CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The Thirty-fourth Annual Conference of the Oklahoma District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Enid, Oklahoma, July 13, 1960 at 10:00 A. M.

Rev. O. R. Hofen led the conference in singing the song, "He Lives". Nadene Hofen assisted at the piano. Rev. J. R. Kelley led in the opening prayer.

Dr. R. G. Flexon, General Superintendent, was introduced as the chairman of the conference by the District Super-

intendent, Rev. C. B. Colaw. Dr. Flexon read from Psalms the 4th chapter.

The District Secretary was called upon to read the conference roll.

The Conference Bar was fixed to include the front six seats on the south side of the church and the platform.

The time of proceedings was set from 10:00-12:00 and 1:00 until finished.

The Conference received the Bartlesville church with thankful hearts and praise to God.

The Reception committee introduced the following to be received into the conference; Rev. and Mrs. O. R. Hofen and Rev. A. E. Whittington.

The Educational and Examining Boards reported and the report was accepted by the conference.

Mrs. Sadie Howell was accepted as an inactive minister.

The conference voted to let all the churches have a voice in the conference even though their United Stewardship Fund was not all paid.

The report of the District Superintendent, Rev. C. B. Colaw, was given and heartily received by the conference.

The Assistant Superintendent's report was read and accepted by the conference.

The report of the District Treasurer was given and accepted.

The Statistical report was given and accepted by the conference.

The Resolution committee gave a partial report which was accepted.

The report of the Ways and Means committee was accepted by the conference.

The motion was made that time be extended to 1:15 P.M. in order to finish the business. Carried.

The District Trustees were nominated by the District Council and ratified by the conference.

The Resolution committee again reported. The report was accepted by the conference.

The motion was made and seconded that the Council take care of all unfinished business. Carried.

The Conference adjourned with prayer by District Superintendent Colaw.

ORDINATION SERVICE

The Ordination service was held during the District Camp July 24, 1960. Rev. N. R. Maynard was recommended for ordination.

Rev. A. I. Wise, Rev. C. B. Colaw, Rev. O. R. Hofen, Rev. B. E. Bebermeyer, Rev. G. H. Jenewein and W. P. Haltom comprised the Ordination Committee.

THE EXAMINING AND EDUCATIONAL BOARD REPORT

We recommend N. R. Maynard for ordination.

We recommend R. L. Murrow for renewal of district license.

We recommend J. M. Snook for district license.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. We recommend that the fiscal year close May 31.
2. Inasmuch as the District Treasurer has so much work to do at the close of the year, be it resolved that all district and general money be sent to the District Treasurer not later than June 10.
3. In order that we might conserve the Lord's money and give our churches the advantages of evangelistic meet-

ings, be it resolved that we, as pastors and churches, consult our superintendent in slating Evangelists and if it is possible and practical, that they be consulted for two or more consecutive meetings which would keep down traveling expense.

4. Be it resolved that each pastor have the privilege of conducting one revival off charge and that he pay out of his salary the supply and further he be granted a two weeks vacation with pay and that the church pay his supply during this two weeks vacation period.

5. Resolved that the camp have children and young people's services, the District Council to secure a leader for each and said meetings to be announced on the Camp Meeting bills.

6. Be it resolved that the first Sunday of each month be donations day for the pastors of the district and that the deacons announce same the preceding Sunday; we further urge that the District Superintendent lay special emphasis upon this at each quarterly visit.

7. Be it resolved that the pastors be required to see that all reports are mailed to the District Superintendent by the 15th of the month following the close of the quarter, and that the annual reports be mailed to the chairman of the Statistical Committee by June 15.

8. Be it resolved that the District remain divided into zones as follows: Zone 1, Hopeton, Alva, Pleasant View and Fairview; Zone 2, Blackwell, Newkirk and Enid; Zone 3, Four Corners, Bartlesville, Henryetta and Oklahoma City.

9. We further recommend that when practical and possible one rally be conducted in each zone during the year, and that all rallies shall be under the supervision of the District Superintendent.

10. We recommend the following goals for the next year; 20% increase in Sunday School Attendance; 15% increase in membership; 100% up on Budgets each quarter. We recommend that a report be sent out at the end of each

quarter to all churches, the same showing each church's standing for the quarter; in addition that special emphasis be placed upon soul winning and the spiritual growth of the church.

11. Whereas there is the danger of valuable papers becoming lost in our local churches, we recommend that the District rent a safety box and all churches send their abstracts, deeds, etc., to the District Superintendent for safe keeping in said box.

