The forty-second Annual Conference of the Illinois District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church, reconvened October 15, 1964, at the Charleston Pilgrim Holiness Church, at 10:00 A.M.

The conference was opened by singing "Jesus will walk with me", led by Brother Utterback. Rev. Carl Reed led the Conference in the opening prayer.

After a few words of explanation pertaining to the purpose of the meeting by the District Superintendent, Rev. W. E. Hall, Rev. J. D. Abbott was introduced as chairman.

Brother Hall introduced, Rev. & Mrs. Warren Posey to the Conference, and it was voted approved to accept them into the Illinois conference, and granted him a seat in the coference bar.

Brother Hall then presented the matter pertaining to the sale of the camp ground to the conference, giving them the proposition that had been made to him.

A motion was made and seconded, that we endeavor to sell the camp ground, and that the Trustees of the corporation be authorized to sell the same. In the line of discussion, Brother Hall gave a comparative report concerning the prices of land that could be purchased for the purpose of relocating. After much discussion, a vote was taken and the motion carried.

A motion was made and seconded that the Trustees of the Corporation be instructed to sell the Camp ground with a minimum set at One Hundred Fifty thousand dollars, (\$150,000.00) less the cabins, with all commissions and fees paid. (A question was asked concerning the district being responsible for the satisfying of the cabin owners, and that is the understanding at the present,) was the answer.

A substitute motion was made and seconded that the Ways and Means Committee draft a proposition to be presented to this body for consideration involving all needed items for selling and relocating of the camp grounds.

The time of the first sitting was extended for a period of five minutes or until this matter could be disposed of, by a motion this carried.

The maker and the one that seconded the substitute motion expressed their desire to withdraw their motion, and it was granted. Recessed for lunch.

Conference reconvened at 1:00 P.M. with Brother Utterback leading the conference in singing, "It is Mine", after which Rev. James Sneed led the conference in prayer.

The Secretary read the minutes of the morning sitting and they were approved as corrected.

The Chairman requested that the Secretary read the motion that is before the conference, after which the Chairman read a resolution for the purpose of guidance to the conference. A motion was made and seconded to accept the resolution as a substitute motion, which reads as follows; Resolved that the District council and District Trustees be further authorized on behalf of the conference to incur all necessary expenses, with respect to transfer of said property, should said premises be sold, to execute any and all necessary documents required to give effect to said sale in the event sale is effected, and to handle all matters involved in the same such as, terms of sale, settlement with cottage owners, and arrangements for the 1965 camp meeting which might be effected by such sale.

A motion was made and seconded to amend the substitute adding the following; "that a minimum of One hundred fifty thousand dollars, (\$150,000.00), less the cabins, with all commissions and fees paid".

The amendment to the substitute was voted upon and lost for the lack of support.

A motion carried to accept the substitute that was offered by the chairman in its original form.

A motion was made and seconded that this conference express its purpose to continue to operate an annual camp meeting for the Illinois District, and urge the District council to do all that is possible to obtain for the purpose suitable facilities, if the Charleston camp property is sold.

An amendment was offered, to insert the following; "And to purchase other grounds for the purpose of re-locating." A motion carried to adopt the amendment.

A motion carried to accept the motion as amended which reads as follows; "Resolved, that this conference express its purpose to continue to operate an annual camp meeting for the Illinois District and urge the district council to do all that is possible to obtain through purchase or lease for this purpose, suitable facilities of the Charleston camp property is sold.

A motion was made and seconded that all monies received from the sale of said camp property, be used for the sole purpose of purchasing or leasing grounds and replacing needed facilities. Motion carried.

A motion carried instructing the District Secretary to send copies of these minutes to all delegates, and to General Head-Quarters and that these minutes shall be recorded in the 1965 district conference minutes as permanent record.

Brother Hall then expressed his appreciation to Rev. Abbott as Chairman, and had the conference to give him a rising vote of appreciation.

