Assembly opened by singing, led by Bro Myers. Our General Superintendent Rev Seth C. Rees and Rev Charles Slater arrived and we were led in prayer by Bro Slater. Bro Rees was introduced to the Assembly and brought greetings not only from himself but from our workers in Every land. He then gave us some good advice on being full and overflowing. Minutes were read and accepted, with correction. Moved and seconded that the afternoon session close at 4:30. carried. Sister Medsker's report was read and accepted.

Adjourned with-prayer by Bro Rees.

Report from Examining Board. Alice Van Horn advanced to Second year as local preacher. Also Roberta Murdock advanced to 2 year local preacher. Herbert Mitchell advanced to third year licensed preacher.

Moved and seconded that we receive former action on Rec. of Ways and Means Committee regarding our Dist Supt's Work and support and that it be referred back to Committee. Carried

Moved and seconded that election of officers take place immediately on opening afternoon session. Carried.

Bro Slater presented Advocate again urging us to circulate it abundantly.

Recommendation from Ways and Means Committee, No 11 and 12 were read and adopted.

Moved and supported that when we adjourn we meet again at 2 å'clock. Carried.

Moved and seconded that we adjourn. Carried. Dismissed with prayer by Secretary.

Afternoon Session Aug 30, 1932

Assembly convened at 2:00 p'clock with Gen Supt S.C. Rees in chair. Bro Slater led in singing, "Lead, me Higher up the Mountain". Bro Elmor Hanna led us in prayer.

Bro Rees gave us some good exhortation on being a Co*Worker with God.

Reading of Minutes and approval. Tellers were appointed and election of officers was in order. W.E. Catey was elected Superintendent. Geo A. Smith Assistant Supt. H.Jl Kemp Secretary and W.G. Henschen Treasurer. Brother's Hanna, Meeks, and Myers were elected as additional members of Council. The Assembly voted for Secretary to cast one ballot for Examining board and Bro Catey, Hanna and Shull were re-elected. Also Educational Board was re-elected in Same manner, Bro Smith. Ways and Means of the Illinois-Missouri District as revised by the Annual Assembly of 1932.

I.Each Church shall adopt the tithe system and all members shall $\not p \not I$ place their tithe in the local church treasury. From this as stipulated amount shall be paid the pastor sufficient for his support. At the Annual Church ##### Meeting, the Church shall decide what support their pastor shall receive the following year.

2-A tithe of all funds received by each local church, including that received by the pastor for his services as such, and exclusive of all $f \dot{\mu}/$ funds paid to the purchase, rental, or necessary upkeep, of real estate or buildings for church or parsonage uses, shall be set aside by the local church Treasurer each Monday and remitted by him to the District Treas.on the first of each month. Said money to be divided by the District Treasurer as follows;

District Superintendant's Fund--50% General Budget Fund-----25% District Expense Fund-----25%

Also, a free will offering shall be taken by the pastor for the \$A Superintendant At at the time of each of his visits to the churches, same to be applied by the Supt on his salary and expenses and Dist.given credit for same.

(N.B. "Necessary #xpenses" upkeep#" would not include money spent for furniture, furnishings, electric light bills, etc. It would include only money spent for anything <u>actually</u> necessary to the maintainance or preservation of the property, such as paint, roofing, together with the cost of applying same, special taxes, payments on church debt, etc., etc)

3. The Local Churches of the District shall accept and work the plan as suggested by the General Board for increasing interest in Foreign Missions and for raising Foreign Missionary Funds.

We suggest that the pastor apply his tithe on this Budget.

2. The District Council shall have charge of the Home Hissionary Work of the District with authority to take such steps as they think best for the interest of the work.

3. The Supt. shall perform the daties of his office and devote as much time as possible to the Home Missionary York of the District, and is granted the privilege of holding regular Evangelistic meetings at his discretion and shall be paid from \$800.00 to \$1000.00 plus traveling and mailing expenses. 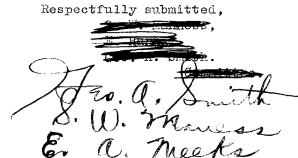
