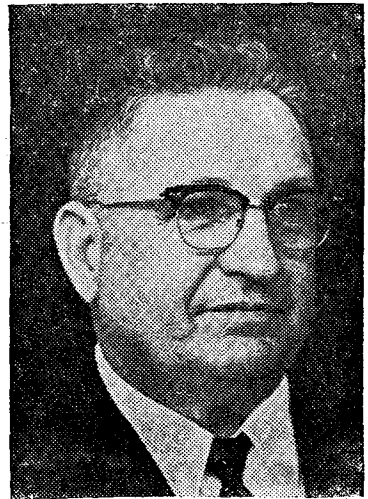

JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

First Sitting

The Forty-second Annual Conference of the Illinois District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, convened at Charleston, Illinois, June 29, 1964, at 7 P.M.

The Conference was opened by singing, "He Lives," led by Brother Lawrence Butts. Reverend T. B. Ross led the Conference in the opening prayer.

After a few opening remarks, Reverend W. E. Hall introduced Dr. P. W. Thomas, the General Superintendent, as Chairman.

Brother Thomas led in the chorus, "This Is My Story".

After a few opening remarks Brother Thomas asked the District Secretary to proceed with the roll call. The roll call was given with 70 present.

A motion carried setting the hours for the business session

Monday: 7 P.M. to 9:30 P.M.

Tuesday: 8 A.M. to 11:30 A.M.

1:30 P.M. to 4:30 P.M.

Brother Thomas read scripture from Isaiah 54:2, after which he gave a very timely message on "Enlarging the Place of Thy Tent" which was heart-stirring. The climax was to "Lengthen Thy Cords and Strengthen Thy Stakes". Brother Thomas then led the Conference in singing "Blessed be the Name".

In proceeding with the Conference business, the District Superintendent read his personal report, which was full of activity for the year. A motion was made and seconded to accept this report with great appreciation. It was voted approved, by the Conference expressing their appreciation with a hearty Amen.

The Assistant Superintendent, Brother L. A. Williams, gave an oral report. A motion carried to accept this report.

The Auditing Committee gave their report, a motion carried to accept this report.

The District Statistician gave a summary of the statistical report. A motion carried to accept this report as read.

The District Treasurer, Brother Oden, gave his report. A motion was made and seconded to accept this report. Voted approved.

Brother Oden, the Camp Treasurer, gave his report. A motion carried to accept this report.

The District Secretary read the names, Rev. Orville Awe, Sister Awe, and Rev. Garry Spriggs of whom has been transferred to the Illinois Conference. Brother Thomas met them at the altar, asking them to give a word of testimony. A motion carried to accept them as members of the Conference, and that they be seated within the conference bar.

Brother Thomas introduced to the Conference, Rev. R. A. Beltz, Director and Treasurer of the Pilgrim Pension Plan board. Brother Beltz spoke to the Conference pertaining to the Pension Plan and the Ministerial Benefits, after which Brother Thomas expressed his appreciation to Brother Beltz for his very good explanation of the Pension Plan as well as the Ministerial Benefits.

Conference adjourned by the expiration of time with the closing prayer by Brother Henschen.

Second Sitting

Conference reconvened at 8 A.M. June 30, 1964, by singing "Stepping in the Light," led by Brother Lawrence Butts. Brother James Sneed led the Conference in prayer.

The Secretary read the minutes of the first sitting, and they were accepted as read.

The roll call was brought up to date by the adding of 4 Ministerial delegates, and 4 lay-delegates, making a total of 78 present.

Then Brother Thomas read Scripture from St. Matthew 24:1-14, after which Brother Thomas addressed the Conference on the theme of "Building The Kingdom", enlarging upon the Sign of the times, and our responsibility of Preaching the Great Message of hope to the lost. In closing, the members of the Conference were asked to stand and unite in prayer, and in singing "Showers of Blessing".

In proceeding with the Conference business, Brother Hall passed out a written message entitled, "A Call to Prayer", after which the Chairman, Brother Thomas, requested Brother Hall to read the same to the Conference. A motion was made and carried, to endorse this message presented entitled, "A Call to Prayer."

The Sunday School Promotional Secretary, Brother L. A. Williams, read his report, and it was voted to accept this report.