The Secretary then read the minutes of the afternoon session and they were approved as read.

A motion carried to adjourn, and Rev. Lewis Russell gave the benediction.

#### STANDING RESOLUTIONS

- 1. Inasmuch as the General Board has ruled that all our District Camps shall provide for Sunday School to be conducted on the Camp Grounds each Sunday of the Camp. Therefore be it resolved, that there shall be a Sunday School service conducted on this Camp Ground each Sunday at the Camp. The Sunday School Committee to be in charge of the same, and that suitable cards of recognition be given to all who attend, denoting their presence at the Camp Sunday School. These cards to be returned to the local Sunday School, thus encouraging a perfect attendance, and that local averages be figured and any awards be given in recognition of the same.
- 2. Be it resolved, that all pastors and evangelists arrange their work so as not to conflict with the Camp and Conference, and that if any minister does not atted Camp and Conference he shall send a report of his work and an excuse for the absence. If he fails to do so for two consecutive years he shall be dealt with by the council.
- 3. Be it resolved, that the Annual Conference election of officers be deferred until all resolutions affecting officers' duties are adopted.
- 4. Resolved, that all our preachers and laity secure respectively a copy of the Church Manual and the District Conference minutes, and shall read and study the same until they are able to understand and carry out all of their provisions and requirements.
- 5. Be it resolved, that each pastor shall endeavor to bring the Pilgrim Holiness Advocate subscription list up to a number equal to or greater than the membership of the church.
- 6. Resolved, that the revision of the church membership rolls shall be made prior to the respective annual church meetings.
- 7. Whereas our officials and ministers are looked upon as examples of the standards of our church therefore:

Be it resolved that: The Illinois District Conference call attention to page 35, section 65 of our Manual which reads, "Whereas the present trend toward immodesty of dress is so evidently out of keeping with the Word of God, the girls and women who are members of the Pilgrim Holiness Church are not to appear in public wearing the immodest forms of dress so current today; such as: sun-suits, shorts, dresses of immodest length, slacks or similar garments, or without stockings. Men and boys of the church are not to appear in public places in shorts or without shirts."

8. Inasmuch as television is rapidly becoming a daily habit and an open door for infiltration of all kinds of vice and crime into the sanctity of the home in an ever-increasing number of homes in America;

Therefore be it resolved that we as a District go on record as being opposed to the use and/or ownership of a television set.

- 9. Be it resolved, that the District Superintendent be authorized to appoint all standing committees not otherwise provided for and to fill any vacancies occurring in them from time to time, and that there be five members on each Ways and Means and Resolutions Committee.
- 10. Be it resolved, that the District Superintendent devote at least eleven months of his time to the District work.
- 11. Be it resolved, that the District be zoned and the boundaries apply to the Ministerial, Youth, and Sunday School Departments. Be it further resolved, that the District Superintendent appoint Ministerial and Sunday School Zone Chairmen and that the Zone Chairmen and the District Superintendent be authorized to arrange Zone meetings as they deem advisable, and that a Zone Secretary and Treasurer be elected at the first meeting of the year.
- 12. Whereas it is helpful to a better understanding among our people who contribute to the support of our work and: Whereas the District handles this money as a public trust; Be it resolved, that the District Treasurer give a statement in totals of disbursements in his annual report of District Home Missionary funds, the same to be placed in the Conference Minutes.
- 13. Be it resolved, that all resolutions retained in the minutes from year to year be listed under "Standing rules" and all new resolutions be listed as "Conference rules" for one year, after that, all that are retained be placed under "Standing Rules."
- 14. We recommend, that all cabin owners get together and file for tax exemption on their cabins,
- 15. We recommend that the action of the 1962 General Conference be adopted (Sunday School and Youth Quadrennial Goals, 1962-1966)
  - 1. Sunday School enrollment gain of 2% per month.
  - 2. Average weekly Sunday School attendance of 80% of enrollment.
  - 3. Teacher Training Course annually conducted for each church.
- 4. Sunday Schools organized and conducted by the STANDARD of EXCEL-LENCE.
  - 5. Worship opportunities provided for children of junior age and younger.
- 6. Full scale participation in the 1960-1970 Decade of Progress program for Sunday School growth.
- 7. Youth Sccieties graded and organized to serve three age levels in the 12-35 year old limit.
  - 8. Developement of new fields of service through youth and Bible clubs.
- 16. Be it resolved, that the Council be given authority to take the necessary steps to take out Camp Insurance.
- 17. Be it resolved that this Conference delegate authority to the District Council to make necessary repairs and improvements on the campgrounds.
- 18. Be it resolved that the Ministerial Convention convene the first Tuesday of April, at 2 P.M. through Wednesday evening service. The place to be chosen from invitations from churches on Zone level, alternating as follow: Northern; North Central; South Central; and Southern zones.
- 19. Be it resolved, that all members being received into the local Pilgrim Holiness Church, that their attention should be called to Section 144, Article 2, and Section 54 of the 1962 Pilgrim Holiness Manual.
- 20. Be it resolved that this Conference approve of our Churches making application for and borrowing money from the General Church Pilgrim Pension Loan Fund. This to be in accordance with the Manual.
- 21. As the Illinois conference is incorporated be it resolved that the District Superintendent be authorized to make the annual report of the corporation as required by the state. The period of reporting is from January 15 to the last day of February each year.

