

PROCEEDINGS

First Session

The 44th Annual Conference convened at the Denton Camp Ground on August 2 with Rev. H. D. Dukes, our District Superintendent, in the chair. We sang "Heavenly Sunlight" with Sr. Louetta Holden leading. We were then led in prayer by Rev. T. S. Dixon. Rev. Dukes then yielded the chair to Rev. A. H. Wilson, our 2nd Assistant General Superintendent, who read a scripture lesson from Philippians 2:1-8.

We had the roll call of the preachers and lay delegates.

A motion carried that Mrs. Charles Ruark be accepted as delegate for Crisfield Church as their delegate was unable to be here.

The Exmore Church was presented to the Conference. A motion carried to accept this church in the Conference.

A motion carried to substitute James Godwin as Groton Church delegate.

A motion carried that we use the platform and the first eight seats in the center section as the conference bar.

A motion carried that we set the time of the sittings of the conference the same as last year, which is from 8:30 A. M.-12 noon, 2:00-5:00 P. M., and 7:00-10:00 P. M.

A motion carried that Revs. Charles Reiter, James Flexon, Rev. and Mrs. Forrest Benner, Rev. and Mrs. Helsby be accepted as members in the conference on the basis of their present standing.

Reports were then called for. Rev. Dukes gave his report which was accepted with additions. The report of the Auditing Committee was read and accepted.

Conference ratified the action of the Council who had appointed Rev. Frank Nason to serve on the Resolution Committee in Rev. Senter's place and Rev. Ewell to serve on the Ways and Means Committee in Rev. Kresge's place.

A motion carried that Rev. Dukes appoint a Camp and Conference Reporter. Rev. Mary Joiner was appointed.

The report of the treasurer was read and after some discussion, accepted. The matter of improved treasurer's report blanks was referred to the Ways and Means Committee.

The Statistical Report was given. It was accepted with a rising vote of thanks.

The Reception Committee presented Rev. and Mrs. Forrest Benner, Rev. and Mrs. Reiter, Rev. and Mrs. William Miller, Rev. Helsby, Rev. Jump, and Miss Evalean Walker. Those who were not members were given honorary seats within the bar.

A motion carried that Standing Rule No. 33 be deleted and be placed in the Annual Resolutions.

A motion carried to set the price of the minutes at 50¢ per copy and the loss be taken from the District Treasury.

A motion carried that we recess until afternoon session. After announcements Rev. Helsby dismissed with prayer.

Second Session

The second sitting opened with Rev. A. H. Wilson in the chair. The opening song "Redeemed" was led by Rev. Slimmer. We were led in prayer by Rev. Hope.

The Resolution Committee reported:

RESOLUTIONS:

No. 1. Be it resolved that the camp purchase a lapel mike. A motion carried that this matter be referred to the Camp Committee.

No. 2. Be it resolved that the District minutes be columnized thus simplifying their reading. Adopted.

No. 3. Resolved that sufficient gravel be purchased to fix the driveways all around the camp, and to make a walkway from the boarding tent to the ladies rest room. Adopted.

No. 4. Resolved that a mechanical dishwasher be purchased or made by the Camp Committee to be installed by next year's camp, providing the cost does not exceed \$300. Adopted.

No. 5. Resolved that proper sanitation be given to the ladies room before another camp. Adopted.

No. 6. Be it resolved that a committee be appointed to investigate the possibility of buying some government buildings, to be used as dormitories on this camp ground. Adopted.

Rev. Dukes appointed the District Superintendent, the District Secretary, and the District Treasurer.

THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORTED:

WAYS AND MEANS RESOLUTIONS:

No. 1. We recommend that Resolution No. 1, page 13, read as follows: "As our conference has accepted the pension plan, we recommend that each church raise its 4% on the pastor's salary as it deems best, and that each Evangelist, take care of his 2% of his salary as seems fit, and send to the district treasurer. Adopted.

No. 2. We recommend that Resolution No. 3, page 13, be corrected to read as follows: "Resolved that each pastor and evangelist pay 50% of his tithe into the local church treasury to be sent to the District treasury, to be divided as follows; one half of this amount to district home missions, the remaining half

to the District budget, and that a special offering be taken on Mother's Day for District Home Missions to be sent to the District treasury. Adopted.

The council was excused to work on the examining board report.

The report of the District Memorials was given and accepted by a rising vote.

The Resolution Committee reported again:

No. 7. Resolved that the Camp be rewired before next camp. Adopted.

A motion carried that Rev. Slimmer sing. He sang "Tell Me His Name Again".

