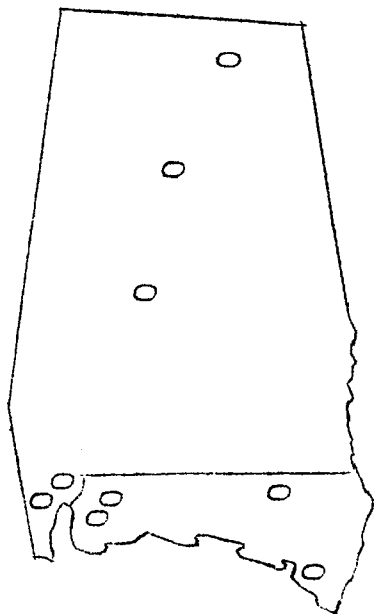

## CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The Eleventh Annual Conference of the Alabama, Northwest Florida District convened in Birmingham, Alabama at 8:30 A. M. June 12, 1959.

Rev. Robert Emmons led the Conference in singing "When We All Get To Heaven" and "It Is Joy Unspeakable," after which Rev. C. S. Simmons led in prayer.

Rev. M. C. Kittle, the District Superintendent, introduced Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church Extension. Rev. Hawkins made some remarks regarding the wonderful message delivered by Dr. Neff in the precious service. Rev. Hawkins then read a Scripture lesson from Colossians 1:21-29 and made some remarks that were very instructive and up-lifting.

Dr. Neff, the General Superintendent, took the chair and led the conference in singing "We'll Work 'Till Jesus Comes." The first order of business was the calling of the roll.

A motion prevailed for the Conference Bar to consist of the first five pews in the church.

Moved and seconded to seat Rev. Chapin and Rev. Earlywine in the Conference.

The District Superintendent, Rev. M. C. Kittle, read his report, which was accepted by a hearty Amen.

The treasurer's report was read and accepted.



The statistical report was read and accepted.

The report of the educational and examining board was read and accepted.

A partial report of the resolutions committee was heard.

Resolutions 5, 10, 18, 20, 22, and 23, were deleted.

Resolution 8 was accepted.

Resolution 18 was accepted.

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was heard.

Recommendations 3, 4, 6, 8, 9, and 11 were changed.

Recommendation 13 was deleted.

Rev. Hawkins announced the General Board's appointments for the offices of District Superintendent, District Secretary, and District Treasurer.

The Conference elected the following officers:

Two councilmen

One member for the educational and examining board.

One trustee.

The committee on resolutions completed their report.

Resolution 19 was accepted.

Resolution 20 was accepted.

Resolution 21 was accepted.

Resolution 22 was accepted.

Resolution 23 was accepted.

Conference adjourned.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF WAYS AND MEANS  
COMMI TTEE

1. We recommend that all Licensed and Ordained Ministers pay their Ministerial tithes into the District Treasurer to be applied on the District Budget.
2. We recommend that all Birthday offerings be paid to the District Treasurer to be applied on the District Budget.
3. We recommend that the District Superintendent's travel expenses, while traveling in the interest of the District, be paid at the rate of five cents per mile. Also that his District correspondence and communications, and utilities be paid by the District Treasurer.
4. We recommend that each church pay fifty cents (50¢) per member per month to the District Treasurer for District Budget.
5. We recommend that on each visit of the District Superintendent, that the church visited take an offering to be applied to the Superintendent's travel expenses and to be sent to the District Treasurer.
6. We recommend that all money be sent to the District Treasurer not later than the tenth of each month in order that the monthly obligations might be met.

7. We recommend that each church pay fifty cents (50%) per member this year to be applied on General Conference expenses for sending delegates to the General Conference. Money to be sent to the District Treasurer.

8. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$50.00 per year for his services, the same to be paid from District funds.

9. We recommend that the District Secretary be paid \$35.00 per year for his service, the same to be paid from District funds.

10. We recommend that the District continue the Pilgrim Pension Plan; that each church pay into the District Treasurer monthly four per cent of the sum of their pastor's salary

11. We recommend that each church pay ten dollars (\$10.00) per year for the District Conference expenses not later than sixty days prior to the Conference.

