## CURRENT AND STANDING RULES

1. BE IT RESOLVED: That the District Council be given authority to select place and date of the Ministerial Convention. (1942).
2. BE IT RESOLVED: That the District Council be given authority to select the place and date for the next Annual Camp and Conference. (1942).
3. BE IT RESOLVED: That the Fifth Sunday School Offerings of each Church in the District be placed in the District Treasury to be used for miscellaneous expenses of the District (stamps, printing, etc.) (1942).
4. BE IT RESOLVED: That a District Camp Meeting Association be organized with dues of one dollar (\$1.00) or more per member. (1942).
5. BE IT RESOLVED: That the District Young People's President, with the approval of the District Council, be given authority to set the place and date of this first Young People's Rally and each succeeding Rally. (1943).
6. (1) WHEREAS the high cost of war-time living makes it imperative to supplement our District Superintendent's salary, and WHEREAS the General Home Mission Board pays only \$75.00 per month to his salary, BE IT RESOLVED: That we as a District pay \$50.00 per month to our District Superintendent's salary.

10. BE IT RESOLVED: That in case of an emergency arising on the District, that, if the funds permit, the District Superintendent draw the expenses for such an emergency from the District Treasury.

## REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the Third Annual Conference of the South Carolina District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church—Greetings:

We praise God for the blessings of the past year. In spite of war-time restrictions and other obstacles He has helped us to go forward in the District, financially, numerically and Spiritually.

The Church at Winnsboro has completed a full sized basement with fine new Sunday School rooms which fulfill a great need. The building has been veneered with blue granite stone, a new roof has been put on and the inside has been finished with celotex. With the Lord's help Bro. Ellenburg and his people have made great progress this year, not only financially, but many souls have been saved and sanctified and quite a few members have been received into the Church.

Brother and Sister Eads have been wonderfully used of the Lord at Greenville this year. The attendance at Young People's meeting, Church and Sunday School has been much increased. The building has been floored and several changes have been made in both the Church and parsonage. The lovely lawn and flowers add much to the beauty of the place. The Lord has surely blessed the work there this year.

Brother and Sister Mosely have worked hard in Columbia and God is honoring their labors. The Sunday School and Church attendance has grown very rapidly during the past few months and they have a fine Young People's Society in operation. Brother Shields, the evangelist in the spring revival was a great blessing to the people here.

The Lugoff Church, also, enjoyed a profitable revival with Brother Shields as evangelist, and the Lord is helping in the Church. Brother Ellenburg, the pastor, has received the cooperation of the Church and community.

During this past year we have organized a Church at Killian (twelve miles from Columbia), with 18 members. Our Sunday School has a good attendance. We have been blessed here with Godly teachers and a good Sunday School Superintendent. The Church is well organized and has a good financial system.

Recently we have opened a Church at Pleasant Hill. This is a needy field. A Church has been on the property for 150 years. We recently set out to repair the building; this we have not yet completed.

We are grateful to the ministers and workers of the District for their help and faithful work. We have fellowship one with another.

During this past year, I have preached 105 times, with 75 seeking regeneration and 50 seeking sanctification. I have traveled 10,000 miles, conducted one revival off the District, visited three camps in the interest of Home Missions; have received \$1,200.00 cash support and \$75.00 donations. I also received my house rent.

## GENERAL PROCEEDINGS

### FIRST SITTING

With the singing of "All Hail the Power", led by Rev. Robert Addington, the Third Annual Conference of the South Carolina District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened in the Winnsboro Pilgrim Church on Friday morning, September 10, 1943, at 10:00 o'clock. Rev. R. W. Wolfe, General Secretary of Home Missions and Church Extension, presided. After prayer by the local pastor, Rev. J. H. Ellenburg, the congregation sang "Amazing Grace".

Robert Addington of Muncie, Indiana; Rev. D. M. Royer of Frankfort, Indiana; Rev. L. C. Hiles, returned missionary to South America and Foreign Missionary representative; Rev. R. D. Brown, District Superintendent of Canada—all of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

After a duet, "The Unveiled Christ", sung by Rev. Robert Addington and Mrs. R. S. Shelton, Rev. R. W. Wolfe delivered the Conference sermon. The Lord poured an extra blessing upon His people as Brother Wolfe spoke from Philippians 2:15, "Ye shall shine as lights in the world". What a refreshing service this was!

After a brief recess the Conference re-assembled with Rev. R. W. Wolfe presiding. The roll was called and the Conference bar was set, giving visitors the privilege to sit inside the bar.
