JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The Third Annual Conference of the Louisiana District was called to order by Superintendent J. C. Williams on the District Camp Grounds at Simms, Louisiana, at 9:45, July 12, 1951. All joined in singing, "Draw Me Nearer", after which Sr. Floyd Goins led in prayer. Then Rev. R. A. Beltz, General Secretary of Church Extension, took the chair. He brought us a stirring message on "The Church at Antioch."

The first four rows of chairs across the tabernacle was declared the conference bar. Rev. Floyd Goins, our camp evangelist, and his good wife and daughter were given honorary seats within the conference bar. Our good friend, Bro. Corey, pastor of the Methodist church at Ball, Louisiana, was also given an honorary seat within our conference bar.

Conference hours were declared from 9:30 A. M. to 12 M. and from 1:30 P. M. to 4:00 P. M.

Superintendent Williams read his report and it was commended and accepted.

The Auditing Committee reported on the work of our District Treasurer; the report was accepted.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted. Bro. Cheveallier is to be commended for his fine work.

The Statistical report was read and accepted subject to correction on the transfer of Sunday School money to the church treasury. The Council recommended that the District Secretary write Sr. McCord a letter of appreciation for her labor in preparing the report.

We were recessed until 1:30 P. M.

The afternoon session convened at 1:30. The service opened by singing "Onward Christian Soldiers". We were then led in prayer by Bro. George Carr, Pastor of the Pineville church.

Sr. Goins sang the beautiful song, "Shall I Empty Handed Be", after which Bro. Goins brought us a message, using as his topic, "Antioch, the Model Church".

It was moved, seconded and adopted that Sr. J. C. Squyres be admitted into the conference bar to represent the Shreveport II church.

Since neither the delegate nor the alternate from the Pineville church were present, Sr. Hattie Peart was elected as lay delegate for the Pineville church.

The Youth Leader's report was read and accepted.

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was read, discussed and partially accepted, but tabled to have one of the recommendations be worked out with Bro. Beltz and Bro. Williams working with the committee.

Due to the lack of time for the Resolutions Committee to report, it was decided to have election of officers. Bro. Carr and Bro. Creech were elected as the other two council members, Bro. J. C. Williams was elected as our third member on the board of trustees for a period of three years.

Adjourned.

The third session opened at 9:30 A. M. Friday 13, 1951, by singing "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." Bro. James Crews led in prayer; then he sang, "I Will Pilot Thee". Bro. Beltz urged us to push our church paper so our people would know more about our church.

The roll was called.

Bro. and Sr. Whittinghill gave their testimonies and were admitted to the conference bar as honorary members.

Bro. Williams took up a love offering for our General Secretary of Church Extension, Bro. Beltz.

Bro. Beltz brought us a message concerning the qualifications of the minister, using I Tim. 3.

The report of the Ways and Means Committee was completed and accepted.

The Educational and Examining Board completed its work on the candidates. The report was accepted.

After the close of the business, Bro. Beltz gave us some good advice and encouraging council to aid us in advancing the Master's kingdom.

Conference was closed with prayer by Bro. Beltz invoking God's blessings upon us throughout the year.

Conference adjourned.

REPORT OF DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT

I feel the deep need of trusting our Heavenly Father for the district needs more and more.

This past year the First Church at Shreveport helped get a new project started. Rev. J. C. Cheveallier and his fine people have done a good job. Rev. Lee Hollingsworth pastored the new work for awhile and God blessed his efforts. Brother and Sister J. E. Squyres, formerly members of the first church, have become the pillars of the new church. May God bless them good.

There have been some changes in the district this year. Rev. W. H. Pope from the Oklahoma District is taking Rev. J. C. Cheveallier's place. Rev. J. Godwin Rimmer comes to us from the Eastern District and he and his wife will take over at the Second Church in Shreveport. Rev. Roy Grant and his wife of North Carolina will go to Lake Charles. All of these works are on the forward move.

Rev. Creech and the folk at Simms have stood by the church and camp this year. All the churches of the district rallied to their camp project and we have a nice kitchen and a small tabernacle on the camp ground now. Our good friend, Rev. Floyd Goins from Indiana, gave us a good camp this year. This proved a great blessing to our district.

Rev. Carr and the church in Pineville have been going forward and they plan a live program this coming year. They have lost one of their good supporters, Mr. Hez. Hooter, through the avenue of death. May God bless the loved ones of this brother.

The church at Oakdale with the Rathbuns pastoring surely is moving on. The membership increased along with the Sunday School attendance; also the finances have increased some. This church will add to our district.

The Baton Rouge church is taking on new life and we predict a good year for the Crews and their people. The camp meeting helped their field a lot.

Rev. McDonald and family have gone to our church in Bogalusa to take the place of the McCords and God is truly blessing their efforts

there. The McCords certainly left a good name behind in Bogalusa. They are now located at our school in Kernersville, North Carolina.

The district as a whole is on the upward move. We look for greater things to come to pass in the coming year.

