## REPORT OF THE DISTRICT SUNDAY SCHOOLS

Ministerial and lay delegates to the 50th Annual Conference:

Due to the lack of religious training in the public schools and for the most part in the home, this district feels that the Sunday School is a very important phase of the Christian Church. The District S. S. Committee has worked with the Superintendent in promoting in a small way the work of the Sunday School in the district this year.

There was a pastor's and superintendent's meeting called in the fall which was held in the church at Salisbury, where over 20 pastors and their superintendents met together and discussed some things relative to the Sunday School work as it pertained to them.

A district wide rally was held April 9, in the fire hall at Greensboro, Md. Rev. Thomas Weir from the Capital District gave a very stirring message to over 300 people. The Bozman Church was awarded the district banner at this gathering.

The 5th Annual S. S. Convention was held on the Camp grounds on July 5th with a good attendance. Rev. P. F. Elliott was the speaker and challenged all Christians with a message on "Going with the Gospel". Interesting oral reports were heard from several churches on the district that had conducted Daily Vacation Bible Schools. The district banner was awarded to the Centreville Sunday School at this rally.

The Sunday School hour was observed both Sundays at camp with a fine attendance. Mimeographed slips were given to each one attending so that they could be counted in their local Sunday Schools.

The leaders in average attendance this year are: Cambridge 207, Salisbury 180, Baltimore 136, Harrington 104, Dover 100 and Milton 100.

Leading in net gain over last year in the district over last year are Salisbury 34, Baltimore I-27, Milton 26, Broome's Island, 21 and Cambridge 21.

The four highest in percentage gain over last year are: Broome's Island 55%, Milton 35%, Baltimore I 24% and Salisbury 23%.

Our statistics show that the average weekly attendance in the district for the year was 2453 or a gain of 125 or a little over 5%.

May God grant us a vision to see the whitened harvest fields, vitality, that will enable us to work in them and Victory in winning men and women, boys and girls, in our district to Christ and the church.

### REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the 1954 District Conference, Greetings!

"We give thanks to God and the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ" that we are allowed in His all-wise providence to meet together in this 50th annual conference of the Eastern District. In reaching this half-century mark and considering the measure of grace dealt to us it is easy to agree with the psalmist who said, "The goodness of God endureth continually."

More particularly, however, we consider the past twelve months in this report. Immediately following the 1953 conference I assumed the responsibility of closing out my pastoral ministry at Cambridge, Maryland and accepting the charge layed upon me by the conference in the office of district superintendent. These obvious and responsible duties I have endeavored to shoulder with steady courage remembering what Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "... be steadfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the works of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord."

During the year I have made 95 visits to our churches—no fewer than twice to each one, I have presided at 14 district council meetings, attended many committee meetings, one district superintendent's meeting at Indianapolis, one general board meeting at Winona Lake, Indiana, General Conference, a Sunday School conference at Allentown, a district meeting of Sunday School Superintendents and pastors at Salisbury. I have preached 184 times, conducted one funeral and one wedding, participated in a mortgage burning service at Cambridge, a dedication of Sunday School rooms at Milton and went to Eastern Pilgrim College to meet with the young people from our district who were students there. My salary has been paid promptly and in full.

Two one-day ministerial conventions were held in the district, namely, at Laurel October 23 with Rev. R. C. Hawkins as speaker and at Dover March 12 with Rev. R. D. Gunsalus addressing the group. These seemed to be very profitable times to the ministers.

The two annual youth rallies were conducted on Thanksgiving day at Millsboro and Good Friday at Harrington. Related to youth, too, was the action of the



council to zone the district for the purpose of promoting a more aggressive youth program. An effort was launched to encourage the young people to attend camp by offering them room and board at half price with the understanding that a certain amount of work be done to help cover the expense.

The district Sunday School board engaged Rev. Thomas Weir for their Greensboro rally April 9th and Dr. Paul F. Elliott for the July 5th convention held on the Denton Camp Grounds.

