Journal of Proceedings

FIRST SESSION, TUESDAY, JANUARY 5th, 1926.

The Twenty-First Annual Assembly of the Eastern District, Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Hurlock, Md., 10.30 a. m., January 5th, 1926, with District Superintendent, Rev. P. F. Bean, in the chair. Session was opened with song, "He Abids" and led in prayer by Rev. H. J. Olsen.

Rev. J. W. Covington pastor of Hurlock Church addressed the assembly and extended a welcome to the ministers and delegates. Rev. W. H. Vickers responded in behalf of Assembly.

At the request of the secretary R. O. Musser was elected assistant secretary.

The chair appointed W. T. Martin and lay delegate Troy Morris committee on credentials.

Rules governing the assembly were adopted as follows: Conference bar to consist of the first three seats on each side the aisle. Business session to begin at 9.00 a. m. and adjourn at 11.00 a. m. Devotional service from 11.00 to 12.00. Afternoon business session from 1.30 to 4.00.

It was moved and carried that the rules in the manual govern the assembly.

The time for adjournment having arrived the assembly stood adjourned to 1.30 p. m.

Board of Examiners: Revs. Vickers, Olsen, Hope, Lewis Adams and Covington.

Moved and supported we hear the reading of the ministers reports at this time. Carried.

Moved and supported Revs. R. O. Musser and J. W. Covington be accepted into this district. Carried.

Moved and carried Rev. Thos. Dixon pastor of Mardela Springs M. E. Church be invited within the conference bar.

Church and Sunday School reports read by delegates. Adjourned

THIRD SESSION, WEDNESDAY MORNING, JANUARY 6th.

Session opened at 9.00 a. m. by singing hymn, "Waiting on Thee Lord," Rev. P. F. Bean in the chair. Bro. Bean read for a lesson 1st Thess., 5th Chap. and Bro. S. L. Adams led in prayer

After the roll call the minutes were read and approved.

Moved and supported Jno. H. Price, who holds local preachers' license be invited within the bar and given a voice in the proceedings. Carried.

Moved and supported Rev. E. R. Clough be accepted as a member of this assembly. Carried

H. J. Olsen chairman of Committee on Resolutions read the following resolutions

Resolution No. 1. Resolution to General Assembly providing for shorter report blanks. Adopted.

Resolution No. 2. Resolved the Eastern District petition the General Board of Publication to allow the subjects of "divorce," and labor unions to be discussed in our official organ "The Advocate." Moved and supported this resolution be adopted. Carried.

Resolution No. 3. Resolved, that the Eastern District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church go on record as desiring but one General Superintendent of the Pilgrim Holiness Church. Resolution adopted unanimously.

Moved and supported that the election of officers be made the order of the day for the afternoon session at 1.30. Carried.

Adjourned.

FOURTH SESSION, WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON 1.30

Session was opened with song, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arm." The General Superintendent, Rev. W. R. Cox, presiding. Bro. Vickers led in prayer.

Roll was called and minutes read and approved.

Moved and supported Rev. M. C. Reed and Jno. Cummings be invited within the conference bar. Carried

After a brief season of silent prayer the assembly proceeded to elect officers.

Superintendent P. F. Bean appointed Chas. Schellhouse and Avey Ornett tellers.

For Superintendent, Rev. P. F. Bean was re-elected.

For Assistant Superintendent, Rev. W. H. Vickers.

For Secretary-Treasurer, Chas. T. Griffin.

For four additional members of the council, Bros. Lewis Adams, R. O. Musser, H. J. Olsen, C. S. Hope.

Foreign Missionary Board, H. J. Olsen, R. O. Musser, C. T. Griffin.

Church Extension Board, S. L. Adams, T. L. Trice, P. F. Bean, R. O. Musser, J. W. Covington.

District Superintendent Bean appointed H. J. Olsen and S. Lewis Adams Auditing committee.

The District Secretary-Treasurer read his report which was adopted as read.

The District Superintendent read his report which was accepted.

The report of the Church Extension Board was read by the treasurer and passed.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

FIFTH SESSION, THURSDAY MORNING, JANUARY 7th

Session opened at 9.00 a. m. with Bro. Cox in the chair. After singing "Onward Christian Soldiers" Bro. Bean read Rom. 8 and Rev. Jno. Cummings prayed. The roll was called followed by reading the minutes of previous session which were approved.

Moved and supported, Rev. L. B. Smith, of Greensboro N. C. Bible School be invited within the conference bar and given a voice in this assembly. Carried.

