First Sitting

The Thirty-fifth Annual Conference of the Illinois District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Charleston, Illinois, August 12, 1957 at 8:00 a.m.

The Conference was opened by the Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. L. A. Williams, with Rev. C. L. Oden leading the congregation in singing the songs, "Draw Me Nearer," and "The Solid Rock." Rev. Clyde Moreillon offered the opening prayer of the Conference.

The Conference sang, "I Need Thee Every Hour," after which several testimonies were given.

Rev. W. E. Hall, District Superintendent, after a few opening remarks, introduced Rev. Melvin Snyder, First Assistant General Superintendent, as chairman of the Conference.

Rev. Snyder, after greeting the Conference, spoke words of commendation of the General Superintendent and of the improved state of his health. He then brought a challenging message on, "The Major Problem of our Growth," reading the Scripture from the tenth chapter of Luke.

The Secretary called the roll with 78 answering present.

A motion carried to seat Mrs. Wm. Seeley as delegate from the Coffeyville Church.

A motion carried to seat Virgil Nettleton as delegate from Gibson City.

A motion prevailed to have the first 10 sects in the two center rections and the platform constitute the Conference Bar. The bar was cleared.

A motion carried to have the time of meeting to be from 8:00 a. m. to 12:00 a. m., the afternoon sitting to be from 1:00 p. m. to 5:00 p. m., and that this be a standing rule of the Conference.

The Reception Committee introduced to the Conference, J. R. Robertson, of Wichita, Kansas, and Sister A. H. Wilson of Montpelier, Ind., widow of one of our former First Assistant General Superintendents. They each spoke words of testimony to the Conference after which the motion prevailed to grant each an honorary seat within the Conference bar.

The District Superintendent, Rev. W. E. Hall, read his annual report. A motion carried to receive.

The District Treasurer's report was read. A motion carried to accept. The Camp Meeting Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

A partial report of the District Statistician was read.

The Conference adjourned by expiration of time.

Second Sitting

The second sitting of the Conference convened at 1:00 p. m. Rev. W. C. Beard led the congregation in singing, "'Tis So Sweet to Trust In Jesus," after which Rev. William Pratt led in prayer.

The final report of the Stastician was read and a motion carried to receive.

The Assistant District Superintendent, L. A. Williams, gave an oral report which was accepted.

The Reception Committee introduced Rev. Clyde Moreillon and Vernon Munson to the Conference. Upon request they each gave a word of testimony. A motion prevailed that Bro. Munson be given an honorary seat within the Conference bar.

The report of the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary was given. A motion carried to accept.

A partial report of the Resolutions Committee was read and adopted.

A partial report of the Ways and Means Committee was read.

The Conference recessed until the call of the chair.

The final report of the Ways and Means Committee was read. (Printed in the reports as adopted.)

The report of the joint meeting of the Educational and Examining Boards was read. A motion carried to receive.

The report of the Memorial Committee was read and received with appreciation. The Conference stood in a moment of silent prayer, after which the chairman, Rev. Melvin Snyder, offered prayer. Bro. Close gave an expression of appreciation to the many who had prayed and extended sympathy, and praise to God for his help in the time of their sorrow in the loss of their daughter Beverly.

The final report of the Resolutions Committee was given. (Printed in the reports as adopted.)

The meeting adjourned by expiration of time.

Third Sitting

The third sitting opened by singing, "My Jesus I Love Thee." Prayer by D. M. Horn.

A final report of the Memorial Committee was read.

The proposition of the University's desire to purchase the Camp ground was discussed.

A motion carried that the Conference go on record that we do not want to sell the Camp property.

A motion carried to re-instate F. E. Glendening as an ordained minister of the Conference.

The District Superintendent appointed the following as tellers: Eura Bailey, Lewis Russel, Keith Sheridan, Richard Loftis, Floyd Myer, and Troyd Carter.

Ballots were cast for Assistant District Superintendent. Rev. L. A. Williams was re-elected.

Ballots were cast for District Secretary. D. M. Horn was re-elected.

