#### JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

#### First Sitting

The Thirty-fourth Annual Conference of the Illinois District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Charleston, Illinois, August 13, 1956 at 8:00 a.m.

The Conference opened with Rev. Fred Wagner leading the congregation in singing, "He Brought Me Out." Rev. C. L. Oden offered the opening prayer of the Conference.

Rev. W. E. Hall, District Superintendent, after a few opening remarks, introduced Rev. Melvin Snyder, First Assistant General Superintendent, as chairman of the Conference.

Rev. Snyder, after greeting the Conference, brought an encouraging report of the health of Rev. Wm. Neff, our Genral Superintendent. He then brought a challenging message on the need for a, "Forward Movement."

The Secretary called the roll with 73 answering present.

A motion carried to seat Dwight Henschen as delegate from Lawrence-ville.

A motion prevailed to have the first 10 seats in the two center sections and the platform constitute the Confernce Bar. The bar was cleared.

A motion carried to have the time of meeting to be from 8:00 a. m. to 12:00 a. m., and the afternoon sitting to be from 1:00 p. m. to 5:00 p. m.

The District Superintendent, Rev. W. E. Hall, read his annual report. A motion carried to receive with apprecaition.

The Reception Committee introduced the following ministers to the Conference: Rev. Clifford Richardson, of Ottawa, Illinois; Rev. Phillip Wiley, coming from Washington; Rev. and Mrs. Fred Wagner, coming from Wisconsin; and Rev. Harrod Grove, recently come from Indiana. A motion carried to grant them an honorary seat within the conference bar.

The report of the Auditing Committee was read. A motion carried to receive.

The District Treasurer's report was read. A motion carried to accept. The District Superintendent reported on the pending County Court Campground Tax case. A motion carried to authorize the District Council to use their judgment as to the advisability of appealing the case in the event it is lost.

The District Statistician's report was read and accepted.

The Secretary read a report to the Conference from Rev. K. W. Phipps, President of Frankfort Pilgrim College.

The District Superintendent presented to the Conference the pastors and delegates of the newly organized churches of Mason and Mt. Vernon. They were warmly received into the Conference by motion.

A motion carrid to adjourn until 1:00 p. m.

#### Second Sitting

The second sitting of the Conference convened at 1:00 p. m. Rev. Morris Berry led the congregation in singing, "Amazing Grace", after which Rev. Chester Peterson led in prayer.

A motion carried that a message of condolence be sent to Sister Grace Catev and her family because of the death of Rev. W. E. Catey, our beloved brother in the Lord, who passed away this morning.

Bro. Snyder asked for twelve quotations from the Scriptures, which were given.

The Secretary read the minutes of the previous sitting. A motion carried to accept as read.

A motion was made and supported to dispense with the roll call. Motion carried.

The Camp Meeting Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The District Youth Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

A report of the Resolutions Committee was read and acted upon as follows:

A report of the joint meeting of the Educational and Examining Boards was read. A motion carried to receive.

A report of the Ways and Means Committee was read. (Printed in the reports as adopted.)

A motion carried to recess until 4:05 and that at that time the election of officers be the order of the day.

The chair called the Conference to order. The District Superintendent appointed the following as tellers: B. H. McBride, Harvey Severs, Keith Sheridan, Lewis Russel, Richard Loftis, and Clifford Richardson.

Ballots were cast for District Superintendent. Rev. W. E. Hall was re-elected for two years.

Ballots were cast for Assistant District Superintendent. Rev. L. A. Williams was re-elected.

The Conference adjourned by expiration of time.

#### Third Sitting

The third sitting opened with prayer by Bro. L. S. Lancaster.

Ballots were cast for District Secretary. D. M. Horn was re-elected.

W. C. Beard was re-elected as District Treasurer.

Ballots were cast for the Advisory members of the District Council. L. S. Lancaster, Sylvan Calloway, and Elmer Waltrip were elected.

A motion carried that D. M. Horn serve for 3 years on the Educational Board, and that C. L. Oden serve for 2 years in the place of Bro. Catey.

A motion carried that L. S. Lancaster serve for 3 years on the Examining Board, and that Elmer Waltrip serve for one year in the place of A. O. Cassady.

By acclamation Sylvan Calloway and L. S. Lancaster were re-elected as District Trustees and D. M. Horn was elected to take Bro. Catey's place.