Rev. W. H. Vickers read a report of the "Hedge and Highway" association which was accepted.

Moved and supported we elect the delegates to the General Assembly. Carried.

The following were named as delegates by virtue of office: P. F. Bean, W. H. Vickers, Chas. T. Griffin and H. J. Olsen.

The ministerial delegates elected were: S. Lewis Adams, R. O. Musser, J. W. Covington and H. P. Adams.

Lay Delegates were elected as follows: Jno. H. Price, Graham D. Price, Mayme Parker and Winifred Mears.

Session adjourned by expiration of time.

SIXTH SESSION THURSDAY AFTERNOON, JANUARY 7TH.

Session opened at 1.30 by singing "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name," after which Sister Amy Slaughter led in prayer.

Rev. W. R. Cox presiding.

Roll call omitted. Minutes read and approved. Moved and supported to accept the invitation of Cambridge for the next Annual Assembly. Carried.

Dates set January 4, 5 and 6th, 1927.

Moved and supported that the matter of a ministerial convention be left for the District Superintendent to arrange. Carried.

The report of the statistical committee was read and accepted.

Moved and supported that the minutes be printed and the pastors send their orders to the Secretary and send an offering to pay for same. Carried.

Moved and supported this Assembly authorize the District Council to appoint alternates to the General Assembly, if needed the same to be selected from those receiving the highest number of votes who were not elected. Carried.

The examining committee recommended that Rev. B. C. Reed be accepted a licensed minister of this district and Clara A. Musser be accepted a licensed deaconess of this district. The recommendations were voted approved.

Moved and supported a memorial of Bro. Chas. W. Brooks be inserted in the minutes and words of consolation be sent the bereaved family. Carried.

The District Council was authorized by a vote of the assembly to draw up memorials to the next General Assembly. It was moved and carried that a committee be appointed to apportion to the several churches their share in the expenses of the delegates to the General Assembly. The chair appointed C. T. Griffin, H. J. Olsen and W. H. Vickers on this committee.

The chair also appointed committee on editing and publishing minutes to consist of Chas. T. Griffin, R. O. Musser and Avery Ornett.

By expiration of time the assembly stood adjourned to meet at Cambridge, Md., January 4, 5 and 6th, 1927.

IN MEMORIAM.

Rev. Charles Wesley Brooks.

There are times when it is fitting that we step aside from the ordinary activities of life and give a moment to the memory of those "Whom we've loved long since and lost awhile."

Rev. Charles Wesley Brooks the son of J. D. and Miranda Brooks was born at Woolford's, Dorchester county, Maryland, September 20, 1883, and died September 28, 1925, age 42 years.

Bro. Brooks had been a christian from childhood and in May, 1913, was sanctified under the tent of Rev. W. H. Vickers near his home.

Feeling his call to the ministry he was granted license to preach by the Council of the Eastern District Pilgrim Holiness Church in which capacity he served his church and his God faithfully. Bro. Brooks was a wide awake, alert and ready worker for his Master and was cut down as a tender branch in his youth. On Sunday preceeding Monday, the day of his death, he was never more happy. He sang he shouted, he laughed, he cried; he led souls to God. He returned home from the meeting and after a few short hours of rest, awoke early and proceeded with his day's work.

In the afternoon he left his home with a load of produce for market, happy, well and jovial, smiling a good bye to his wife as he thought for only a few minutes, yet it was forever, for there are no good bye's in Heaven.

Between his home and Cambridge a truck collided with his car, bruising and mangling his body resulting in his death a few hours later

There are left behind to mourn his loss his father, mother, seven brothers, four sisters, besides a devoted wife and four little children.

Bro. Brooks never lost his fire and zeal. He never came down to the shores of time wrapped about by the mantle of many years and the scars caused by many hard fought battles, but was snatched away in a moment of time in the days of his youth.

He was an obedient son, a loving husband, a considerate father, a fair singer, a good preacher, a consecrated, sanctified Christian, a successful soul winner and mighty in prayer. His gain is our loss.

His body sleeps beneath the sod of "Old Trinity Church" burying ground at Woolford's Md. His soul is basking around the throne light of the Celestial City.

The funeral was held at the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Cambridge, October 1st, 1925.

The services were conducted by Rev. W. H. Vickers, assisted by Rev. P. F. Bean, pastor of the church.

The text used was 1 Sam. 20th Chapter, 18 verse: "Thou shalt be missed because thy seat will be empty."

"Lives of great men oft remind us
We can make our lives sublime:
And departing leave behind us
Footprints on the sands of time."
