JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

First Sitting

The Twenty-Fifth Annual Conference of the Illinois District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at the Charleston camp grounds, August 11, 1947, at 9:00 A. M., with General Superintendent, Rev. L. W. Sturk in the chair.

Mrs. Lydia Johnson led the Conference in singing, "Blessed Assurance". We were led to the Throne of Grace by Brother Robert Bell.

Brother Sturk brought greetings from the "Official Family" of our church, Rev. Wm. H. Neff, Rev. A. H. Wilson, Rev. S. M. Stikeleather, Rev. E. V. Halt, Rev. R. G. Flexon, Rev. R. A. Beltz, Rev. Paul Elliot, and Rev. Paul Thomas. After which he brought a stirring message from the second chapter of Acts, speaking on the subject, "Some of the things upon which the success of our church depends."

The congregation sang a portion of the song, "Amazing Grace."

The Secretary called the roll.

A motion carried to seat Mrs. Elmer Waltrip as delegate from Bridgeport inasmuch as there was no other delegate present.

Motion prevailed to seat Herman Lashbrook as Casey delegate and Mrs. Johnson as Onarga delegate in the absence of their delegates.

A Motion carried to have the platform and the first eight seats in the two center sections constitute the Conference bar.

Motion made and supported that the time of meeting be from 8:30 A. M. to 11:30 A. M. The afternoon sitting to convene at the call of the chair until 5:00 P. M., and the evening sitting be from 7:00 to 9:00 P. M.

The District Superintendent appointed James Cunningham and

Charles Riggs as Reception Committee.

Motion carried to recess for five minutes.

The District Superintendent read his report. Motion carried to accept.

The Auditor's report was read and accepted.

The Reception Committee introduced the following persons to the Conference: Rev. and Mrs. W. E. Catey, District Superintendent of Central District; Rev. and Mrs. Leadingham, Kentucky District; Rev. Norval Rickner, Ohio District; and Rev. Stogdill of the Nazarene Church.

The Motion prevailed to give them an honorary seat within the Conference bar.

The District Treasurer's report was read and approved.

The Statistical report was given. Motion carried to accept.

The Camp Meeting Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

A partial report of the joint meeting of the Educational and Examining Boards was read and accepted.

Motion prevailed to extend the time until the noon bell.

The following persons were introduced to the Conference: Rev. and Mrs. Ben Colen, Rev. Louis Ford, and Rev. Jesse Carrell.

Motion carried that they be given an honorary seat within the Conference Bar.

A partial report of the Ways and Means Committee was read.

A motion was made and seconded to have the election of officers as soon as all matters pertaining to the election is out of the way.

The Conference adjourned by expiration of time. Brother Catey offered prayer.

Second Sitting

The Conference re convened at 2:00 with Brother Everett Ashley leading the congregation in singing, "What a friend we have in Jesus." Prayer by Brother Calloway.

Motion carried to dispense with the roll call.

The minutes of the previous sitting were read and approved.

Rev. Chester Wilkins of the Indiana District was introduced to the Conference.

The Ways and Means Committee gave a further report.

The final report of the joint meeting of the Educational and Examining Boards was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).

Motion carried to ratify the action of the District Council to receive Rev. Chester Wilkins into the Conference on credentials.

The District Superintendent appointed Brothers Bell, Kettwig, Lancaster and Riggs as tellers.

Motion prevailed to grant Mrs. J. W. Hancock a seat within the Conference bar with the privilege to vote inasmuch as she is a member of the Resolutions Committee.

The Conference bar was cleared.

After a season of prayer for Divine guidance the Conference proceeded with the election of officers.

Rev. H. J. Beecher was re-elected as District Superintendent.

Rev. Sylvan Calloway was re-elected as Assistant District Superintendent.

Rev. D. M. Horn was re-elected as District Secretary.

Rev. J. W. Hancock was elected as District Treasurer and Statistician.

