## FIRST SESSION, TUESDAY MORNING, JANUARY 7th, 1930

The Twenty-Fifth Annual Assembly of the Eastern District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, comprising the States of Maryland, Delaware and the Eastern Shore of Virginia, convened at Denton, Md., January 7th, at 10:00 A. M. District Superintendent in the chair. Session was opened with song, "A Charge to Keep".

Rev. H. E. Uhrig, pastor of the Denton Church delivered the address of welcome.

Rev. Thos. S. Dixon, District Superintendent, responded in behalf of the Assembly.

The District Superintendent, Rev. Dixon, read Phillipians 4th Chapter, for a Scripture lesson. Rev. P. F. Bean led in prayer.

General Superintendent, Rev. S. C. Rees took the chair to preside during the Assembly. The roll was called. The Minutes of the last session of 1929 Assembly were read and adopted.

Moved and supported we extend the time of this session to 12:10 to hear Rev. W. H. Vickers evangelistic report. Carried. Session adjourned. Benediction by Rev. R. O. Musser.

Moved and supported that we receive an offering at this time to defray the expenses of printing the District Minutes. Carried. Moved and supported we adjourn. Carried. Benediction by Rev. S. Lewis Adams.

### SIXTH SESSION, THURSDAY AFTERNOON, JANUARY 9th.

Session opened at 2:00 P. M. by singing "Sing of My Redeemer." Rev. Earl Lowry led in prayer. Rev. T. S. Dixon read for a Scripture lesson the 96th Psalm. Moved and supported that we dispense with the reading of the report of the Statistical Committee. Carried.

Moved and supported that Resolution No. 1 of the 1927 Assembly be adopted and placed in our Minutes as Resolution No. 23. Carried.

Moved and supported we change the date of the opening session of our next Annual Assembly from the first to the second Tuesday of January, 1931. Carried. Moved and supported that our next Annual Assembly meet at Milton, Del. Carried.

Moved and supported that the Convention of the Young People's Society meet at Denton Camp Ground July 23rd and 24th, 1930. Carried.

Moved and supported our District Superintendent appoint a committee of two to draft more convenient report blanks. Carried. Revs. H. J. Olsen and W. I. Donahoe were appointed.

Moved and supported that the District Council apportion the Churches the amount to be raised for the expenses of Delegates to the General Assembly. Carried.

Moved and supported we adjourn to meet, the Lord willing, at Milton, Delaware, the second Tuesday of January, 1931. Carried.

## RESOLUTIONS

### BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the District Superintendent appoint a Statistical Secretary to serve for an indefinite period and he be authorized to select his own assistants.
2. That this Assembly petition the General Council to select a more central location for the next General Assembly.
3. That no member of the Assembly shall leave the room without the consent of the Chairman.
4. That the members of the Assembly shall not leave the Assembly with the intention of not returning without stating their case to the body in session, the same to take action in said case, the results be determined by a two-thirds vote and approved by the Chairman.
5. That all business in each local Church close at the end of the Calendar year, the same to be acted upon by the local Church and reports made covering the same period, which shall correspond with the local minutes, and the said report to be presented to the Annual Assembly.
6. We engage one Evangelist for our District Camp, and employ singers and musicians from our own District, the Ministerial body assist in the services, this is to become effective in 1931 and thereafter.
7. That all deeds from each local Church be examined by the District Council, and should any error be found, the same to be corrected in accordance with the Manual.
8. That our Ministerial Conventions be held on the following dates: April 22, 23 and 24, and October 7, 8, and 9th, and none of our Ministers shall conduct extra services during the dates of the Conventions.
9. That each Church be proportioned according to its strength the amount it should raise for the expenses of the Delegates to the General Assembly, this amount may be divided into four payments, the total amount to be sent to the Treasurer before the last Annual Assembly preceding the General Assembly.

10. That the Pastors and Churches of this District shall not engage an Evangelist or Pastor who has been divorced and married another while the former companion is living.

11. We express our appreciation to Rev. H. E. Uhrig and the members and friends of Denton Church by a rising vote of thanks for every courtesy shown us during this Assembly.

12. The District Superintendent shall not be required to visit the established churches twice. Annually as heretofore, but he shall devote his spare time helping new and struggling churches, and that he shall be remunerated from free-will offerings and the Home Missionary Treasury.

