JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

FIRST SITTING

The Twentieth Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at the Campground, Charleston, Illinois, August 31, 1942, at 8:30 A. M., with General Superintendent W. L. Surbrook in the chair.

Rev. Charles Riggs led the conference in singing, "What a Friend we have in Jesus". We were led to the Throne in a refreshing season of prayer by Rev. W. A. Frye.

Rev. W. L. Surbrook read the scripture lesson from the fifth chapter of I Peter, speaking on "Ministerial Responsibilities".

The Secretary called the roll.

Motion carried to have the first seven rows of seats of the two middle aisles and the platform constitute the Conference bar.

Motion prevailed that the following persons be seaed as delegates for the respective churches named: Aden Eschew, Beecher City; Mrs. Charles Riggs, Lawrenceville; Mrs. J. W. Hancock, Onarga; Mrs. D. M. Horn, Palestine; Mrs. W. H. Wineinger, Peoria; and Mrs. Charles Ducommon, Robinson.

Moved and supported that the time of meeting be 8:30 A. M. to 11:30 A. M., 2:00 P. M. to 5:00 P. M., and the evening sitting 7:00 to 10:00. Motion carried.

Motion prevailed that the District Supt. appoint any committees or fill any vacancies necessary. He appointed Rev. Wm. Kerney and Rev. James Cunningham to serve as reception committee.

The District Supt. read his annual report. Motion carried to accept the report as read.

The District Statistician's report was read and accepted.

Motion carried that the Statistician add to the report the statistics from any church whose report has not yet been received.

The Auditors report was read and accepted.

The Reception Committee introduced the following persons to the Conference: Rev. and Mrs. J. H. Sherwood, Rev. and Mrs. W. A. Frye, Rev. A. R. C. Howard, Rev. W. H. Wineinger, and Rev. T. B. Bailey.

Motion prevailed that they be granted an honorary seat within the Conference bar.

Rev. J. M. Yarbrough reported on the new Church at Summit, Ill.

Rev. W. H. Pratt and Mrs. Emma Elliot reported on the new Church in Casey, Ill.

Motion carried to receive these new churches into the Conference.

A partial report of the Ways and Means Committee was read.

Motion carried to extend the time briefly.

Motion carried to recess until 2:00 P. M.

The business session was resumed at the call of the chair, and the congregation stood to sing, "What a Friend we have in Jesus."

We were led in prayer by Rev. W. E. Catey.

The Ways and Means Committee asked to be excused to complete their report. Motion carried to grant their request.

Motion prevailed that Rev. W. H. Wineinger and Rev. Ezekiel Haley, local preachers but pastors of churches, be given a seat within the bar.

A partial report of the Resolutions' Committee was read and accepted.

Motion prevailed to recess until the call of the bell and that Rev. and Mrs. Virgil Caudill sing at that time.

The session was resumed with Rev. and Mrs. Caudill singing, "The best thing to have is Salvation."

The partial report of the Ways and Means Committee was continued.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The following persons were received into the Conference by transfer: Rev. and Mrs. J. H. Sherwood from the Penn.-New Jersey Dist.; Rev. and Mrs. W. A. Frye from the Indiana Dist.; Rev. A. R. C. Howard from the Central Dist.; and Rev. T. B. Bailey from the Ohio Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church.

The report of the Joint Meeting of the Educational and Examining Boards was read.

Motion carried to have the election of officers.

Motion prevailed that the District Superintendent appoint two sets of three ellers each. They were appointed.

Rev. W. H. Pratt was re-elected as District Superintendent.

Rev. W. E. Catey was re-elected Assistant District Superintendent.

Motion carried to extend the time.

Ballots were cast for District Secretary. Rev. D. M. Horn was re-elected.

Motion prevailed to adjourn until 6:00 P. M.

SECOND SITTING

The Conference reconvened by singing "Close to Thee", led by Rev. Ellis Maness. Rev. A. R. C. Howard led in prayer.