The report of the Memorial Committee was read and received with appreciation. The Conference stood in a moment of silent prayer, after which the chairman, Rev. Melvin Snyder offered prayer for Sr. Catey and family.

A motion carried that in the event of the death of a minister, his wife, his children, or his parents, that flowers be sent from the District; and that the District Superintendent notify the Secretary, who in turn shall notify the ministers of the Conference.

 $\boldsymbol{A}$  motion prevailed that the District Council take care of all unfinished business.

The pastoral appointments were read by the District Superintendent.

A motion carried to give our chairman, Rev. Melvin Snyder, a rising vote of thanks for the splendid and efficient manner in which he conducted the Conference.

A motion carried that we give a rising vote of thanks to Bro. Hall for his faithful service to the District.

A motion carried to adjourn. Rev. Snyder pronounced the benediction.

## REPORT OF THE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE

- 1. Inasmuch as the General Board has ruled that all our District Camps shall provide for Sunday School to be conducted on the Camp Grounds each Sunday of the Camp, Therefore be it resolved, that there shall be a Sunday School service conducted on this Camp Ground each Sunday at the Camp. The Sunday School Committee to be in charge of the same, and that suitable cards of recognition be given to all that attended, denoting their presence at the Camp Sunday School. These cards to be returned to the local Sunday School, thus encouraging a perfect attendance, and that local averages be figured and any awards be given an recognition of the same.
- 2. Be it resolved, that all local ministers shall meet with the Educational Board and all licensed ministers shall meet with the Educational and Examining Boards not later than the last Saturday of the camp meeting.
- 3. Be is resolved, that all pastors and evangelists arrange their work so as not to conflict with the Camp and Conference, and that if any minister does not attend Camp and Conference he shall send a report of his work and an excuse for the absence. If he fails to do so for two consecutive years, he shall be dealt with by the Council.
- 4. Be it resolved, that the Annual Conference election of officers be deferred until all resolutions affecting officers' duties are adopted.
- 5. Be it resolved, that the Conference Year begin July 1st, and end on June 30th of each year, and that all annual reports be mailed to the District Statistician by July 10th.
- 6. Resolved, that all of our preachers and laity secure respectively, a copy of the Church Manual and the District Conference Minutes, and shall read and study the same until they are able to understand and carry out all of their provisions and requirements.
- 7. Be it resolved, that each pastor shall endeavor to bring the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate subscription list up to a number equal to or greater than the membership of the church.
- 8. Resolved, that the revision of the church membership rolls shall be made prior to the respective annual church meetings.
- 9. Inasmuch as books of the course of study have been furnished by the District to the examiners, be it resolved, that the examiners be responsible for the same.
- 10. Be it resolved that the District Council set the time of the Ministerial Convention and that the place be chosen from invitations from the Churches.
- 11. Be is resolved, that because of the present trend of this immodest age, our ministers and the laity be admonished to carry out the special rules of our Manual page 35, section 65.
- 13. Be it resolved, that the District Superintendent be authorized to appoint all standing committees not otherwise provided for and to fill any vacancies occurring in them from time to time.
- 13. Be it resolved, that the District Superintendent devote at least eleven months of his time to the District work.
- 14. Be it resolved, that the District Superintendent or the Assistant Superintendent be consulted and present when drawing up all the deeds in the District.
  - 15. Be it resolved, that the District be zoned as follows:

Northern Zone-Argo, Chicago, Joliet, Ottawa, Streator, and Zion.

North Central Zone—Bloomington, Decatur, Galesburg, Gibson City, Jerseyville, Onarga, Pleasant Hill, Springfield, Tuscola, Woodriver.

South Central Zone—Asbury, Casey, Charleston, Coffeyville, Janesville, Marshall, and Martinsville.

Southern Zone—Bridgeport, Centralia, Lawrenceville, Mason, Mt. Vernon, Oblong, Olney, Palestine, Robinson, and St. Marie.

Be it further resolved, that these boundaries apply to the Ministerial, Youth, and Sunday School Departments.

