FIRST SESSION, TUESDAY MORNING, JANUARY 1st, 1929.

1. The District Secretary be appointed District Secretary of the Burial Association of the Eastern District.

2. We elect a District Evangelist to do Home Missionary work on the District, and he shall be remunerated by the Home Missionary Treasury.

7. Inasmuch as the District Camp-meeting at Denton gives each pastor support during time of said Camp-meeting to the amount of twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars. **RESOLVED:** Each church send that amount with their pastor attending camp.

8. That by a rising vote of thanks we express our appreciation to the Pastor and people of the Delmar Church and the many friends who have so generously provided for and entertained this Assembly.

9. The resignation of our District Treasurer, Brother Chas. T. Griffin, on account of ill health, has so moved upon our hearts that we feel some mention should be made of the fifteen years of untiring service he rendered our District.

During these years of faithful service thousands of dollars have been collected and disbursed to the various Mission fields and letters of encouragement have been written to the laborers far out on the firing lines. At our District Council meetings we have been favored by the sound advice and assistance of our Brother that has been both helpful and inspiring. Our fellowship has been sweet.

We reluctantly accept his resignation and fervently pray for the restoration of our Brother and co-laborer.

District Superintendent's Report

Some days in our lives are memorable days. But to me all memorable days have a vageness comparted with the closing day of last year's Assembly. When all other business gave way to the election of the officers for our Church and District

I somehow had a strange obsession and hoped that the Mantle of District Superintendent would fall on other shoulders, but the returns of the election left me the embarrassed victim. I felt, regardless of size, that the task was too big. I felt fit in one respect only—physical-ly, as some will recall, I asked that my name be withdrawn.

It has thus far been the best year of my Ministry, and that does not mean to say, that every coast has been clear, for I had hardly recovered from the election shock, when adverse winds began to blow, but having some experience as a sailor, I knew how to (Tack) first to Port then to Starboard. The first unfavorable flaw came from Hurlock, I trusted my Pilot who brought us through in fine shape for the storm has abated.

But other storms are bound to come. We saw the clouds rising to-wards Brooms Island, but when at our wits end, "The Pilot" took control and led a young man and woman to us in the persons of Brother and Sister Dukes, who are successfully pastoring that Church. I have traveled over the District twice this year, and it has been my privilege to visit the home of each of our Pastors, I would not have missed that privilege for any thing reasonable. The fellowship and co-operation on the part of the Brethren has been both beautiful and helpful.

In every board meeting I have urged the taking care of the Pastor, with good conscience I have always kept silent as a Pastor regarding my support, but with as good conscience I have spoken this year for the support of my Brother Minister. I feel the Lord has blessed these efforts, as some have already responded, while in other cases the situ-ation is not favorable.

There has been some sickness among our Brethern be we are in-debted to our Heavenly Father for bringing us together with our ranks unbroken. Revivals have been held all over our District, while the re-sults were not what we hoped for yet some good was accomplished in all. Praise God. There are two new building projects on our District, viz: Laurel and Roxanna. We would neither have time or space to record the individual work, but a more zealous hard working self sac-rificing lot of men and women would be hard to find.

I desire to express my appreciation of the assistance given me by my brethern. I wish to record my deep felt sense of gratitude to my Heavenly Father for health and strength which has enabled me to pros-ecute my duties and to come to this Assembly with victory in my Soul. May the Blessing of God accompany us all through life and finally count us of membership in the General Assembly and the Church of the first born.
