DISTRICT CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The thirty-fifth Annual Conference of the Oklahoma District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Hopeton, Oklahoma, July 17, 1961 at 10:00 a.m.

Bro. E. W. Lewis led the conference in singing the song, "He leadeth Me". Rev. W. L. Thomas assisted at the piano. Rev. H. C. Bushman led in the opening prayer.

Dr. R. G. Flexon, General Superintendent, was introduced as the chairman of the conference by the District Superintendent, Rev. C. B. Colaw. Dr. Flexon preached from Haggai 1:8. God's blessings were felt and several testified of His goodness to them.

The District Secretary was called upon to read the conference roll.

The Conference bar was fixed to include the center section and the platform.

The time of proceedings was set from 10:00 - 12:00 A. M. and 1:00 - 5:00 P. M.

The reception committee introduced the following to be received into the conference: Rev. Ralph Coy, Rev. E. R. Snook and Rev. Walter Thomas.

The Conference voted to let all the churches have a voice in the conference even though their United Stewardship Fund was all not paid.

The report of the Educational and Examining Board was read and excepted by the Conference.

The report of the District Superintendent, Rev. C. B. Colaw, was given and heartily received with an Amen.

The assistant Superintendent's report was read and accepted by the Conference.

The Auditing committee gave their report which was accepted.

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS (Cont.)

The report of the District Treasurer was accepted by the conference.

The statistical report was read and accepted.

Rev. Bushman gave his report as Sunday School Promotional Secretary and it was accepted by the Conference.

The Conference was recessed until 1:00 P. M.

The Conference convened again at 1:00 P. M. with Brother E. W. Lewis leading the singing and Rev. Walter Thomas at the piano. Sister Irene Freek led in prayer.

Rev. and Mrs. Ira Diggs were presented to the Conference and they were given an honorary seat in the Conference bar.

The minutes of the first session were read and approved.

The Resolution committee gave a partial report which was accepted.

The report of the Ways and Means committee was accepted by the Conference.

The Memorials to the General Conference were read and approved.

The Memoirs Committee report followed with prayer by Dr. R. G. Flexon.

The District Trustees were nominated by the Council and ratified by the Conference.

The final report of the Resolution Committee was given and accepted.

The Conference adjourned with prayer by Rev. O. R. Hofen.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. We recommend that the fiscal year close May 31.
2. Inasmuch as the District Treasurer has so much work to do at the close of the year, be it resolved that all district and general money be sent to the District Treasurer not later than June 10.
3. In order that we might conserve the Lord's money and give our churches the advantages of evangelistic meetings, be it resolved that we, as pastors and churches, consult our superintendent in slating Evangelists and if it is possible and practical, that they be consulted for two or more consecutive meetings which would keep down traveling expense.
4. Be it resolved that each pastor have the privilege of conducting one revival off his charge and that he pay out of his salary the supply and further he be granted a two weeks vacation with pay and that the church pay his supply during this two weeks vacation period.
5. Resolved that the camp have children and young people's services, the District Council to secure a leader for each and said meetings to be announced on the Camp Meeting bills.
6. Be it resolved that the first Sunday of each month be donations day for the pastors of the district and that the deacons announce the same the preceding Sunday; we further urge that the District Superintendent lay special emphasis upon this at each quarterly visit.
7. Be it resolved that the pastors be required to see that all reports are mailed to the District Superintendent by the 15th of the month following the close of the quarter, and that the annual reports be mailed to the chairman of the Statistical Committee by June 15.
8. Be it resolved that the District remain divided into zones as follows: Zone 1, Hopeton, Alva, Pleasant View, and Fairview, Enid; Zone 2, Blackwell, Newkirk, Four Corners, Bartlesville, Henryetta, and Oklahoma City.

9. We further recommend that when practical and possible at least one combined Sunday School and Youth Rally be conducted in each zone during the year, and that all rallies shall be under the supervision of the District Superintendent.

10. We recommend the following goals for the next year; increase in Sunday School attendance to 500; increase in membership to 300; 100% up on budgets each quarter. We recommend that a report be sent out at the end of each quarter to all churches, the same showing each church's standing for the quarter; in addition that special emphasis be placed upon soul winning and the spiritual growth of the church.

