DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

To Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church Extension, to our faithful, sacrificing pastors, to the loyal members and friends of the sixth Annual Conference of the Louisiana District, greetings in the name of our Christ.

It is through the help of the God of all mercies that we are permitted to meet once again for an Annual Conference.

This has been a year of definite progress by the Louisiana Pilgrims.

GENERAL:

Alexandria has a beautiful new church building which is a real asset to this district. The lowest appraisal value of this building has been \$23,000.00 and best of all the indebtedness is only \$5,930.00.

Two lots have been purchased in the city of Bastrop, and the District's Portable Chapel has been erected there. I believe one of our best opportunities for expansion is in this town.

Baton Rouge has done a remarkable job this year. Their building has been completely remodeled and they now have a beautiful place of worship.

Bogalusa is on the march for God. Improvements have been made on the property and several new members have been added to the church.

New seats have been constructed at Lake Charles along with other improvements. Our church in Lake Charles has faced many battles but God continues to give victory to our fine people there.

Oakdale has purchased a parsonage which has been sorely needed. They have also done considerable work to the interior of the church, which has added not only to the beauty of the church but to its utility as well.

A beautiful parsonage has been purchased by our fine people at Shreveport. This property is a real asset to the district.

Our Simms church has done considerable work on their buildings. They have redecorated their class rooms, purchased new seats and have made several general improvements.

The Pineville church is making definite plans for either remodeling their present building or building a new sanctuary. They now have several hundred dollars in their building fund for this purpose.

Two dormitories have been constructed on our camp grounds this year, along with several other improvements.

The report of our Statistician will show that definite gains have been made in practically all phases of our work. The per capita giving of our people for the year is \$191.00 as compared with \$87.10 last year, a gain of \$104.30 per member. Our church income this year has been \$35,792.25 compared to \$18,389.90 last year. Showing a gain of \$17,402.35. Our total property value as reported last year was \$89,987.50 with an equity of \$74,306.22. Our property value this year is \$137,635.29, a gain of \$47,647.79. Our equity in this property is \$103,401.52 showing a gain of \$29,095.30. It should be kept in mind that our Camp Ground is not included in the above figures.

Our pastors have made 5,020 calls this year compared with 3,865 last year, a gain of 1,155. Our pastor's support has shown an increase of over 20% this year.

Our Sunday School have had an average increase of 70 in attendance. This is approximately 21%.

PERSONAL

I have organized one church. I have visited each church at least twice. Conducted 4 revivals and God has given me over 100 seekers at my altar. I traveled 13,500 miles in the interest of the District. I have done at least 2000 hours of manual labor for the district.

Pastored the Alexandria church and made over 400 calls in connection with that pastorate and the revivals I held. I have preached 136 times, have received 16 people into church membership. I attended one District Superintendents Conference in Indianapolis, Indiana.

I would like to say that through all the toils, all the battles, and all the problems of the past year, I have had cooperation from the preachers of this district, I feel that God has blessed us with the finest group of self-sacrificing men to be found anywhere. The presence of the Holy Spirit is my supreme delight, the blood covers, He abides, and I believe my passion for the souls of men is increasing with the passing of time. My desire for this district is, that we will adopt the slogan, "FORWARD MARCH."

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The Sixth Annual Conference of the Louisiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church was assembled and called to order by the District Superintendent Rev. J. E. Abla, at 9:00 a. m. July 12, 1954, on the District Camp Grounds at Simms, La.

The Conference was opened by singing songs, "Ere the Sun Goeth Down," and "Hold the Fort for I am Coming." The Conference was led in prayer by Rev. E. L. Reiff, pastor of the Pineville Church, after which Rev. R. C. Hawkins the new Secretary of Church Extension was introduced by Rev. J. E. Abla, the District Superintendent.

Rev. Hawkins took charge of the conference and brought a message from the text; "Lift up your eyes and look on the fields for they are ripe already to harvest." John 4:35. The subject of his message was "The Last Opportunity."

The first order of business was the roll call after which the conference bar was established. Moved to accept Rev. E. L. Reiff, Rev. Wilma Reiff, Rev. Wayne Quinn, and Rev. Leonard Wolfe into the Louisiana district and given a seat within the bar.

Rev. Alba presented the Monroe Church Organization with its lay delegate to the conference. The church was received into the district and the delegate, Sr. Cromartie was seated within the conference bar.

Rev. M. T. Cockman, our camp evangelist, was presented to the Conference and given an honorary seat in the Conference bar.

The District Superintendent read his report. It was received with a hearty Amen.

The Auditing Committee's report was read and accepted.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The Statistitian's report was read and accepted.

The Resolution Committee reported:

(1) A substitute for number 3, was recommended, which reads that each church gives a pounding for the pastor the first Sunday of each month and that the church board appoint some one to take care of this matter.

(2) That number 7 be changed to read; Resolved that the camp meeting begin the second Monday in June with Conference following on the third Monday.

(3) Number 10 was deleted.

The Ladies Missionary report was read and accepted with a hearty Amen.

The educational-examining board report was read and accepted.

Rev. Ira Lee Young was given a seat within the Conference bar after receiving his First Year License.

The Ways and Means Committee reported:

(1) A substitute for number 3, was recommended, which read that each church be assessed according to the following figures:

Alexandria, \$120.00; Bastrop, \$25.00; Baton Rouge \$75.00; Bogalusa, \$60.00; Lake Charles \$75.00; Monroe \$50.00; Oakdale \$125.00; Pineville \$175.00; Shreveport \$150.00; Simms \$175.00. This sum to be paid on the district budget, in monthly instalments.

