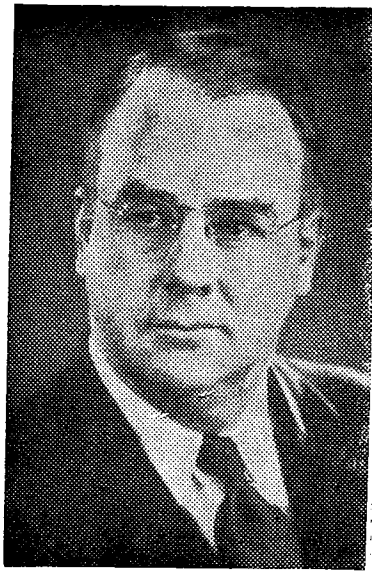

Morning Session

The Forty-sixth Annual Conference of the Eastern District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 8:30 A. M. on August 7, 1950 at the Denton Camp Ground in Denton, Md.

The Conference opened with singing "Near the Cross" led by the Rev. J. D. Abbott. The Rev. G. L. Helsby led in prayer.

The Statistician gave his report. A motion prevailed to receive his report with the understanding that the Foreign Missionary Society report from Denton be included.

Second Session

The afternoon sitting opened at 2:00 P. M.

A motion prevailed to dispense with the roll call.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

A motion prevailed to have the ordination service this evening.

A motion prevailed to change the time of the evening sitting from 7:00 to 6:00 P. M.

A motion prevailed to proceed with the election. The following tellers were appointed by the Rev. Dukes: Rev. Birdsall Bell, Rev. Charles L. Engrem, Rev. Allen Thomas, and Rev. Harley McKee.

Rev. P. F. Bean led in prayer.

Ballots were cast for an Examining Board member. There was no election. A motion prevailed that the secretary cast a ballot for the election of the three highest, Rev. Alfred Clark, Rev. Charles Ruark, and Rev. Elmer Hocking.

A motion prevailed to accept an invitation from the Dover, Delaware church for the spring ministerial convention.

A motion prevailed to extend the time.

Invitations were accepted for the Young People's Rallies. A mo-

tion prevailed that the Thanksgiving Rally be held in the Ridgely church. A motion prevailed that the Good Friday Rally be held in the Denton church.

A motion prevailed to adjourn.

Third Session

The evening session convened at 6:00 P. M.

The session opened with singing "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder" led by the Rev. Ruth Morris. Rev. Frank Nason led the conference in prayer.

A motion prevailed to change the order of the session so that all business might be taken care of before the Ordination Service.

The minutes were read and approved.

The District Superintendent made the Committee appointments. A motion prevailed to ratify the appointments.

A motion prevailed to have the Rev. H. D. Dukes appoint a committee as Camp and Conference reporter.

The Memoirs Committee reported. The report was accepted by standing in reverent prayer.

The Resolutions Committee reported again.

After a beautiful ordination service a motion prevailed that the conference adjourn.

RESOLUTIONS OF THE 1950 CONFERENCE

I. BE IT RESOLVED that this Conference authorize the Council to build a District Parsonage as soon and as economically as possible. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this be of the bungalow type consisting of 8 rooms and built high enough from the ground to provide for oil heat.

II. BE IT RESOLVED that the District Council build two cottages on the Camp Ground for sale and that this practice be continued.

III. BE IT RESOLVED that Standing Rule 34, page 48 of the 1949 Conference Journal, be amended to read: "The District Young People's Business Meeting shall be held during the Good Friday Young People's Rally which shall be centrally located in the District."

IV. BE IT RESOLVED that 5 tables be provided for the convenience of those bringing lunches on the grounds. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a garbage can be placed at each table.

V. BE IT RESOLVED that the Council appoint a committee of three (3) to work out the details of building the district parsonage and that one of these men act as chairman to be responsible for the execution of the plans.

VI. BE IT RESOLVED that the pump house be insulated sufficiently to prevent freezing.

VII. BE IT RESOLVED that a man be appointed to see that the corner stones are placed in the front gate post and the remainder of the fence be put up as soon as possible.