11. Whereas there is the danger of valuable papers becoming lost in our local churches, we recommend that the District rent a safety box and all churches send their abstracts, deeds, etc., to the District Superintendent for safe keeping in said box.

12. Be it resolved that all pastors desiring or considering changing pastorates, shall send their requests to the District Superintendents prior to their annual meeting. Be it further resolved that the District Superintendent present to each church a complete list of available pastors to be voted upon.

13. Be it resolved that the Church Secretary help count all offerings with the Church Treasurer.

14. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be granted two weeks vacation with pay.

15. Inasmuch as we have no record of ministerial tithes other than that appears in the District Treasurer's books, be it resolved that one extra column be added to the Pastor's Statistical Report to give said amounts.

16. Be it resolved that one day of the District Camp be devoted to the Young People's interests.

17. We recommend that the Sunday Schools of the district be permitted to record the average of their yearly attendance for the Sundays of the camp.

18. We recommend that all children attending camp be accompanied by their parent or guardian and that they be subject to all camp rules.
19. We recommend that we have a seven (7) day camp beginning on the third Monday in July.
20. Be it resolved that the hours of the District Conference be set by the District Council.
21. Be it resolved that the Sunday School Hour on the last Sunday of our District Camp be designated as District Sunday School Hour. This service shall be in charge of the program arranged by the District Sunday School Committee. At the time of the above service a freewill offering shall be taken to help defray expense of the District Sunday School committee.

SPECIAL RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that this conference express its appreciation for the unselfish labors of our District Superintendent the past year by a rising vote of thanks.
2. Be it resolved that this conference express its appreciation to Dr. R. G. Flexon for his labors as chairman of this conference by a rising vote of thanks.
3. Be it resolved that the District Secretary write letters of appreciation to the Hopeton Church, its people and pastor for their excellent entertainment by a hearty Amen.

The District Budget to be prorated as follows:

District expense 80% and the General Conference Fund 20%.

2. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid five (5) cents a mile travel expense. We further recommend that at the time of the District Superintendent's visit a freewill offering be taken to apply on his travel expense. This offering to be handed to the Superintendent at the time of his visit, and reported by him to the District Treasurer.

3. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid a salary of \$75.00 a year.

4. We recommend that the District Secretary be paid a salary of \$40.00 a year.

5. We recommend that the matter of the District Superintendent's salary be determined by the District Council.

6. We recommend that all ministerial tithe (Evangelists 75%) be paid through the local treasurer the first of each month the same to be applied to the District Fund.

7. We recommend that camp registration fee be set as follows: adults \$7.00 or breakfast 35¢, noon and evening meals 50¢ each. Children 5 and younger will receive their meals free. Anyone will be permitted to work for their meals.

8. We recommend that district postage, telephone and telegrams be paid from the district expense fund.

9. We recommend that all district checks be kept on file and turned over with the Treasurer's books.

10. We recommend that the Home Missions Offering taken the last Sunday of camp be applied to the District Home Missions interests as directed by the District Council.

11. We recommend that we have 300 copies of the 1961 minutes printed and that each church take an offering to help pay the same.

12. Whereas, the General Board in session May 12, 1960 has recommended that the local church pay the Ministerial Benefit Association assessment fees for their pastors who are eligible for, and have membership in, The Ministerial Benefit Association.

13. Whereas the Oklahoma District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church is a part of the Zone of Central Pilgrim College, and inasmuch as we recognize the great value of this institution to our work as it trains ministers and missionaries, be it resolved that we include in our local church budget in the amount of 50¢ per assessable member per month. Be it further resolved that from these funds the District Treasurer set aside for Central Pilgrim College Board of Trustees travel expense an amount equal to 25¢ per assessable member. Be it further resolved that from these funds an amount equal to 75¢ per assessable member be set aside to establish a District Scholarship fund to meet the plan set forth by the Executive Committee of Central Pilgrim College in their May 1961 meeting which provides for a tuition scholarship on a matching basis between Central Pilgrim College and the District. Be it further resolved that a special freewill offering be taken each month to meet this school budget and that it be forwarded to the District Treasurer monthly.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

General Superintendent Flexon, Fellow Ministers, delegates and friends of the Thirty-fifth Annual Conference of the Oklahoma district of the Pilgrim Holiness Church: Greetings!