13. The District Superintendent appoint a Committee of two to redraft a set of report blanks to be presented to the General Assembly the same to be presented to the District Council for adoption during the Ministerial Convention which convenes in April 22-24.

14. We urge our people to support our own Pilgrim Holiness Missionary Work and the offerings taken at our District Camp for Foreign Missions be sent to our work.

15. The Pastors verify all reports from their Churches as to the correctness of the same before they come to the Assembly, that they may be able to assist the Statistical Committee make any needed corrections at the Assembly.

16. That we express to our Presiding Officer our Senior General Superintendent, Rev. S. C. Rees by a rising vote of thanks our appreciation for the blessing he has been to this Assembly by his preaching and counsel.

#### MEMORIALS TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

1. We recommend that no delegate be sent to the General Assembly under the age of 21 years.

2. We recommend that section 143 be retained in our Manual without revision.

3. Whereas, in some districts the District Superintendent is regularly employed as a Pastor or Evangelist, be it therefore,

RESOLVED, that paragraph 6 under section 49 in our Manual be so changed as not to require the District Superintendent to make two visits to each Church annually but that the matter be left to the District Assembly which he serves.

Whereas, our present General Headquarters has proven unsatisfactory for the following reasons:

1. Men who elected to fill General Offices complain that living expenses in Cincinnati are prohibitive and have refused to move to our present Headquarters.

2. The Editor of the Advocate finds it necessary to have said paper printed outside the city of Cincinnati, and whereas our General Officers are so scattered, therefore be it,

RESOLVED—That our General Headquarters be transferred to Frankfort, Ind., and that all of our General Offices be immediately moved to the above named place.

5. Whereas experience in the past has taught us that so many important questions that confront the General Council requiring the presence of so many of our representative men in the Church, and



Whereas there has been both difficulty and expense in securing the men that have aided the General Council in carrying forward the work of the General Church, Be it therefore,

RESOLVED, The General Assembly shall elect a Correlated Board to replace the following General Church Boards:

General Board of Foreign Missions.

General Board of Home Missions.

General Board of Publication.

General Board of Education and other departments of the General Church.

### DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

As we meet again in this Assembly realizing another year has gone by, and we are privileged to meet with our Ministerial ranks unbroken, it calls forth from us our deepest sense of gratitude to our Heavenly Father, who with His eye has guided us, and His hand has protected us, and His Holy Spirit has directed.

This causes my thought to run parallel with the Psalmist when he said: "O come let us sing unto the Lord, let us make a joyful noise to the rock of our Salvation. Let us come before His presence with thanksgiving, for the Lord is a great God and a great king above all Gods, for He is our God and we are the people of His pasture and the sheep of His hand." Psam 95. Surely goodness and mercy have been our companions during the year past.

We meet again under God's special mercies to do business for the Kingdom's interests and to report our work in a meager fashion. The year past was like other years with its many and varied problems and if the human was appealed to only some would still be problems. But we have access to a never failing source, and that is God.

One of the District Problems began early in the year at Tilghman's Island. Brother Bafford who was then shepherding that flock was called to Roxana, Del., a newly organized church. He felt led by God to accept this call and he did. This left Tilghman's uncared for, and sheep without a shepherd are constantly in peril. We began to look for a shepherd and God had one in reserve in the person of Bro. Jason Sherwood, a more sacrificing spirit would be hard to find. He seemed to be a perfect fit, has a lovely family, and God is blessing them and making them a blessing.

The next problem came from Denton, the seat of the present Assembly. I supposed that Brother S. Lewis Adams the lines had fallen in pleasant places and he had a goodly heritage and here he would dwell, but he sighed: Oh, that I had wings like a dove, then would I fly away, and he left us to take charge of the battleground at Glassboro, N. J. The last we heard from him he was bombarding the battlements of Hell, and strengthening God's army out of the ranks of the enemy.

The going of Brother Adams left Denton without a regular pastor. Several suggestions were offered and names mentioned. Finally, the present pastor, Brother H. E. Uhrig was directed this way, and true, we feel it was the Holy Ghost that was directing, for he seems to be another perfect fit, as God has been honoring his work from the beginning and is still blessing.

