DISTRICT SUPERINTENDENTS REPORT

To the Seventh Annual Conference of the Louisiana District, to our faithful, sacrificing pastors, to the faithful members and friends of our District, to Rev. R. C. Hawkins, our Chairman, greetings in the name of Him that loved us and washed us from our sins in his own blood, and hath made us kings and priests unto God.

It is with a great deal of pleasure and satisfaction that we are able to report to you that this has been another year of progress for the Louisiana District.

GENERAL:

Alexandria has moved forward beautifully under the leadership of Brother and Sister Quinn. A parsonage has been bought. The church has been furnished, and a small educational unit has been added to the church and this work is rapidly becoming completely self supporting. They have the second largest gain in the District this year.

Bastrop has had a good year. The statistics will show that Brother and Sister Polson have made one of the largest gains in the District in Sunday School. They are now making plans to build a church. They have been able to gather some fine people about them and we believe there is a bright future for this work.

Bogalusa has had a fine year with Brother and Sister Creech. They also show a fine gain in Sunday School, and they have added greatly to the church and parsonage materially. Considerable improvement has been made on their buildings. They are to be especially commended for being the first church in the District to get all their budget in.

Lake Charles also shows a gain in Sunday School this year. Despite the handicaps encountered we feel God has victory for our people there. Brother and Sister Rathbun have been willing to sacrifice in order to hold this work together.

Oakdale has had a good year with Brother and Sister Ross. They have added rest rooms to their church and have made many other improvements. They show a gain of ten in membership.

Shreveport is moving forward under the capable leadership of Brother and Sister Pridgen. It is my own personal feeling that this church has made solid progress this year although the statistics may not bear this out. We believe the outlook for this church is bright.

Simms had a wonderful year under the fine leadership of Brother and Sister Wolfe. The reports will show good gains in every department, except possibly the young people. They had more than 30% gain in finances. They have added one room to the parsonage and remodeled or redecorated the rest. They also have materials on the ground for a new roof on their church.

Pineville has had an outstanding year. Brother and Sister Reiff have led their fine people forward. They show one of the largest gains in the District in Sunday School. They have a beautiful new sanctuary to their credit. This fine piece of property certainly adds to the District materially. I'm sure their financial report will show an all time high. They have also made gains in membership.

It has been my privilege to pastor our wonderful people at West Monroe this year. We are not ashamed to report the largest gain in the District both in Sunday School and in church membership. Lots have been purchased and the foundation has been poured and materials are being bought to erect our sanctuary.

The district shows a membership gain of 23.2%, a Sunday School gain of 21.44%, a property gain of \$36,714.71 with a total property value of \$174,350.00 and an equity of \$125,324.56.

More than \$13,000.00 was given by our people to the building fund this year.

The total receipts of our churches reached an all time high of \$45,429.29 this year compared with \$35,792.25 last year, a gain of \$9,636.99.

Our pastors salaries were increased over 30% this year reaching a record high of \$12,642.71.

The per capita giving of our people soared to \$219.08 this year. I wish to personally thank our fine pastors and wonderful people for this part of the report.

PERSONAL:

I have organized two churches this year. I have visited each church in the District at least twice during the year. I have held three revivals and God has given more than 150 seekers at the altar. I have travelled more than 14,000 miles in the interest of the District. I have done considerable manual labor for the District.

I have pastored the West Monroe church and have made over 300 calls in connection with this work. I have received more than 30 members into church fellowship. I attended the Church Leaders Conference in Indianapolis.

I appreciate the fine spirit of cooperation I have had from our good pastors and people. If I know my own heart, despite the hardships, handicaps and problems that go with church extension work, I love it. I am willing to spend and be spent to see this work forge ahead. I wish to express my thanks for three tremendous influences in my life; first of all, for the God of my salvation. Secondly, for my godly wife and lastly, for the Pilgrim Holiness Church which has nurtured me, taught me, stood by me and is now supporting me. The Blood covers, The Holy Spirit abides and my love for God increases from day to day.

CONFERENCE PROCEEDINGS

The Seventh Annual Conference of the Louisiana District of the Pilgrim Holiness Church convened at 9:30 A. M. June 14, 1955 at Camp Mil Mar near Pineville, La.

The Conference was opened by singing the songs, "At The Cross" and "To The Work." Rev. E. L. Reiff offered the opening prayer. After the prayer our District Superintendent, Rev. J. E. Abla, introduced the Rev. R. C. Hawkins, General Secretary of Church Extension, to the Conference. Rev. Hawkins took charge of the service and presided at the business sessions.

Before conducting the business session, Rev. Hawkins addressed the delegates and friends of the Conference. He used as a subject for his address "Temporary Religious Trends," using as a text for his remarks II Timothy Chapter four and verse three, which reads: "For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears." Rev. Hawkins treated his message under three general headings: The Economical Trend, The Political Trend and The Religious Trend.