The District Missionary President, Sister Mae Roller, gave her report. A motion carried to accept this good report with deep appreciation.

Brother Hall introduced to the Conference, Rev. Paul Stroud. A motion carried to receive Brother Stroud as a member of this Conference, granting him a seat in the bar.

The Reception Committee introduced Sister R. A. Beltz, Rev. Roy Glen-jening, and Rev. Kenneth Elliott. A motion carried to grant them honorary seats within the bar.

Pastors' personal reports were read to the Conference.

A motion carried to recess for 10 minutes.
Pastors continued with the reading of their personal reports.

A motion carried, granting Brother Beckham Day an honorary seat within the Conference bar.

Continued reading the Pastors' reports.

Brother Thomas introduced to the Conference, Rev. James Hertel, asking him to be seated upon the platform.

The resolutions Committee gave their reports. Standing Resolutions No. 24 accepted as recommended by the Committee. A motion was made and seconded, to amend No. 8 in Camp Meeting Resolutions, and motion carried.

A motion was made that the order of business following the reports of the various committees be the election of officers.

A motion carried to adjourn for lunch, and Brother L. A. Williams offered the closing prayer.

Third Sitting

The Conference reconvened at 1:30 P.M. by singing "Blessed Assurance" led by Brother Lawrence Butts. Brother Eckart led the Conference in prayer.

The order of business was the Resolutions Committee reporting. A motion carried to delete No. 14 of the Camp meeting resolutions.

A motion carried to refer No 1 under New Resolutions presented by the Committee, back to the Committee for Re-drafting.

Motion carried to accept No 2 as presented by the Committee under New Resolutions.

The Ways and Means Committee gave their report as follows: 8, 9, 10, 13, 20, and 21 be re-listed under standing resolutions. Motion carried.

No. 4 carried as presented. No. 6 was amended to read 150.00 for District Statistician. Part two District treasurer 390.00. Carried as amended. No. 11 carried as presented.

A recommendation to adopt a percentage budget system was presented to the Conference. Brother Hall gave an explanation upon the recommendation. A motion carried to refer the recommendation back to the Committee for re-drafting.

The District Secretary read the recommendation made by the District Council, pertaining to the ordination of the following: Dale Campbell, Eugene Gray, and James Sneed. The time for the Ordination Service will be the last Saturday afternoon of the Camp meeting.

The Educational board gave their report. A motion carried to accept this report.

Brother Hall introduced the New Church at Danville to the Conference, and a motion carried to accept it into the Conference.

Brother Hall appointed to serve as tellers, Brother Richardson, Brother Butts, Brother Ramsey, Brother Eckart, Brother Munson and Brother Tewell.

Brother Hall presented a recommendation from the District Council that the District treasurer, and Camp treasurer be a combined office. With separate records to be kept. A motion carried to accept this recommendation.

Brother Hertel was granted the privilege of addressing the Conference in regards to Frankfort Pilgrim College.

Ballots were passed out and the election of officers was the order of the day. The following officers were elected:

A motion carried to extend the time of this Conference sitting, for the period of 15 minutes.

Educational Board: 3 years, James Taylor

District Missionary President: Mae Roller

A motion carried to change the time of the evening session to 6:30 P.M.

Conference adjourned by the expiration of time. Brother L. S. Lancaster pronounced the benediction.

Fourth Sitting

Conference reconvened at 6:30 P.M. by singing "He Abides" led by Brother Lawrence Butts. Brother Dwight Henschen, led the Conference in prayer.

The Secretary read the minutes of the Second sitting, and they were approved as read.

The Resolution Committee gave a partial report, and a motion carried to accept their report.

The Ways and Means Committee brought back to the floor the resolution that had been referred for re-drafting, pertaining to the adoption of a percentage budget system. A motion was made to amend the resolution, but the motion for amendment lost. The main motion was then presented to the floor. A motion carried to accept the main motion as presented by the committee.

A motion carried to delete No. 15 under Ways and Means.

The Memorial Committee read their report, and this report was approved by a rising vote, and with bowed heads and silent prayer, after which the Conference sang, "Shall We Gather at the River."

Brother Hall made the following appointments:

Brother Hall then read the pastoral appointments, and it was voted to approve these appointments.