Our next problem is yet unsolved, that is the Centreville problem. Bro. Musser, who had pastored that Church for some years, grew restless, and being of Dutch descent, and though he was in the land of quail, milk and honey, he longed for the delicacies of his ancestors: viz, "sweitzer, weinies and sauer-kraut." The lure was so great he could not resist, he left and his going left a vacancy hard to fill, he was especially liked by the townspeople and had endeared himself to the hearts of the people he served. The people seem to be expecting a counterpart, when there is none. We are praying and looking for another self-sacrificing man to take that work as it calls for such. While we are truly sorry to see Brother Musser move, we are happy to learn that he is doing exploits for God in his new field at Pine Grove, Pa.

Wachapreague, another one of our churches, small in membership and not self-supporting, has no regular services. Outside of these two, the rest of the District work is well cared for.

We are glad to report progress along several lines. One in church building. Two Pilgrim Holiness Churches have been dedicated during the past year. Roxana Church building was dedicated on Sunday, April 28th, 1929. The day was stormy and cold, yet there was a splendid audience. We raised in cash and pledges around \$700.00. They have a neat church building, a loyal people and a wonderful preacher. The church building at Laurel, Del., was dedicated August 19th, 1929. The sum of about \$1300.00 was realized in cash and pledges. This church building is one of neatness and beauty, built by the hands of the present pastor, Bro. Thos Phillips, who laid aside a good paying job to answer the "Macedonian Cry," took the work here when only a handful were worshipping in a hall, but under his wise and fearless leadership the work has gone ahead by leaps and bounds and is still going.

Our recently built Holiness Churches do credit to any town they are in. Some folks are surprised when they come in our churches like Milford, Milton, Laurel, Mardela, Cambridge and Fishing Creek. Folk are beginning to realize anything is not good enough to worship God in, the best we can give is not good enough. He is worthy.

We are glad to report revivals to some extent over the whole District. The mission of the Church primarily is to get souls to God, and the present day is calling for our best. The enemy is truly busy, surely it behooves us to be as one, up and doing while it is yet day.

Special mention should be made of our Young People on the District. A number of churches are especially fortunate in having such a fine body of young people who are both talented and consecrated. The first young people's convention of the District was held at Dover, Del., on the Camp Ground, July 3rd and 4th, 1929. It was in every way a real success. Each one who took part in the program acquitted themselves nobly. God bless our young people.

The Ministerial Conventions are helpful to those who attend. The one held at Brooms Island was signally owned of God. Brother and Sister Dukes are doing splendid work there. The Lord helped us to lift a load of debt of many years standing at the Convention.

The District is making progress along the line of Missionary endeavor, both Home and Foreign. I feel especially proud to report that from the two churches I serve, one was barely alive four years ago, with no report at all, and the other not built, we sent \$245.09 to Foreign Missions alone. We are making plans to do some needed repairs at Salisbury.

The Camp Meetings on the District were blessed of God along both spiritual and financial lines. Bloxom Camp was especially favored in the latter, after taking care of the camp expenses more than \$7000.00 was raised in two services. In the near future we expect to see a new Pilgrim Holiness Church at Bloxom. This work is the outcome of the pioneer work on the part of Brother W. H. Vickers, Sister Mayme Parker, and Sister Winifred Mears, under the leadership of the Holy Ghost. Its going on to successful completion, is under the wise management of the present pastor, Rev. F. C. Walls. His address is Bloxom, Va., but Accomac County is his parish. His preaching places are so many, his schedules so complicated that his wife is often at sea to know where he goes next. There are folks yet who love the Word. Much could be said and commendably said of every pastor and work if time would allow.

We do not feel like closing this report without mentioning the loss the District has suffered in the translation of some of our noble laymen, such as Brother Dashiell of Cambridge, Brothers Clough and Holland of Centreville, Brother Griffin of Trappe, and Brothers Phillips and Billbrough of Denton. The local churches do not only feel their loss but the District shares it with them.

I visited the churches twice and tried to make my visits pleasant and profitable to all. Surely it has been pleasant to me to visit my Brethren, a glad hand of welcome was extended by all. I feel encouraged and pray that our best years are ahead. I pray that God will be pleased to bless us in this Assembly, and that His special favor will be upon our Precious Father in Israel and beloved General Superintendent, Rev. S. C. Rees as he presides and counsels.