Ballots were cast for the three additional members of the District Council. Rev. Ashley and Rev. Riggs received sufficient number of votes for election.

Motion prevailed that the Ordination service be at 7:00.

Motion carried to excuse Brothers Cohen, Grafton, Johnson, Kettwig, Ross, and Wilcke because of sickness and pressing obligations.

The Conference adjourned.

Third Sitting

The third sitting opened with Rev. Burtle Evans leading the Conference in singing, "At the Battle's Front."

Arrangements were made and an Ordination Service was held with Rev. L. W. Sturk, Rev. H. J. Beecher, Rev. W. E. Catey, Rev. James Cunningham, Rev. D. M. Horn, and Rev. Parker Husselton constituting the Ordination Council. Rev. Sylvan Calloway was duly ordained. The service was concluded with the Conference joining in singing "Bless be the Tie."

Motion carried to set aside the election of officers for the present for some other business before the General Superintendent has to leave the Conference.

The final report of the Ways and Means Committee was read and accepted. (Printed in Reports).

In response to a request by the District Superintendent the Conference gave a hearty "God Bless You" in appreciation to our General Superintendent Rev. L. W. Sturk and his presence with us.

As it was necessary for Brother Sturk to leave he was asked to sing. He sang a portion of each of the songs, "Amazing Grace" and "I'll not have to cross Jordan alone" to the enjoyment of all.

Rev. Leadingham as representative from the General Church presented the "Pension Plan" to the Conference. Discussion followed.

Motion prevailed that we co-operate with the General Church in the "Pension Plan" and give the Ministers and Churches of this district, who wish to, the privilege to participate.

Ballots were cast and Rev. Parker Husselton was elected as final member of the District Council.

A motion prevailed to recess for five minutes.

Rev. Elmor Hanna was elected to serve as District Trustee for three years and Rev. F. E. Glendening for one year in the place of the unexpired term of Rev. W. E. Catey.

The Conference ratified the nominations of the Council for members to serve on the remaining Boards and Committees. (See the Official Directory).

A report of the Resolutions Committee was read and approved. (Printed in Reports).

The report of the Stationing Committee was read.

A motion prevailed that the Conference stand in a vote of appreciation to Brother and Sister Catey and Brother Cunningham who are leaving the district.

Motion carried to adjourn. Rev. Sylvan Calloway dismissed the Conference with prayer.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE

1. Inasmuch as there has been a failure on the part of some of our pastors in carrying out some of the resolutions of the District Conference; therefore, be it resolved that if any pastor shall fail to carry out any resolution as passed by the District Conference he shall be denied both voice and vote in the following District Conference unless he shows just cause.

2.(a) Be it resolved that in accordance with the request of the General Church Sunday School committee, a District Sunday School committee be appointed by the District Council, and that this committee shall give a report to the District Conference.

(b) Be it resolved that a banner be given each quarter to the Sunday School that has the largest attendance and that a banner also be given to the Sunday School that has the highest percentage of increase in attendance over the preceding quarter.

(c) Be it resolved that each Sunday School shall send a quarterly report to the District Sunday School Secretary immediately following the

last Sunday of the quarter. Failure to do so—the dog house!

(d) Be it resolved that each church make an earnest effort to double their average attendance during the following year. The churches reaching this goal shall be awarded a special certificate and commendation at the next District Conference.

3. Be it resolved that all local ministers shall meet with the Educational Board and all licensed ministers shall meet with the Educational and Examining Boards not later than last Saturday of the camp meeting.

4. Resolved that all our evangelists and ministers arrange their slates and work so as not to conflict with the camp and conference. Be it further resolved that each pastor shall have the privilege of holding one revival off his charge with regular salary provided he supply his pulpit satisfactorily in his absence.

5. Resolved that the District Secretary be instructed to have 500 copies of these minutes printed within 30 days after the close of the annual conference.