In the field of Home Missions the Girdletree church was re-opened and Mr. Bill Miller was asked to supply. This he did for about eleven months. However, today finds the church again without a pastor. The Home Missionary Board authorized the printing of a phamplet of introduction and information which could be used in pastoral calling and such contacts on behalf of the church. These have been made available to all at a price to cover cost of printing and postage. The revival conducted in the Ridgely church was backed by the superintendent as chairman of the Home Missionary Board. This proved to be very successful and encouraging to the local nucleus of Pilgrims. The Greenwood work was organized September 16th with 8 members. The Centreville work was re-organized June 23 with 12 members. Several trips were made in the interest of new works and it is sincerely hoped that even yet a work may be opened in, or at least, near Wilmington. Let us pray that God will give us the men and money to reach out in His name and the name of the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

One aid in the advancing of district interest and promotion of the work was the district council authorized purchasing of a Speed-O-Print duplicator. Since then the district paper, titled EASTERN PILGRIM has been prepared monthly and a supply sent to each church for distribution. There have been seven issues of 750 copies each. It has contained financial, Sunday School and incidental reports from all points of the district. Practically every church has made, during the past year, improvements in one field or another. Such notable accomplishments have been presented to those of our district by means of EASTERN PILGRIM. This paper seems to have been received well by many of our people.

One bright hope on the horizon of our anxious day of Gospel labors is in our ministers. I thank God for them. Upon them rests much of the burden for our work. They bear this precious load manfully and valiantly. Those who labor in the bounds of our district deserve a rating second to none. I believe God will prove this statement to be substantial. Many of them have received salary increases from the churches. In some cases the local board has agreed to pay some or all of the parsonage utilities.

Our hearts are saddened because of the passing from us of Rev. Walter Joiner and Rev. C. S. Hope, two ministers of the Gospel. But today, it is our belief that they now rejoice in the blessings of a hope come to full fruition.

The 56th Annual Denton Camp Meeting proved to be a glorious time of manifold blessings. God signally anointed his servants, Rev. R. W. Chatfield, Rev. W. F. Drown, and Rev. R. D. Gunsalus who preached the Word and the singing Chatfields who were in charge of the music and singing until the spiritual tide was often raised to the flood stage God be praised for the gladsome victories achieved.

As I have met with the church boards and membership groups to inquire concerning the spiritual tone, attendance, finances, and other matters I have an overall evaluation of our work. I feel that more recently there has been a noticeable increase in efforts to advance both in things spiritual and material. On the part of ministerial and lay groups there seems to be a quickening of interest in

reaching out for the lost and bringing them to the Saviour, a desire to more faithfully "serve this present age" not by only preaching the gospel but also in efforts to follow up the message to see it profoundly effecting the regeneration it very deliberately accomplishes. May God help us to see even more of this very thing.

Our day races by—it is cursed by sin, clouded by uncertainties, divided by despoiling forces yet blessed with resplendent opportunities to preach Christ and Holiness; it is graced by conscientious Christians who are solemnized by thier challenge and kept busy until Jesus Comes. May God help us to intensify and focus all efforts towards launching out in new directions and establishing hearts in His most wonderful Name.

## STANDING RULES

### MATTERS OF FINANCE

No. 1. Since our General Budget has been set at 6.00 per member per year the apportionment to be as follows: Foreign missions 35%, Administration 25%, Church extension 20%, Church extension loan fund 6%, Senior College 10%, Sunday School and youth work 4%, our District Budget shall be set at \$2.25 making a total budget of \$8.25 per member. This is to be raised monthly and sent to the District Treasurer.

No. 2. The Conference shall accept the Pension Plan on a District Basis. Each church shall raise its 4 per cent on the pastor's salary as it deems best, and each Evangelist take care of the 2 per cent of his salary as he sees fit and send it to the District Treasurer.

No. 3. Each pastor, evangelist, song evangelist, and the district Superintendent, shall pay 60% of his tithe into the local church treasury to be sent to the district treasurer monthly. This amount to be divided between district budget and district Home Missions by the district council. A special offering shall be taken on Mother's Day for District Home Missions and sent to the district treasurer by the tenth of each month.

No. 4. The District Superintendent's salary shall be set by the Council before the election of officers and that in addition he receive postage, telephone, fuel, electric, mileage, two weeks vacation with pay, and he be allowed to conduct three revival meetings each year with remuneration. All finances received to be reported in full to the Conference.

No. 5. The District Superintendent's shall receive \$60.00 a week and 5c per mile for district travel.

No. 6. Each church shall pay the District Superintendent 25c per member each visit.

No. 7. The District Secretary and Treasurer shall receive \$35.00 and \$50.00 respectively, plus postage.

No. 8. The District Statistician shall be paid \$10.00 a year.

No. 9. Each church shall permit representatives to make an annual visit in the interest of raising funds to pay off the indebtedness on the district parsonage.

### CAMP REGULATIONS

No. 10. Nothing shall be sold at Denton Camp on Sunday.

No. 11. Ministers children under 12 years of age be entertained free,

those over 12 shall work in the dining room and assist with camp work.