W. C. Beard was re-elected as District Treasurer.

Ballots were cast and the following were elected as advisory members of the District Council: L. S. Lancaster, D. R. Close, and C. L. Oden.

A motion carried to vote for the Examining Board member by acclamation.

After some discussion a motion prevailed to rescind the former action and vote by ballot. Ballots were cast and Elmer Waltrip was elected to the Examining Board for three years.

W. C. Beard was elected to the Educational Board for three years.

A motion carried to ratify the nominations of the District Superintendent, Sylvan Calloway, L. S. Lancaster, and D. M. Horn, for District Board of Trustees.

Upon receiving a telegram, stating the serious condition of Doris Anderson and a request for prayer, the Conference went to earnest prayer in her behalf.

Ballots were cast and C. L. Oden was elected as Camp Treasurer, and Elmer Waltrip as Camp Secretary.

A motion carried to authorize the District Council to take care of any unfinished business and approve the minutes.

A motion carried that the delegates and the alternate delegates to the General Conference be chosen by plurality vote. Ballots were cast and the following were elected:

Ministerial Delegates-W. H. Pratt, Sylvan Calloway, D. R. Close, L. S. Lancaster, C. L. Oden, and Myrtle Rogers.

Ministerial Alternate Delegates-Elva Lancaster, Floyd Dunn, Charles Riggs, and Elmer Waltrip.

Lay Delegates-Kenneth Roller, and Jerrel Adams.

Lay Alternate Delegates-James Heath and Leonard Holt.

Arrangements were made and an Ordination service was held, with First Assistant General Superintendent, Rev. Melvin Snyder, giving the Ordination message, and W. E. Hall, L. A. Williams, D. M. Horn, W. C. Beard, and L. S. Lancaster, constituting the rest of the Ordination Council. Clif-ford Richardson and Philip Wiley were duly ordained. The Conference approved the appointment of the various committees.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTION COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE

1. Inasmuch as the General Board has ruled that all our District Camps shall provide for Sunday School to be conducted on the Camp Grounds each Sunday of the Camp, Therefore be it resolved, that there shall be a Sunday School service conducted on this Camp Ground each Sunday at the Camp. The Sunday School Committee to be in charge of the same, and that suitable cards of recognition be given to all that attended, denoting their presence at the Camp Sunday School. These cards to be returned to the local Sunday School, thus encouraging a perfect attendance, and that local averages be figured and any awards be given an recognition of the same.

2. Be it resolved, that all local ministers shall meet with the Educational Board and all licensed ministers shall meet with the Educational and Examining Boards not later than the last Saturday of the camp meeting.

3. Be is resolved, that all pastors and evangelists arrange their work so as not to conflict with the Camp and Conference, and that if any minister does not attend Camp and Conference he shall send a report of his work and an excuse for the absence. If he fails to do so for two consecutive years, he shall be dealt with by the Council.

4. Be it resolved, that the Conference Year begin July 1, and end on June 30 of each year, and that all annual reports be mailed to the District Statistician by July 10.

5. Be it resolved, that the time of the sittings of the District Conference be from 8:00 a. m. to 12:00 a. m., and the afternoon sitting be from 1:00 p. m. to 5:00 p. m.

6. Be it resolved that the first 10 seats in the two center sections and the platform of the tabernacle constitute the Conference Bar.

7. Be it resolved, that the Annual Conference election of officers be deferred until all resolutions affecting officers' duties are adopted.

8. Resolved, that all of our preachers and laity secure respectively, a copy of the Church Manual and the District Conference Minutes, and shall read and study the same until they are able to understand and carry out all of their provisions and requirements.

9. Be it resolved, that each pastor shall endeavor to bring the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate subscription list up to a number equal to or greater than the membership of the church.

10. Resolved, that the revision of the church membership rolls shall be made prior to the respective annual church meetings.

11. Inasmuch as books of the course of study have been furnished by the District to the examiners, be it resolved, that the examiners be responsible for the same.

