Opening Session

June 29, 1954

9:00 A.M

The Thirteenth Annual Conference of the South Carolina- Georgia District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened in the tabernacle at Winnsboro, South Carolina on June 29, 1954.

Rev. Osborn led the gospel song, "Standing on the Promises", after which Rev. M.T. Cockman made a few remarks and called on our pastor of Winnsboro to lead us in prayer.

Rev. Cockman introduced the chairman of our conference, the new General Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R.C. Hawkins. He made a few remarks and brought a short message from I Thes. 5: 1-13 on "Spiritual and Political Conditions". He mentioned our attitudes, subjection to authority and peace in the church and among ourselves.

The secretary called the roll and the conference bar was fixed. The first two rows of chairs and the first bench were established as the bar.

Rev. R.C. Duda introduced five guests, Rev. Hendrick, our camp evangelist from Michigan; Mrs. Frank Usry, Mrs. Barber, Mrs. Legrand and Mrs. Parish. These were given an honorary seat in the bar.

A splendid report was given by our District Superintendent which was accepted.

The educational and Examining Committee read their report and they moved that Rev. Arthur Barber be ordained and that J.D. Smith and Homer Smith receive first year district license. It was accepted.

We were glad to have two new churches presented by M.T. Cockman, our District Superintendent. These were Macon, Georgia and Easley, South Carolina, These were received.

The Sunday School Awards were given at this time to Killion, South Carolina, Easley, South Carolina and Macon, Georgia.

An amendment to the second resolution was brought that the District treasurer send a report of the budget due once a year to each church. The main resolution was that the District budget remain as is for the coming year. The amendment and main resolution were carried.

Rev. Hawkins discussed the district budget.

Rev. Duda closed the morning session with prayer.

The meeting of the morning session was adjourned at 11:45 until 1:00

SECOND SESSION

June 29, 1954

1:00 PM

Rev. Hawkins called the conference to order. Chaplain E.W. Friesen led in a gospel song after which Rev. C.R.Hendrick offered prayer.

Rev. Hawkins called for the minutes. They were read and accepted.

The resolution committee brought two resolution at this time. That we give Rev. Hendrick a rising vote of thanks for his labors in our camp and the other resolution that there be a camp committee to govern the activities of the camp meeting. An amendment was made to this resolution by A.J. Taylor that three be appointed by the Executive Council to aid in the labors of the camp with the district council. This amendment was lost. Rev. Cockman amended the main motion that four be appointed to assist the district council with the activities of the camp. This was moved and adopted. The resolutions were carried.

The Resolutions Committee recommended that number 7, page 18 of our minutes and number 9, page 19 be put in our standing rules. This was moved and carried.

The memorial committee reported and brought one memorial, that of Horace Overby Oliver, Jr. It was moved and accepted.

A District Trustee was voted on and Rev. Ellenburg was elected.

It was moved that the remaining business be left to the District Council. It was moved and carried.

Rev. Osborn introduced Mrs. Hendrick and she gave her testimony.

Rev. R.C.Hawkins announced the ordinations service by appointing Rev.Cockman,Rev. Taylor, Chaplain Friesen, Rev. Ellenburg and Rev. Sutton. Chaplain Friesen led in the singing of "A Charge to Keep I Have", after which Rev. H.S. Mosser offered prayer. Rev.Hawkins delivered a message to the ministry that it should be a God called ministry, a ministry based on the word, and the theme should be to preach Christ and His Glory, to preach Christ in His splendor of miracles, to preach Christ in His death, to preach Christ as the sanctifier, to preach Christ as the coming King, to preach Christ as the judge of the wicked, and to preach Christ as the sum of the Gospel. Rev. Arthur Barber knelt before the altar and the ordination committee placed their hands on him while Rev. Cockman prayed, after which Rev. Hawkins ordained him to the ministry of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. We then sang, "Praise God from Whom All Blessings Flow". Rev. Sutton moved that the afternoon session of the June 29th. conference be adjourned. Rev. Sutton dismissed in prayer and the conference was adjourned.

REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

The Ways and Means Committee recommends that the District Budget remain as is for the coming year.

The General Conference passed a resolution that each Pilgrim Church join the Pension Plan. That 4% of the salary of the minister shall be paid by the local church and 2% by the pastor. We, therefore, recommend that 4% of the District Superintendent's salary be paid out of the District Treasury and the 2% be paid by the District Superintendent.

1. Be it resolved that we stand in a moment of silent prayer in appreciation of Gods blessings during the past year.
2. Be it resolved that the Conference stand as a token of appreciation to our District Superintendent, Rev. M.T. Cockman, for his leadership, councilship, and untiring efforts to lead us to victory through the past year.
3. Be it resolved that we give a rising vote of thanks to our evangelist, Rev. C.R. Hendrick for his ministry and encouragement to our district.
4. Be it resolved that we give Mrs. C.R. Hendrick a rising vote of thanks for her labours with us.
5. Be it resolved that we rise in a vote of thanks for our former General Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R.A. Beltz, and that a letter be sent by the district secretary in appreciation for his labours with us these past eight years.
6. Be it resolved that we give a rising vote to our newly elected General Secretary of Church Extension Rev. Richard Hawkins, and that we pledge by God to uphold him in our daily prayer life.
7. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent appoint four members other than the District Council to assist in the camp meeting.

STANDING RULES

1. The district council shall set the date of the District camp and Conference and call the workers.
2. The District Council shall select the date and place for the Ministerial Convention.
3. There shall be a District Camp Meeting Association with dues of one dollar per member each year, money to be used in promoting the annual camp.
4. All licensed and ordained ministers shall tithe the income of their ministerial labours into the district treasury for the support of the District Superintendent.
5. The churches shall raise the following amount each month toward the support of the District Superintendent.

In addition to these amounts, each church shall take a free will offering for the Superintendent on each of his visits to apply on his traveling expense.

6. Our District Treasure send each quarter a financial report of the churches to each pastor of the District with copy to the District Superintendent.
7. Each pastor make a monthly report of the Sunday School giving the average attendance and the amount of offerings received, immediately after the closing Sunday of each month, and that a copy be sent to the District Sunday School Secretary and also to the District Superintendent.

8. The District Superintendent salary from the District shall be 50.00 dollars a month, same to be paid from the ministerial tithé and the monthly appropriations from the churches.
9. All district funds shall be forward to the District Treasure on or before the tenth of each month.
10. All church books and records shall be closed April 30th and reports prepared for the annual District Conference. The statistical report shall be sent immediately after this date to the District Secretary.
11. Each pastor shall be expected to attend the camp and conference and remain until the cleaning up is finished, unless excused by the District Council.
12. The District Young Peoples Work shall be under the supervision of the District Superintendent. There shall be a Young Peoples Convention held in connection with the annual camp.
13. Be it resolved; that the District Treasure, make a monthly report, on the first day of the month, to be sent to the District Superintendent.
14. Each minister on the District shall contribute at least one weeks work on the camp ground, subject to the call of the District Superintendent.
15. Be it resolved; that the week preceeding Easter be a week of self-denial for the benefit of the Great Easter offering for Church Extension.
16. Be it resolved; that our District Statistician have the conference minutes ready for publication thirty days after conference convenes.