Once more this conference is meeting in session to learn of the activities of yesterday, reflect on our position today, and make plans for the future. I believe we have just cause to rejoice in the gains of yesterday. At the same time we are sobered with the cold facts of today, and at once, frightened and challenged with the awesome possibilities of tomorrow.

Let us first of all praise God for what he has wrought in our midst. We are grateful for His blessings upon us, and the activities of His Spirit among us.. We are glad for the sense of unity that prevails among our people. For the second year in succession we are thrilled to report not one negative vote cast in the pastoral elections. May we ever continue in this precious spirit of harmony.

It has been my privilege to labor with a most wonderful group of pastors in our Church for the past five years; for their earnest effort in the Cause of The Kingdom we owe our deepest gratitude. It takes a pastor with real dedication to labor in a small, yet organized district, where there is no particular department of the General Church organization backing them with its finance and power. His success then depends to a large extent upon his own relationship with God and his ability to carry out the work of the Lord in the local church. We have found these devoted men wholeheartedly supporting the district program and giving their splendid cooperation to their District Superintendent. We praise God for them!

Our layman also are to be complimented for their work as will be reflected in the comparisons that follow. May God reward each of them.

To learn of our progress we will compare with the figures given at the Annual Conference in 1956. This is what our pastors and layman have accomplished with the aid of the Lord in the past five years:

1. The Church membership has been increased...48%
2. Sunday School yearly average attendance is up.....36%

3. Giving to the General Budget, or the United Stewardship fund as it is now called, is up 320%
4. Giving to the District Budget is up.. 250%
5. Giving to the Zone College has increased 750%
6. The average weekly support for pastors at the beginning of this year has showed an increase over the year ending June 30, 1956 of...42%

For all this wonderful progress we give thanks to God for His help and for the excellent work of both pastors and layman.

All the churches but one have paid their District Budget in full, with six of our eleven churches paying all of their budgets in full.

Now for a look at the plans for the future which must include an all-out effort for a great spiritual revival. Oh, pray God that we will have a real spiritual awakening among us. We need it and I believe we want it. Let us pray until we have it.

Our further plans must include the program of personal evangelism. Our General Superintendent Flexon has made it possible for this program to be carried out in our churches. This we must do!

The District Council has approved, and resolutions will be brought to this Conference for the approval of the following goals to be reached by the end of this Conference year:

1. An increase in church membership to total..300
2. An average Sunday School attendance for the year of.....500
3. All budgets paid in full.

There is no doubt in my mind but that you will want to approve these goals and then strive to reach them.

There is little need to go into detail about the many improvements the local churches have made. An excellent job has been done in this area and greater improvements are in the plans for the future.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE GENERAL CONFERENCE MEMORIALS
COMMITTEE PASSED BY THE DISTRICT
CONFERENCE

1. Section 116, Paragraph 2, The Pilgrim Holiness Manual shall be amended to read as follows:

"The Delegates to the General Conference shall be selected as follows: Ministerial delegates shall be selected, at the ratio of one for every seven, or major fractional part of such number, from all ordained ministers who are actively and regularly engaged in the work of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, and all licensed ministers who are pastoring Pilgrim Holiness Churches."

2. The District Youth President shall be elected by the District Conference from two or more nominations made by the District Council. Further that the District Youth President shall by virtue of his office be a member of the District Council.
3. The activities and actions of the District Youth Organization shall at all times be subject to review and approval by the District Council.
4. Section 130, of the Manual shall include the following:

"The General Secretary-Treasurer shall direct a study group in the revision and standardization of all statistical forms or reports used by local, district, and general organizations. In conjunction with the revision of these forms, a Handbook shall be made available to the local church Pastor, Treasurer, and Secretary, and also to the District Treasurer and District Secretary. The Handbook shall give general instructions dealing with each specific item in the uniform church report forms."