- Be it further resolved, that the District Superintendent appoint Ministerial and Sunday School Zone Chairmen and that the Zone Chairmen and the District Superintendent be authorized to arrange Zone meetings as they deem advisable, and that a Zone Secretary and Treasurer be elected at the first meeting of the year.
- 16. Whereas it is helpful to a better understanding among our people who contribute to the support of our work and: Whereas the District handles this money as a public trust; Be is resolved, that the District Treasurer give a statement in totals of disbursements in his annual report of District and District Home Missionary funds, the same to be placed in the Conference minutes.
- 17. Be it resolved that this Conference consider the sale of the District parsonage due to its depreciation and that said sale and purchase of another be left in the hands of the District Council.

#### CAMP MEETING RESOLUTIONS

- 1. Be it resolved, that all preachers either come, send one, or pay the equivalent of \$2.00 per day labor for the preparation of the District Camp and Conference when called upon by the District Superintendent.
- 2. Be it resolved, that the conference shall elect a Camp Secretary and a Camp Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be elected from nominees from the Council. The Assistant District Superintendent shall be chairman of this committee and the District Superintendent shall appoint four additional men to serve on this committee. These seven men shall be known as a Camp Meeting Committee, and their names shall be in our official directory as such. It shall be the duty of this committee to supervise and be responsible for the operational or functional work of the Campgrounds, both preparatory to Camp and during Campmeeting. They shall work under the authority of the District Council. Be it further resolved, that in case the Assistant Superintendent cannot serve as chairman that the Council shall fill the vacancy.
- 2. Be it resolved, that the District Council appoint someone to be deputized to patrol the camp ground during the meeting and to be hereafter enforced.
- 4. In the face of the present need, be it resolved that the pastors and the District Superintendent present the needs of th camp meeting to the churches and that each church be responsible for six desert dishes, six heavy glasses, six heavy cups, six dish towels, one blanket, one straw tick, also fruit, jelly and vegetables.
- 5. Be it resolved, that no single young person shall be allowed off the grounds after 7:00 p. m., without special permission from the proper Camp authorities or accompanied by their parents. They shall be required to attend Young People's and night services. Failure to keep this rule may forfeit their privilege of remaining in Camp. There shall be a Dean of Men and a Matron of Women, appointed by the Camp Committee, who shall be responsible for the enforcement of this rule.

Be it further resolved that this resolution be printed and copies given to each one registering.

- 6. Be it resolved, that receptacles for trash be placed in convenient places on the camp grounds.
- 7. Inasmuch as so many children are on our grounds throughout the campmeeting, therefore, be it resolved, that special services be held for them and that the Council secure a children's worker at least 30 days prior to the camp.
- 8. Be it resolved, that the Campmeeting Committee be responsible for the placing of four way-side tables on the campgrounds.
- 9. Be it resolved, that all who rent rooms during camp be advised to bring their own bedding.
- 10. Be it resolved, that all dormitory reservations be declared non-transferable as long as the present holders occupy them. When the holders of said reservations secure lodging elsewhere the former reservations shall

be turned to the camp committee. Those having reservations and those desiring reservations shall write the secretary of the Campmeeting Committee within 30 days and not later than seven days prior to the coming campmeeting.

- 11. Be it resolved, that our Camp Meeting begin the first Friday in August of each year.
- 12. Be it resolved, that all those working for their meals and actively engaged ministers be required to register, at which time they shall be given a meal ticket which must be presented at the entrance of the dining hall. Be it further resolved, the Camp Meeting Committee be responsible for the enforcement of this rule.
- 13. Be it resolved, that all ministers and their wives be available for work during the Camp Meeting. Be it further resolved, that those not working shall be charged a stipulated amount to be set by the Council.
- 14. Be it resolved, that the District Council appoint a Young People's leader to conduct special youth services during camp.
- 15. We recommend that each church be requested to furnish a bed and springs for the camp.
- 16. Be it resolved, that we urge each church that is able to do so build a cottage on the camp ground for their pastor, or pastor and delegate. Be it further resolved that a lot shall be furnished free to each church completing said building prior to our next annual camp. The type and location of said cottage to be agreed upon by the church and the District Council.
- 17. Be it resolved, that our District Council shall have our District Treasurer bonded immediately following this camp, provided the cost is not prohibitive.

## REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE

- 1. We recommend, that in accordance with the new manual, each church in the District shall raise an amount equal to \$6 per member per year for General Budget, to be raised monthly and sent to the District Treasurer. (This amount is pro-rated by the General Treasurer as follows: Forign Missions 35% or \$2.10, General Administration 25% or \$1.50, Church Extension 20% or \$1.20, Senior College 10% or 60 cents, Church Extension Loan Fund 6% or 36 cents, and Sunday School and Youth 4% or 24 cents. This need not be thus divided by the local treasurers.)
- 2. We recommend that each pastor be given a stipulated amount for his support and that at the respective annual meetings each church shall decide upon a minimum financial support they will pay their pastor during the year.
- 3 We recommend that the District Budget consist of 10% of all regular Church, Sunday School, and Youth People's offerings except that raised for Missions, General Budget, building funds, rents and evangelists, and that the District Budget be pro-rated as follows: District Expense Fund, 80%; District Home Missions, 15%; General Conference Expense, 3%; and Frankfort Pilgrim College, 2%.
- 4. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$3,600 per year and 7c per mile traveling expense.
- 5. We recommend that the District Council members, the Home Missionary Committee, and the Camp Meeting Committee be paid the sum of 7c per mile for traveling expense while rendering service for the District.
- 6. We recommend that the District Superintendent give 50% of his tithe into the District Treasury to be credited to the District Expense Fund; 25% of the local church of which he is a member; and 25% as he sees fit throughout the District.
- 7. We recommend that the District Secretary shall act as District Statistician, and be paid the sum of \$75.00 per year. We further recommend that the District Treasurer be paid the sum of \$240.00 per year.
- 8. We recommend that each local church shall pay into the Camp Meeting Treasury the sum of \$10.00 for each delegate attending the Camp and Conference and this is to include board and room.

- 9. We recommend that where parsonages are not equipped with heating devices that provisions be made for the same by the local church.
- 10. We recommend that each church grant its pastor a two weeks vacation with salary, which shall include two Sunday.
- 11. We recommend that each church provide its parsonage with a telephone.
- 12. We recommend that the Assistant District Superintendent, in the absence of the District Superintendent, be paid the sum of \$10.00 per day, plus 7c per mile traveling expenses while rendering services for the District or Camp Meeting.
- 13. We recommend that the dormitory rooms rent as follows: first floor, \$4.50; second floor, \$3.50 and third floor, \$1.50 per cot.
- 14. We recommend that each local and licensed minister taking his or her examination shall pay the examiner the amount of \$1.00 for each examination taken.
- 15. We recommend that District Letter Heads be printed the amount to be decided by the District Secretary.
- 16. We recommend that the District Council appoint a District Home Missionary Committee of three, and the District Superintendent act as chairman. We further recommend that the expense of this Committee be paid from the District Home Missionary fund while rendering any service to the Home Missionary Work.
- 17. We recommend that the churches of this District be asked to contribute the amount of \$2 per year per member to meet the indebtedness of the District parsonage.
- 18. Whereas there is a definite need for funds to be placed at the disposal of the District Sunday School program; We recommend that each Sunday School in the District be asked to send the Sunday School Promotional Secretary the amount of \$3 (three dollars) for this work, immediately following the District Conference.
- 19. We recommend that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary be paid a salary of \$30.00 per year. The salary shall be raised from the Sunday School Conventions.
- 20. We recommend that the District Treasurer pay utilities at the District parsonage, consisting of lights, gas, fuel, water, and telephone.
- 21. We recommend that the District Treasurer pay all the postage expense of the District Superintendent.
- 22. Whereas the Loan Fund has proved to be such a blessing in the General Church Extension Department, and other Districts have likewise been helped in the promotion of Home Missions; we therefore recommend that we set up a District Loan Fund. We also recommend that funds from wills, gifts, legacies, etc., be placed in this fund. We further recommend that the District Council or a Committee be appointed to formulate rules and by-laws governing this fund. Rate of interest and churches to which loans are made and all business be delegated to said Council of Committee. (We recommend 3% interest.)
- 23. We recommend that a fee of \$3.00 per adult person be charged for those who attend the District Ministerial Convention.
- 24. We recommend the District Council buy a new P. A. system for the Camp and that a booth be built to place it in.

#### REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the chairman, Rev. M. H. Snyder, ministers and lay delegates of this 34th annual conference of Illinois district of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, greetings.

We are grateful to God for the good Camp meeting held prior to this conference. Many have been the blessings He has bestowed upon us this year. Many problems have come our way, but our trust in the God of Elijah has brought us through. Yes the great field of the State of Illinois is a great challenge to our faith. Can we not hear the cry, "No man careth for my Soul"? Let us be workers together for the work of the Lord.

