FIRST SESSION, TUESDAY MORNING, JANUARY 3rd, 1928

The Twenty-Third Annual Assembly of the Eastern District, Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened at Milton, Delaware, 10.30 a. m., January 3rd, 1928, with acting District Superintendent, Rev. W. H. Rev. W. H. Vickers Acting District Superintendent read a report
 covering 1 1-2 months. Moved and supported the report be adopted.

Moved and supported Miss Pearl Vincent, Gospel Singer, be gran-
 ted an honorary seat within the Conference Bar. Carried.

Moved and supported the Treasurer of the Denton Camp be per-
 mitted to read an abbreviated report. Carried.

Moved and supported Rev. H. A. Saneholtz, District Superintendent of the Penna. District, be granted an honorary seat within the Conference Bar. Carried.

Moved and supported we suspend the rules and adjourn at 11.00 a. m. to day to permit the different committees to meet, and Rev. H. A. Saneholtz be requested to preach to the Assembly at that hour. Carried.

Moved and supported at the hour of 3.00 p. m. we enter into election of officers. Carried.

The Committee on Resolutions read Resolutions from No. 1 to No. 7.

Moved and supported we adjourn. Carried.

FOURTH SESSION, WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, JANUARY 4th.

Session opened with hymn: "Out of Egypt into Canaan." Led in prayer by Rev. A. A. Price. General Superintendent, Rev. W. R. Cox delivered a brief message on the subject: "Dealing with difficulties in the Church." Roll was called. Reading of minutes of the previous session. Report of District Council on Resolutions from Cambridge Church was read and adopted.

By order of the day we proceeded to elect officers after a brief period of silent prayer.

Moved and supported the District Council outline the work of our District Superintendent for this Assembly year. Carried.

Moved and supported, each church raise a free-will offering to pay for printing minutes. Carried.

The report of the Statistical Committee was read and accepted.

Moved and supported we extend a rising vote of thanks to the Statistical Committee for their faithful service. Carried.

A telegram was read requesting the Assembly pray for a woman in North Carolina. Rev. A. A. Price led in prayer.

Retiring Acting District Superintendent, Rev. Wm. H. Vickers, briefly addressed the Assembly, expressing his appreciation for support rendered by the churches and pastors while he acted as Superintendent, and urged the Assembly to support our new Superintendent in all his efforts to make this year the greatest year of our History.

Rev. Thos. S. Dixon, newly elected Superintendent, addressed the Assembly, pledging his best to the work this year.

Moved and supported, we adjourn to meet at Delmar, Del., January 1st, 2nd and 3rd, 1929. Carried.

Resolutions

The following Resolutions were considered by the Assembly and adopted:

Be it Resolved:

1. That the District Superintendent visit each church twice annually as the Manual requires and that he be paid by said churches the sum apportioned to them two years ago, as follows: Small and struggling churches, \$5 per visit, and the stronger churches, \$10 per visit.
2. That the Home Missionary Board bend every energy to establish churches in new fields on our District, by employing Evangelists and Pastors that are available both winter and summer.
3. All persons desiring to become members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church be carefully questioned by the Advisory Board, of the Local Church, concerning their belief in the modern Tongue Movement and all other known erroneous teachings, doctrines and religions contrary to the teachings taught by the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

If anyone desiring membership, leans toward, believes in part or all, teaches privately or publicly, part or all, or has any warm feelings for any erroneous doctrines, he shall not be considered by the Advisory Board for membership, unless he renounces before them his error.

4. That, any member believing in or found teaching part or all of any arroneous doctrines, such as Modern Tongues, Christian Science, etc., shall be brought before the Advisory Board and dealt with.

5. That, the District Superintendent be made a member of all our District Camp Meeting Boards and have a voice in the selection of all Evangelists and Singers for the District Camps, and that he visit each tent meeting held on our district at least once, and that each meeting visited remunerate him for his services and expenses.

6. That we have two (2) Ministerial Conventions on our district this year, the time and place of same to be decided by the District Council.

7. That the name "Church Extension Board" be changed to "Home Missionary Board," to harmonize with the name used by our Manual.