12. Be it resolved that the District Council set the time of the Ministerial Convention and that the place be chosen from invitations from the Churches.

13. Be is resolved, that because of the present trend of this immodest age, our ministers and the laity be admonished to carry out the special rules of our Manual page 35, section 65.

14. Be it resolved, that the District Superintendent be authorized to ar point all standing committees not otherwise provided for and to fill any vacancies occurring in them from time to time.

15. Be it resolved, that the District Superintendent devote at least eleven months of his time to the District work.

16. Be it resolved, that the District Superintendent or the Assistant Superintendent be consulted and present when drawing up all the deeds in the District.

17. Be it resolved, that the District be zoned and that the boundaries apply to the Ministerial, Youth, and Sunday School Departments. Be it further resolved, that the District Superintendent appoint Ministerial and Sunday School Zone Chairmen and that the Zone Chairmen and the District Superintendent be authorized to arrange Zone meetings as they deem advisable, and that a Zone Secretary and Treasurer be elected at the first meeting of the year. 18. Be is resolved that we set a goal of 5% increase in our Sunday Schools for the ensuing year.

19. Whereas it is helpful to a better understanding among our people who contribute to the support of our work and: Whereas the District handles this money as a public trust; Be is resolved, that the District Treasurer give a statement in totals of disbursements in his annual report of District and District Home Missionary funds, the same to be placed in the Conference minutes.

20. Be it resolved that this Conference consider the sale of the District parsonage due to its depreciation and that said sale and purchase of another be left in the hands of the District Council.

CAMP MEETING RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved, that our Camp Meeting begin the first Friday in August of each year.

2. Be it resolved, that the conference shall elect a Camp Secretary and a Camp Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be elected from nominees from the Council. The Assistant District Superintendent shall be chairman of this committee and the District Superintendent shall appoint four additional men to serve on this committee. These seven men shall be known as a Camp Meeting Committee, and their names shall be in our official directory as such. It shall be the duty of this committee to supervise and be responsible for the operational or functional work of the Campgrounds, both preparatory to Camp and during Campmeeting. They shall work under the authority of the District Council. Be it further resolved, that in case the Assistant Superintendent cannot serve as chairman that the Council shall fill the vacancy. We further recommend that the District Council outline the specific duties of this Committee in writing.

3. Be it resolved, that the District Council appoint someone to be deputized to patrol the camp ground during the meeting and to be hereafter enforced.

4. Be it resolved, that the pastors and the District Superintendent present the needs of the Camp to the churches and that each church respond with such needed items as requested.

5. Be it resolved, that no single young person shall be allowed off the grounds after 7:00 p. m., without special permission from the proper Camp authorities or accompanied by their parents. They shall be required to attend Young People's and night services. Failure to keep this rule may forfeit their privilege of remaining in Camp. There shall be a Dean of Men and a Matron of Women, appointed by the Camp Committee, who shall be responsible for the enforcement of this rule.

Be it further resolved that this resolution be printed and copies given to each one registering.

6. Be it resolved, that receptacles for trash be placed in convenient places on the camp grounds.

7. Inasmuch as so many children are on our grounds throughout the campmeeting, therefore, be it resolved, that special services be held for them and that the Council secure a children's worker at least 30 days prior to the camp.

8. Be it resolved, that the Campmeeting Committee be responsible for the placing of four way-side tables on the campgrounds.

9. Be it resolved, that all who rent rooms during camp be advised to bring their own bedding.

10. Be it resolved, that all dormitory reservations be declared nontransferable as long as the present holders occupy them. When the holders of said reservations secure lodging elsewhere the former reservations shall be turned to the camp committee. Those having reservations and those desiring reservations shall write the secretary of the Camp meeting Committee within 30 days and not later than seven days prior to the coming campineeting. 11. Be it resolved, that all those working for their meals and actively engaged ministers be required to register, at which time they shall be given a meal ticket which must be presented at the entrance of the dining hall. Be it further resolved, the Camp Meeting Committee be responsible for the enforcement of this rule.