No. 12. All who go to the dining room during our District camp shall register and be supplied with tickets to be presented upon entrance into the dining room.

No. 13. All cottage holders shall be encouraged to paint their cottages in uniformity with others.

No. 14. A Bible College service shall be held the first Saturday of the camp and the representative be allowed to take an offering for the Eastern Pilgrim College.

No. 15. Inasmuch as cottages at camp lack identification as to the occupants, name signs should be placed on each cottage before camp.

No. 16. No other service shall be in progress during Missionary Services at Denton Camp.

No. 17. A day and hour shall be set for healing services at Denton Camp annually.

No. 18. A leader shall be appointed by the Council to have charge of the Ring Meetings for the coming year and the same be announced and attendance encouraged from the platform.

No. 19. The Camp Committee shall build two cottages on the Camp Ground for sale—this practice to be continued.

No. 20. No buildings shall be constructed in the area that was occupied by the two old dormitories which have been moved.

No. 21. Each year there shall be a Preachers' Retreat held for a few days in the month of April for the purpose of cleaning up the camp grounds and making general repairs. This retreat shall be directed by the District Council as to date and program and each minister on the district is required to attend.

No. 22. Ladies taking part in the services on the platform shall be required to dress modestly.

No. 23. No tree shall be cut on the Camp Ground without permission of the Camp Committee.

No. 24. One man shall be appointed and deputized to police the grounds with the aid of helpers.

No. 25. The District Home Missionary service shall not be held in conjunction with the General Home Missionary service.

No. 26. The Family Prayer Hour during camp shall be announced and the keeping of it urged.

No. 27. All children eating in the dining room, except minister's children, between the ages 6-12 be charged one-half price; all under six be entertained free.

No. 28. A time shall be set for our District Home Missionary Service during the Camp by the Camp Committee.

#### CONFERENCE REGULATIONS

No. 29. Whereas the General Superintendent has ruled that the Conference Year ends when we close books, the books shall be closed June 30th and newly elected church board take office immediately. All reports must be in the hands of the Statistician 10 days before camp.

No. 30. No delegate or alternate shall serve in the Annual Conference who has not been nominated by the local church board and elected by the local church.

No. 31. As much as possible all resolutions to be considered by the conference shall be in the hands of the committee in typewritten form not later than the Wednesday preceding the opening of Conference.

No. 32. No individual shall serve as a member of more than one of the following: Council, Examining Board, Education Board, and Resolution Committee.

No. 33. The District conference shall be held on Thursday and Friday before camp. The said conference to convene on Thursday at 1:30 P. M. and run until 12:00 Noon on Friday.

No. 34. The committees appointed during the conference shall be given time to present their objectives and goals for the year during the camp.

No. 35. The District Council in office previous to the conference shall carry through their duties incidental to the camp.

No. 36. The district secretary shall send, immediately following the district conference, mimeographed copies of the conference actions concerning finances to each minister, evangelist, song evangelist, the district superintendent and to each local church treasurer.

### MINUTES

No. 37. The Manuscript for the district minutes shall be in the hands of the printer within 30 days and churches receiving them send the money to the District treasurer within 10 days.

No. 38. The price of the Conference Journal shall be set by the District Council.

No. 39. The Editing Committee shall delete from the minutes all standing rules deemed obsolete.

No. 40. Each pastor shall see that the names of deceased members be mailed to the Memoirs committee when the church books close on June 30.

### DISTRICT BUSINESS

No. 41. Two one-day ministerial conventions shall be held each year.

No. 42. No annual church business shall be held on Sunday.

No. 43. Whenever possible each pastor shall hold a meeting within the bounds of his own church within the conference year.

No. 44. Each pastor shall have a two weeks vacation with pay.

No. 45. The Revised Standard Version of the Bible shall not be used as a pulpit Bible for Scripture readings.

No. 46. Each pastor is requested to furnish the District Secretary with the name and address of the local paper.

### YOUNG PEOPLES WORK

No. 47. The District shall hold Labor Day and Memorial Day Young People's Rallies.

No. 48. Special youth services shall be held the first Friday night, Saturday morning, and Saturday afternoon of the camp.

No. 49. The business meeting for the election of youth officers shall be held Saturday morning of the youth services at camp, however the previous officers shall serve until the close of camp.

### SUNDAY SCHOOL WORK

No. 50. A District Sunday School rally shall be held on July 4.

No. 51. Two Sunday School banners shall be awarded at the district rallies: one on the basis of the percentage of enrollment present and the second on the basis of the number present in all sessions multiplied by the number of mile traveled.
