FIRST SESSION, TUESDAY MORNING, JANUARY 12th. 1932

The Twenty-seventh Annual Assembly of the Eastern District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, comprising of States of Maryland, Delaware, and the Eastern Shore of Virginia, convened at Delmar, Delaware, January 12th at 10:00 A. M., with the District Superintendent, Rev. T. S. Dixon in the chair. Session was opened with the song "Waiting on the Lord." Rev. A. A. Price led in prayer. Rev. Due to Sr., A. A. Price's illness, necessitating her absence, Rev. Price gave a brief verbal report of Sr. Price's work in her missionary capacity on the District.

The Assembly entered into a season of prayer for those critically ill on the District.

Moved and supported our Annual Assembly meet the First Tuesday of January, 1933. Tabled.

Adjourned by expiration of time.

Rev. S. Lewis Adams, pastor of the Pilgrim Church at Glasboro, N. J., was introduced and given honorary seat within the conference bar.

Moved and supported that each minister pledge himself to secure subscriptions to the Advocate. Carried.

Moved and supported we adjourn. Carried.

Moved and supported that the Dist. Supt. appoint another to fill Sr. A. A. Price's vacancy as President of the F. M. S. Carried.

Resolution Committee reads Resolution No. 12. Adopted.

Moved and supported that we elect the President of our Young People's Society by acclamation. Carried.

Sr. Louetta Holden was elected by unanimous vote.

Moved and supported that the Dist. Supt. appoint a Statistican. Carried.

Rev. W. I. Donahoe was appointed.

Sr. W. H. Shoemaker was appointed by Dist. Supt. to be President of the W. F. M. S.

Resolution Committee read resolution Nos. 13, 14, 15 and 16. Adopted.

Moved and supported that an offering be taken for the traveling expenses of the Asst. Gen. Supt.

Moved and supported that we have the minutes printed and an offering be received for the same. Carried,

Moved and supported that this money be sent to the District Treasurer, designated "Minute Money." Carried.

Moved and supported that the 1933 Annual Assembly meet at Bloxom, Va., on January 10, 11, 12 of 1933. Carried.

Moved and supported that our Spring Ministerial Convention convene at Brooms Island, Md., on April 19, 20 and 21 of 1932. Carried.

Moved and supported that our Fall Ministerial Convention convene at Groton, Va., on October 18, 19, 20 of 1932. Carried.

Moved and supported that the statistics be read by the secretary. Carried.

Dist. Supt. appoints Bros. Saneholtz, Adams, Talbirt and Vickers to compose subjects suitable for the ministerial conventions.

Bro. Sanholtz sent his resignation to District Council. Accepted.

Bro. T. S. Dixon appointed to fill the vacancy.

Moved and supported that Srs. Louetta and Nellie Holden be given a rising vote of thanks for their untiring efforts in the Home Tent Work. Carried.

Moved and supported that we adjourn to reconvene at Bloxom, Va., on the second Tuesday of January, 1933. Carried.

BE IT RESOLVED:

- 1. That all necessary reports are to be in the hands of the Statistical Secretary one week prior to the date of the Annual Assembly.
 - 2. That the reports of the different churches be changed from the

tabulated form, in the minutes to that of paragraph so that they can be printed consectively and alphabetically.

- 3. That the business enterprise of our local church close December 31st of each year, and reports made up to that time, the same to be presented at the Annual Assembly.
- 4. That our District Superintendent be both District Supt. and District Evangelist, that he devote his time to building up our District work, that is visiting the churches, holding Home Missionary Meetings in halls and under our District tent. Be it further resolved that our Pastor give him invitations to hold old-fashioned revivals in their churches, and that our District see that he has a reasonable support for said efforts.
- 5. That all our ministers actively engaged as Pastors and Evangelists, contributes one-half of their tithes to help support our District Superintendent in performing the duties we are asking him to do.
- 6. That each local church forward money for General Budget, directly to our General Headquarters and our General Treasurer send receipts to our local churches and the District Treasurer.
- 7. That the splary of the District Supt., incorporating the combined office of District Supt. and District Evangelist be fixed by the District Council and to be presented to this Assembly for its approval.
- 8. That our District Foreign Missionary Board with our District Council decide upon the apportionment of our missionary money which we shall give to the Oriental Missionary Society.
- 9. That the District Treasurer employ a competent bookkeeper to set up a standard set of Books, and to buy an adding machine, to be used at the Assembly.
- 10. That inasmuch as the leaders of the Pilgrim Holiness Church have recognized the Oriental Missionary Society as their spiritual agent in China Japan and Korea and whereas so many of our reople are pledged to the support of the Oriental Missionary Society. Be it resolved That the Eastern District go on record as pledging \$509.00 annually to the support of the Oriental Missionary Society and that their workers be welcomed into our District to help create interest in the World Wide Work of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.
- 11. That this Assembly elect a Young People's Society president for the District and that this president visit the Young People's Societies on the District and do his best to organize Societies where there are none.

Be it further resolved that the Societies visited, take an offering to bear the expenses of the president's visits.

- 12. That we have a Young People's Convention, consisting of two days.
- 13. That 50% of the ministers tithes be forwarded to the District Treasurer on the first of each month.
- 14. That we express our appreciation, by a rising vote, to Rev. C. S. Hope and the people of Delmar, Del., for the generous way in which they have entertained the ministers and delegates of this Assembly.

- 15. Whereas our Assistant General Superintendent, General Secretary and District Officers have served us so faithfully in this Assembly, be it resolved that we give them a rising vote of thanks, and bid them God's speed.
- 16. In view of the fact that our District Superintendent, Rev. T. S. Dixon, who has so faithfully served us for four years, is now retiring from this office, be it resolved that we offer him a rising vote of thanks for his valuable service.