Invitations were given, and it was voted to accept the invitation from the Robinson Church for the Ministerial Convention. Brother Hall then expressed his appreciation to Brother Thomas, and had the Conference to give him a rising vote of appreciation as Chairman.

A motion carried to sojourn, and Brother Hall gave the benediction.

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. Inasmuch as the General Board has ruled that all our District Camps shall provide for Sunday School to be conducted on the Camp Grounds each Sunday of the Camp. Therefore be it resolved, that there shall be a Sunday School service conducted on this Camp Ground each Sunday at the Camp. The Sunday School Committee to be in charge of the same, and that suitable cards of recognition be given to all who attend, denoting their presence at the Camp Sunday School. These cards to be returned to the local Sunday School, thus encouraging a perfect attendance, and that local averages be figured and any awards be given in recognition of the same.

2. Be it resolved, that all pastors and evangelists arrange their work so as not to conflict with the Camp and Conference, and that if any minister does not attend Camp and Conference he shall send a report of his work and an excuse for the absence. If he fails to do so for two consecutive years he shall be dealt with by the council.

3. Be it resolved, that the Annual Conference election of officers be deferred until all resolutions affecting officers' duties are adopted.

4. Resolved, that all our preachers and laity secure respectively a copy of the Church Manual and the District Conference minutes, and shall read and study the same until they are able to understand and carry out all of their provisions and requirements.

5. Be it resolved, that each pastor shall endeavor to bring the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate subscription list up to a number equal to or greater than the membership of the church.

6. Resolved, that the revision of the church membership rolls shall be made prior to the respective annual church meetings.

7. Whereas our officials and ministers are looked upon as examples of the standards of our church therefore:

Be it resolved that: The Illinois District Conference call attention to page 35, section 65 of our Manual which reads, "Whereas the present trend toward immodesty of dress is so evidently out of keeping with the Word of God, the girls and women who are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are not to appear in public wearing the immodest forms of dress so current today; such as: sun-suits, shorts, dresses of immodest length, slacks or similar garments, or without stockings. Men and boys of the church are not to appear in public places in shorts or without shirts."

8. Inasmuch as television is rapidly becoming a daily habit and an open door for infiltration of all kinds of vice and crime into the sanctity of the home in an ever-increasing number of homes in America;

Therefore be it resolved that we as a District go on record as being opposed to the use and/or ownership of a television set.

9. Be it resolved, that the District Superintendent be authorized to appoint all standing committees not otherwise provided for and to fill any vacancies occurring in them from time to time, and that there be five members on each Ways and Means and Resolutions Committee.

10. Be it resolved, that the District Superintendent devote at least eleven months of his time to the District work.

11. Be it resolved, that the District be zoned and the boundaries apply to the Ministerial, Youth, and Sunday School Departments. Be it further resolved, that the District Superintendent appoint Ministerial and Sunday School Zone Chairmen and that the Zone Chairmen and the District Superintendent be authorized to arrange Zone meetings as they deem advisable, and that a Zone Secretary and Treasurer be elected at the first meeting of the year.

12. Whereas it is helpful to a better understanding among our people who contribute to the support of our work and: Whereas the District handles this money as a public trust; Be it resolved, that the District Treasurer give a statement in totals of disbursements in his annual report of District Home Missionary funds, the same to be placed in the Conference Minutes.

13. Be it resolved, that all resolutions retained in the minutes from year to year be listed under "Standing rules" and all new resolutions be listed as "Conference rules" for one year, after that, all that are retained be placed under "Standing Rules."

14. We recommend, that all cabin owners get together and file for tax exemption on their cabins.

15. We recommend that the action of the 1962 General Conference be adopted (Sunday School and Youth Quadrennial Goals, 1962-1966)