Rev. and Mrs. J. H. Sherwood sang, "Sweeter than all".

Motion made and supported that we dispense with the roll call. Carried.

The Secretary read the Minutes of the preceding sitting. They were accepted as read.

Motion carried that Rev. Estella Hancock be received as an ordained minister into the Conference from the Pa. and N. J. District.

The Conference continued with the election of officers.

Rev. H. J. Beecher was re-elected as District Treasurer.

Rev. Calloway, Rev. Hanna, and Rev. Cunningham were elected as additional members of the District Council.

The District Trustees were elected as follows: Rev. W. E. Catey, 3 years; Rev. Elmor Hanna, 2 years; and Rev. R. S. Wheeldon, 1 year.

Rev. Elmor Hanna, whose term of office expired on the Examining Board, was re-elected for 3 years.

Rev. W. G. Henschen, whose term of office expired on the Educational Board, was re-elected for 3 years.

Motion prevailed that the District Superintendent appoint 5 members on the Ways and Means Committee. He appointed the various committees. (See Official Directory).

The Secretary read the Council's nominations for Bible School Representative. W. G. Henschen was elected.

Motion prevailed that we drop the part of the title of Executive Secretary of Young People's and Sunday School Work with reference to Sunday School work.

Motion carried that No. 20 be dropped from the Report of Resolutions Committee.

Motion prevailed to accept the invitation from the Lawrenceville Church for the place of the Ministerial meeting and that the District Superintendent set the time and arrange the program.

Motion carried that we change the time of the closing of the conference year to June 30th, and the annual reports be mailed to the District Statistician by July 10.

Arrangements were made and a very impressive ordination service was held with Revs. W. L. Surbrook, W. H. Pratt, W. E. Catey, H. J. Beecher, Elmor Hanna and D. M. Horn constituting the Ordination Council. Revs. Everett Ashley, Robert Gould, J. W. Hancock, W. J. Kerney and Albert Lacy were duly ordained.

In compliance with Resolution No. 20, the District Supt. appointed the Ministerial Zone Chairmen as follows: Northern Zone, W. A. Frye; Central Zone, H. J. Beecher; Southern Zone, Charles Riggs.

Motion prevailed to adjourn. W. H. Pratt dismissed with prayer.

**REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED
BY THE CONFERENCE**

1. We recommend that no pastor call an evangelist over the protest of the District Superintendent.

2. Inasmuch as there has been a failure on the part of some of our pastors in carrying out some of the resolutions of the District Conference; therefore, be it resolved that if any pastor shall fail to carry out any resolution as passed by the District Conference he shall be denied both voice and vote in the following District Conference unless he shows just cause.

3. Resolved that each zone shall have a Sunday School Attendance Banner given quarterly to the Sunday School having the largest percentage of increase. Each Sunday School shall send reports to the Young People's zone chairman who shall be responsible for buying the Banner out of funds from the Sunday Schools.

4. Resolved that all local ministers shall meet with the Educational Board and all licensed ministers shall meet with the Educational and Examining Boards not later than the last Saturday of the camp meeting.

5. Each local and licensed minister taking examination shall pay his examiner the amount of 50c for each examination taken.

6. Resolved that all our evangelists and ministers arrange their slates and work so as not to conflict with the camp and conference. Be it further resolved that each pastor shall have the privilege of holding one revival off his charge with regular salary provided he supply his pulpit satisfactorily in his absence.

7. Resolved that the District Secretary be instructed to have 300 copies of these minutes printed within 30 days after the close of the annual conference.

8. We recommend that any unfinished business be referred to the District Council.

9. The District Superintendent shall keep in touch with the pastors, reminding them of the plans of this Conference, encouraging and helping them in carrying out said plans.

10. Each pastor shall maintain a calling list, using a card filing system which shall be the property of each succeeding pastor and the expense of the same shall be borne by the local church.