6. The District Superintendent shall keep in touch with the pastors, reminding them of the plans of this Conference, encouraging and helping them in carrying out said plans.

7. Each pastor shall maintain a calling list, using a card filing system which shall be the property of each succeeding pastor and the expense of same shall be borne by the local church.

8.(a) Resolved that the Conference Year shall end with June 30th each year and all business transacted between that and the Annual Conference shall be included in the following year's report. Also the Conference year shall be divided into four quarters ending with the following dates respectively: First Quarter, July 1st to September 30th; Second Quarter, October 1st to December 31st; Third Quarter, January 1st to March 31st; Fourth Quarter, April 1st to June 30th.

(b) Be it further resolved that a quarterly meeting be held in each church within ten days following the close of each quarter, at which time reports covering the quarter shall be heard and then copied in the Church Secretary's book and mailed to the District Superintendent.

(c) Resolved that all annual reports be mailed to the District Statistician by July 10h.

9. Resolved that all of our preachers and laity secure respectively, a copy of the Church Manual and the District Conference Minutes, and shall read and study the same until they are able to understand and carry out all of their provisions and requirements.

10(a) Resolved that each pastor shall keep a record of all subscribers to the Advocate in each neighborhood where he pastors and shall, about thirty days before each subscription expires, endeavor to secure a renewal of the same.

(b) Be it further resolved that each pastor shall endeavor to secure in each town or community in which his regular appointments are located, a sufficient number of subscriptions to the Advocate to cause the total number of subscribers of each community to be equal in number to 50% of the membership of the respective churches.

11. Resolved that the revision of the church membership rolls shall be made prior to the respective annual church meetings.

12. Resolved that this Conference require its Ministerial members to attend the Conference and Camp Meeting. They shall be present on the first day and remain to the close. Each church shall keep up the salary of its pastor during Camp Meeting. If any minister does not attend he shall send a report of his work and an excuse for his absence. If he fails to do so for two consecutive years he shall be disciplined.

13. Resolved that the District Secretary shall notify in writing all of the members of this conference who have failed to meet the requirements of the foregoing rule No. 12, calling their attention to such failure and the penalty for the same at least thirty days before our next conference.

14. Resolved that the pastor shall be responsible for the accuracy and condition of all church records, and of all quarterly and annual reports.

15. Resolved that the books of the course of study not now possessed

by the examiners shall be purchased by the District for their use. The books shall remain the property of the District and the examiners using the same shall be responsible for their preservation and shall reimburse the District if the books are damaged or lost through their neglect.

16. Be it resolved that the District Council name the District Young People's Officers and Zone Chairmen not later than Wednesday of Camp Meeting each year.

17. Be it resolved that the Zone Chairmen be expected to visit each church in his zone at least once during the Conference year in the interest of the Young People's Work. Since there are so many churches in the Central Zone we recommend that co-chairmen for this zone be named by the District Council.

18. Be it resolved that a special Young People's report blank be prepared by our District Secretary and District Young People's Executive Secretary, to be mailed along with the regular quarterly report blanks to each local church. The said special blanks to be filled out and mailed to the Executive Secretary to keep him informed as to the progress of the local Young People's Societies.

19. Be it resolved that our Young People's Committees be empowered to provide their own legislation upon the approval of the District Council.

20. Be it resolved that because of the present trend of this immodest age, our ministers and the laity be admonished to carry out the special rules of our Manual page 49, section 65.

21. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent be authorized to appoint all standing committees not otherwise provided for and to fill any vacancies occurring in them from time to time.

22. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent devote at least eleven months of his time to the District work.

23. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent or the Assistant Superintendent be consulted and, if possible, present when drawing up all deeds in the District.

24. Be it resolved that we have a quarterly Ministerial Zone meeting. The Zone Chairman to be appointed by the District Superintendent.

25. Be it resolved that a joint Ministerial, Sunday School, and Young People's Convention be held the first Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of June on the camp ground. The plans to be worked out by the District Council and the committees.

