JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

Easley, South Carolina

July 9, 1960

FIRST SITTING

The 1960 Conference of the South Carolina-Georgia Conference convened at 9:00 A. M., July 9, 1960 at the Reunion School, Easley, South Carolina. Rev. H. C. Rickner, District Superintendent, led in an opening prayer. Mr. Gilbert Koon led in the singing of "More About Jesus" and "In the Sweet By and By." Rev. H. S. Mosser led in prayer.

Rev. Harold C. Rickner introduced Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of the Church Extension of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Rev. Hawkins read I Thess. 4:16. He spoke of the near coming of the Lord as pertaining to the present world conditions. He stated, "All the tragedy will try to be covered with smooth words, "Peace and safety."

Rev. J. D. Smith, District Secretary, called the roll.

The Conference bar was fixed to include the first two rows of seats on either side of auditorium.

A motion carried that the time of sittings be 9:00-12:00 and if necessary from 1:00-4:00.

Rev. H. C. Rickner, District Superintendent, read his report which was heartily received by the Conference.

The following reports were read and accepted.

Treasurer, Rev. Howard Smith.

Statistical Committee, Mrs. Edith Smith. The report was received with its corrections.

Rev. Hawkins spoke on the importance of correct reports.

Rev. Frank Hopkins, District Sunday School Promotional Secretary, read the Sunday School report which was accepted. Rev. H. S. Mosser read the report of the Examining and Educational Board. After explanations of the workings regarding the year in which Ministers are placed, the report was accepted.

Rev. H. S. Mosser read for the Resolutions Committee.

Resolution No. I—was carried regarding the Closing Date of Conference.

Resolution No. II—Regarding Committee appointments by the District Superintendent.

Resolution No. III—The Council to serve as the Camp Meeting Board.

Resolution No. IV—Ministerial Convention.

Resolution No. V—This was referred to the committee to be re-drafted.

Resolution No. VI—Each pastor to have vacation with pay.

Resolution No. VII—Day for fasting and prayer.

Resolution No. VIII—Regarding the camp at Easley. It was moved and carried that this resolution be tabled until we hear the next resolution regarding the purchasing of the Reunion School property at Easley.

Resolution No. IX-was read and discussed.

Adjourned by expiration of time. Mr. W. M. Bene-field.

SECOND SITTING

The second sitting convened at 1:00, July 9, 1960 at Easley, S. Carolina. Rev. Homer Smith led in the singing of "Come Unto Me." Rev. Orville Parks led in prayer.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

Rev. Mosser re-read Resolution No. 9, regarding the purchasing of the property at Easley. It was carried seven to five.

Resolution No. 8 was re-read. It was carried that we adopt this resolution.

Resolution No. 10 regarding selling the property at Winnsboro was read. The resolution as amended was passed. The amendment "that after selling the property in Winnsboro, that the council retain the money and use it to finance our District Camp Ground."

Rev. Howard Smith reported for the Ways and Means Committee. This report was accepted.

Resolution No. V was re-read and passed as amended by the Committee.

It was moved and carried that the first seven District resolutions and the three from the Ways and Means Committee become our standing rules for next year, replacing what is in the present Minutes.

Resolution No. 11 was read and carried.

The District Superintendent appointed the following as tellers: Mr. A. J. Black and Mr. Foxworth.

Ballots were passed for the following officers:

Advisory members to the District Council, Homer Smith and Frank Hopkins.

Examining and Educational Board, H. S. Mosser.

Ballots were cast for District Trustee and no election resulting, it was moved and carried that we vote on the two highest, J. D. Smith and G. Koon. G. Koon was elected.

Rev. H. C. Rickner, District Superintendent, read the Committee appointments.

Rev. R. C. Hawkins spoke words of commendation to the members of the Conference.

Resolution No. 12 regarding rising votes of thanks was read and carried. It was moved and carried that each pastor be listed in the Yellow Pages of the telephone directory.