Motion was made and seconded that the district secretary be delegated to write a letter of appreciation to Rev. R. A. Beltz for his services to our district while he was our General Secretary of Church Extension.

Appointments as made by the General Board were read by Rev. R. C. Hawkins:

District Secretary	Rev. Lee Rathbun
District Treasurer	Rev. Jack Polson

Rev. E. L. Reiff and Rev. Wayne Quinn were elected as Advisory Council members.

Rev. Wilma Reiff was elected on the Educational-Examining Board.

The conference declared by unanimous vote, that the next camp-meeting should be June 13-19. Conference to be the following day.

The Conference empowered the District Council to take care of any unfinished business.

The conference was adjourned with prayer by Rev. Cockman.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that all ordained and licensed ministers pay their ministerial tithe into the District Treasury, through their local church treasury.

2. We recommend that all birthday offerings be paid to the District treasurer to be applied on the District Home Missions.

3. We recommend that each church be assessed according to the following figures: Alexandria \$120.00; Bastrop \$25.00; Baton Rouge \$75.00; Bogalusa \$60.00; Lake Charles \$75.00; Monroe \$50.00; Oakdale \$125.00; Pineville \$175.00; Shreveport \$150.00 Simms \$175.00. This sum to be paid on the district budget in monthly installments.

4. We recommend that the District Superintendent's traveling expenses while traveling in the interest of the District be paid at the rate of five cents a mile and also that the District Correspondence and communications be paid by the District Treasurer.

5. We recommend that on each visit by the District Superintendent each church take an offering on the Superintendent's expenses, but send the money to the District Treasurer.

6. We recommend that all monies be sent to the District Treasurer not later than the tenth of each month.

7. We recommend that all monies from the local churches destined to the General Treasurer be sent to the District Treasurer.

8. We recommend that each church pay the equivalent of \$1.00 per member of voting age, per year to be applied on the General Conference expense; the last payment to be made not later than May 1, 1958.

9. We recommend that there be a camp meeting registration fee of \$1.00 per person above the age of twelve years old, to be applied on the expenses of the camp.

10. We recommend that the District continue in operation the Pilgrim Pension Plan; that each church pay into the District Treasury monthly the sum of four per cent of its pastor's salary to be forwarded to the Board of Pensions. Be it further resolved that four per cent of the evangelist's salaries be paid from the District Treasurer's funds provided the evangelists are paying their tithes into the District.

11. We recommend that a camp meeting committee be elected by the council at conference and that said committee be in full charge of necessary arrangements of camp said committee visit each church in the District once each year and raise an offering from each church to be used to promote the camp; said money to be sent to the District Treasurer to hold until called for by the camp committee.

12. We recommend that five per cent of the District Budget be paid to our Zone Bible School.

13. We recommend that when the council has passed on a time and place to begin a new church, a fee of \$1.00 be assessed each voting age member of the district to be applied on the property.

14. We recommend that the District Pay our District Superintendent a salary of \$75.00 monthly.

15. We recommend that all who have books of the study course for licensed ministers or deaconess, send a list of the same to the District Secretary, and that the District purchase the remaining needed books to complete the courses, that these books be placed with the District Secretary to be lent to any one taking the courses, but who do not have the means to purchase same, and the care of the books or loss of same be chargeable to the borrower as well as the mailing charges both ways.

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Resolved that the quarterly report be mailed to the District Superintendent and that the yearly reports be made in duplicate; one copy be mailed immediately to the District Statistician and the other to be brought by the delegate to the conference.

2. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of his or her report to the District Statistician not later than ten days after the conference year closes, which is May 31. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer's books close at noon, June 10.

3. Resolved that each church give a pounding for the pastor the first Sunday of each month and that the church board appoint some one to take care of this matter.

4. Resolved that the minister's license shall not be granted to anyone who does not tithe to the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

5. Resolved that the churches pay their pastors while they are attending camp and conference the same as if they were on their charge.

6. Resolved that there be an offering taken in the local church to defray the pastor's expense to and from camp; this offering to be taken by the District Superintendent at his annual meeting with the local church.

7. Resolved that the camp meeting begin the second Monday in June with Conference following on the third Monday.

8. Resolved that all register who come to camp.
9. Resolved that every person attending the camp bring his own bed linens.
10. Resolved that each pastor be given a vacation of two weeks each year with pay.
11. Resolved that all ministers pursuing the course of study take the examination through the Pilgrim College at Kernersville, North Carolina.
12. Resolved that the conference show our appreciation to our District Superintendent by a rising vote of thanks and a God Bless you.
13. Resolved that we, the Louisiana District, are heartily in favor with the evangelical program that the General Church made in regards to personal evangelism.
14. Resolved that we, as a conference, show our Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, that we appreciate his presence with us, and that we pledge our utmost loyalty to him by a rising vote of thanks and a God Bless you.
15. Resolved that by a standing vote, this conference expresses its appreciation to Rev. M. T. Cockman, our camp evangelist, and to our musicians, Mr. and Mrs. Julius Hooter. Also Sr. Abba, for the Children's Work and to our cook, Sr. Ross.
16. Resolved that we as a conference show our appreciation to our District Secretary, District Treasurer, Statistician, District Sunday School Secretary, and District Young People's president by a rising vote of thanks.
17. Resolved that during camp, that the lights be turned out at eleven p. m. and all staying on the grounds should be in bed at that time.