After the address the secretary called the roll, calling first for the ministerial delegates then the lay delegates.

A motion prevailed that the first five rows of seats across the building constitute the conference bar, the delegates were ask to occupy these seats for the remainder of the Conference.

The chair called for the establishment of the time for the sessions. Motion was made and ratified that the first session, now in progress adjourn at 11:45 A. M. and that the second session convene at 1:00 P. M. and remain in session until the business is completed.

The reception committee introduced the following people to the conference: Rev. and Mrs. G. B. Carroll of Colorado Springs, Colorado, Rev. John Doll of Wichita, Kansas, Rev. Jessie Carter of the Alabama Northwest Florida District, Rev. Richard Carr of the Owosso Bible College, Owosso, Mich., and Rev. and Mrs. Otho Jennings, our Camp evangelist and Childrens worker. After each gave their testimony the conference united in singing "Blest Be The Tie That Binds", after which they were given seats in the conference bar. Rev. and Mrs. Carroll and Rev. Carter were given voting privileges since they were coming into the district as workers. The others were granted seats as honorary members.

Our District Superintendent, Rev. J. E. Abla, read his report of the work of the district as well as his own personal report. The report showed gains in every department. The conference appreciated this report very much and made manifest their acceptance by a standing vote with a hearty AMEN!

The auditing committee reported that the District Treasurer's books were correct and satisfactory in every respect. The report was accepted by the conference.

The District Treasurer's report was read and accepted.

The Sunday School Promotional Secretary's report was read and accepted.

The Young Peoples Secretary's report was read and commendably received.

The Statistician's report was read and accepted.

The reception committee presented Sister Ada Johnston to the conference. She gave a good testimony of God's Spirit in her life.

The Ladies Missionary report was read and accepted with words of commendation.

The reception committee presented Sister Effie Gish and Brother J. E. Moore to the conference, each gave a testimony of the love of God burning in their souls.

Mr. J. M. Pumpelly was presented to the conference. He gave witness of the saving knowledge of the Lord Jesus Christ in his heart and the indwelling of the Holy Spirit.

Sister Cromartie rendered in a most pleasing manner the beautiful song: "Pray Your Way Through".

We were adjourned by the expiration of time.

SECOND SESSION OF THE CONFERENCE:

The second session of the conference was opened by singing, "He Rolled The Sea Away". Prayer was offered by Rev. C. P. Pridgen.

Moved and ratified that we deviate from our regular order of business long enough to receive the Bastrop Church into the conference. It was received.

Moved and ratified that we dispense with the reading of the roll call.

The minutes of the morning sitting were read and accepted by the conference.

The Ways and Means committee report was read. With certain rejections and corrections it was accepted.

The Educational Examining Committee met and offered the following recommendations:

- (1) All ordained ministers receive their credential renewals.
- (2) Rev. George Carr and Rev. Leonard Wolfe to be ordained.
- (3) Rev. R. D. Rodriguez to receive his third year license.
- (4) Rev. Ira Lee Young, Rev. Irene Creech and Rev. Jessis Carter receive second year license.
- (5) Rev. Herman Henderson and Rev. Lee Hollingsworth receive first year license renewals.

Resolutions committee report read. With certain rejections and corrections it was accepted.

Rev. Hawkins was called from the conference floor by a long distance telephone call. When he returned he brought us the sad message of the home-going of our dearly beloved General Superintendent, Dr. L. W. Sturk. The conference joined in prayer in behalf of Sister Sturk and the family.

Motion was made and ratified that the conference send a telegram to Sister Sturk and family extending our sympathy in this such trying hour; also that we wire flowers for the funeral from the Louisiana District.

Bro. Julius Hooter sang the song, "I Know A Name". This lifted our souls heavenward.

Moved and ratified that the camp meeting committee be abolished and the District Council be empowered to take charge of it.

The District Superintendent read the committees for the coming year. These will be found on the page with the Official Directory.

Recommended that our camp be held on the same grounds (Lake Mil Mar) next year.

With the conclusion of the business the conference was adjourned with prayer.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. Resolved that three copies of all reports be made: the monthly reports to be mailed; one to General Sec. of Church Extension, and one to the District Supt. and the annual reports be sent immediately at the close of the year to the District Statistician and District Supt. The third copies of the reports to be retained for local files.

2. Resolved that each preacher and deaconess send a copy of his report to the Dist. Statistician not later than 10 days after the Conference year closes, which is April 30. Be it resolved that the District Treasurer's books close at noon May 10.

3. Resolved that each church give a pounding for the pastor the first Sunday of each month and that the church board appoint someone to take care of this matter.

