FIRST SESSION, TUESDAY MORNING, JANUARY 13th, 1931.

An invitation was extended by the Delmar, Md., Church.

Moved and supported that we accept the invitation and our next Annual Assembly will convene at Delmar, Md., the second Tuesday of January 1932 at 10:00 A. M. Carried.

Moved and supported that we have the minutes printed and an offering be received at this time for the same. Carried.

Adjourned. Benediction by T. Howard Jones.

FOURTH SESSION, WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON, JANUARY 14th

Session opened at 2:00 P. M. by singing: "On Christ the Solid Rock I Stand." In view of the election of District Officers, Gen. Supt. S. C. Rees addressed the Assembly with timely remarks.

Minutes of previous session were read and approved.

Rev. J. F. Woods, Dist. Supt. of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the W. Va., district was introduced to the Assembly and by motion granted an honorary seat within the bar with privileges of the floor.

The Superintendent appointed the District Council that Committee. Moved and supported the District Superintendent appoint a committee of three Ministers to prepare subjects for the Ministerial Conventions. Carried.

The following ministers were appointed: Revs. H. A. Saneholtz, P. F. Bean and W. H. Vickers.

Adjourned. Benediction by Rev. F. C. Walls.

SIXTH SESSION, THURSDAY AFTERNOON, JANUARY 15th

Session opened at 2:00 P. M. by singing: "All Hail the Power of Jesus Name." Rev. W. H. Vickers led in prayer. The minutes of the previous session were read and approved.

Moved and supported our Ministerial Conventions meet as follows: The Spring convention meets at Harrington, Del., Mch. 24th, 25th 26th, 1931, and the Fall Convention meet at Hurlock, Md., October 20th, 21st and 22nd, 1931. Carried.

The Committee on resolutions read resolutions Nos. Fifteen to Nineteen.

Moved and supported our Young Peoples' Convention meet at Dover, Del., July 3rd and 4th, 1931. Carried.

Moved and supported we suspend the rules and elect Mrs. A. A. Price as President of the Women's Missionary Society of the Eastern District and Mrs. Henry Shoemaker as Secretary. Carried.

Moved and supported we adjourn to meet at Delmar, Md., the Second Tuesday of January, 1932. Carried.

BE IT RESOLVED:

1. Whereas our General Assembly in the providence of God re-elected for another quennium as our General Superintendent our Brother Seth C. Rees,

Therefore be it Resolved, that we here and now extend Him our sincerest Christian welcome as our presiding officer, and pledge Him our fullest co-operation for the advancement of every interest of our Church and the establishment of the Kingdom of God throughout the earth.

2. That each resolution presented to the committee on Resolutions bear the name of the maker and the same be made known when the Resolution is read.

3. That our Churches and District Camp support our own Pilgrim Holiness Missionary work.

4. That our Home Missionary Board call their first meeting to formulate working plans within thirty days after this Assembly.

5. That we extend our thanks to the First National Bank of Milton for use of adding machine during our Assembly.

6. That we have two Ministerial Conventions this Assembly year and that subjects be given the Ministers of the District, and the same be discussed on the Convention floor, a committee of three with our District Superintendent be appointed to select the subjects and each minister be informed what he shall speak upon, at least six weeks before the convention.

7. That each Church pledge to our Home Missionary work over and above the General Budget, to keep our District Evangelist on the field.

8. That the Pastors and Churches of the Eastern District shall not engage an Evangelist or Pastor who has been Divorced and married another while the first companion is living.

9. That we discourage recognition for leaders of our services those who have disagreed with some local Church program and have absented themselves from and have proven disloyal to their local Church and Pastor.

10. That we express our appreciation for the presence and untiring services of Brother and Sister Rees during this Assembly by a rising vote of thanks.

11. That we express our appreciation by a rising vote of thanks to Rev. H. P. Adams and the members and friends of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of Milton for the generous way they entertained the Ministers and Delegates of this Assembly.