- 22. That the District Council as elected from year to year be the district trustees in accordance with the articles of incorporation.
- 23. Be it resolved in the event of Death of any of our active or retired Ministers and wives, the District Superintendent is to be notified by the Church Secretary, and flowers shall be sent by the District Treasurer.
- 24. Inasmuch as the Conference and the Camp are at different times, be it resolved, that all new Resolutions, either to the Ways and Means or the Resolutions Committee, be mailed to the Chairmen of said Committees, one week prior to Conference.
- 25. Be it resolved that where parsonages are not equipped with heating devices, that provisions be made for the same by the local Church.
- 26. Be it resolved that each Church grant its pastor a two-weeks vacation with salary, which shall include two Sundays.
- 27. Be it resolved that each Church provide its parsonage with a telephone.
- 2. Be it resolved that District letter heads be printed, the amount to be decided by the District Council.
- 29. Be it resolved that the District minutes be paid for out of the District funds, and that each church shall be charged for the number of copies of the minutes they receive, and that as they are paid for, the money shall be replaced in said funds.
- 30. Whereas many of our ministers and wives who are eligible for membership in the Ministerial Benefit Association are not members. We recommend that all eligible pastors and wives become members of the Association, and that each church pay the assessment fees of the pastor and wife. We further recommend that the District Treasurer carry out the same provision for the District Superintendent.
- 31. Be it resolved, that the Conference year begin June 1 and end on May 31 each year, and that all annual reports be mailed to the District Statistician, by June 10th. Be it further resolved, that all business of the Conference, and changing of pastors be done at this time. (P. H. Manual 1962 Sec. 53-1 "The Minister's term of office as pastor shall continue until and including the first Sunday following the District Conference.
- 32. Be it resolved, that the pastors notify the District Superintendent of their intended absence from their churches.
- 33. Since the local Church books close on the last day of each month, and the District Treasurer's books close on the 10th day of each month, be it resolved, that all money for the current month, is to be in the hands of the District Treasurer on that day. Be it further resolved, that all money received after the 10th of the month, will be credited on the following month. All District and General money should be paid through the local church Treasurer to the District Treasurer.
- 34. Be it resolved, that the Chairman of the Educational and Examining boards shall call their respective Committees together prior to the Annual Conference, at which time candidates for Conference license shall be notified when to appear before them.
- Be it further resolved, that the Chairman of these Committees set the time to meet. Candidates failing to appear as scheduled each year, shall appear without fail the following year. If not, they will not receive license, unless in the judgment of the combined boards, an exception should be made.