CAMP MEETING RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that all preachers either come, send one, or pay the equivalent of \$2.00 per day labor for the preparation of the District Camp and Conference when called upon by the District Superintendent.

2. Be it resolved that the District Superintendent appoint the various camp meeting committees and said chairman of each committee be authorized to purchase the necessities of his department under the direction of the District Superintendent.

3. Be it resolved that the District Council appoint some one to be deputized to patrol the camp ground during meeting and to be hereafter enforced.

4. Be it resolved that the pastors and the District Supt. present the needs of the camp meeting to the churches, and that each church be responsible for six dessert dishes, six heavy glasses, one blanket or comfort, one straw tick, three each of plates, knives, forks, and spoons and to secure donations of fruit and vegetables.

5. Be it resolved that no single young person shall be allowed off the ground after 7:00 p. m. without permission from parents or the one under whom they work and they shall be expected to attend Young People's and night services.

6. Be it resolved that each pastor shall secure during the year not fewer than five new members for the Charleston Camp Meeting Association.

7. Be it resolved that receptacles for trash be placed in convenient places on the camp grounds.

8. Inasmuch as so many children are on our grounds throughout the camp meeting; therefore, be it resolved that special services be held for them.

9. Inasmuch as so many people bring their lunch during the camp meeting; therefore, be it resolved that wayside tables be made and placed in convenient places on the grounds for their accomodation.

10. Be it resolved that we express our thanks to the Mattoon Baking Co., Charleston Courier, The A & P Store, the Meadow Gold Dairy, the Charleston Ice Company, and the Palmer Battery Shop, and that our secretary convey the same to them.

11. Be it resolved that all who rent rooms during camp be advised to bring their own bedding.

12. Be it resolved that when one has reserved a room or rooms that they notify the chairman of the entertainment committee not later than Wednesday prior to the beginning date of the camp as to when they expect to arrive and if not heard from by first Friday of camp their room may be rented to another.

13. Be it resolved that our Camp Meeting date be as follows, to begin the first Friday in August of each year.

14. We recommend that all working for their meals at camp meeting shall pay a registration fee of \$1.00, at which time they shall be given a worker's ticket.

15. We recommend that the Camp Meeting Committee have a Registration and Information sign made for the Office and that all campers, upon arrival, be requested to register their names and addresses and arrange for meals and lodging.

16. We recommend that each church be requested to furnish a bed and springs for the camp.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE

1. Since the General Conference has adopted the budget system of administering the finances of the General Church, we strongly urge all local boards to adopt the budget system for administering the finances of their respective local churches, namely: Each church in this District shall raise an amount equal to \$1.00 per member for General Home Missions, \$1.00 per member for General Administration expense and \$2.00 per member for Foreign Missions, the same to include money raised for Missions by the Sunday School, etc.

2. We recommend that each pastor be given a stipulated amount for his support and that at the respective annual meetings each church shall decide upon a minimum financial support they will pay their pastor during the year.

3. We recommend that the District Budget consist of 10% of all regular Church, Sunday School, and Young People's offerings except that raised for Missions, General Budget, building funds, rents, and evangelists, and that the District Budget be prorated as follows: District Expense Fund, 75%; District Home Missions, 20%; General Conference Expense, 3%; and Frankfort Bible School, 2%.

4. We recommend that all pastors, District evangelists, and other licensed and ordained ministers of the District tithe their income into the local church of which they are a member.

5. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$2,600.00 per year and 5c per mile traveling expense. The District Council further recommends that \$400.00 be transferred from the District Expense Fund to District Home Missions.

6. Since the District Superintendent is to the District what the pastor is to the church, we recommend, that the District Superintendent shall meet with each local church board at the time of his visits and inquire into the spiritual and financial condition of the church and help them in the solution of their various problems; we further recommend, that the duties of the District Superintendent, as outlined by the

District Council, be printed in the minutes.