4. Resolved that the minister's license shall not be granted to anyone who does not tithe to the Pilgrim Holiness Church.

5. Resolved that the churches pay their pastors while they are attending camp and conference the same as if they were on their charge.

6. Resolved that there be an offering taken in the local church to defray the pastor's expenses to and from camp; this offering to be taken by the District Supt. at his annual meeting with the local church.

7. Resolved that the camp meeting begin the first Thursday in June and run through the second Sunday. The dates being June 7-17, 1956. Conference shall be conducted on Tuesday June 12, 1956.

8. Resolved that all register who come to camp.

9. Resolved that every person attending the camp bring his own bed linens.

10. Resolved that each pastor be given a vacation of two weeks each year with pay.

11. Resolved that all ministers pursuing the course of study, take the examination through the Pilgrim College at Kernersville, North Carolina.

12. Resolved that the conference show our appreciation to our District Superintendent by a rising vote of thanks and a God Bless You.

13. Resolved that we, as a conference, show our Secretary of Church Extension, Rev. R. C. Hawkins, that we appreciate his presence with us and that we pledge our utmost loyalty to him by a rising vote of thanks and a God Bless You.

14. Resolved that by a standing vote, this conference expresses its appreciation to Rev. and Mrs. Otho Jennings, our camp evangelists and to our musicians, Mr. and Mrs. Julius Hooter. Also to our cook and kitchen help.

We further resolve that a vote of appreciation be given Mrs. Roy O. Martin for her kind consideration in leasing these beautiful commodious grounds to the Pilgrim Holiness Church of the Louisiana District.

15. Resolved that we as a conference show our appreciation to our District Secretary, District Treasurer, Statistician, District Sunday School Secretary and District Young People's President by a rising vote of thanks.

WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE REPORT

1. We recommend that all ordained and licensed ministers pay their ministerial tithe into the District Treasury through their local church treasury.

2. We recommend that all birthday offerings be paid to the District Treasurer to be applied on the District Home Missions.

3. We recommend that the Ministerial tithe and budget system as practiced last year be continued, providing that in some of the churches the budget be raised to an amount agreed upon by the pastor and conference. We also recommend that offerings taken on the superintendents expense when he is present at a church be applied on the local church District budget.

4. We recommend that each church be assessed according to the following figures: Alexandria, \$180.00; Bastrop, \$30.00; Baton Rouge, \$84.00; Bogalusa, \$60.00; Lake Charles, \$75.00; West Monroe, \$75.00; Oakdale, \$120.00; Pineville, \$192.00; Shreveport, \$150.00; Simms, \$192.00. This sum is to be paid on the District Budget in monthly instalments.

5. We recommend that the District Superintendent's traveling expenses while traveling in the interest of the District be paid at the rate of five cents a mile and also that the District Correspondence and Communications be paid by the District Treasurer.

6. We recommend that all monies be sent to the District Treasurer not later than the tenth of each month.

7. We recommend that all monies from the local churches destined to the General Treasurer be sent to the District Treasurer.

8. We recommend that each church pay the equivalent of \$1.00 per member of voting age, per year to be applied on the General Conference expense; the last payment to be made not later than May 1, 1958.

9. We recommend that there be a camp meeting registration fee of \$1.00 per person above the age of twelve years old, to be applied to the expenses of the camp.

10. We recommend that the District continue in operation the Pilgrim Pension Plan; that each church pay into the District Treasury monthly the sum of four percent of its pastor's salary to be forwarded to the Board of Pensions. Be it further resolved that four percent of the evangelist's salaries be paid from the District Treasurer's funds provided the evangelists are paying their tithes into the District.

11. We recommend that five percent of the District Budget be paid to our Zone Bible School.

12. We recommend that when the council has passed on a time and place to begin a new church, a fee of \$1.00 be assessed each voting age member of the district to be applied on the property.

13. We recommend that the district raise it's portion of the District Superintendent's salary from \$75.00 a month to \$100.00 a month. We further recommend that we pay 5 cents a mile travel expense, also that we pay his postage, stationery, and telephone expense as used in connection with his official duties in district work.

14. We recommend that the District Treasurer be paid \$3.00 per month for his service. Further we recommend that each member of the District Council be paid at the rate of 5 cents per mile when called to District Council meetings. Further we recommend that the District Treasurer and Secretary be supplied their stationery and postage for district work.

15. We recommend that all who have books of the study course for licensed ministers or deaconess, send a list of the same to the District Secretary, and that the District purchase the remaining needed books to complete the courses, that these books be placed with the District Secretary to be lent to any one taking the courses, but who do not have the means to purchase same, and the care of the books or loss of the same be chargeable to the borrower as well as the mailing charge both ways.

Auditing Committee Report

We, the auditing committee, have examined the District Treasurer's books and find them satisfactory in every respect.