11. a. Resolved that the Conference Year shall end with June 30th each year and all business transacted between that the the Annual Conference shall be included in the following year's report. Also the Conference year shall be divided into four quarters ending with the following dates respectively: First Quarter, July 1st to September 30th; Second Quarter, October 1st to December 31st; Third Quarter, January 1st to March 31st; April 1st to June 30th.

b. Be it further resolved that a quarterly meeting be held in each church within ten days following the close of each quarter, at which time reports covering the quarter shall be heard and then copied in the Church Secretary's book and mailed to the District Statistician.

c. Resolved that all annual reports be mailed to the District Statistician by July 10th.

12. Resolved that all of our preachers and laity secure respectively, a copy of the Church Manual and the District Conference Minutes, and shall read and study the same until they are able to understand and carry out all of their provisions and requirements.

13. a. Resolved that each pastor shall keep a record of all subscribers to the Advocate in each neighborhood where he pastors and shall, about thirty days before each subscription expires, endeavor to secure a renewal of the same.

b. Be it further resolved that each pastor shall endeavor to secure in each town or community in which his regular appointments are located, a sufficient number of subscriptions to the Advocate to cause the total number of subscribers of each community to be equal in number to 50% of the membership of the respective churches.

14. Resolved that the revision of the church membership rolls shall be made prior to the respective annual church meetings.

15. Resolved that this Conference require its Ministerial members to attend the Conference and Camp Meeting. They shall be present on the first day and remain to the close. Each church shall keep up the salary of its pastor during Camp Meeting. If any minister does not attend he shall send a report of his work and an excuse for his absence. If he fails to do so for two consecutive years he shall be disciplined.

16. Resolved that the District Secretary shall notify in writing all of the members of this Conference who have failed to meet the requirements of the foregoing rule No. 15, calling their attention to such failure and the penalty for the same at least thirty days before our next Conference.

17. Resolved that the pastor shall be responsible for the accuracy and condition of all church records, and of all quarterly and annual reports.

18. Resolved that the books of the course of study not now possessed by the examiners shall be purchased by the District for their use. The books shall remain the property of the District and the examiners using the same shall be responsible for their preservation and shall reimburse the District if the books are damaged or lost through their neglect.

19. Be it resolved that the District Council name the District Young People's Officers and Zone Chairmen not later than Wednesday of Camp Meeting each year.

20. Be it resolved that the Zone Chairmen be expected to visit each church in his zone at least once during the Conference year in the interest of the Young People's Work. Since there are so many churches in the Central Zone we recommend that co-chairmen for this zone be named by the District Council.

21. In order to protect our local treasurers and to encourage giving, be it resolved that the deacons be required to count and recount all offerings before they are turned over to the local treasurer.

— CAMP MEETING RESOLUTIONS —

1. Resolved that all preachers either come, send some one, or pay the equivalent of \$2.00 per day labor for the preparation of the District Camp and Conference when called upon by the District Superintendent.

2. Resolved that the District Council appoint some one to be deputized to patrol the camp ground during camp meeting and to be hereafter enforced.

3. Resolved that each church be responsible for six dessert dishes, six glasses or tin cups, one syrup pitcher, one water pitcher, six tea towels, one comfort, and one straw tick for double bed; and that the secretary call the attention of the pastors to this resolution 30 days before camp meeting.

4. Resolved that each pastor present the needs of the camp meeting to his Church and secure donations of fruit and vegetables, beds and bedding; and that the camp meeting committee provide a truck to be sent at the beginning of camp meeting to the various churches whose donations would justify the expense.

5. The District Superintendent shall present the needs of canned fruits, vegetables, meats, etc., for the District Camp Meeting to each Local Church, at least once during the year.

6. Resolved that no single young person shall be allowed off the ground after 7:00 p. m., without permission from parents or the one under whom they work, and they shall be expected to attend Young People's and night services.

7. Each pastor shall secure during the year not fewer than five new members for the Charleston Camp Meeting Association.

8. We recommend that the Young People's Rally be held the first Friday night and Saturday of the Camp Meeting.

9. Resolved that we express our thanks to the Keith Bakery, Charleston Courier, and others for their donations and that a copy of this resolution be sent to each by the Secretary.