RESOLUTIONS OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1950 Conference

I. BE IT RESOLVED that Standing Rule number 1, page 46, 1949 Conference Journal, be amended to read: "Since our General Administration budget has been set at \$1.00 per member, General Home Missions at \$1.00, General Foreign Missions at \$2.00, Sunday School and Youth Work at 25 cents, Church Extension Loan Fund at 50 cents, Senior College Fund at 75 cents our District Budget shall be set at \$1.00 per member making a total of \$6.50 per member. This money shall be sent to the district treasurer as budget money to be proportioned accordingly.

II. BE IT RESOLVED that Standing Rule number 3, page 46, 1949 Conference Journal, be amended to read: "Each pastor, evangelist, and the district superintendent shall pay 50 per cent of his tithe into the local church treasury to be sent in monthly to the district treasurer which shall be divided as follows: one-half to District Home Missions and one half to the District Budget. A special offering shall be taken on Mother's Day for District Home Missions and sent to the district treasurer. All district monies are to be sent to the District treasurer by the 10th of each month.

III. BE IT RESOLVED that the district secretary shall send, immediately following the District Conference, mimeographed copies of the conference actions concerning finances to each minister, evangelist, song evangelist, the district superintendent, and local

church treasurer.

IV. BE IT RESOLVED that Standing Rule number 8, page 46, 1949 Conference Journal, be amended to read: "Each member of the district shall be assessed 55 cents quadrennially for General Conference expenses."

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the forty-sixth annual conference of the Eastern District, greetings. Grace and peace be multiplied unto you through the knowledge of God, and of Jesus our Lord, according as His divine power hath given unto us all things that pertain unto life and godliness, through the knowledge of him that hath called us to glory and virtue: We thank God for the privileges of the Gospel for another year. The distressing horrors of war are upon us again, but let us look up to Him who can solve every problem and know that our "Redemption draweth nigh." Let us roll up our sleeves, as it were, and gird on the full armor and work harder for the Master. The shadow of the approaching night is already upon us. But we are serving a conquering Christ who will enable us to be conquerors as we trust and obey Him.

We appreciate the splendid spirit of our Ministerial brethren and of the district laity as we have labored together this year. We have seen some advancement, but we are not satisfied with this. We must win more souls for the Lord.

We have lost from our ranks a faithful warrior of the Cross and an ordained deaconess of the church, Sr. Lillie Rose—our loss is Heaven's gain. Several of our brother ministers have been seriously ill this year, but so far God has graciously left them with us.

Home Missionary Department

There were three special home missionary efforts this year. One meeting at Starkey's Corner was led by Bro. and Sr. B. H. Lucas last fall. The next two were conducted by Srs. Louetta and Nellie Holden at Barclay, then at Chestertown, the last of June and into July. We are looking forward to having a work in this community. We had hoped to present two organizations to this conference this year, but to date they haven't materialized. The Home Missionary Board has purchased 80 new metal chairs that we might have seats not only for our summer tent work but for winter meetings in rented

halls, etc.

It was our pleasure to have our general deputational workers to present the general home missionary work and foreign work on our District. We have had some unusually gracious revivals over the District this year.

District Improvements

The Cape Charles church under Sr. Mary Garrett's capable leadership moved into their new church on November 13, with a revival with Bro. Bowling as evangelist and Bro. and Sr. Sorrells as singers. It was my pleasure on the last Sunday of the meeting to dedicate this new brick building, which is valued at \$16,000. It is now two thirds free of indebtedness. In conjunction with the Cape Charles work we still maintain our Oyster, Va. preaching point, where some souls were saved this year.

Roxana has painted the interior and exterior of both their church and parsonage.

Denton is in the process of remodeling their church; putting in five extra Sunday School rooms and installing an excellent heating system. The form-stone front will present an attractive building when completed.

The Hurlock church is building on an addition to their church to care for their Sunday School.

On October 16 the Bloxom church burned their bond note, freeing it of indebtedness.

Delmar has renovated the interior of their church by sanding and refinishing the floors and pews.