#### REPORT OF WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend each church in the District shall raise an amount equal to \$8.00 per member per year for the United Stewardship Fund, to conform with the action of the 1962 General Conference, to be raised monthly and sent to the District Treasurer. (This amount is prorated by the General Treasurer as follows: Administration, 38% or \$3.04; Church Extension, 30% or \$2.40; Liberal Arts College, 22% or \$1.76; Sunday Schools and Youth, 6% or 48 cents; Church Extension Loan Fund, 2% or 16 cents; and Contingent, 2% or 16 cents.

It was further recommended that 5% of the total receipts of the Youth Society be contributed to the Department of Sunday Schools and Youth.

2. Whereas the Manual is specific in delegating the joint responsibility of the District Superintendent and the local church board, in the matter of the Pastor's salary, therefore be it resolved that the District Superintendent meet annually with the local church board to give due consideration to the pastor's salary.

Be it further resolved that at said meeting the District Superintendent diligently promote the practice of paying the pastor's travel expense, connected with his pastoral duties.

- 3. We recommend that the District Superintendent be paid a salary of \$4500.00 per year and 7¢ per mile traveling expense.
- 4. We recommend that the District Council Members, Home Missionary Committee, and all special committees be paid the sum of 7 cents per mile for traveling expense while rendering service for the District.
- 5. We recommend that the District Secretary shall act as District Statistician, and be paid the sum of \$150 per year. We further recommend that the District Treasurer be paid the sum of \$390 per year.
- 6. We recommend, that each church pay the sum of \$10.00 per delegate, to cover the expense during Conference, said \$10.00 to be paid to the District Treasurer.
- 7. We recommend that the Assistant District Superintendent, in the absence of the District Superintendent, be paid the sum of \$15.00 per day, plus 7¢ per mile traveling expenses while rendering service for the District or Camp Meeting.
- 8. We recommend that the dormitory rooms rent as follows: first floor, \$4.50; second floor. \$3.50; little dormitory rooms, \$3.50; third floor, \$1.50 per cot. We further recommend that the electric rate shall be: All cottages, cabins or trailers, a minimum of \$1.00, plus  $25\phi$  for each appliance; rooms in dormitories  $25\phi$  per appliance in addition to room rent.
- 9. We recommend that District letterheads be printed, the amount to be decided by the District Council.
- 10. We recommend that the District Council appoint a district Home Missionary Committee of three, and the District Superintendent act as chairman. We further recommend that the expense of this committee be paid from the District Home Missionary fund while rendering any service to the Home Missionary work.
- 11. Whereas there is a definite need for funds to be placed at the disposal of the District Sunday School Program; we recommend that each Sunday School in the district send the Sunday School Promotional Secretary the amount of four (\$4) dollars as soon after conference as possible, said four dollars per church, plus Camp Meeting Sunday School Offerings, and District Sunday School Convention Offerings, constituting the District Sunday Promotional Fund.
- 12. We recommend that the District Sunday School Promotional Secretary be paid a salary of \$75 per year, plus all incidental expenses, to be paid from the District Sunday School Fund.
- 13. We recommend that the District Treasurer pay utilities at the District parsonage, consisting of lights, gas, fuel, water, and telephone.
- 14. We recommend that the District Treasurer pay District postage expense.
- 15. We recommend that the District minutes be paid for out of the District funds, and that each church shall be charged for the number of copies of the minutes they receive, and that as they are paid for, the money shall be replaced in said funds.
- 16. Whereas many of our ministers and wives who are eligible for membership in the Ministerial Benefit Association are not members. We recommend that all eligible pastors and wives become members of the Association, and that each church pay the assessment fees of the pastor and wife. We further recommend that the District Treasurer carry out the same provision for the District Superintendent.
- 17. We recommend the continuation of the percentage budget system based upon 14% of the regular Church and Sunday School offerings. This budget includes monies which have been going for United Stewardship Fund,

