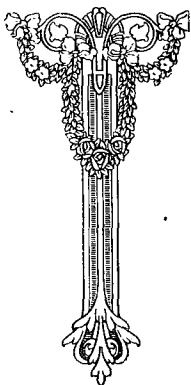

II. PROCEEDINGS

The Illinois and Missouri District Assembly of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at Charleston, Illinois, on Monday morning at nine o'clock, with District Superintendent Rev. D. C. Shearer in the chair. After reading a Scripture lesson Brother Shearer gave a short talk, which was followed by prayer. After roll call a motion carried to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last assembly.

On motion the first four rows of seats were made the assembly bar.

On motion the following names were admitted into the assembly as advisory members: Rev. Walter G. Henschen, Rev. Clem Smith, Rev. Kelly, Rev. McGraner, Rev. Beard, and Miss Susie Payne. Each of these parties was called on for a speech.

A motion carried that the morning sessions should be from 8 to 11:45 o'clock, and that the afternoon sessions should be from 1:30 to 5:30.

Motion carried that inasmuch as V. L. Johnson has surrendered his credentials that he be dropped from the assembly roll.

A motion prevailed that inasmuch as Anna Armstrong is a resident of Indiana and a member there, her name be dropped from the roll; and that inasmuch as Rev. H. M. Bassett has transferred to the Indiana district his name be dropped from the roll; likewise that Rev. W. C. Stone be dropped from the roll inasmuch as he is now a member of the California district.

On motion the church at Dogwood, Missouri, was accepted into the assembly, which was followed by the

reading of the report from this place, which report was received and referred to the statistical committee.

A motion prevailed that Brother Joseph Smith be admitted into the assembly bar as an advisory member.

A report from Holmon, Missouri, was received and referred to the statistical committee.

A new church at Paris was received into the assembly and its report accepted and referred to the statistical committee.

A motion carried that the Chairman appoint the committees of the assembly. The following were appointed: Resolution Committee—Vada Deardorff, Mary Dice, Lucy Quillen. Statistical Committee—Fred Reed, Otis Shaffer, Roland Cleaver. Ways and Means Committee—Alma Shearer, W. M. Pratt, Walter G. Henschen. Examining Committee—C. E. Connelly, O. C. Meyers, S. E. Lacy.

A report from Springfield, Missouri, was read and referred to the statistical committee.

A report from Carlinville was received and referred to the statistical committee.

A motion prevailed that Rev. O. L. King and A. L. Ewing be admitted into the assembly bar as advisory members.

A report from Robinson was accepted and referred to the statistical committee.

Reports from the following churches were received and referred to the statistical committee: Jerseyville, St. Louis, Oblong, Randles, Effingham.

On motion Rev. Joel R. Kelly was referred to the examining committee; also Rev. Clem Smith.

Report from Dow was received and referred to the statistical committee.

Evangelistic report from Marion French was received and referred to the statistical committee.

Evangelistic report from Miss Deborah Wharton was likewise received and referred to the statistical committee.

Report from Coffeyville received and referred to the statistical committee.

Partial report from the examining committee: We recommend that Plen Smith be received on his credentials as an ordained minister. Accepted.

Report from Onarga received and referred to the statistical committee.

Adjourned by benediction from Brother Shearer.

AFTERNOON SESSION—JULY 28

Minutes of forenoon session read and approved.

Report of foreign missionary treasurer read, accepted and referred to the statistical committee.

Rev. Plen Smith at this time gave a stirring talk on his experience in home missionary work.

Alice Head, local preacher, gave a report which was read to the assembly.

Partial report from examining committee. (See Report of Examining Committee.) We recommend that Joel R. Kelly be received into the assembly as an ordained minister in this assembly on the strength of his credentials.

Rev. W. M. Beard gave a verbal report of his labors for the past year. S. E. Lacy gave an evangelistic report which was received and referred to the statistical committee.

A. J. Kirkpatrick's verbal report was accepted. Bro-

ther Shearer gave a report on our church paper, urging each one, especially the pastors, to subscribe for it.

S. W. Maness and E. M. Gurtz were recommended from the St. Louis church to the assembly. Received and referred to the examining committee.

Rev. Clem Wright was recommended to the examining committee.

The names of Robert Hatfield and Mrs. Ira Walden were referred to the examining committee. (See Report of Examining Committee.)