12. Be it resolved that all pastors desiring or considering changing pastorates, shall send their requests to the District Superintendent prior to their annual meeting. Be it further resolved that the District Superintendent present to each church a complete list of available pastors to be voted upon.

13. Be it resolved that the Church Secretary help count all offerings with the Church Treasurer.

14. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be granted two weeks vacation with pay.

15. Inasmuch as we have no record of ministerial tithes other than that appears in the District Treasurer's books, be it resolved that one extra column be added to the Pastor's Statistical Report to give said amounts.

16. Be it resolved that one day of the District Camp be devoted to the Young People's interests.

17. We recommend that the Sunday Schools of the district be permitted to record the average of their yearly attendance for the Sundays of camp.

18. We recommend that all children attending camp be accompanied by their parent or guardian and that they be subject to all camp rules.

19. We recommend that we have a seven (7) day camp beginning on the third Monday in July, and that each pastor come the morning of the third Monday and stay until work is done after camp.

20. Be it resolved that the hours of the District Con-

ference be set by the District Council.

21. Be it resolved that the Sunday School Hour on the last Sunday of our District Camp be designated as District Sunday School Hour. This service shall be in charge of the program arranged by the District Sunday School Committee. At the time of the above service a freewill offering shall be taken to help defray expense of the District Sunday School Committee.

22. Be it resolved that the Oklahoma District sponsor its own Youth Camp and that the District Youth Executive Committee make all arrangements.

SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that this Conference express its appreciation for the unselfish labors of our District Superintendent the past year by a rising vote of thanks.

2. Be it resolved that this conference express its appreciation to Dr. R. G. Flexon for his labours as chairman of this conference by a rising vote of thanks.

3. Be it resolved that the District Secretary write letters of appreciation to all who make donations to the camp.

4. Be it resolved that this conference express its appreciation to the Enid Church, its people and pastor for their excellent entertainment by a hearty Amen.

The District Budget to be prorated as follows: District expense 80% and the General Conference Fund 20%.

2. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid five (5) cents a mile travel expense. We further recommend that at the time of the District Superintendent's visit a freewill offering be taken to apply on his travel expense. This offering to be handed to the Superintendent at the time of his visit, and reported by him to the District Treasurer.

3. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid a salary of \$75.00 a year.

4. We recommend that the District Secretary be paid a salary of \$40.00 a year.

5. We recommend that the matter of the District Superintendent's salary be determined by the District Council.

6. We recommend that all ministerial tithe (Evangelists 75%) be paid through the local treasurer the first of each month the same to be applied to the District Fund.

7. We recommend that camp registration fee be set as follows: adults \$7.00 or breakfast 35¢, noon and evening meals 50¢ each. Children 12 to 6 \$3.50 or breakfast 20¢, noon and evening meals 25¢ each. Children 5 and younger will receive their meals free. Anyone will be permitted to work for their meals.

8. We recommend that all district and general monies be forwarded to the District Treasurer the first of each month.

9. We recommend that district postage, telephone and telegrams be paid from the district expense fund.

10. We recommend that all district checks be kept on file and turned over with the Treasurer's books.

11. We recommend that the Home Missions Offering taken the last Sunday of camp be applied to the District Home Missions interests as directed by the District Council.

12. We recommend that we have 200 copies of the 1960 minutes printed and that each church take an offering to help pay the same.

13. Whereas, the General Board in session May 12, 1960 has recommended that the local church pay the Ministerial Benefit Association assessment fees for their pastor and spouse who are eligible for membership, be it resolved that each local church in the Oklahoma District pay the assessment fees for their pastors who are eligible for, and have membership in, The Ministerial Benefit Association.

(Total Cost for 1959 \$15.15

Per Member)

14. Whereas the Oklahoma District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church is a part of the Zone of CENTRAL PILGRIM COLLEGE, and inasmuch as we recognize the great value of this institution to our work as it trains ministers and missionaries, be it resolved that we include CENTRAL PILGRIM COLLEGE in our local church budget in the amount of \$.50 per member each month. Be it further resolved that a special freewill offering be taken each month to meet this School Budget, and that it be forwarded

to the District Treasurer monthly.

15. Whereas there is considerable expense involved in travel for the purpose of The Annual Meeting of The Board of Trustees of CENTRAL PILGRIM COLLEGE and inasmuch as we want to help meet the expenses of our Zone School, be it resolved that the district pay annually from its administrative funds an amount equal to 25¢ per member toward the travel fund for Central Pilgrim College Board of trustees meetings.

REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

General Superintendent Flexon, fellow ministers, delegates, and friends of the Thirty-fourth Annual Conference of the Oklahoma District of The Pilgrim Holiness Church: Greetings!