1. Sunday School enrollment gain of 2% per month.

2. Average weekly Sunday School attendance of 80% of enrollment.

3. Teacher Training Course annually conducted for each church.

4. Sunday Schools organized and conducted by the STANDARD of EXCELLENCE.

5. Worship opportunities provided for children of junior age and younger.

6. Full scale participation in the 1960-1970 Decade of Progress program for Sunday School growth.

7. Youth Societies graded and organized to serve three age levels in the 12-35 year old limit.
8. Development of new fields of service through youth and Bible clubs.
16. Be it resolved, that the Council be given authority to take the necessary steps to take out Camp Insurance.
17. Be it resolved that this Conference delegate authority to the District Council to make necessary repairs and improvements on the campgrounds.
18. Be it resolved that the Ministerial Convention convene the first Tuesday evening through Thursday afternoon of April. The place to be chosen from invitations from the Churches.
19. Be it resolved, that all members being received into the local Pilgrim Holiness Church, that their attention should be called to Section 144, Article 2, and Section 54 of the 1962 Pilgrim Holiness Manual.
20. Be it resolved that this Conference approve of our Churches making application for and borrowing money from the General Church Pilgrim Pension Loan Fund. This to be in accordance with the Manual.
21. As the Illinois conference is incorporated be it resolved that the District Superintendent be authorized to make the annual report of the corporation as required by the state. The period of reporting is from January 15 to the last day of February each year.
22. That the District Council as elected from year to year be the district trustees in accordance with the articles of incorporation.
23. That in the event of death or hospitalization of any of our active ministers or wives, flowers shall be sent by the district treasurer. The District Superintendent is to be notified in either event of the above. All carefulness should be taken about notifying the District Superintendent so there will be no misunderstanding.
24. Inasmuch as the Conference and the Camp are at different times, be it resolved, that all new Resolutions, either to the Ways and Means or the Resolutions Committee, be mailed to the Chairmen of said Committees, one week prior to Conference.
25. We recommend, that where parsonages are not equipped with heating devices, that provisions be made for the same by the local Church.
26. We recommend, that each Church grant its pastor a two-weeks vacation with salary, which shall include two Sundays.
27. We recommend, that each Church provide its parsonage with a telephone.
28. We recommend that District letter heads be printed, the amount to be decided by the District Council.
29. We recommend that the District minutes be paid for out of the District funds, and that each church shall be charged for the number of copies of the minutes they receive, and that as they are paid for, the money shall be replaced in said funds.
30. Whereas many of our ministers and wives who are eligible for membership in the Ministerial Benefit Association are not members. We recommend that all eligible pastors and wives become members of the Association, and that each church pay the assessment fees of the pastor and wife. We further recommend that the District Treasurer carry out the same provision for the District Superintendent.
31. Be it resolved, that the Conference year begin June 1 and end on May 31 each year, and that all annual reports be mailed to the District Statistician, by June 10th. Be it further resolved, that all business of the Conference, and changing of pastors be done at this time. (P. H. Manual 1962 Sec. 53-1 "The Minister's term of office as pastor shall continue until and including the first Sunday following the District Conference.
32. Be it resolved, that the pastors notify the District Superintendent of their intended absence from their churches.
33. We the Resolutions Committee, recommend that there be a harvest offering for Frankfort Pilgrim College, conducted by the Youth of Illinois Conference.

REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend each church in the District shall raise an amount equal to \$8.00 per member per year for the United Stewardship Fund, to conform with the action of the 1962 General Conference, to be raised monthly and sent to the District Treasurer. (This amount is pro-rated by the General Treasurer as follows: Administration, 38% or \$3.04; Church Extension, 30% or \$2.40; Liberal Arts College, 22% or \$1.76; Sunday Schools and Youth, 6% or 48 cents; Church Extension Loan Fund, 2% or 16 cents; and Contingent, 2% or 16 cents.

It was further recommended that 5% of the total receipts of the Youth Society be contributed to the Department of Sunday Schools and Youth.

2. Whereas the Manual is specific in delegating the joint responsibility of the District Superintendent and the local church board, in the matter of the Pastor's salary, therefore be it resolved that the District Superintendent meet annually with the local church board to give due consideration to the pastor's salary.

Be it further resolved that at said meeting the District Superintendent diligently promote the practice of paying the pastor's travel expense, connected with his pastoral duties.

3. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$4500.00 per year and 7¢ per mile traveling expense.

4. We recommend that the District Council Members, Home Missionary Committee, and all special committees be paid the sum of 7 cents per mile for traveling expense while rendering service for the District.

5. We recommend that the District Secretary shall act as District Statistician, and be paid the sum of \$150 per year. We further recommend that the District Treasurer be paid the sum of \$390 per year.