After a short talk from Brother W. R. Cox, our general superintendent who had just arrived, and the appointment of the ways and means committee, a motion to adjourn carried. Benediction by Rev. Joseph Smith.

MORNING SESSION—JULY 29

Rev. W. R. Cox, general superintendent, in the chair, opened the session with singing and the reading of a Scriptural lesson, and a stirring talk which was followed with prayer by Rev. Walter G. Henschen. The roll was then called.

On motion by Brother Shearer, Brother Wheelton and Roy Beltz were admitted to the assembly bar.

Motion carried to refer Roy Beltz and E. L. Pendry to the examining committee.

The pastor from East St. Louis gave a report which was received and referred to the statistical committee.

Pastor from Mattoon gave a report which was received and referred to the statistical committee.

Mount Carmel gave a report which was received and referred to the statistical committee.

The ways and means committee submitted a partial report. (See Report of Ways and Means Committee.)

A partial report from the examining committee was given. (See Report of Examining Committee.)

The district superintendent's report was given and approved.

The camp meeting treasurer's report was received.

Otis Shaffer gave a written report which was received.

Resolutions committee report. (See Report of Resolutions Committee.)

A resolution carried that we give a rising vote of appreciation for the faithful and efficient work of this committee.

Motion carried that the Chairman appoint a committee to draft resolutions for the General Assembly. Rev. Walter G. Henschen, Rev. W. M. Pratt and Rev. Fred Reed were appointed.

Motion carried that the next camp and assembly be held at Charleston, Ill.

Motion carried that the date of camp and assembly be left to the decision of the district council.

Motion carried that a ministerial conference be held during the year. It was ruled that this conference begin March 4th, 1925. Motion carried that the conference be at Oblong, Ill. It was moved and carried that a committee be appointed to assign subjects to each minister of the assembly. Motion carried that Brother Shearer be chairman of this committee. W. M. Hall, J. R. Kelly, Walter G. Henschen and Fred Reed were appointed on this committee.

Motion to adjourn carried.

AFTERNOON SESSION—JULY 29

The afternoon session opened with a short talk by Brother Cox and prayer by Brother Caty.

On motion the roll call was omitted. The minutes were read and accepted. This was followed by the election of officers which resulted as follows: District Superintendent, Rev. D. C. Shearer; Assistant District Superintendent, Rev. W. M. Hall; District Secretary, Rev. Walter G. Henschen; District Treasurer, Rev. W. M. Pratt; Council Members, Fred Reed, O. C. Meyers, C. E. Connelly. A motion prevailed that we elect a foreign missionary secretary instead of a missionary board, resulting in the election of Miss Vada Deardorff. Examining Board, W. M. Hall (three years), C. C. Breen (two years), Fred Reed (one year); Trustee to fill vacancy, W. M. Hall.

The examining committee submitted a partial report. (See Report of Examining Committee.)

The ways and means committee gave a partial report which was accepted. (See Report of Ways and Means Committee.)

A motion was sustained that the district superintendent make four quarterly rounds and that he superintend the home missionary work.

On motion the time of adjournment was extended until six o'clock.

Partial report of examining committee was given and received. (See Report of Examining Committee.)

MORNING SESSION—JULY 30

Brother Cox in chair. After song and prayer the roll was called and the minutes read and accepted.

The ways and means committee submitted partial report which was accepted. (See Report of Examining Committee.)

By vote of the assembly the following ministerial delegates were elected to the General Assembly: Fred Reed, Mrs. Alma Shearer, W. H. Pratt, O. C. Meyers, Mary E. Dice, O. K. Shaffer, J. R. Kelley, Vada A. Deardorff, C. C. Breen and Miss Lillie Oliver.

It was moved and supported that the district superintendent appoint any alternate delegates which might be needed. The following were elected as lay delegates to the General Assembly: Clarence Popham, Sophia Moelling and Lenora Pratt.

The district treasurer gave a report which was received.

A motion carried to allow the car fare of the district superintendent to Kingswood last April at the meeting of the General Council and district superintendents.

A motion carried that the churches which have not yet reported should give said reports to the district secretary as soon as possible.

It was moved and supported that the pastors raise fifty cents per member from their churches for the car fare of the delegates to the General Assembly.