12. That we organize a Women's Foreign Missionary Society on the Eastern District to create a greater interest in Foreign Missions of the Pilgrim Holiness Church among the women of the Eastern District. Be it further Resolved this Assembly elect a President and a Secretary who shall also serve as organizers, and all money received by this society shall go through our district treasury and shall be applied to our Missionary work.

Greetings to All: What can be more helpful to each of us than to meet together as one, and to do business for our King. We are representatives of an interest that involves the world. Our calling is both high and Holy. This is but a brief reminder of our relation to the God of all the earth.

Another year has passed since we met in the capacity of a District Assembly. Many perhaps view the past with reluctance, failures and short comings accuse us, but the New Year is offering the possibility of making amends for the past. I for one am encouraged and will adopt for my New Year's slogan, Paul's inspiring note recorded in Phil: 3-13-I.

Whatever in the past is worth remembering let us remember it and what cannot be remembered with pleasantness let us forget.

Every year has its peculiar trials and the past year was not an exception, but the Lord has brought us through them all, and I trust they have served as God's refining crucible.

Even the District Superintendent is often tried, for the Brethern both Ministerial and Lay do not do all things as he wants them to do, and he doesn't do all things as they think it should be done, and that makes the situation a complex one, but we must forgive and forget. But there is one fault with some of my Brethern I cannot easily forgive and they won't let me forget it. Viz: Their failure to attend the Ministerial Conventions. Some are always absent and it manifests disinterest. I am willing to accept excuses on the grounds of sickness and death only. I feel it is the duty of every Minister to attend and take active part, and stay until the close of each Convention and District Assembly, and District Camp.

The Ministerial Conventions are real helpful, even if there wasn't an outlined program, to meet with the Brethern in worship and prayer are days well spent. The two Conventions of the past year were especially helpful. The first was held at Fishing Creek with Brother and Sister Donahoe and their Church, they truly exceeded themselves in making our visit an enjoyable one. For the second Convention we journeyed to Bloxom, Va., with Brother and Sister Walls and their big hearted people, who only know how to do and never know when they have done enough. This convention followed the General Assembly and the changes that were made at the General Assembly involved each Church on the District. I invited Brother Slater to attend and he gladly accepted and proved a blessing. Brother Olsen co-operating with a valuable asset. Those who missed it missed much.

There have been some changes in our preaching personnel on the District. Rev. A. A. Price our Sr. Warrior of the Cross resigned the Pastorate at Hurlock, Mr. Brother Talbirt came from the Tar Heel State and accepted the Pastorate at Hurlock, and good news is coming from Hurlock.

Crisfield suffered the loss of their faithful pastor in Sr. Mary Garrett who deserves worthy mention, she accepting the pastorate at Goldsboro, Md.

Rev. P. F. Bean also resigned a long and fruitful pastorate at Cambridge, Md., to accept the lure of the Pines, but like Saul of Tarsus he was arrested but not with the same force, but sent another direction, and is now filling with credit the pastorate at Crisfield. The vacancy at Cambridge was filled by Rev. H. A. Saneholtz, who came from the Pa. District.

Rev. Jason Sherwood who was stationed at Tilghman accepted a promising call to Jonesboro, Ark., of which he was worthy.

Tilghman is a difficult field, small salary, few in number, and interest lagging, this makes any field hard. This pastorate was offered a few, but none would accept it. I kept in touch with Brother Price hoping for something worth while for him for he is worthy, so I offered him the Tilghman Pastorate and like a child willing to exchange one toy for another regardless of value he accepted it.

A worthy word of mention should be given the Church at Delmar, Md., who for a number of years functioned as the Peoples Holiness Church united with Pilgrim Holiness Church. This is a loyal Church and Missionary at Heart.

Centreville under the leadership of Brother and Sister Shoemaker deserves a word of praise, this work is progressing nicely.

Truly we are indebted to our Heavenly Father for His care over us during the past year. Sickness has come to some of us, but death, our enemy, was kept away.

We are especially Thankful to have our Dear Brother Rees with us again, and we pray for his continued health, and the blessings of God on both he and Sister Rees as they labor in the interest of the Kingdom of Heaven, may God bless their Assembly and each Church during the coming year.