My personal report:

This past year I have made 500 calls, preached ninety-eight times, held six revivals, had fifty-four seekers, prayed with ten sick folk, married one couple, attended one school board meeting at Kernersville, North Carolina, attended the superintendent's meeting in Indianapolis, Indiana, held five annual meetings, conducted one ministerial convention and one camp meeting, and travelled around 30,000 miles in the interest of the church.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

1. We recommend that all ordained and licensed ministers pay their ministerial tithe into the District Treasury.
2. We recommend that all birthday offerings be paid to the District Treasurer to be applied on District Home Missions.
3. We recommend that each church pay five per cent of all regular tithes and offerings to the District Treasurer to be applied on the District Budget.
4. We recommend that the District Superintendent's traveling expenses while traveling in the interest of the district, be paid at the rate of five cents per mile, also that the district correspondence and communications be paid by the District Treasurer.
5. We recommend that on each visit by the District Superintendent each church take an offering to be applied on traveling expenses.
6. We recommend that all monies be sent to the District Treasurer not later than the tenth of each month.
7. We recommend that all monies from the local churches destined to the General Treasurer be sent to the District Treasurer.
8. We recommend that each church pay the equivalent of \$1.00 per member per year to be applied on General Conference expense, the last payment to be made not later than May 1, 1954.
9. We recommend that there be a camp meeting registration fee of

- one dollar per person above the age of twelve years of age, to be applied on the expense of the camp.
10. We recommend that a camp meeting committee be elected by the council at conference and that said committee visit each church in the district once each year and raise an offering from each church to be used to promote the camp, said money to be sent to the District Treasurer to hold until called for by the camp committee.
 11. We recommend that five per cent of the District Budget be paid to our Zone Bible School.
 12. We recommend that for each examination in the study course a fee of twenty-five cents be paid to cover the expense of the questions and postage.
 13. We recommend that the District continue in operation the Pilgrim Pension Plan; that each church pay into the District Treasury monthly the sum of four per cent of its pastor's salary to be forwarded to the Board of Pensions. Be it further resolved that the four per cent of evangelists' salaries be paid from the District Treasury providing the evangelists are paying their tithes into the District.
 14. We recommend that when the council has passed upon a time and place to begin a new church, that a fee of \$1.00 be assessed each voting age member of the district to be applied on the property.
 15. We recommend that the district pay our District Superintendent \$75.00 per month.
 16. We recommend that all who have any books of the Study Course for licensed ministers or deaconesses send a list of same to the District Secretary; and that the District purchase the remaining needed books to complete the courses; and that these books be placed with the District Secretary to be lent to those who are taking the course, but who do not have means to purchase the same. The care of the books or loss of books to be chargeable to the borrower, also the mailing charges both ways be chargeable to the borrower.

RESOLUTIONS

1. Resolved that the quarterly reports be mailed to the District Superintendent, and that the yearly reports be made in duplicate, one copy to be mailed immediately to the District Statistician and the other to be brought by the delegate to the conference.
2. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of his or her report to the District Statistician not later than ten days after the conference year closes, which is May 31, and that the Statistician disregard any and all reports received thereafter. Be it also resolved that the District Treasurer's books close at noon, June 10.
3. Resolved that the District Treasurer send to the Editor of the District Bulletin a monthly financial report of all monies that each church has sent into the district.
4. Resolved that each church give a pounding for the pastor the first prayer meeting of each month.

5. Resolved that minister's license shall not be granted to anyone who does not tithe to the Pilgrim Holiness Church.
6. Resolved that the churches pay their pastors while attending camp and conference the same as if they were on their charge.
7. Resolved that there be an offering taken in the local church to defray the pastor's expense to and from camp, this offering to be taken by the District Superintendent at his annual meeting with the local church.
8. Resolved that the camp meeting begin on Wednesday night and continue until Friday night of the following week.
9. Resolved that all register who come to camp.
10. Resolved tht every person attending the camp bring his own bed linens.
11. Resolved that since our conference is not large, it be conducted on Tuesday and Wednesday after the first Sunday of the camp.
12. Resolved that each pastor be given a vacation of two weeks each year with pay.
13. Resolved that the conference show our appreciation to our District Superintendent by a rising vote of thanks and a "God bless you".
14. Resolved that we, the Louisiana District, are heartily in favor with the evangelical program that the general church made in regard to personal evangelism.
15. Resolved that we as a conference show our Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. A. Beltz, that we appreciate his presence with us, and that we pledge our utmost loyalty to him by a rising vote of thanks and a "God bless you".
16. Resolved that by a standing vote this conference express its appreciation to Rev. F. J. Goins, our camp evangelist, and to his wife and daughter Mary for their special numbers in song, also to Rev. and Mrs. L. W. Quinn for their ministry of music and song.
17. Resolved that we, the conference and camp, express our appreciation for the faithful service of the cooks, and for the good donations of our neighbors and friends, and that we express the same by a rising vote of thanks.
18. Resolved that we as a conference show our appreciation to our District Secretary, District Treasurer, Statistician, District Sunday School Secretary, and District Young People's President by a rising vote of thanks.

LADIES MISSIONARY SOCIETY

Ladies of the Louisiana District met July 10, P. M. under the new tabernacle on the District Camp Grounds at Simms. The meeting opened with a congregational song, "Follow On", after which Sr. Peart led in prayer. The purpose of the meeting was to elect district officers for the society.

Reports were given from the following churches: Lake Charles, Oakdale, Shreveport I, Pineville and Simms. Each report was accepted. Following these reports Sr. J. C. Williams gave an interesting and in-

formative talk concerning ways to conduct missionary meetings, also suggested worthwhile projects.

The three nominees for president given by the council were Sr. Squyres, Sr. Morgan and Sr. Rathbun. The first ballot cast resulted in a tie of the highest vote for Sr. Squyres and Sr. Morgan. On the second ballot Sr. Squyres of Shreveport II church was elected president, with Sr. Morgan of Lake Charles church vice president. Since Sr. Rathbun of Oakdale was one of the nominees, she was made secretary. Sr. Rathbun made a very encouraging speech.

There was a discussion on the purpose of prayer and fasting dues. It was decided to divide the amount received, giving half to foreign missions and half to home missions.

The meeting adjourned.