6. We recommend, that each church pay the sum of \$10.00, per delegate, to cover the expense during Conference, said \$10.00 to be paid to the District Treasurer.

7. We recommend that where parsonages are not equipped with heating devices, that provisions be made for the same by the local church.

8. We recommend that each church grant its pastor a two-weeks vacation with salary, which shall include two Sundays.

9. We recommend that each church provide its parsonage with a telephone.

10. We recommend that the Assistant District Superintendent, in the absence of the District Superintendent, be paid the sum of \$15.00 per day, plus 7¢ per mile traveling expenses while rendering service for the District or Camp Meeting.

11. We recommend that the dormitory rooms rent as follows: first floor, \$4.50; second floor, \$3.50; little dormitory rooms, \$3.50; third floor, \$1.50 per cot. We further recommend that the electric rate shall be: All cottages, cabins or trailers, a minimum of \$1.00, plus 25¢ for each appliance; rooms in dormitories 25¢ per appliance in addition to room rent.

12. We recommend that District letterheads be printed, the amount to be decided by the District Council.

13. We recommend that the District Council appoint a district Home Missionary Committee of three, and the District Superintendent act as chairman. We further recommend that the expense of this committee be paid from the District Home Missionary fund while rendering any service to the Home Missionary work.

14. Whereas there is a definite need for funds to be placed at the disposal of the District Sunday School Program; we recommend that each Sunday School in the district send the Sunday School Promotional Secretary the amount of four (\$4) dollars as soon after conference as possible, said four dollars per church, plus Camp Meeting Sunday School Offerings, and District Sunday School Convention Offerings, constituting the District Sunday Promotional Fund.

15. We recommend that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary

be paid a salary of \$50 per year, plus all incidental expenses, to be paid from the District Sunday School Fund.

16. We recommend that the District Treasurer pay utilities at the District parsonage, consisting of lights, gas, fuel, water, and telephone.

17. We recommend that the District Treasurer pay District postage expense.

18. We recommend that the District minutes be paid for out of the District funds, and that each church shall be charged for the number of copies of the minutes they receive, and that as they are paid for, the money shall be replaced in said funds.

19. Whereas many of our ministers and wives who are eligible for membership in the Ministerial Benefit Association are not members. We recommend that all eligible pastors and wives become members of the Association, and that each church pay the assessment fees of the pastor and wife. We further recommend that the District Treasurer carry out the same provision for the District Superintendent.

20. We recommend the adoption of a percentage budget system based upon 16% of the regular Church and Sunday School offerings. This budget includes monies which have been going for United Stewardship Fund, District expense, District Home Missions, District parsonage, Frankfort Pilgrim College and General Conference.

This money will be distributed in the following percentages:

United Stewardship Fund	31%
District Administration	44%
District Home Missions	12%
District Parsonage	5%
Frankfort Pilgrim College	5%
General Conference	2%
Contingent Fund	1%

CAMP MEETING RESOLUTIONS

1. Be it resolved that our camp Meeting begin the first Friday in August of each year.

2. Be it resolved that the District Council appoint someone to patrol the camp grounds during the Meeting and to be hereafter enforced.

3. Be it resolved that the pastors and the District Superintendent present the needs of the Camp to the Churches and that each Church respond with such needed items as requested.

4. Be it resolved that no single young person shall be allowed off the grounds without special written permission from the Dean of men or the Matron of women, or accompanied by their parents. They shall be required to attend Young People's and evening services. Failure to keep this rule will forfeit their privilege of remaining in camp. There shall be a Dean of men and a Matron of women appointed by the District Council who shall be responsible to enforce this rule. Be it further resolved that this resolution be printed, and copies given to each one registering.

5. Be it resolved that receptacles for trash be placed in convenient places on the camp grounds.

6. Inasmuch as so many children are on the grounds throughout the camp meeting, therefore be it resolved, that special services be held for them and that the Council secure a children's worker at least 30 days prior to the camp.