12. We recommend that the District Sunday School Secretary's expenses be paid for the mailing of all Sunday School Reports. Same shall mail a quarterly statement to the District Treasurer.

## RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that the yearly reports be made in triplicate. One copy to be mailed within ten days from the close of the conference year, to the District Statistician, one copy to the District Superintendent, and one copy to be brought to the Conference by the delegate.
2. Be it resolved that our Conference year close on May 31.
3. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer's books close at noon (12:00 O'clock) June 9.
4. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer send each church a quarterly financial report of all the money received from the churches.
5. Be it resolved that each church pay their Pastor's and Delegate's expenses to the Conference and to the Ministerial Convention.
6. Be it resolved that each pastor have the privilege of holding two revivals a year, and that one of these shall take the place of his vacation.
7. Be it resolved that each Church shall endeavor to start a branch Sunday School or prayer meeting in a nearby community.
8. Resolved that the District have two zones. The Northern Zone being comprized

of Birmingham, Huntsville and the Selma Churches. The Southern Zone shall consist of Mobile, Magnolia Springs, Brownsville, Crestview, Lynn Haven and Warrington Churches.

9. Be it resolved that we have a special Convention open to our ministers and their wives; the date, place, and time to be decided by the District Council and Rev. R. C. Hawkins. The night service to be open to the public.

10. Resolved that each Church install and practice the envelope system of collecting the tithe and offerings.

11. Resolved that the District Superintendent on each visit to the Churches, meet with the board, question the Pastor as to whether or not the Churches are paying their District obligations, also if the Pastor is sending his Ministerial tithe to the District Treasurer. If they are coming short, he is to impress upon them the importance of meeting their District obligations. Be it further resolved that he impress upon the congregation as to their duty to their pastor.

12. Resolved that all persons applying for license to appear in person before the ~~Ex-~~ amining and Educational board, unless the applicant is sick or otherwise unable to appear in person, and in that case some member of the Conference shall certify as to his character and location.

13. Resolved that the District Superintendent be consulted and present, if possible, when drawing up deeds in the District, and that all deeds be abstracted.

14. Resolved that each Church send in a monthly report to the District Superintendent, and the Secretary of Church Extension not later than the tenth of the month.

15. Be it resolved that any Church desiring to call an evangelist of another Denomination should first consult the District Superintendent.

16. Be it resolved that each Sunday School of the District have a set time for the Sunday School count, and that this time be set by this Conference, as being half the time of the Sunday School Period.

17. Whereas we of the Alabama, Northwest Florida District have been privileged to have had with us the Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, and his wife and family and since they have been such a blessing to us, let us all say a hearty Amen.

18. Be it resolved that the District Conference be as early in June as feasible and that a joint District Camp and Youth Camp be planned by the District Council at another date.

19. Be it resolved that we express our appreciation to our General Superintendent, Rev. Wm. Neff, for his messages and minis-

try in the Camp by a hearty Amen.

20. Be it resolved that we show our appreciation for the leadership and spirit of our Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, by standing saying God Bless You.

21. Be it resolved that we render thanks to God for sparing our District Superintendent through his recent illness for the continuing inspiration of his constructive leadership by standing and saying Thank The Lord.

22. Be it resolved that we express our thanks to the host Church for their wonderful hospitality and entertainment by saying Thank You Birmingham.

23. Whereas Mrs. Pearl Crute, widow of Rev. L. T. Crute, was called to her reward, be it resolved that, as a memorial, we stand for a period of silent prayer.

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

1. Mobile has made parsonage and church repairs.
2. Magnolia Springs has redecorated the church, purchased new hymnals, platform draw drapes, altar carpet, etc. Improvements have been made in the parsonage.
3. Brownsville
4. Warrington:- New tile on Sunday School rooms and redecorated them. Added new room and completely redecorated the parsonage.
5. Lynn Haven:-Redecorated church. Construction of parsonage well under way with faithful local group carrying all the financial burden of construction.
6. Crestview:- Repairs on parsonage. Church redecorated.
7. Selma:- Landscaping of church and parsonage grounds, equipment for Sunday School, black boards, tables, etc.
