

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the forty-seventh Annual Conference of the Eastern District, Greetings: Grace be unto you and peace from God, our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ. Thanks be unto God who giveth us the victory. I am thankful for the consciousness of the cleansing of the

precious Blood and the abiding of the Divine Presence in my soul. What a joy to feel and realize we are in His will and pleasing Him in our daily lives. As we have sought His guidance throughout the year God has graciously and definitely helped us. Praise His Name!

We deeply appreciate the splendid spirit of cooperation of our ministry and laity throughout the district and especially of our district officials. God bless each one! Because of God's blessing and our District cooperation we feel we have a good report to bring you this year.

We are bringing to the District two new organizations. One, Hughes Chapel with Bro. Ernest Gary as pastor, was organized in July with eighteen charter members. These folk have considered coming with us for some time. We heartily welcome them into our midst. The other organization is a new group of nine charter members coming to us partly as a result of two tent meetings held in North and South Chessconessex. We welcome these fine folk and hope we may in the near future have a church building there in Chessconessex.

The Home Missionary Department has sponsored three tent meetings this calendar year—two near Chessconessex and one at Deals Island. Also last summer after our Conference, tent meetings were held at Templeville, and Whitman, Md. and one at Possum Point near Millsboro, Del. They have also bought a concrete block building at Greenwood, Del. 30' by 70' and reconditioned the same. It is now valued at \$3000. Bro. Grier Baker expects to begin services in it after this Conference.

In late September the District purchased a splendid bungalow in a very desirable location on the Main street of Denton for a District parsonage. It is exceptionally well built, fitted with an automatic furnace and water heater. The side porch could easily be enclosed for a study and there is ample room upstairs for a master bedroom; should this be done it would be an ideal parsonage. As it is, we, as a District, feel we have a fine home for our District Superintendent. Thank the Lord!

There have been several other improvements over the District. in a substantial building program.

at a cost of above \$5000, all is now paid except less than \$500. The

improvements include six Sunday School rooms, a new heating system, reroofing, a form stone front, new sidewalk, etc.

The Millsboro church, which two years ago was a Home Missionary project, has this year built a beautiful 56' by 32' cement block church at an actual cost of \$8615, which today, with the lot is valued at \$11,000. They have a remaining indebtedness of \$3,250. This is a remarkable record for so young a church and we feel the Millsboro folk and their fine pastor are to be heartily commended.

The Mardela church was reconditioned to the extent of about \$1200, and paid for the same.

The Crisfield church has installed a thousand dollar heating system.

The Milford church has built four additional Sunday School rooms and insolated the same. The Salisbury church, also, is now Our Denton church started here last year and completed them this,

Work is progressing on the erection of a new church on Goldsboro St., at Easton under the capable direction of Bro. Allen Clark. The building 60' by 32' is of brick construction and is expected to be completed by Thanksgiving.

Last October Hurlock dedicated four new Sunday School rooms built into the church there.

The outside of the Broomes Island parsonage was reconditioned. Oxford church has been reroofed. They have also procured a fine Hammond Organ.

The District Young People are sponsoring the building of a three room wash and utility room on the Camp Ground—not being able to complete it for this year's camp, it was turned into a three room dermitory temporarily. We hope, the Lord willing, to have it completed by next year's Camp.

Our Ministerial convention at Dover in April was graciously owned of God. Bro. Paul Thomas was the guest speaker.

At our midwinter week-end convention on general evangelism our hearts and minds were greatly stirred to greater service for the Lord and souls. Our General Superintendent, Bro. Sturk, was our guest speaker.

There were two Young Peoples' Rallies: one at Ridgely on Thanksgiving Day followed by the dedication of the District Parsonage. Bro. Bean brought the dedicatory message. The parsonage was dedicated by the Assistant Superintendent, Bro. Baker, and the key handed to the Superintendent, Bro. Dukes. The Easter Rally at Denton was well attended and very inspirational.