8. That each local church at their annual meeting examine into the conduct and Christian character of all candidates for renewal of credentials, who are members of said Church, and report in writing their findings to the Annual Assembly.

9. That none of our pastors shall call on Evangelist for a revival from another denomination, especially from one which has a reputation of proselyting and exercising influences against the interests of our Church.

10. That all church property that is not being used, and now idle and depreciating, and where there cannot be any hope of reviving, same be sold, and after deducting all selling expenses the proceeds to be put into the District Home Missionary fund and held in reserve to be loaned on first mortgage on any new Church erected, in the District; the same to be paid back into the treasury with 5 per cent interest, per annum, payable semi-annually; the face of the mortgage to be reduced at the rate of 10 per cent annually, or in other words, closed at the end of the tenth year, unless otherwise provided by the Annual Assembly.

11. That by a rising vote of thanks we express our gratitude to our General Superintendent and our District officers for their unselfish services in our behalf during the past year and at this Assembly.

12. That by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to the pastor and people of Milton Church and the many friends who have so generously provided for this Assembly.

District Superintendent's Report.

**District Superintendent's Report for the Eastern District From
January 6th to November 18th, 1927.**

Christian Greetings to all the Pilgrim Holiness people of our District. Dear Co-Labours in Christ: Another year has gone by on the wings of time, with all its opportunities, privileges and blessings. What we have done this year is recorded now in the skies, either for or against us.

We, the Eastern District, have much to be thankful for: First, The many blessings God has bestowed upon us. Second, The blessings He has enabled us to be through Him to others, and the many victories He has helped us to win. I say all praise be unto his Holy name.

You will note from my report I have only served you a part of this year from January 6th, to November 18th. I resigned owing to my bodily condition, mostly from my nerves and stomach trouble. But since getting relieved from the District work and some other burdens. I am now better, for which I praise God and thank all who prayed for me. I did not resign District work because I had aught against anyone of you, but for the fact I was unable to do the work. I must say I enjoyed the fellowship of you all, and may the work go forward in a greater way under our incoming Leader, I will promise my best co-operation to whomsoever it may be.

I believe the good work which God has enabled us to accomplish in our District this year, has been owing to the faithful work of our good pastors and the good co-operation of their people with them. And may the good Lord help us to continue. We believe most all of our Churches have made some gain; and with this we have been able to Organize two new Churches, or one Church and one mission. They are as follows: 1st, Laurel, Del., was organized with 19 Pilgrims on April 23rd; Rev. Tom. Phillips is their beloved pastor, and they now have 42 members. 2nd, I helped to organize at Fishing Creek, August 7th, in their beautiful new Church, with a charter membership of 45; Rev. W. I. Donohoe is their successful pastor. I also feel good by being able to help two of our faithful pastors; by encouraging their people to help them purchase for both of them a nice Enclosed Car, which they are now enjoying.

During the time I served as District Superintendent this year I dedicated two Churches. First, Mardela Springs, April 10th; Second, Lawsonia, June 19th.

I made 15 visits to Churches and 4 extra visits looking after new organizations which makes a total of 19 visits in all, and I suppose I traveled about 3000 miles. The total offerings received for this District work was 139.51.

**REPORT OF WILLIAM H. VICKERS, SUPERINTENDENT BY
RESIGNATION OF P. F. BEAN.**

Brethren:

I regret very much to have to report as Superintendent under the circumstances and conditions which has made me the Superintendent. Am sorry that Rev. P. F. Bean had to resign on account of his poor health and hope, and am praying that God will restore him to perfect health again. Too much cannot be said in commendation regarding Brother Bean's administration. He made us a splendid Superintendent and I am sorry his health will not allow him to serve the church further in that capacity. I assumed the office as Superintendent the 18th of November last, 1927, and have served the church about a month and a half; in which time I visited 12 of our churches that Bro. Bean had not been able to visit. Each of our churches showed a spiritual, healthy condition. There was an increase in membership and spiritual progress in every department of the activities of the church. The work as a whole is encouraging. While it is the opinion of the preachers, unanimously, there is chance for much improvement, and it is to be hoped that this annual assembly will be able to bring into existence proper legislation to promote constructive and progressive revivals throughout our work. I think there are ways by which we can do so much more than we are doing now.
