CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The Sixth Annual Conference of the Alabama North-west Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, opened, 7:30 P. M., June 29, 1954, in the Magnolia Springs, Alabama, Church.

Rev. S. V. Repple, the host pastor of the Conference, made a few salutory remarks and introduced the District Superintendent, Rev. O. A. Simmons, who after a few remarks requested, Rev. H. K. Lee to lead the congregation in singing. After singing "Leaning On The Everlasting Arms" and "Whoever Searches Me", Rev. Cliff Pallitt, the pastor of the Birmingham, Ala. Church, led us in prayer. A special song was very especially rendered by Miss Jo Anne Jordan and Miss Marlene Scott, entitled, "Love Divine". Congregation then sang "There Shall Be Showers of Blessings". A beautiful rendition of, "Saved By Grace" was offered by Larry Lee, accompanied by Miss Jordan at the piano.

Rev. O. A. Simmons, introduced our new General Secretary Of Church Extension, Rev. R. D. Fleming, presiding officer of the Conference, who brought greetings to the Conference and stated, "If we do anything, it will be God working through us." His scripture lesson was taken from Isaiah the fifth chapter. He said "This parable is to apply to us as individuals."

The Conference was dismissed by prayer led by Rev. J. A. Thomas, Pastor of the Warrington Church.

FIRST SITTING

The first sitting of the Sixth Annual Conference of the Alabama N. W. Florida District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened at 9 A. M., June 30, 1954 in the Pilgrim Holiness Church in Magnolia Springs, Ala.

Rev. Harold Huff led the Conference in singing "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart". Prayer was led by Brother Emune, after which the congregation lifted

their voices in singing, "He Hideth My Soul."

Brother Simmons, introduced, Rev. Hawkins, the General Secretary Of Church Extension, who brought the morning message, basing his remarks on the scripture text, St. John 15:16 -

The Price Of Leadership

"All Ministers are leaders, especially in Home Missionary Districts. Due to the fact that we are holding a Conference, there is a price we must pay for the leadership and many things required of a leader that is not required of a follower. To be a successful leader we must be:

1. Established in God.
2. Your devotion to God must be deeper than any other cause and that which we do must be done for Jesus sake.
3. You must be loyal to the Pilgrim Holiness Church and it's teachings.
4. We must learn how to come under authority.
5. You must be a living sacrifice.
6. We are to have living labors.
 - (a) We must be a living vision.
 - (b) We must see the white harvest fields.
 - (c) Our vision must be activated.
7. We must find a way to do the impossible.
8. We must carry out our marching orders.

"Go ye into all the world and preach the Gospel."
9. We must get the job done."

At the conclusion of the message the roll was called by the Secretary. Mrs. Ada Norris, was the alternate for the Magnolia Springs Church and by motion, Mrs. George H. Carr was seated for the Pensacola Second Church. A Motion prevailed to cause the Conference Bar to consist of the first three pews across the Church, also the Platform.

Rev. Hawkins took the chair.

Rev. K. W. Phipps and his wife were presented to the Conference by the Reception Committee and were granted honorary seats in the Conference Bar.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and accepted.

3. That we join our forces and have Holiness Rallies in each Zone and that all Churches participate in these.

4. That we have a Young People's Convention or Rally this year.

5. That every Church pay all their District obligations this year.

6. That we adopt and support the plan for raising finance for District Home Missions.

7. That each Church make a special effort to increase their membership this year. While we donot advocate taking in just anyone we do feel that there are others who would join in the Covenant with us if they were urged.

8. That we all put on a special drive in the Sunday School to make it our best year.

9. To make this the most spiritual year we have had in the history of the District.

10. That where new buildings are needed, we make a venture of faith and make plans for building them.

11. That every Pastor help us make the District Bulletin a success by getting news items, testimonies, etc. to us on time.

12. That each Pastor spend as much of his time as possible pastoring his Church and though some may have to take some work to suppliment his salary we should be conscientious as to the amount of support we are receiving from the church and give as much time at least as they are paying us for.

13. That each Minister within the District devote two weeks of his time, if called on, to the work of the District, as Evangelist or helper or aiding in getting new work started. It is of course understood that the District Superintendent will endeavor to call him at a convenient time for the one concerned.