Will you share with me the deep sense of gratitude that I feel for the manifold blessings we have enjoyed from the hand of our Lord and Master through this past year.

It is a real privilege to report that there was not a single negative ballot cast in the pastoral calls or recalls this year. This evidence of unity in our midst has been a source of rejoicing in my own soul. May we ever continue in this spirit of blessed unity. It is a prerequisite to revival. And a revival of spiritual fervor accompanied by the proper personal conduct expected of Christians is the need of this day.

We are all aware of the limited money and personnel needed to start new churches that more souls can be saved. Being limited in these fields keeps us from having the enlargement desired in that field. However, we can double our S. S. attendance, we can double our church membership with the facilities and personnel we already have, if we will rally to the task. If each of our churches would see just one soul saved each month, and see that soul brought into the fellowship of the church, we would see a gain of almost 75% in membership in one year, with the churches we already have. IS IT TOO MUCH TO EXPECT A BODY OF CHRISTIANS TO BRING ONE PERSON TO

CHRIST EACH MONTH? We must put our present personnel to work WINNING SOULS for the night cometh when no man can work.

Let us consider the temporal progress of this past year. We do rejoice in the continued rise in the payment of the United Stewardship fund. Our people have made a real effort in this area of their giving. We are grateful. Some of the other departments also showed a gain in their support, while some of them fell behind last year. Of course, we are reflecting an eleven month period in our report this year which is the factor in some of these lower amounts of giving. We are most grateful for the splendid cooperation of the people in the field of finance.

It was our delightful privilege to organize a new church in Bartlesville with 40 charter members. While the church has been worshiping in the College Chapel, they have bought lots in a new area of town and are making plans to build a place of worship.

For many years there has been a need for a District Parsonage. A nice property has been purchased in Bartlesville, and the District has a \$3,000.00 equity in the property.

The coming of Central Pilgrim College to this district has been a very distinct blessing to the district. Many of the Ministerial Students have supplied in various of our pulpits. It is our hope that we may use some of these fine young men doing some Mission Work this coming year.

A quick look at the progress of the individual churches will be quite interesting, thus we will include it in this report.

ALVA reports a nice gain in S. S. attendance, with new members being received into fellowship. The Maynards will be staying for their third year.

BLACKWELL has seen many new folk in the services. A lovely new lighted sign has been erected. The Hofens came there last Sept. and are staying for their second year.

ENID has raised their pastor's salary 400% this year. They are to be congratulated. They too, have received new members into fellowship. The Jeneweins are staying for their fifth year.

FOUR CORNERS is still progressing. The Kelleys are laboring on with good results as they go into their 12th year.

FAIRVIEW has reported a nice increase on all fronts. The Berrys are staying for their second year.

HENRYETTA has suffered some reverses, but God has blessed the Whittingtons in their faithful efforts and victory is theirs as they continue into their second year.

HOPETON has received new members into fellowship. They are continuing their growth as the Bebermeyers go into their third year as pastors.

NEWKIRK have new pastors coming in the persons of Rev. and Mrs. Ivan Ullom from Glenwood Iowa.

OKLAHOMA CITY suffered severe loss in the storms of the past year, but the spirit of the people was such that they have carried on under the leadership of the Bushmans who are continuing into their second year.

PLEASANT VIEW will have a new pastor next year. The Blands are leaving after eight years of faithful service.

Your District Superintendent has given much of his time to the work at Bartlesville this year with somewhat less time being spent on the district. This new work will continue to make heavy demands upon the time of the District Superintendent.

The program of personal evangelism as launched by the General Church is finding fertile ground and will pay big dividends as it is practiced.

A report of the personal activities of the Superintendent:

Held 18 services in the local churches.

Conducted 10 local Church Board Meetings.

Conducted 7 District Council meetings.

Made 43 visits to the pastors in addition to the Church services.

Attended 1 District Youth meeting.

Attended 1 Ministerial Retreat.

Conducted all of the Annual Business meetings with the exception of Bartlesville which was conducted by Asst. Superintendent Wise.

Attended three meetings of the Board of Trustees of

Central Pilgrim College, also three Executive Council meetings of the School.

Made one trip of a week's length in deputational work for the School.

In addition to the above it has been our privilege to serve as pastor of the Central Pilgrim Church newly organized in Bartlesville.

Have driven 10,305 miles in the District Interest. My salary and mileage are all paid in full.

The pastors and people of the Oklahoma District have been cooperative and a real pleasure to work with. May God bless each of them.

This has been a good year in my own soul and it is my sincere desire to have the Oklahoma District of The Pilgrim Holiness Church continue the progress it has been making.