12. Be it resolved, that all ministers and their wives be available for work during the Camp Meeting. Be it further resolved, that those not working shall be charged a stipulated amount to be set by the Council.

13. Be it resolved, that the District Council appoint a Young People's leader to conduct special youth services during camp.

14. We recommend that each church be requested to furnish a bed and springs for the camp.

15. Be it resolved, that we urge each church that is able to do so build a cottage on the camp ground for their pastor, or pastor and delegate. Be it further resolved that a lot shall be furnished free to each church completing said building prior to our next annual camp. The type and location of said cottage to be agreed upon by the church and the District Council.

16. Be it resolved, that our District Council shall have our District Treasurer bonded immediately following this camp, provided the cost is not prohibitive.

REPORT OF THE WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AS ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE

1. We recommend, that in accordance with the new manual, each church in the District shall raise an amount equal to \$6 per member per year for General Budget, to be raised monthly and sent to the District Treasurer. (This amount is pro-rated by the General Treasurer as follows: Forign Missions 35% or \$2.10, General Administration 25% or \$1.50, Church Extension 20% or \$1.20, Senior College 10% or 60 cents, Church Extension Loan Fund 6% or 36 cents, and Sunday School and Youth 4% or 24 cents. This need not be thus divided by the local treasurers.)

2. We recommend that each pastor be given a stipulated amount for his support and that at the respective annual meetings each church shall decide upon a minimum financial support they will pay their pastor during the year.

3. We recommend that the District Budget consist of 10% of all regular Church, Sunday School, and Youth People's offerings except that raised for Missions, General Budget, building funds, rents and evangelists, and that the District Budget be pro-rated as follows: District Expense Fund, 80%; District Home Missions, 15%; General Conference Expense, 3%; and Frankfort Pilgrim College, 2%.

4. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$3,600 per year and 7c per mile traveling expense.

5. We recommend that the District Council members, the Home Missionary Committee, and the Camp Meeting Committee be paid the sum of 7c per mile for traveling expense while rendering service for the District.

6. We recommend that the District Secretary shall act as District Statistician, and be paid the sum of \$75.00 per year. We further recommend that the District Treasurer be paid the sum of \$240.00 per year.

7. We recommend that each local church shall pay into the Camp Meeting Treasury the sum of \$10.00 for each delegate attending the Camp and Conference and this is to include board and room.

8. We recommend that where parsonages are not equipped with heating devices that provisions be made for the same by the local church.

9. We recommend that each church grant its pastor a two weeks vacation with salary, which shall include two Sundays.

10. We recommend that each church provide its parsonage with a telephone.

11. We recommend that the Assistant District Superintendent, in the absence of the District Superintendent, be paid the sum of \$10.00 per day, plus 7c per mile traveling expenses while rendering services for the District or Camp Meeting.

12. We recommend that the dormitory rooms rent as follows: first floor, \$4.50; second floor, \$3.50 and third floor, \$1.50 per cot.

13. We recommend that each local and licensed minister taking his examination shall pay the examiner the amount of \$1.00 for each examination taken.

14. We recommend that District Letter Heads be printed the amount to be decided by the District Secretary.

15. We recommend that the District Council appoint a District Home Missionary Committee of three, and the District Superintendent act as chairman. We further recommend that the expense of this Committee be paid from the District Home Missionary fund while rendering any service to the Home Missionary Work.

16. We recommend that the churches of this District be asked to contribute the amount of \$2 per year per member to meet the indebtedness of the District parsonage.

17. Whereas there is a definite need for funds to be placed at the disposal of the District Sunday School program; We recommend that each Sunday School in the District be asked to send the Sunday School Promotional Secretary the amount of \$3 (three dollars) for this work, immediately following the District Conference.

18. We recommend that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary be paid a salary of \$30.00 per year. The salary shall be raised from the Sunday School Conventions.

19. We recommend that the District Treasurer pay utilities at the District parsonage, consisting of lights, gas, fuel, water, and telephone.