District Expense, District Home Missions, District parsonage, Frankfort Pilgrim College and General Conference. This money will be distributed in the following percentages:

#### CAMP MEETING RESOLUTIONS

- 1. Be it resolved that our camp Meeting begin the first Friday in August of each year.
- 2. Be it resolved that the District Council appoint someone to patrol the camp grounds during the Meeting and to be hereafter enforced.
- 3. Be it resolved that the pastors and the District Superintendent present the needs of the Camp to the Churches and that each Church respond with such needed items as requested.
- 4. Be it resolved that no single young person shall be allowed off the grounds without special written permission from the Dean of men or the Matron of women, or accompanied by their parents. They shall be required to attend Young People's and evening services. Failure to keep this rule will forfeit their privilege of remaining in camp. There shall be a Dean of men and a Matron of women appointed by the District Council who shall be responsible to enforce this rule. Be it further resolved that this resolution be printed, and copies given to each one registering.
- 5. Be it resolved that receptacles for trash be placed in convenient places on the camp grounds.
- 6. Inasmuch as so many children are on the grounds throughout the camp meeting, therefore be it resolved, that special services be held for them and that the Council secure a children's worker at least 30 days prior to the camp.
- 7. Be it resolved, that all who rent rooms during camp be advised to bring their own bedding.
- 8. Be it resolved that all dormitory reservations be declared nontransferable, as long as the present holders occupy them. When the holders of said reservations secure lodging elsewhere, the former reservation shall be turned to the one in charge. Those having room reservations shall receive cards from the registrar 30 days before camp, these to be returned to the one in charge of reservations. If not returned before camp, these rooms shall be rented. Said cards and postage shall be furnished by the camp, for the registrar.

Be it further resolved, inasmuch as all dormitories are the property of the District, that rooms in said dorms shall be made available, to be used as deemed advisable at any time, and be used or rented when not occupied by the person holding reservations.

Be it further resolved, that all persons holding room reservations, forfeit these reservations when moving their membership from this Conference.

- 9. Be it resolved, that all those working for their meals and actively engaged ministers be required to register, at which time they shall be given a meal ticket which must be presented at the entrance of the dining hall. Be it further resolved the District Council be responsible for the enforcement of this rule.
- 10. Be it resolved that all ministers and their wives who are physically able be available for work during Camp. Be it further resolved that those who choose not to work shall be charged a stipulated amount set by the District Conneil.
- 11. Be it resolved, that we urge each church that is able to do so to build a cottage on the camp ground for their pastor and delegate. Be it further resolved, that a lot shall be furnished free to each church completing said

building prior to our next annual Camp. The type and location of said cottage to be agreed upon by the church and the District Council

12. Whereas each year there are more workers signed up for work than are needed, rendering it impossible to use them all, be it resolved that only the required number be engaged. Be it further resolved that these be accepted on a first come, first served basis, and that the department heads reserve the right to interview and reject any who would not serve his or her department in the best interest.

13. Inasmuch as transistor radios have become so distracting, and such a hindrance to the spiritual atmosphere of our camp, therefore we recommend that their use on the camp ground be abandoned.

#### CONFERENCE RULES

- 1. We recommend that the District Council be authorized to purchase a Christmas gift for the District Superintendent, in the amount of \$100.00 in the name of the District.
- 2. We recommend that the C.Y.C. and PELT program be supported from the District administration fund, at the discretion of the District Council. This recommendation is to be retroactive for the previous year.
- 3. Whereas there is a definite need for funds to operate the Youth program of the Illinois District, we recommend that each Church try to raise and send 25¢ per Church member, per year to the Illinois Youth Treasurer, for the purpose of promoting this arm of the District.

We have endeavored through God to forge ahead this year. It has been a time of progress in several ways. With the addition of two new Adult Societies; Ste. Marie, and Streater, the total now reaches 24 adults and 5 Junior Societies.