7. We recommend that the District Superintendent title his salary into the District Treasury to be credited to the District Expense Fund.

8. We recommend that the District Secretary shall act as camp meeting treasurer and be paid the sum of \$45.00 per year. We further recommend that the District Treasurer shall act as District Statistician and be paid the sum of \$125 00 per year.

9. We recommend that each local church shall pay into the Camp Meeting Treasury the sum of \$5.00 for each delegate attending the Camp and Conference and this is to include board and lodging.

10. We recommend that the regular Sunday School offering on one Sunday per month shall be an offering for Missions, the same to be forwarded by the local church treasurer to the District treasurer.

11. We recommend that where parsonages are not equipped with heating device that provisions be made for the same by the local church.

12. We recommend that each church grant its pastor a two weeks vacation with salary.

13. We recommend that each church provide its parsonage with a telephone if possible.

14. We recommend that the Assistant District Superintendent be paid the sum of \$7.00 per day, plus 4c per mile traveling expenses while rendering services for the District.

15. We recommend that the dormitory rooms rent as follows: first floor, \$4.00; second floor, \$3.00; and third floor, \$1.50 per cot.

16. We recommend that each local and licensed minister taking his or her examination shall pay the examiner the amount of \$1.00 for each examination taken.

17. We recommend that District Letter Heads be printed; the amount to be decided by the District Secretary.

18. We recommend that each Zone take an offering for the District Young People's Executive upon each visit.

19. We recommend that each member of the District be asked to contribute \$1.00 per year for camp meeting expense

20. We recommend that an Editor be appointed by the District Council and that he be authorized to publish a Quarterly Bulletin; one page to be given to the District Treasurer's report; one page to the District Sunday School work; and the other pages to the work of District Home Missions, Young People's work, and other District interests.

DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To the Twenty-Fifth Annual Conference of the Illinois District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, Greetings: Grace be unto you and peace from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

This past year has been one of such a peculiar and strenuous nature that I hardly know how to report. Peculiar in a large measure because of the shortage of pastors. Immediately following camp I supplied Springfield church five consecutive Sundays, giving them one and sometimes two services, but it has gloriously paid. I kept urging the saints to pray and in answer God sent the right one in the person of Brother Pearl Poe who first conducted a five weeks revival and the church has been in a revival tide since. From a mere handful to begin with they are now running over 100 in Sunday School and are supporting their pastor well.

The Captain of the Host of Israel has been with us. The power of His presence has been over and round about us. Good and profitable revivals prevailed throughout the District. The pastors are to be commended for their heroic efforts to build up their Sunday Schools and to get people to God.

As a District, I believe we are becoming more Sunday School minded and I also feel the work of our Young People is intensified with good results but we have been too slack and indifferent concerning our own District Home Missionary needs, however, it appears now that the tide is beginning to turn. We rejoice in the good response of the District Home Missionary offering during this camp. Jesus said to a certain man, "Go home and tell what great things the Lord hath done for thee." We dare not neglect our home base.

The change of our financial set up is getting under way well and I would recommend its continuation. Possibly some slight improvements will be made by our Ways and Means Committee.

I have constantly visited the churches always trying to go and do that which was most needed. I have wrestled in prayer and held lengthy consultations trying to solve the many problems. Much of my time has been given to the mending of broken threads. Jesus said, "Because iniquity shall abound the love of many shall wax cold." Is this not an inference that our problems will multiply under the shadows of the Great Tribulation?

I have preached 142 times, conducted 27 annual church meetings and at least 56 board meetings. Made 250 visits in homes at which time prayer was made once and sometimes more. Enjoyed the fellowship of the saints and traveled 20,000 miles, 16,250 in the direct interest of the District. Attended two General Board meetings, conducted one ministerial convention, two revivals, one church dedication service, and worked quite a little on the camp grounds.
