going on in our Sunday Schools over the district. It has been gratifying to note that some of the material which we have sent out has been used in the bulletins of two other districts of our church. We want to thank every pastor and Sunday School Superintendent for their splendid cooperation in sending in their monthly reports. Several months we had 100% returns.

I have also written two articles in the interest of the movement-wide Sunday School promotion which have been published in the Advocate.

During the midwinter Young Peoples Convention a plan was presented to the district, entitled "Filling God's House Through the Sunday School", covering the months from New Years until Easter. Beside the service at the Young Peoples Convention, I have conducted a three-day convention at Grandview, and spoke at the Northern Lights Zone Rally, and at Hermiston in the interest of Sunday School. I have accepted every invitation that has been given me to speak on this subject.

It might be interesting to give you the overall picture of the District Sunday Schools. The net district increase was 31; however, our established schools showed a net decrease of 22. Only 4 schools made an increase. Two schools tied their last year's average. Eight schools showed a loss. Our gain from the new schools was 53, making it possible to show a net increase for the district.

This year's work has been a great blessing to me personally, I have done my best to make you SS-conscious. It has also been a means of becoming acquainted with the work of the Idaho-Wash. District. I still say, "Let's Do Something".

increased. We were able to pay all our obligations until the last two months, during which time, we have incurred a \$4000 current expense indebtedness. We trust that a major portion of this amount can be raised during this camp.

I have visited the churches and camp meeting of the Pacific Northwest and the Idaho-Washington districts. I have traveled over 40,000 miles and have spoken in 120 services in the interest of Western Pilgrim College.

8. Resolved that in the quarterly meetings each church take an offering for the superintendent's travel expense to be sent to the district treasurer.
9. Resolved that the district superintendent upon his first quarterly visit to the churches, instruct the local church board as to its duties.
10. Resolved that all committees be appointed by the district council at the close of each conference and hold office through the year, except the reception committee, which the superintendent shall appoint at the beginning of each conference.
11. Resolved that each pastor and the superintendent be given a two-week vacation with pay.
12. Resolved that each church pay their pastor his salary during camp and conference.
13. Resolved that we have a district young people's convention during the year and that it be held at a convenient time for the young people who are in school.
14. Resolved that we have a meeting for ministers and workers at least three times during the camp meeting, the district superintendent shall be in charge and all ministers and workers are urged to be present.
15. Resolved that we have a District Sunday School Committee to promote Sunday School interest in the district and to cooperate with the general committee and that said committee be appointed by the District Council, and the District Superintendent be a member of the committee. Be it further resolved, that said committee be given one service during the annual Camp Meeting.
16. Resolved that the people who attend camp meeting be counted in attendance at their local Sunday School.
17. Resolved that we elect a district missionary president to oversee the work of the local missionary societies, and be it further resolved that

each missionary society send a quarterly report to the district missionary president, and an annual report to the conference and that said report be entered in the conference minutes.

18. Resolved that the district council appoint an advertising committee for the annual camp meeting.
19. Resolved that we include a directory of pastoral appointments and local major officers in our minutes.
20. Resolved that two hundred and fifty copies of the district minutes be printed.
21. Resolved that each pastor give an oral report of from three to five minutes to the conference annually.
22. Resolved that a modified quarterly report, set up by the District Superintendent take the place of standard quarterly reports.
23. Resolved that all reports to the conference be typed: be it further resolved that secretarial help be furnished the District Secretary so that the conference Minutes be completed within a month from the ending of conference.

WAYS AND MEANS

1. Resolved that each church raise the equivalent of 12% of the receipts except building and improvement funds and evangelists' offerings to be applied on the district budget as follows: 88% for District expense, 3% for General Conference Delegate expense, 6% for District Church Extension, 3% for District Church Extension Loan Fund. Be it further resolved that each church raise an amount equal to \$6.00 per member for the General Budget.
2. Resolved that all treasurers send local money for the district and general purposes to the district treasurer by the tenth of each month.
3. Resolved that each local treasurer give the pastor a monthly statement of the church's district obligation and that when in arrears the pastor and treasurer shall attempt to raise the same.
4. Resolved that a special offering be taken the last Sunday of Camp for District Home Missions and/or camp improvement.
5. Resolved that each Sunday School send 5% of their regular offering to the district treasurer for the district church extension work.
6. Resolved that the annual remuneration of the secretary and statistician be \$15.00 each and the treasurer \$30.00. Also the purchasing agent to receive \$25.00, plus three cents per mile car expense.
7. Resolved that the travel expense of 3 cents per mile and entertainment for all sessions of the council except those meetings held during the camp meetings and conventions be assumed by the district.
8. Resolved that the superintendent's salary be \$200.00 per month and that he be permitted to hold four meetings each year off the district, also that he receive five cents per mile when he uses his car and actual train or bus fare when traveling in the interest of the district.

9. Resolved that the district treasurer be bonded, such amount to be set by the council, and the cost to be paid out of the district expense fund.
10. Resolved that all pastors and unstationed ministers be requested to pay their tithe from ministerial remuneration to the local treasurer to be directed into the district expense fund.
11. Resolved that the district treasurer pay the equivalent of 4% of the Superintendent's salary into the pension fund of the General Church.
12. Resolved that the treasurer deposit the General Conference Delegate Fund in a savings account until needed.
13. Resolved that in our Camp free entertainment except registration fees be given the ministers and families who work on the ground on the designated work days, preparing for and cleaning up after the camp and conference.
14. Resolved that the camp registration fee be \$2.00 for every one six years or older. Be it further resolved that the regular cost of meals shall be \$1.00 per day or 50 cents per meal except for those working their way through camp, and all children under age of 12.
15. Resolved that each church be requested to take an offering quarterly for the support of our zone school, Western Pilgrim College.