I have travelled with other members of the District Missionary Committee some 1100 miles, attending all 4 zone rallies, and speaking at each of them. The money for World Missions was for furniture for a Mission home in South Africa. District Home Missions received the sum of \$75.00; General Church Extensions

To General Superintendent, Rev. P. W. Thomas, district superintendent, Rev. W. E. Hall, pastors, delegates, and friends of this conference, Greetings.

Another Conference year has so quickly gone by and we are not recording the history of our church. What has been done determines much what can be done tomorrow. We trust that the very purpose of the work of Sunday Schools is deep within the heart of every pastor, sunday-school superintendent, and teachers, as well as every layman of the church. Our work is second to none in keeping the door open by our influence to a world about us.

We do not like to report a loss here, so we will go about it this way. #### REPORT OF ILLINOIS DISTRICT CYC DIRECTOR

As District CYC Director I have to the best of my ability urged each pastor to give CYC a try. Also I have urged them to get their CYC packet from headquarters.

In August, I mailed a 2-page letter to each pastor with a questionnaire attached, to be returned to me. Very few were returned.

In September, Janesville and Charleston Churches organized CYC chapters.

In October, I sent or gave another letter to pastors encouraging the organizing of CYC chapters and to get CYC before the people.

In December, Lawrenceville organized a CYC.

In January, I attend a District Leader's Convention held at Winona Lake, Indiana.

In March, the Urbana Church organized a CYC organization,

In April, at our Ministerial Convention, I had CYC material on display, also I gave a short talk encouraging CYC to be set up.

In the last report received from headquarters there were 67 CYC'ers registered in the district and 9 Certified Directors. These are in four Churches: Charleston, Janesville, Lawrenceville, and Urbana.

I find our people are eager to know more about CYC. Pastors, it is up to you to help them find out about it. I highly recommend it for any church. I hope you will see the need for this in your church in order to save our young people for the Pilgrim Holiness Church. CYC begins with the first graders and has many, many aspects of learning and interests connected to our church. I pray CYC will be district wide in Illinois by this time next year.

#### "MEMORIALS TO CONFERENCE"

- 1. Section 53—P. 1—1962 Manual. "An ordained or licensed minister may be called to the pastorate of a local church, or circuit, by a majority vote of all the church members voting. These shall vote at a church meeting duly called for that purpose, provided that said minister has been recommended to the church by the district superintendent and a majority vote of the local church board. The initial call of the pastor shall be for two years. The ministers' term of office as pastor shall continue until and including the first Sunday following the district conference."
- 2. Page 43—No. 209 in 1962 General conference Minutes also page 22, No. 91 in 1958 Gen. Conf. minutes.

  "Whereas the 10 years period for the completion of the ministerial study course." In case of failure to meet this allotted time limit, be it resolved that the candidate shall be placed in a restricted category, and shall be denied a vote in the district conference (unless he or she is pastoring),

also shall be denied holding an office in the district until the course of study is completed or requirements are met for ordination."

3. Pension Plan: "Inasmuch as the General Conference voted in 1958 that upon retirement a cash settlement could be made with a member of the Pension Plan, however inasmuch as the meaning of "cash Settlement" has been left to the discretionary powers of the Pension Board thereby creating dissatisfaction and misunderstanding therefore be it resolved that "cash Settlement" shall be understood to be 95% of all funds credited to the individual account which would include personal, conference allotments and dividends with accumulated interest."

4. General Officials: "Inasmuch as there is duplication and overlapping duties and responsibilities as well as expense in the work of the Departments of World Missions and Church Extension and these duties and responsibilities can be assumed by the General Superintendents in their respective Areas with considerable economy to the General Church. Therefore be it resolved that the duties and responsibilities of the oversight of World Missions and Church Extension be under the direct supervision of the General Superintendents in their respective Areas, thus eliminating the offices of General Secretary of World Missions and General Secretary of Church Extension."