A motion carried setting 4:00 P. M. this afternoon as the time to elect officers.

The report from the Examining Committee was given.

At the appointed time we proceeded with the election of officers. Rev. Dukes appointed Revs. Sullivan, Rimmer, Nason, and Slimmer as tellers.

While the Council was out in conference, the report of the Sunday Schools was given and accepted.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS:

On the first ballot Bro. Dukes was re-elected as District Superintendent. Rev. Dixon was elected for Assistant District Superintendent. Ballots cast declared Rev. Allen Clark elected for District Secretary. Nominations for District Treasurer were Bro. Ewell and Rev. Godwin Rimmer. Bro. Ewell was elected.

We proceeded to elect advisory members of the council.

Rev. Hope and Rev. Bean were elected to serve on the advisory council on the first ballot. On the second ballot Rev. Grier Baker was elected.

A motion carried to have the ordination service immediately after the election.

A motion carried to meet at 6:30 instead of 7:00.

We were dismissed with prayer by Rev. Hope.

Third Session

The 3rd session was opened by singing "Love Lifted Me" led by Rev. Slimmer. Prayer was led by Rev. Bean. Minutes of the 1st and 2nd sittings were read and approved as corrected.

The Reception Committee then introduced Rev. James Flexon to the conference.

We then proceeded with the election. Members of the Home Missionary Board were elected. Ballots cast declared Rev. Alfred Clark and Howard Williams elected. The 2nd ballot declared Rev. Charles Ruark elected.

The council asked to be excused and were excused by common consent.

Motion carried to rescind the former action of having a lay member on the Home Missionary Committee.

Report of the Council on Nominees to the examining board was asked for. Ballots cast declared Rev. Bateman elected as a member of the examining board to serve 3 years.

The council then proceeded to appoint the Sunday School Committee as follows: Sr. Nellie Holden, Secretary, Sr. Godwin Rimmer, and Rev. Elmer Hocking.

A motion carried that the Board of Trustees be the same as last year.

A motion carried that the District Superintendent be permitted to hold three revivals a year with remuneration.

The Ways and Means Committee reported again. A motion carried that the District Superintendent, Secretary, Treasurer, Statistician, and Rev. Hocking be appointed to revise the report blanks.

Invitations to the Ministerial and Young People's Conventions were then considered. The church at Oxford extended an invitation to the Good Friday Young People's Rally. The Bloxom church invited us for the Thanksgiving Rally. The Salisbury church invited for the fall ministerial convention. The Baltimore 3rd church extended the invitation for the Young People's Rally. The Ridgely church extended the invitation for the Young People's Rally. A motion was carried to close the invitations.

The invitation from Oxford was accepted. Invitations for the Thanksgiving Rally at Bloxam was accepted. Invitation for the Ministerial Convention at Salisbury was accepted. A motion carried that the Pastor of the churches work out the date of these conventions. An invitation of the Baltimore church for the Spring Ministerial Convention was accepted.

A motion carried to get the number of minutes to be mailed to each church.

Rev. Dukes appointed committees for the coming year.

A motion carried for a rising vote of thanks to Rev. A. H. Wilson for so efficiently presiding over the Conference.

A motion carried that the editing committee delete from the minutes all standing rules deemed obsolete.

A motion carried to proceed with the ordination service. After the beautiful service we proceeded with the conference.

The reception committee introduced Rev. Gunsalus who gave the report of the Allentown Bible Institute.

The minutes of the last sitting were read and approved as corrected.

A motion carried to express our appreciation to the evangelists, singers, and workers of this camp by a rising vote of thanks.

A motion carried to adjourn and we were dismissed with prayer by Rev. Dukes.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Forty-fourth Annual Conference of the Eastern District, Greetings:

Trankful we are to our Great Redeemer for the power of the Blood to save and cleanse, and to the Holy Spirit for His guidance through this year. We have had, with the splendid cooperation of our District Ministers and laity, a busy year of service wherein we, conscientiously, have sought to do our best for God and the District.

Throughout the year I have visited every church, preached for them, and held all but two of their business meetings. I have attended two General Board meetings and one District Superintendents' meeting at Indianapolis; two Directors meetings at A. B. I., as well as visited them at their Baccalaureate and Commencement. I was also privileged to attend the National Youth Rally of our church at Springfield, Ohio.

We had a good Ministerial Convention at Baltimore and two Young People's Rallies at the Cambridge and the Exmore Churches.

Under the Home Missionary Department we held a very profitable meeting at Harberton, in a home, with souls praying through to old-fashioned victory. The weekly cottage prayer meetings now being held by Sisters Mitchell and Clough are very encouraging.