20. We recommend that the District Treasurer pay all the postage expense of the District Superintendent.

21. Whereas the Loan Fund has proved to be such a blessing in the General Church Extension Department, and other Districts have likewise been helped in the promotion of Home Missions; we therefore recommend that we set up a District Loan Fund. We also recommend that funds from wills, gifts, legacies, etc., be placed in this fund. We further recommend that the District Council or a Committee be appointed to formulate rules and by-laws governing this fund. Rate of interest and churches to which loans are made and all business be delegated to said Council of Committee. (We recommend 3% interest.)

22. We recommend the District Council buy a new P. A. system for the Camp and that a booth be built to place it in.

REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

To the chairman, Rev. M. H. Snyder, ministers and lay delegates of the 35th Annual Conference of the Illinois district of the Pilgrim Holiness Church greetings:

While we are rejoicing in the Savior's love and enjoying the blessings of the Lord, much of the world is in spiritual darkness. We are praising God for the blessings of the past year and for present victory in our hearts. It has been a very enjoyable year serving God and the church, yet there has been many things to make our hearts sad. Surely we are made to feel we are in a world of death, trials and testings, yet our God has not failed us, praise His name. We are certainly in a white harvest field, ready unto harvest. We are very thankful that we have the privilege of attending camp meetings. Also for the good camp meeting just closed.

Home Missions

At our camp last year we took as projects, Chicago, Woodriver and Zion to help. We felt it would be profitable to assist these churches. Surely the need is great in this great state. It has taken our available funds to carry this out and to help these smaller churches get more established.

Forward Movement

We feel this forward movement program is one that will not only help each one but will help us to start Sunday schools, prayer meetings and new churches. We seem to be slow in getting the program in action but we feel much can be accomplished through the program. The Forward Movement Committee has held some meetings in interest of it, we have had six Zone Conventions, also several letters sent out urging our people to get behind this program. Our desire is that we put this program in motion as a District.

Property Improvements

ARGO: The folk here have redecorated the church and parsonage inside and out, also an additional Sunday school room in the basement, it has been painted and inlaid linoleum put on floor, the estimated cost of \$400.00.

BRIDGEPORT: The folk here have completed a part of the new church building which is being used as a place of worship until the auditorium is completed. The present building being 38'x62' at cost of \$10,878.61 valued at \$25,000.00. The old church has been sold, torn down and moved away. The auditorium will be 40'x60', work is to be finished soon after this camp meeting. A new gas furnace has been installed in the present building now being used for worship. Not only do they have a place of worship in the building now completed but they have several nice Sunday school rooms.

CASEY: The folk here have put a new roof on the church also have made some other very much needed repairs.

CHARLESTON: The folk here have put tile floor in the balcony of the church, also acoustic tile ceiling in the basement, approximate cost of \$400.00.

CHICAGO: The parsonage basement has been remodeled giving three Sunday school rooms, rest rooms also tile covering on floor, vertical shades and black boards in each room. They have paid \$2,116.72 in finishing and remodeling parsonage and church. The debt on the church building is \$800.00 and parsonage \$5,769.85.

COFFEYVILLE: An electric pump has been installed and water has been run into the parsonage, repair on lane leading into the parsonage also some redecorating of parsonage, the estimated cost being \$260.00.

DECATUR: The folk here have purchased a used Sunday school bus, put cement floor in garage, new ceiling, molding and painted the church auditorium and vestibule, also the used ceiling taken off the church auditorium has been put on ceiling of basement, enclosed the stairway, painted the exterior of church and parsonage, damp chaser for piano in basement has been purchased, also new altar rug, extension ladder, adding machine and other small improvements at an estimated cost of \$1,142.50.

GALESBURG: A new blower for furnace has been installed, a garage built, new screens for parsonage, insulated parsonage, estimated cost \$475.00.

JANESVILLE: New venetian blinds have been put in the church, another stoker installed, church redecorated inside and out at an estimated cost of \$263.42.

JERSEYVILLE: Some redecorating and repair has been made on the parsonage.

