## JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

### First Sitting

The Twenty-Sixth Annual Conference of the Oklahoma District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Hopeton, Oklahoma, July 28, 1952, at 9:15 o'clock.

The Conference opened with singing of "I'm Pressing On," which was led by Grace Nelson. The Conference was led in prayer by Rev. L. C. Hiles.

Rev. P. F. Elliott was introduced as the chairman of the Conference and spoke from Obadiah 1:17 on "Possessing Our Possessions." He stressed the importance of being Spirit led, valuing our possessions and using our possessions.

The next order of business was the reading of the Conference Roll by the secretary.

The motion prevailed to seat LeRoy Lynch as the delegate from Oklahoma City in the absence of the regular delegate.

Rev. G. P. King was admitted to the Conference bar.

Motion prevailed to adopt the same hours for the sittings as of last year (9:00-12:00, 1:00-5:00 and 7:00 to finish).

Motion prevailed to recess for 30 minutes to allow completion of committee work necessary to the conference proceedings.

Conference re-convened at 11:15.

The next order of business was the Examining Board report which was received in its entirety by the Conference.

The report of the Educational Board was heard and received.

The District Council recommended Rev. L. C. Gray for Ordination.

The District Superintendent's report was given and received by the Conference.

The report of the Auditing Committee was received by the Conference.

Motion prevailed to hear the entire report of the District Treasurer. The Conference extended the time for the hearing of this report, which was received.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

### Second Sitting

The second sitting convened at 1:00 with a song led by Rev. Wayne Quinn, and a prayer by Rev. I. L. Shanafelt.

The minutes of the first sitting were read and received.

The report of the District Statistician was heard and received.

The Executive Secretary of the young people reported and the report was received.

Motion made to hear a partial report of the Ways and Means committee and then proceed with the election of officers. Motion carried.

Partial report of the Ways and Means committee was heard and adopted.

The Conference was led in prayer by the chairman.

The motion was made and seconded to ask the General Council for permission to be received as a Home Missionary District and that said Council appoint Superintendent subject to approval of District Council.

Motion made to table former motion and proceed with the election. Motion seconded and carried.

The election of officers was the next order of the day.

The District Secretary tendered his resignation. The move died for want of support.

The remaining recommendations of the Ways and Means committee were heard and adopted.

The report of the Resolutions committee was heard and adopted.

Motion prevailed to appoint a committee on Memoirs to report in

the night sitting. Committee was composed of Rev. D. R. Close and Rev. Grace Nelson.

Motion prevailed to have, as part of the night sitting, an ordination service.

Acting on the prevailing motion that a five man ordination committee be appointed, the District Superintendent appointed Rev. Close, Rev. Kelley, Rev. Bland and Rev. Hiles to serve with the Superintendent who was a member by virtue of his office.

Motion prevailed that all standing resolutions remain until deleted or amended.

The chairman spoke on the National Holiness Missionary Society and the National Holiness Association, as well as the Pilgrim Pension Plan.

Session adjourned by the expiration of time.

### **Third Sitting**

Convened at 7:15 by singing "A Charge to Keep I Have," led by Grace Nelson. Led in prayer by Bro. L. C. Hiles. Scripture appropriate for an ordination service was read by Rev. J. F. Wilson, Rev. D. R. Close and Rev. H. L. Bland. Rev. Elliott gave the message on "Be An Example."

The ordination followed.

The chairman spoke on the program of Evangelism, giving us our failures and duties.

Bro. H. A. Downing excused by vote of the Conference.

The District Sunday School promotional secretary gave the Conference award which went to the Enid Sunday School.

Two letters were heard and received from the secretary of two Foreign Missionary fields.

The hearing of the Memoirs was the next matter of business.

Motion prevailed to send greetings to Rev. Paul Nering from the Conference.

The hearing of two special resolutions was followed by the motion to adjourn which prevailed. The Conference was dismissed by the chairman after singing of "Blest Be The Tie That Binds."

### **Amendments to the Standing Resolutions**

10. Be it resolved that each pastor have the privilege of conducting two revivals off charge during the year, or one meeting and a two weeks vacation with pay, providing the charge is supplied satisfactorily with the local church board.

14. Resolved that the first Sunday of each month be donations day for the pastors of the District and that the deacons announce same the preceding Sunday.

### **New Resolutions**

1. Inasmuch as we have no record of ministerial tithes and assessments other than appears in the District Treasurer's books, be it resolved that two extra columns be added to the Pastor's Statistical Report to give said amounts.

2. Resolved: That the first three days of the District Camp be devoted to the young people's interests.

### **Special Resolutions**

1. Be it resolved that the Conference express its appreciation for the labors of our District Superintendent the past year by a standing vote of thanks.

2. Be it resolved that the Conference express its appreciation to P. F. Elliott for his labors as chairman of this Conference by a standing vote of thanks.

The conference was led in singing by Harriette Wilson and Mrs. D. R. Close led in prayer.

The chairman addressed the conference on "Pilgrim Youth Is On The March," speaking of the achievements, aims, goals and needs of the youth of the church.

The conference bar was determined and the delegates were asked to come within the bar which comprised the first four rows of seats in the church.

The roll call of delegates was the next order of business.

The report of the District Young People's Executive Secretary was read and received, as was the report of the treasurer.

The report of the Ways and Means committee was heard and received.

The report of the Resolutions committee was heard and received.

The report of the District Council list of nominations was heard.

The election of officers was the order of the day.

1. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid four (4) cents a mile travel expense.
2. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid a salary of \$50.00 a year.
3. We recommend that the District Secretary be paid a salary of \$30.00 a year.
4. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$75.00 a month plus a free will offering each quarterly meeting.
5. We recommend that all ministerial tithes be paid through the local treasurer the first of each month, the same to be applied to the district fund.
6. We recommend that Sunday Schools under fifty (50) pay ten (10) cents per week and schools over fifty (50) pay twenty (20) cents per week to the District Parsonage Fund and that an offering be taken each year for this fund.
7. We recommend that the registration fee be set at four (4) dollars for adults who stay the full time and fifty (50) cents for cots used full time. Those coming on or after the last Thursday half fee and children 5—12 half adult rate.
8. We recommend that district postage, telephone and telegrams be paid from the district fund.
9. We recommend that all district and general money be forwarded to the district treasurer the first of each month.
10. We recommend that all district checks be kept on file and turned over with the treasurer's books.
11. We recommend that the Home Missions offering taken the last Sunday of camp be applied to the District home missions interests as directed by the District Council.
12. We recommend that we have 200 copies of the 1952 minutes printed to sell for 50 cents per copy and that each local church take an offering to help pay for same.
13. We recommend that all licensed and ordained ministers and deaconesses be assessed a fee of \$2.00 to be paid by the end of the first quarter.
14. We recommend that all children attending camp be accompanied by a parent or guardian and that they be subject to all camp rules.