The Sunday School Convention, the 4th of July, on the Denton Camp Ground was well attended. Our hearts were stirred with the urgency of the Gospel and the value of Sunday School work, under Bro. P. F. Elliott's helpful messages.

Personally, I have assisted in several revivals, held all annual business meetings but one, visited all the churches, attended all the General Board meetings as well as the Director's meetings at Allentown. I have assisted in the district building projects, supplied for the pastors and sought to help the churches whereever I could. I have received my salary of \$45 per week, returned to the treasury \$948.65 from the churches plus my tithe, driven 7,302 miles in District work and received \$125.23 for district postage, telephone and telegram expense. I would like to recommend to this Conference that some provision be made for the prompt liquidation of the debt on the District parsonage.

This year, we are sorry to report, we have lost three of our good ministers: Bro. Bafford an aged but active soldier of the Cross, Bro. Phillips middle aged with his joyous testimony, and Sr. Joiner a younger active minister. We surely do miss their victorious testimony and presence. Two of our younger pastors have left the District to labour elsewhere; Bro. Allen Thomas went to Texas to labor among the Mexicans, and Bro. Frank Nason went to a Home Missionary Work in South Carolina. May God richly bless them there!

This has been a great camp—the spirit of cooperation, the inspiring messages, and best of all the mighty working of God dealing with the hearts of the people, the shouts of victory, as newborn souls struck fire, the mighty outpouring of Heavenly Glory and the joyous experience of sanctification—these old land marks of the old fashioned heart-felt religion are still with us. Praise the Lord!

On Wednesday morning at Williston Pond after an inspiring message by Bro. M. C. Kittle, six Christians followed the Lord in baptism.

Due to the growing number attending Denton Camp and the time

needed to serve them their meals, we have changed this year from table service to cafeteria style in the dining room. The necessary changes including serving tables, covered outside walkway, and plans for the procedure having been made before camp, the time and labor of meal service was much less this year. The dining room and kitchen force with their efficient new cook and general "set up" are to be highly commended for their splendid service.

As our camp continues to grow we plan to make the necessary additions and changes to accommodate the crowds who come, for we feel we must do what we can to help spread the Gospel Story.

Thanking the Lord for past blessings we press on in service for the Master "till He comes."

MATTERS OF FINANACE

No. I. Since our General Administration budget has been set at \$1.00 per member, Church Extension at \$1.00, Foreign Missions at \$2.00, Sunday School and Youth Work at 25 cents, Church Extension Loan Fund at 50 cents, Senior College Fund at 75 cents our District Budget shall be set at \$1.00 per member making a total of \$6.50 per member. This money shall be sent to the district treasurer as budget money to be proportioned accordingly.

No. 2. The Conference shall accept the Pension Plan on a District Basis. Each church shall raise its 4 per cent on the pastor's salary as it deems best, and each Evangelist take care of the 2 per cent of his salary as he sees fit and send it to the District Treas-

nrer.

- No. 3. Each pastor, evangelist, song evangelist, and the district superintendent shall pay 50 per cent of his tithe into the local church treasury to be sent in monthly to the district treasurer which shall be divided as follows: one-half to District Home Missions and one-half to the District Budget. A special offering shall be taken on Mother's Day for District Home Missions and sent to the district treasurer. All monies are to be sent to the District Treasurer by the tenth of each month.
- No. 4. Our District Superintendent shall receive \$45.00 a week, postage, telephone, fuel, electric, mileage at the rate of 4 cents per mile, two weeks vacation with pay, and be allowed to hold three revivals each year with remuneration.
- No. 5. Churches with 75 members or more shall pay the District Superintendent \$25.00 a visit, churches with 50 to 74 members \$15.00, churches with 30 to 49 members \$10.00, and all others \$7.50 a visit.
- No. 6. The District Secretary and Treasurer shall receive \$35.00 and \$50.00 respectively, plus postage.
 - No. 7. The District Statistician shall be paid \$10.00 a year.
- No. 8. Each member of the district shall be assessed 55 cents quadrennially for General Conference expenses.