14. In conclusion, will you not join with me in prayer and effort to make this our best and most spiritual year?

Greetings to you in the Name of our Lord.

As I prepare to you this report, I would like to praise God for His goodness and many blessings through out the year. Providence has overshadowed me with many mercies and I have enjoyed numerous blessings which I did not deserve. To you who have prayed for me and hold me in love, thank you great hearts. I extend my sincere appreciation through the hour spent with you. In the time which this year, we all have had been the subject of our appreciation. I wish to thank each of you for your letters and words, also for the beautiful prayers which surrounded you concern for my welfare.

I have endeavored to conduct the interests of the District in a manner that we felt was pleasing to our God. There has not a day passed that we have not called each another by name in prayer and asked God's blessings for you and your work (perhaps while in hospital and not conscious enough to do so). I appreciate every minister and their family who seem to have such a burden to see God's work advance in this District.

I have great concern for the spiritual welfare of our District. We cannot get along without the touch of God which was upon the early Church. If and when we loose this great power we will find ourselves substituting with worldly programs and trying to build

In these special times when men are seeking pleasure, power, and fame we must endeavor to lead them to the only One who can fill them with His satisfying power. If we will seek the spiritual blessings for our Church and ourselves as leaders, our members will not be far as large. Often we who travel and throughout the day the burden for more of God's spirit in our District has driven us to our knees pleading with God for help. I do believe we are farther up the road than ever before but beloved, let us keep moving. The enemy is after us. I notice that there is great concern and burden among the leaders of our District to see the work move forward and I appeal to all of you. By standing together there will be power enough to accomplish the task ahead for there is power in unity. The Scripture teaches us that, one shall chase a thousand and two shall put ten thousand to flight.

We are happy to inform you, that through the faithfulness of Brother Robert Emons and his good wife we now have a good spot for a Church in Orestes, Florida. Soon after Conference last year some of the Brethren and I rented the tent on the bank and started out hardly knowing where we were going. In fact we had two places on our hearts so we first drove to Atmos, Alabama, but due to some conditions existing there we decided that it was not the right time in this place so we then went to Orestes and after some looking and refusal we located a lot for the tent meeting. Brother Lee, held the first meeting while Brother Emons was in charge as Pastor. It was through the influence of this meeting that Brother Emons later secured the property we now have leased. We are paying and looking for a lot to buy and plan to build real soon. Your District Home Missionary dollars have been invested here.

The gain at Magnolia Springs Church certainly merits mention here. The Sunday School had a numerical gain of eleven. They also gained six members for the Church. God has blessed the Church in many ways under the leadership of Brother Reppogle and wife. This Church

is now making plans for building an educational unit which is much needed.

We regret that Brother Cole had to resign the Mobile Church due to a serious heart attack. Brother Shroyer and wife, from Huntington, Indiana, are the new workers there and though things may seem rather slow at this place now I believe God is going to use these good workers to bring it out.

As you know, I resigned the Church at Birmingham to take up other duties. Brother Cliff Pollitt and family, from Tennesboro, Kentucky are the new workers for this Church. I believe God is going to use them for the advancement of His Kingdom in this place.

We are endeavoring to secure some property in Montgomery for the building of a new Church. I appreciate the faithfulness of our good Pastor and wife there.

My Personal Report.

Beside Pastoring the Birmingham Church, I have visited the Churches thirty-one times and held four Annual Business Meetings. I have traveled eight-thousand miles in the District interest and four-thousand and six hundred miles to special meetings of District and General Church interests. I have presided over eight District Council meetings. Attended two other Campmeetings other than our own representing General Church Extension, and one Bible School board meeting, one Superintendent's Conference and the Regional Sunday School Leader's Institute.

If they are coming short he is to impress upon them the importance of meeting their obligations. Be it further resolved that he impress the Congregation as to their duty to their pastor.

20. Resolved that all persons applying for license appear in person before the Examining and Educational Board, unless the applicant is sick or otherwise unable to appear and in that case some members of the Conference certify as to his or her character and location.