#### Home Missions

At our last district conference we engaged Rev. A. O. Cassady to do home missionary work, opening up new work and helping to strengthen the weaker places. He held a revival at Gibson City. Soon after this he asked to be released from the Home Missionary work in the District. Then we engaged Rev. and Mrs. Wm. McFarlin to go to Mason for a meeting and to carry on as pastor for awhile. On March 2 we organized a church here and Rev. Chester Parker was placed as pastor. Later Rev. and Mrs. McFarlin conducted a revival at Gibson City. The Home Missionary Committee visited several places in interest of the District. The field is truly white unto harvest.

#### **New Churches**

As stated above in my report we organized a new Pilgrim Holiness Church at Mason, Ill., with 18 Charter members. We are thanking God for the good people there.

Also we organized a new church at Mt. Vernon, Ill., with seven members. More have been added since it was organized. This was one of our Home Missionary projects of last year. There are other places that we feel we will have a Pilgrim Holiness church in the near future.

#### Property Improvements

ARGO: We have paid off all indebtedness total of \$2680.00, new pews have been purchased, refinished the church floor, iron bannisters at rear of church steps, redecorated parsonage inside, a new dining room suite and a bed room suite with several other items for the parsonage has been purchased at an estimated cost of \$3842.28.

BRIDGEPORT: At this time the folks at Bridgeport are in the process of building a new church. The blocks are being laid and much of the work has been done. The need for a larger place of worship is great here.

CHICAGO: A portable tabernacle 24'x32' has been erected on rear of lot. The need for a place of worship here is great. The tabernacle is expected to be finished soon after conference.

CENTRALIA: A new roof has been put on the church building also the front porch of the parsonage has been repaired.

DECATUR: A conversion burner from coal to gas for the parsonage, valves in sewer to stop back water in church and parsonage basements has been installed. Guttering has been put on the parsonage, redecorated church vestibule, new roof on half of church and new hymnals have been donated to the church. The estimated cost is \$500.00.

GALESBURG: The church has been redecorated inside, new porch, repair of balcony, insulated siding being put on parsonage and also being insulated. A gas conversion burner in furnace of parsonage. An estimated cost with donated labor, \$650.00.

MARTINSVILLE: The church has been painted on the outside.

MASON: Our newly organized church has been redecorated. The church floors sanded and some good used pews have been purchased.

LAWRENCEVILLE: A new roof has been put on the church and parsonage. Also the parsonage has been revamped and new floors.

ONARGA: A new sub floor and tile has been put down in the church, also tile has been put down in two rooms of parsonage.

OTTAWA: The church basement has been revamped making more Sunday School rooms. Also some good used pews have been purchased. The estimated cost of \$1,600.00.

PALESTINE: The indebtedness of \$5,900.00 has been paid off on the church. We had a dedication service for the new addition to the church and a mortgage-burning service.

PLEASANT HILL: We have built a two room cottage on the church grounds, painted the church and now in process of turning the church around to face new road and put basement under it.

ZION: We have purchased a large house and property for parsonage. We are at this time using a large garage building for our services. This is only temporary.

WOODRIVER: We finished some more Sunday School rooms at an estimated cost of \$150.00.

SPRINGFIELD: We have installed a gas conversion burner in furnace of the church. Also the basement has been revamped to give more room for the Sunday School.

CAMP GROUND: A new six room cottage for our Camp workers has been built, at an estimated cost of \$2,000.00.

DISTRICT PARSONAGE: A new furnace has been installed, house rewired, and redecorated the outside with insulated siding at an estimated cost of \$1,200.00.

#### Personal Report

I have preached 110 times, conducted 10 District Council Meetings, attended two General Board Meetings, several Zone Rallies, several School Board Meetings at Frankfort, Ind. conducted two Revivals, also several weekend meetings. Conducted one Ministerial Convention, several Ministerial Zone Rallies. Had one Dedication Service and a Mortgage-Burning. Conducted several Communion Services and held one District Youth business meeting.

Twenty-one seeking regeneration, five seeking sanctification. I have traveled 32,397 miles in district interests. I have received my salary, traveling expenses and some gifts and donations. I have also conducted all of the annual business meetings, had the over-sight of the Annual District Camp Meeting.