We have a preaching point at Fairmount under the capable leadership of Brother Charles Ruark.

Using a contact at Shepherdstown, West Virginia, we conducted a revival there and at Sharpsburg, Maryland, hoping to bring these folk into Hagerstown, but to date we have been unable to get a suitable location there.

We also held a revival at Exmore and later returned to organize a church there. Sisters Mitchell and Clough are ably taking care of this new work, together with Quinby which was organized last year.

The new Millsboro work under the capable leadership of Sister Lida Bra-sure in the District Portable Tabernacle is progressing splendidly.

The District Young People's Society sponsored a meeting at Berlin, Md., with Bro. and Sr. Rimmer and Bro. and Sr. Nason in charge.

As to the material progress of the churches: they are lifting their indebtedness, building or buying new churches and parsonages, as well as remodeling and decorating them. The Cambridge brethren lost their church, which they had just beautifully redecored, by a bad fire on November 13, but have bought two lots for \$6500.00, in a splendid location upon which they are erecting a large brick veneer church building forty by sixty feet. It will have eight Sunday School rooms in the basement when completed. They have quite a load to carry having just built a new parsonage.

Cape Charles is now building a fine church thirty by fifty-five feet. They hope to have it completed by winter. The Oyster Chapel services under Sister Garrett are now encouraging. We are hoping for a good work there.

Bishop's Head bought a parsonage and already have it half paid for.

Oxford sold their church building and bought the Methodist Church at \$8000.00. They redecorated and had it rededicated with but a nominal indebtedness remaining. It is now one of the most beautiful churches in the District.

Baltimore First Church has renovated, decorated, and seated the large upper auditorium and are having services there now. They have also installed a fine system of oil heat.

Goldsboro has bought a nice parsonage and added some modern conveniences.

Greensboro has redecorated their church.

On Labor Day the corner stone of the new Crumpton Church was laid.

Broome's Island cellotexed the inside of their church and put in a floor oil furnace with automatic control.

Easton has bought a lot for a parsonage site. They expect, the Lord willing, to start their building this coming year.

On October the twentieth, the new brick veneer church at Bloxom was dedicated.

The Baltimore second church has moved to a better location.

Lawsonia has built a garage by their parsonage.

Ridgely has repaired and painted their church.

Bozman church building was redecorated and reshingled.

Denton has put a cement sidewalk in front of their church.

Dover has repainted their church inside and out adding a cement frontage and steps.

Gumboro has paid off her parsonage mortgage. For these and other improvements over the District we praise the Lord.

The three church camps were well attended and graciously owned of God.

This Fiftieth Anniversary Camp was indeed a glorious one marked by the blessed spiritual atmosphere and the many precious souls bowing at the altar of prayer. Thank the dear Lord! Looking backward we can see a steady growth in size and beauty of our Camp. We humbly thank the Lord for this and yet we look forward to greater things spiritually and materially. The additional five cottages of this year and the twenty-eight room dormitory of last year does not yet give us sufficient room. We must build more, and thank the Lord for this.

On Wednesday morning the Camp crowd moved down to Williston Pond where amidst singing and shouting over thirty were baptized. This baptismal service was so sweetly owned of God that we, as well as others feel it would please Him to have this to become a yearly feature of the Camp.

The two Sunday morning broadcasts were a great blessing to those who were unable to attend the services at Camp.

Financially, personally, I have received my salary in full of \$45.00 per week, \$334.68, for mileage, having traveled 8,367 miles in District work. I received \$77.63, which I had paid out for postage and telephone, and \$848.14 I had received from church visits and for revival services, I returned to the District Treasury.

I have sought to be faithful to God, to the Conference regulations, and to the decisions of the Council. Spiritually, personally I've never enjoyed sweeter victory or felt so humbly thankful for my privilege of Salvation. As a District we still are seeking God's best. Some souls are being saved and sanctified and eagerly we all look forward to greater victories in spite of the powerful working of Satan. We aim by the Grace of God to faithfully "occupy until He comes".

STANDING RULES

No. 1. Since our General Administration budget has been set at \$1.00 per member, General Home Missions at \$1.00 per member, and General Foreign Missions at \$2.00 per member, our District budget shall be set at \$1.00 per member, making a total of \$5.00 per member. This money shall be sent to the District Treasurer as budget money to be proportioned accordingly. Furthermore, we suggest that a mite box be given each member and they be asked to give 1¢ a day for the year.