It was moved and carried that we adjourn.

After the singing of "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder," Rev. Frank Hopkins dismissed with prayer.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the General Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, fellow ministers, delegates, visitors and friends: Greetings in the Name of our Lord Jesus Christ and welcome to the Annual Conference of the South Carolina-Georgia District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

As we are convened to report our activities, to prepare plans for the future, and to receive blessings and inspiration to carry out the Heavenly directions of our Risen Lord; our world struggles in the grip of a sinful, Satanic power that strives to crush God and true righteousness. These days call for our best. We can have no divided loyalties. We must quicken our pace. Forces are closing in on the Church that will do all in their evil purposes to hinder the spread of "true Holiness." As ministers and laymen of the South Carolina-Georgia District we must not fail in this hour. We must work and pray as one. None of us can isolate himself and stand alone. We dare not be divided in these tragic times. As God has said, "We are laborers together," and He has promised strength for the day.

This past year has been one of many new things. The matter of District Administration after years of pastoring; the work of two Districts and the many hours and miles of travel, plus the many adjustments for me and my family, has been interesting and an exciting year to say the least. But to see souls seeking God, new churches opened and established churches strengthened is worth all that may come to us as we labor for Christ and the church.

My predecessor, Rev. A. I. Wise, is to be commended for his efforts to establish and help this District. We have a long way to go, but praise God we are headed in the right direction and we have come a "right smart piece."

I have found some of the most gracious laymen and ministers in this District that I have met anywhere. Our gains are largely due to their efforts and prayers.

OUR PROGRESS

The churches and Sunday Schools of Columbia, Easley, Greenville and Killian have made commendable gains. Greenville has lead the way with a Sunday School gain of 29 or about 66 per cent and a membership gain of 15 or about 65 per cent. It is hoped this year we may see the rest of the churches showing progress. Our over-all giving increased almost \$7,000.00. Our membership gain is a little over 11 per cent. Our District Treasurer received almost \$1,100.00 on District Budget. All churches but two did well on the District budget. We hope to see an increase in our United Stewardship fund this next year. Pastors, it can be done, but we must plan and work our plan. We are grateful for the wonderful gain in our Sunday Schools. According to the Minutes of last year, the Sunday Schools have reported a gain of 85 or almost 33 per cent. This gain has been realized in spite of the fact that three schools reported losses.

NOTES OF PRAISE

The debt of our churches is being slowly paid off. Killian is paying on the settlement of the loan to Church Extension loan fund. We welcome the new Pilgrims who have joined our ranks this year. We rejoice for the number of seekers, for spiritual help at our altars. Our churches have received visitations of God and we are grateful and say "Praises be to our God." But let us not be content, may this next year be greater in all respects for God.

PROPERTY IMPROVEMENTS

Pastors and people have worked to improve parsonages and churches. Listed are some of the major accomplishments.

Columbia—completed the re-decorating of the church and purchased a new parsonage. The erection of a fine Sunday School unit is now in the planning stage.

Easley—re-decorated the church sanctuary and are continuing to expand the facilities of the Sunday School.

Greenville—completely re-decorated the church interior and the Sunday School rooms in the basement. Installed a new heating system in the church. Many improvements have been made in the other churches and parsonages for which we are grateful. May we always strive to keep the House of God in good repair and presentable at all times.

GOALS FOR THIS YEAR

1. Strengthening of local churches spiritually and financially.

2. A wholesome effort for our Youth work.

3. Personal visitation in our churches.

4. A faithful honest effort to build the work of God and the church.

A NOTE OF THANKS

I am grateful to the pastors, especially for their kindness and understanding and co-operation in our District work. We rise to great heights and bigness of understanding and soul when we can adjust to circumstances that may not be ideal. But we make the best of what we have for God's glory and the salvation of souls.

It is a privilege and a pleasure to work in the church Extension department under Rev. R. C. Hawkins. He is a gracious, noble leader and the least we can do is give our best in our labors of love together.