The New Liberty church burned their note, thus freeing it of indebtedness.

Conventions and Rallies

We have had one ministerial convention on April 11, 12, and 13th at Cambridge with Bro. Joshua Stauffer of Westfield, Ind. as guest speaker; the other was on Good Friday at Cape Charles with Bro. Julian Howard as main speaker.

On July 27 and 28 the Young People's Convention met on the Camp Ground with Bro. Gunsalus as speaker. This was followed by the election of officers.

We had a Sunday School Convention on the Denton Camp Ground on July 4th with Rev. O. L. Ruth as speaker.

Personal Report

Personally I have held 8 revivals this year, all on the District.

They were at Hurlock, Quimby, Milton, Fairmount, New Liberty, Centreville, Denton, and Delmar. The Fairmount work is entirely home missionary. Bro. Charles Ruark is faithfully carrying on the work there. All offerings given from these meetings were returned to the District Treasurer excepting three, as allowed by the Conference. I have visited every church on the District twice or more with one exception.

I have attended all General Board meetings of the year also the Directors' meetings at Allentown.

I have received my salary in full which is \$45 per week. We have returned to the treasury \$988.76, driven 8,005 miles in District work and received for postage, telegrams, and telephone \$100.20.

I wish to humbly say to the glory of God, that I have seen more souls saved and sanctified at my altars this year than ever before in my life. To HIM be all the praise!

I would like to recommend to this conference that steps be taken to provide a permanent District Parsonage. And, secondly, since it takes some time for the members of the Home Missionary Committee to become well acquainted with the work and prospects of the Home Missionary Department, I would like to recommend that the terms of office be as the Examining Board: one for one year, one for two years, and one for three years.

Camp Report

The District Young People have built a cottage on the Camp Ground providing accommodation for the Young People and Children's workers. Another cottage was built for Camp use. Three others were built thru private ownership, with prospects of more this coming year.

We have acquired a fine labor saving stainless steel dishwasher, for which we are all thankful—especially the old dishwashers!

Yes, we thank the Lord for all these Camp improvements.

Camp Services

The Sunday morning broadcasts were a great source of blessing to the community as well as the Camp.

On Wednesday morning at Williston Pond after an inspiring message by Bro. Thomas eleven people followed the Lord in baptism.

We wish to thank the Lord for our fine Camp workers and for the gracious services this year on old Denton Camp Ground. The shouts of praise and victory as new born souls came shining through, the cry of triumph over the battles of life, and the showers of bless-

ing as believers received their pentecost are continuing to bless our altar services. Oh may this Holy Fire never be quenched on our altars and joyous expectancy of His Second Coming never leave our plans!

The supreme purpose of our efforts, our plans, and our improvements is to help souls to an old fashioned experience of full salvation—and may it never be anything less! God has blessed us and we with God's help expect "to occupy till He comes."

Now as the horrible tempests of the end-time come sweeping over this sin cursed world let us hold fast to Bible Standards and faithfully labor till the Master comes.

STANDING RULES

MATTERS OF FINANCE

No. 1. Since our General Administration budget has been set at \$1.00 per member, General Home Missions at \$1.00, General Foreign Missions at \$2.00, Sunday School and Youth Work at 25 cents, Church Extension Loan Fund at 50 cents, Senior College Fund at 75 cents our District Budget shall be set at \$1.00 per member making a total of \$6.50 per member. This money shall be sent to the district treasurer as budget money to be proportioned accordingly.

No. 2. The Conference shall accept the Pension Plan on a District Basis. Each church shall raise its 4 per cent on the pastor's salary as it deems best, and each Evangelist take care of the 2 per cent of his salary as he sees fit and send it to the District Treasurer.

No. 3. Each pastor, evangelist, song evangelist, and the district superintendent shall pay 50 per cent of his tithe into the local church treasury to be sent in monthly to the district treasurer which shall be divided as follows: one-half to District Home Missions and one-half to the District Budget. A special offering shall be taken on Mother's Day for District Home Missions and sent to the district treasurer. All monies are to be sent to the District Treasurer by the tenth of each month.