No. 2. The Conference shall accept the Pension Plan on a District Basis. Each church shall raise its 4% on the pastor's salary as it deems best, and each Evangelist take care of the 2% of his salary as he sees fit and send it to the District Treasurer.

No. 3. Each pastor shall pay 50% of his tithe into the local church treasury to be sent to the District treasury which shall be divided as follows: one-half to District Home Missions and one-half to the District Budget. A special offering shall be taken on Mother's Day for District Home Missions and sent to the District Treasury.

No. 4. Our District Superintendent shall receive \$45.00 a week, \$20.00 a month house rent, mileage at the rate of 4¢ per mile, two weeks vacation with pay, and be allowed to hold three revivals each year with remuneration.

No. 5. Churches with fifty or more members shall pay the District Superintendent \$15.00 a visit, all other \$7.50 a visit.

No. 6. Since there are many duties for the District Secretary and Treasurer to discharge during the year, our District Treasurer shall be paid the amount of \$50.00 and our District Secretary \$35.00 for their labors.

No. 7. The District Superintendent, Secretary and Treasurer shall be paid from the District Treasury for all postage relative to district work.

No. 8. Since there is some expense and much work connected with the office of District Statistician this office shall be paid the sum of \$10.00 a year.

No. 9. In order to defray the expenses of sending delegates to the General Conference each pastor shall take an offering equivalent to 5 cents per member and send it yearly to the District Treasurer.

CAMP REGULATIONS

No. 10. Since Denton Camp has held a high spiritual standard from its beginning nothing will be sold on the Lord's Day.

No. 11. The minister's children, 14 years of age or over, receiving free board shall assist in the dining room when necessary.

No. 12. All who go to the dining room during our District Camp shall register and be supplied with tickets to be presented upon entrance into the dining room.

No. 13. During the camp the family prayer hour from 8 to 9 and the praise service from 9 to 10 shall be announced and encouraged.

No. 14. A Bible School service shall be held the first Saturday afternoon of camp and the representative be allowed to take an offering for Allentown Bible Institute.

No. 15. No other service shall be in progress during Missionary Services at Denton Camp.

No. 16. A day and hour shall be set for a healing service at Denton Camp annually.

No. 17. Since the ring meeting has been much appreciated in years past and since there are many who wish them continued, a leader shall be appointed by the Council to have charge of the meetings for the coming years and the same be announced and encouraged from the platform.

No. 18. Since we recognize the need for supervision for the music of the camp, we appoint Sr. Etta Hoffman as honorary musical director for life.

No. 19. Ladies taking part in the services on the platform at Denton Camp shall be required to wear their dresses not shorter than half way between the knee and the ankle. Full-length sleeves are requested, and nothing shorter than three-quarter ones will be permitted. No jewelry, shoulder-bobs, permanent waves, nor cosmetics, including finger nail polish, will be tolerated. "In like manner also, that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety; not with braided hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array; but (which becometh women professing godliness) with good works." I Tim. 2:9-10.

No. 20. No tree shall be cut on the Camp Ground without the permission of the Camp Meeting Committee.

No. 21. The grounds shall be policed while services are being conducted.

CONFERENCE REGULATIONS

No. 22. Whereas our General Superintendent has ruled that our Conference Year ends when we close our books, our books shall be closed June 30th and our newly elected church board take office immediately, and all reports be in the hands of our Statistician 10 days before camp.

No. 23. No pastor's wife shall serve as a delegate to the annual conference if another member of the church is available.

No. 24. Since the Conference follows the District Camp, each minister and wife and delegate shall be entertained free and all others pay 25¢ a meal.

MINUTES

No. 25. The manuscript for the District Minutes shall be in the hands of the printer within 30 days and churches receiving them send money for same within 10 days to District Treasurer.

No. 26. The District Minutes shall be columnized to simplify their reading.

No. 27. The District Minutes shall be 50¢ per copy and the loss sustained from the District Treasury.

DISTRICT BUSINESS

No. 28. No individual shall serve as a member of more than one of the following: Council, Examining and Education Board, and Resolution Committee.

No. 29. No annual church business meeting shall be held on the Lord's Day.

No. 30. Whenever possible each pastor shall hold a meeting within the bounds of his own church within the conference year.

No. 31. Each pastor shall have two Sundays off his Pastorate in the year with pay.

YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK

No. 32. The district shall continue to hold Thanksgiving and Good Friday Young People's Rallies because of their great benefit to Pilgrim Youth.

No. 33. Each pastor shall call his Young People's Society together to make monthly pledges of support for to be sent to the District Young People's Society treasurer to forward a work in Wilmington, Delaware.