Motion was amended that this amount be raised and sent to the district treasurer by September 15.

The ways and means committee submitted a further report. (See Report of Ways and Means Committee.)

A motion was sustained that we show appreciation of the work of the retiring district secretary by giving him an offering.

A motion carried that the district secretary be permitted to confer with other districts regarding recommendations to the General Assembly, and that the district council be empowered to draft any resolutions which they deem necessary to present to the General Assembly.

Assembly adjourned until 1:30 p. m.

AFTERNOON SESSION—JULY 30

The afternoon session was opened with Brother Cox in the chair. The minutes of the forenoon session were read and approved.

The examining committee submitted the following resolution which was adopted: We recommend that W. O. Beard be accepted into the assembly as a licensed minister.

III. REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

No. 1. Report of Ways and Means Committee Adopted by the District Assembly.

1. We recommend that each pastor urge his church to adopt the tithe system and insist that his members place their tithe money into the local church treasury, and that from this a stipulated weekly amount be paid to the pastor sufficient for his support; and at the last quarterly meeting the church decide what support their pastor shall receive the following year.

2. We recommend that this assembly require the ministerial members to be present at our camp and assembly; that the churches keep up the salaries of their pastors while attending same and provide their transportation expenses to and from the camp and assembly, and that if they do not attend they shall send a report of their work and an excuse for their absence, and furthermore if they fail to do so for two consecutive years their names shall be dropped from the assembly roll.

3. We recommend that the churches adopt the envelope system for collecting the tithes and offerings.

4. We recommend that each church send in a comforter for camp meeting purposes.

5. We recommend that the district superintendent devote his entire time to district and home missionary work, and that he be paid twelve hundred dollars a year and traveling expenses.

6. We recommend that the churches be apportioned for district work as follows:

7. In order that the district superintendent may be able to give his entire time to district and home missionary work and receive adequate financial support, we recommend that the licensed and ordained preachers pay their tithe monthly into the district treasury, it being understood that preachers who are not regular pastors may pay their tithe from secular labor into their local churches, but that any remuneration for ministerial labor shall be tithed into the district treasury.

8. We recommend that the pastors raise for assembly claims the equivalent of one dollar a member each year.

9. We recommend that all ministers of this district have their reports made out in full before the assembly convenes.

10. We recommend that our pastors co-operate with the representatives of our church institutions as to suitable dates to represent their interests, and that offerings be taken for the same.

11. We recommend that we as a district endorse the plan of the Board of Publication to take an offering for the Advocate on the Sunday before Labor Day, and we urge all our churches to co-operate with said board in accordance with this plan.

12. We recommend that every pastor open new work in his community and co-operate with the district superintendent in doing home missionary work.

13. We recommend that our Sunday schools take a special offering one Sunday each month for foreign missions.

14. We recommend that the secretary be instructed to publish 250 copies of the minutes, and send them to the pastors to be distributed among the members, and a free will offering be taken by the churches for the same.

15. We recommend that the district secretary keep in touch with the churches, and remind them of the plans of the district assembly and encourage and help them carry out said plans.

16. We recommend that each church put in a church library.

3. We recommend that Clem Wright be received into the assembly as a licensed minister.

4. We recommend that the names of Mrs. Ina Walden and Robert Hatfield be dropped from the assembly roll.

5. We recommend that F. A. Shull be received into the assembly as a licensed minister.

6. We recommend that W. E. Catey be received into the assembly as a licensed minister, providing he decides to come among us later.

7. We recommend that Roy Beltz be received into the assembly as a licensed minister.

8. We recommend that E. L. Pendry be received into the assembly as an ordained minister from the Indiana assembly upon the recommendation of his district superintendent.

9. We recommend that R. S. Wheeldon be received as a licensed minister into the assembly.

8. Resolved, That we urge our people to report to their church, or our district secretary, their offerings and gifts for all purposes, so that the church and district may receive credit for all that is done.

9. Be It Resolved, That we express our thanks to our general superintendent, Rev. W. R. Cox, for his personal interest in our district and his untiring efforts for the church at large and his efficient service.

10. Resolved, That we show our appreciation to Rev. Joseph Smith of Kingswood Holiness College for his valuable exposition of God's word and his faithful service rendered during this camp meeting, by a rising vote of thanks.