No. 4. Our District Superintendent shall receive \$45.00 a week, \$20.00 a month house rent, postage, mileage at the rate of 4 cents per mile, two weeks vacation with pay, and be allowed to hold three revivals each year with remuneration.

No. 5. Churches with fifty or more members shall pay the District Superintendent \$15.00 a visit; all others \$7.50 a visit.

No. 6. The District Secretary and Treasurer shall receive \$35.00 and \$50.00 respectively, plus postage.

No. 7. The District Statistician shall be paid \$10.00 a year.

No. 8. Each member of the district shall be assessed 55 cents quadrennially for General Conference expenses.

CAMP REGULATIONS

No. 9. Nothing shall be sold at Denton Camp on Sunday.

No. 10. Ministers' children, 14 years of age or over, receiving free board shall assist in the dining room when necessary.

No. 11. All who go to the dining room during our District Camp shall register and be supplied with tickets to be presented upon entrance into the dining room.

No. 12. All cottage holders shall be encouraged to paint their cottages in uniformity with others.

No. 13. During the camp the family prayer from 8:00 to 9:00 A. M. encouraged.

No. 14. A Bible School Service shall be held the first Saturday afternoon of camp and the representative be allowed to take an offering for the Allentown Bible Institute.

No. 15. No other service shall be in progress during Missionary Services at Denton Camp.

No. 16. A day and hour shall be set for a healing service at Denton Camp annually.

No. 17. A leader shall be appointed by the Council to have charge of the Ring Meetings for the coming year and the same be announced and attendance encouraged from the platform.

No. 18. Rev. Etta Hoffman shall be lifetime Honorary Music Director for Denton Camp.

No. 19. Ladies taking part in the services on the platform shall be required to wear their dresses not shorter than half way between the knee and ankle. Full-length sleeves are requested, and nothing shorter than three-quarter ones will be permitted. No jewelry, shoulder-bobs, permanent waves, cosmetics, including finger nail polish, will be tolerated. "In like manner also, that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety; not with broided hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array; but (which becometh women professing godliness) with good works." I Tim. 2:9-10.

No. 20. No tree shall be cut on the Camp Ground without permission of the Camp Committee.

No. 21. The grounds shall be policed while services are being conducted.

CONFERENCE REGULATIONS

No. 22. Whereas the General Superintendent has ruled that the Conference Year ends when we close books, the books shall be closed June 30th and newly elected church board take office immediately. All reports must be in the hands of the Statistician 10 days before camp.

No. 23. No pastor's wife shall serve as a delegate to the annual conference if another member of the church is available.

No. 24. Since the Conference follows the District Camp, each minister, his wife and delegate shall be entertained free. All others

pay 25 cents a meal.

MINUTES

No. 25. The Manuscript for the District Minutes shall be in the hands of the printer within 30 days and churches receiving them send the money to the District Treasurer within 10 days.

No. 26. The District Minutes shall be columnized to simplify reading.

No. 27. The District Minutes shall be sold at cost.

No. 28. The Editing Committee shall delete from the Minutes all Standing Rules deemed obsolete.

DISTRICT BUSINESS

No. 29. No individual shall serve as a member of more than one of the following: Council, Examining Board, Education Board, and Resolution Committee.

No. 30. No annual church business meeting shall be held on Sunday.

No. 31. Whenever possible each pastor shall hold a meeting within the bounds of his own church within the conference year.

No. 32. Each pastor shall have a two weeks vacation with pay.

YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK

No. 33. The District shall hold Thanksgiving and Good Friday Young People's Rallies.

No. 34. The District Young People's Business Meeting shall be held during the Good Friday Young People's Rally which shall be centrally located in the District.

SUNDAY SCHOOL WORK

No. 35. A District Sunday School Rally shall be held on July 4.

No. 36. The Sunday School banner shall be given at rallies on the basis of per cent of enrollment. Each Sunday School secretary shall send his Sunday School enrollment annually to the District Secretary of Sunday Schools.