CAMP REGULATIONS

- No. 9. Nothing shall be sold at Denton Camp on Sunday.
- No. 10. Ministers' children, 14 years of age or over, receiving free board shall assist in the dining room when necessary.
- No. 11. All who go to the dining room during our District Camp shall register and be supplied with tickets to be presented upon entrance into the dining room.
- No. 12. All cottage holders shall be encouraged to paint their cottages in uniformity with others.
- No. 13. During the camp the family prayer from 8:00 to 9:00 A. M. encouraged.
- No. 14. A Bible College Service shall be held the first Saturday afternoon of camp and the representative be allowed to take an offering for the Allentown Bible College.
- No. 15. No other service shall be in progress during Missionary Services at Denton Camp.

No. 16. A day and hour shall be set for a healing service at Denton Camp annually.

No. 17. A leader shall be appointed by the Council to have charge of the Ring Meetings for the coming year and the same be announced and attendance encouraged from the platform.

No. 18. The Camp Committee shall build two cottages on the Camp Ground for sale—this practice to be continued.

No. 19. Each year there shall be a Preacher's Retreat held for a few days in the month of April for the purpose of cleaning up the camp grounds and making general repairs. This retreat shall be directed by the District Council as to date and program and each minister on the district is required to attend.

No. 20. Rev. Etta Hoffman shall be lifetime Honorary Music Director for Denton Camp.

No. 21. Ladies taking part in the services on the platform shall be required to wear their dresses not shorter than half way between the knee and ankle. Full-length sleeves are requested, and nothing shorter than three-quarter ones will be permitted. No jewelry, shoulder-bobs, permanent waves, cosmetics, including finger nail polish, will be tolerated. "In like manner also, that women adorn themselves in modest apparel, with shamefacedness and sobriety; not with broided hair, or gold, or pearls, or costly array; but (which becometh women professing godliness) with good works." I Tim. 2:9-10.

No. 22. No tree shall be cut on the Camp Ground without permission of the Camp Committee.

No. 23. One man shall be appointed and deputized to police the grounds with the aid of helpers.

CONFERENCE REGULATIONS

No. 24. Whereas the General Superintendent has ruled that the Conference Year ends when we close books, the books shall be closed June 30th and newly elected church board take office immediately. All reports must be in the hands of the Statistician 10 days before camp.

No. 25. No pastor's wife shall serve as a delegate to the annual conference if another member of the church is available.

No. 26. Since the Conference follows the District Camp, each min-

ister, his wife and delegate shall be entertained free. All others pay 25 cents a meal.

No. 27. The district secretary shall send, immediately following the District Conference, mimeographed copies of the Conference actions concerning finances to each minister, evangelist, song evangelist, the district superintendent, and local church treasurer.

MINUTES

No. 28. The Manuscript for the District Minutes shall be in the hands of the printer within 30 days and churches receiving them send the money to the District Treasurer within 10 days.

No. 29. The District Minutes shall be columnized to simplify reading.

No. 30. The District Minutes shall be sold at cost.

No. 31. The Editing Committee shall delete from the Minutes all Standing Rules deemed obsolete.

DISTRICT BUSINESS

No. 32. No individual shall serve as a member of more than one of the following: Council, Examining Board, Education Board, and Resolution Committee.

No. 33. No annual church business meeting shall be held on Sunday.

No. 34. Whenever possible each pastor shall hold a meeting within the bounds of his own church within the conference year.

No. 35. Each pastor shall have a two weeks vacation with pay. Young People's work

No. 36. The District shall hold Thank giving and good Friday Young People's Rallies.

No. 37. The District Young People's Business Meeting shall be held during the Good Friday Young People's Rally which shall be centrally located in the District.

SUNDAY SCHOOL WORK

No. 38. A District Sunday School Rally shall be held on July 4.

No. 39. The Sunday School banner shall be given at rallies on the basis of per cent of enrollment. Each Sunday School secretary shall send his Sunday School enrollment annually to the District Secretary of Sunday Schools.