JOLIET: The folk here have purchased and installed an air conditioner in the church, basement rooms redecorated, also a new sink and congo wall has been installed in the parsonage, estimated cost \$1,914.33.

MARSHALL: A new sink installed, linoleum on floor and redecorated kitchen in parsonage, purchased a used Sunday school bus, power mower and purchased a cottage on the camp ground for the use of their pastor, estimated cost being \$748.98.

MARTINSVILLE: The inside of the church has been completely remodeled, adding three much needed Sunday school rooms, new celotex tile ceiling, the interior completely redecorated, estimated cost of \$330.00, labor being donated.

MT. VERNON: The back side of the lots landscaped, a building built out of lumber salvaged from other building torn down, an estimated cost of \$108.00.

OBLONG: The folk here have redecorated the parsonage inside and out at estimated cost of \$100.00.

ONARGA: A new roof has been put on the church also it has been painted on the outside.

OLNEY: This year the church has purchased a four room parsonage, it has been repaired, redecorated, putting it in fine condition. The church was remodeled inside and three Sunday school rooms were made. This was very much needed. At Christmas time a lovely rug and rug pad was given to the church by one of the Sunday School members. Excess oil in the oil heater caused a small fire, and the interior of the church was damaged by smoke. Since that time the church auditorium was redecorated. Another attractive thing about the church and parsonage is the lovely lawns which are being beautifully cared for.

OTTAWA: The folk here have made a new concrete walk from front of church to curb, installed sewer valve to prevent basement flooding, redecorated part of parsonage inside, installed inlaid linoleum on kitchen floor, also put plastic wall covering in bath room, an estimated amount of \$136.00.

PALESTINE: We have installed City gas, water heater, some work on the interior, also purchased new pews for the church, new piano was purchased, completed class rooms in the basement and provided an exit from the basement, an estimated cost of \$3,644.31.

PLEASANT HILL: They finished digging the basement for the church, turned the church around facing the north, new black top road entrance o church yard, landscaped the church yard, new concrete walks on North and West side of church, steps in back, rest rooms, also installed water system and new oil furnace. This was done with approximate cost of \$3,000.00. The Township donated much of the labor. This was all paid for when the work was completed.

ROBINSON: The parsonage was redecorated, installed a new water heater, inlaid linoleum in kitchen, estimated cost \$252.00.

SPRINGFIELD: They have changed the front entrance into the church, built a two-car garage, estimated cost of \$850.00.

WOODRIVER: One class room was added in the basement to be used as a class room and nursery, a new forced-air furnace installed in the church to heat church and rooms used for living quarters. Bricks have been purchased to build a church bulletin board on church lawn, estimated cost of \$778.00 and donated labor.

REPORT OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL PROMOTIONAL SECRETARY

To the 35th Annual Conference of the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Illinois District, convened at Charleston, Illinois, August 12, 1957—Greeting:

We have endeavored to fully carry out the responsibilities of the Sunday School Promotional Secretary, after having been appointed to the position by the District Council.

Sr. Lynn had been engaged by the preceeding Sunday School Board for conventions this past fall. Conventions were held at Argo, Bloomington, Charleston, and Lawrenceville. These conventions were well attended. A splendid interest and spirit prevailed in each one. This spring profitable conventions were held at Oblong, Chicago, and Springfield.

We should endeavor to make an advance along the entire line in our Sunday Schools. We have plenty of room for substantial gains. Only 16 of our Sunday Schools reported gains. Fifteen showed losses and two broke even. This gives us plenty of room for gains another year.

Our District shows an all time high of 2141 average attendance. This is only a gain of 39 over last year a .01% plus increase.

We make the following recommendations to this 35th annual conference: First that we have a goal of .05% increase in average attendance. Second, that we have quarterly meetings in each zone for inspiration and reading of our quarterly reports of the Sunday School with proper recognition given for our local and zone attendance.

We have traveled a total of 1,586 miles and spoken in the seven conventions and put out each of the monthly bulletins.