7. Be it resolved, that all who rent rooms during camp be advised to bring their own bedding.

8. Be it resolved that all dormitory reservations be declared nontransferable, as long as the present holders occupy them. When the holders of said reservations secure lodging elsewhere, the former reservation shall be turned to the one in charge. Those having room reservations shall receive cards from the registrar 30 days before camp, these to be returned to the one in charge of reservations. If not returned before camp, these rooms shall be

rented. Said cards and postage shall be furnished by the camp, for the registrar.

Be it further resolved, inasmuch as all dormitories are the property of the District, that rooms in said dorms shall be made available, to be used as deemed advisable at any time, and be used or rented when not occupied by the person holding reservations.

Be it further resolved, that all persons holding room reservations, forfeit these reservations when moving their membership from this Conference.

9. Be it resolved, that all those working for their meals and actively engaged ministers be required to register, at which time they shall be given a meal ticket which must be presented at the entrance of the dining hall. Be it further resolved the District Council be responsible for the enforcement of this rule.

10. Be it resolved that all ministers and their wives who are physically able be available for work during Camp. Be it further resolved that those who choose not to work shall be charged a stipulated amount set by the District Council.

11. Be it resolved, that we urge each church that is able to do so to build a cottage on the camp ground for their pastor and delegate. Be it further resolved, that a lot shall be furnished free to each church completing said building prior to our next annual Camp. The type and location of said cottage to be agreed upon by the church and the District Council.

12. Whereas each year there are more workers signed up for work than are needed, rendering it impossible to use them all, be it resolved that only the required number be engaged. Be it further resolved that these be accepted on a first come, first served basis, and that the department heads reserve the right to interview and reject any who would not serve his or her department in the best interest.

13. Inasmuch as transistor radios have become so distracting, and such a hindrance to the spiritual atmosphere of our camp, therefore we recommend that their use on the camp ground be abandoned.

NEW RESOLUTIONS

1. Since the local Church books close on the last day of each month, and the District Treasurer's books close on the 10th day of each month, be it resolved, that all money for the current month, is to be in the hands of the District Treasurer on that day. Be it further resolved, that all money received after the 10th of the month, will be credited on the following month. All District and General money should be paid through the local church Treasurer to the District Treasurer.

2. Be it resolved, that the Chairman of the Educational and Examining boards shall call their respective Committees together prior to the Annual Conference, at which time candidates for Conference license shall be notified when to appear before them.

Be it further resolved, that the Chairman of these Committees set the time to meet. Candidates failing to appear as scheduled each year, shall appear without fail the following year. If not, they will not receive license, unless in the judgment of the combined boards, an exception should be made.

REPORT OF THE EDUCATIONAL AND EXAMINING BOARDS

We the Educational and Examining Boards having met, and conferred jointly, do respectively submit the following recommendations:

1. That Dale Campbell; Eugene Gray; and James Sneed be Ordained.
2. That Beckham Day; and Elmer Wheeldon be placed in the first year course of study.

3. That Florence Eckart; and Carolyn Moewe be granted first year Deaconesses license.

4. That Garry Spriggs be placed in the third year course of study, pending further communication with the Western Ohio District.

5. That all other Ministers who are pursuing their course of study, be retained in their present standing.

ary Society, reporting. After my advent among you, the District Council placed me in the hands of a committee composed of five ladies who became my spiritual guardian, I'll let the President of District Missionary Society tell you of my survival, care, and progress.

Launching is one thing; accomplishment is quite another. But with God the Father, Son and Holy Ghost as supreme Commander, progress is bound to come. Due to the discretion of the District Council, Committee members chosen, proved most congenial, able, and cooperative. This, too, makes for progress. Now we do not feel by any means, that all attainments have been reached; but praise be to Him for what gains have been made. Our Pastors, local Presidents, and Laity have responded very well to our appeal. Thanks to everyone!

The District Missionary Society was handed to us, the committee, with 18 active Adult societies and 2 Junior societies, out of 33 churches. To date, the Lord has given us this year 3 new Adult societies, 1 re-organized society, 2 new Junior societies, 1 Teen-age-Junior society. This brings the total Adult societies to 22 and 5 Junior-Teen-age societies, a gain of 7 societies.

In this short year of 9 months plus, these societies have raised over \$227.86 that otherwise would not have been raised for World Missions. This money was raised by one offering titled, "Include Jesus on Your Christmas List" which continued from December to March. The Lord helped us to reach our goal.