10. All working for their meals at Camp Meeting shall pay a registration fee of \$1.00, at which time they will be given a workers badge to be displayed at all times.

11. We recommend that receptacles for trash be placed in convenient places on the camp ground.

12. Resolved that this conference give a rising vote of thanks to those who made it possible, by work or support, for us to have our splendid dormitory for this camp meeting.

**REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED
BY THE CONFERENCE**

1. Since the General Conference has adopted the Budget System of administering the finances of the General Church, we strongly urge all local boards to adopt the Budget System for administering the finances of their respective local churches, namely: Each church in this District shall raise an amount equal to 60 cents per member for General Home Missions, 50 cents per member for General Administration expense, and \$1.90 per member for Foreign Missions, the same to include money raised for Foreign Missions by the Sunday School, etc.

2. We recommend that each pastor be given a stipulated amount for his support and that at the respective annual meetings each church shall decide what financial support they will pay their pastor during the year.

3. We recommend that the churches be apportioned for District Expense the following amounts annually:

and that the monthly quota be sent to the District Treasurer not later than the 25th of each month.

4. We recommend that the District Superintendent be supported by the ministerial tithes of pastors, evangelists, and other licensed and ordained ministers of the District; said tithes to be paid through the Local Church Treasurer and definitely specified as ministerial tithe.

We recommend further that each church take an offering for the District Superintendent upon each visit.

For traveling expense of the Superintendent, we recommend that he be paid \$7.50 per month from the District Expense Fund and \$7.50 per month from the Home Missionary Fund.

5. We recommend that each church raise an amount equal to 50 cents per member for District Home Missions.

6. Since the District Superintendent is to the District what the pastor is to the church, we recommend that the District Superintendent shall meet with each local church board at the time of his visits and inquire into the spiritual and financial condition of the church and help them in the solution of their various problems.

7. We recommend that this District have a Camp Meeting Committee which shall be appointed by the District Superintendent and their duties to be outlined by the District Council.

8. We recommend that the District Secretary shall act as Camp Meeting Treasurer and be paid the sum of \$15.00 with entertainment during camp; the District Statistician shall be paid \$12.00 and the District Treasurer shall be paid \$50.00 per year for their services.

9. We recommend that each Local Church shall pay into the Camp Meeting Treasury the sum of five dollars for each delegate throughout the Camp and Conference.

10. We recommend that the regular Sunday School offerings on one Sunday per month shall be an offering for Missions and be forwarded to the District Treasurer for that purpose.

11. We recommend that an annual report sheet of the financial condition of each church in relation to the District and General Budgets be prepared by the District Treasurer and be posted within the next District Conference bar.

12. Inasmuch as our General Conference convenes every four years, we recommend that ten per cent of the District Expense Fund be reserved, each year, for the General Conference Expense.

13. We recommend that where parsonages are not equipped with heating device that provisions be made for same by local church.

14. We recommend that our Camp Meeting date be changed, to begin the first Friday in August of each year.

15. We recommend that the deacons or deaconesses arrange for a monthly donation for the pastor, such donation to be announced publicly.

16. We recommend that each church grant its pastor a two weeks vacation with salary, but that he absent himself from the pulpit one Sunday only.

17. We recommend that all who rent rooms during camp be advised to bring their own bedding.

18. We recommend that we have Ministerial and Young People's Zone Meetings quarterly, and that the District Superintendent appoint a Ministerial Zone Chairman in each zone to work in conjunction with the Young People's Zone Chairman, the District Supt. and the District Executive Secretary of Young People's Work.

19. We recommend that each church provide its parsonage with a telephone, if possible.

20. We recommend that when a new work is definitely planned and financial support is needed, that the District Superintendent be authorized to issue a "call" to each local church through its pastor, asking for \$1.00 per person from all those who are able and willing to contribute to the said new work. The number of calls shall not exceed three per year.
